

1 General safety information

Take note of all warning and safety notes indicated. Do not make any changes or settings that are not described in this user manual. Incorrect operation, and improper handling can lead to physical injury, damage to the product or loss of data.

Setting up the product

This product is for indoor use only. Place the product securely on a stable, flat surface.
To help avoid possible injuries to persons or damage to the product itself, position all cables in such a way that no one will trip over them.

Do not operate the product in damp rooms. Never touch the mains cable or the mains connection with wet hands

The product must have sufficient ventilation and must not be covered. Do not put the product in closed cabinets, boxes, or other enclosures when in use. Do not cover the lens during operation.

Protect the product from direct sunlight, heat, intense temperature fluctuations and moisture. Do not place the product in the vicinity of heaters or air conditioners. Observe the information on temperature listed in the technical data (see Technical data, page 25).

Prolonged operation of the product causes the surface to become warm hot. In case of overheating, the product automatically switches to standby mode.

Do not allow liquids to leak into the product. Turn off the product and disconnect it from the mains supply if liquids or foreign substances leaked into the product. Have the product inspected by an authorised service centre.

Always handle the product with care. Avoid touching the lens. Never place heavy or sharp objects on the product or on the power cable.

If the product gets too hot or emits smoke, shut it down immediately and unplug the power cable. Have your product checked by an authorised service centre. Keep the product away from open flames (e.g. candles).

The product has built-in battery. Do not dissemble and modify. The built-in battery should be replaced by qualified service staff only.

Do not try to replace the built-in battery yourself. Incorrect handling of the battery or using the wrong type of battery can cause damage to the product or cause injury.

Risk of explosion with incorrect type of batteries!

There is a risk of explosion if the wrong battery type is used.

Do not expose the batteries (battery pack or embedded batteries) to excessive heat such as sunshine, or open fire.

Under the following conditions, a layer of moisture can appear inside the product which can lead to malfunctions:

- if the product is moved from a cold to a warm area:
- after a cold room is heated:
- when the product is placed in a damp room

Proceed as follows to avoid any moisture buildup:

- Seal the product in a plastic bag before moving it to another room, in order for it to adapt to room conditions.
- Wait one to two hours before you take the product out of the plastic bag.

The product should not be used in a very dusty environment. Dust particles and other foreign objects may damage the product.

Do not expose the product to extreme vibrations. This may damage the internal components.

Do not allow children to handle the product without supervision. The packing materials should be kept out of the hands of children.

For your own safety, do not use the product during thunderstorms with lightning.

Repairs

Do not repair the product yourself. Improper maintenance can result in injuries or damage to the product. The product must be repaired by an authorised service centre.

Please find the details of authorised service centres on the warranty card supplied with this product.

Do not remove the type label from this product, as this will void the warranty.

Power supply

Use the supplied power adapter, or a compatible USB-C PD adapter of 60W or higher. The adapter must support 15V at 3A or 4A. 20V is not supported.

Check whether the mains voltage of the power supply matches the mains voltage available at the setup location. This product complies with the voltage type specified on the product.

The power outlet shall be installed near the product and shall be easily accessible.

The capacity of the built-in battery diminishes with time. If the product functions only with AC power supply, the built-in battery is defective. Contact an authorised service centre to replace the built-in battery.

CAUTION!



Always use the (1) button to turn the projector off.

Turn off the product and unplug from the power outlet before cleaning the surface (see Cleaning, page 21). Use a soft, lint-free cloth. Never use liquid, gaseous or easily flammable cleaners (sprays, abrasives, polishes, alcohol). Do not allow any moisture to reach the interior of the product.




Risk of eye irritation!

This product is equipped with a high power LED (Light Emitting Diode), which emits very bright light. Do not look directly into the projector lens during operation. This could cause eye irritation or damage.







3 Initial operation

Placement

You can install the projector in the following configurations. Follow the guidelines below for different projector placement.

Notice



For overhead mounting on ceiling, purchase a projector mount recommended by an installation professional and follow the instructions that come with the mount.

Before mounting on the ceiling, make sure the ceiling can support the weight of the projector and mounting kit.

For ceiling installation, this product must be securely attached to the ceiling in accordance with the installation instructions. An improper ceiling installation may result in accident, injury or damage.

Front table


1 Place the projector on a table in front of the projection screen. This is the most common way to position the projector for quick setup and portability.



To adjust projection to the correct position, select on the upper right of the home screen, and press OK, then go to Projector Settings - Image - Ceiling - Front.

Front ceiling


 Mount the projector on the ceiling with upside up in front of the projection screen.
 A projector mount is required to mount the projector on ceiling.



2 To adjust projection to the correct position, select on the upper right of the home screen, and press OK, then go to Projector Settings - Image - Ceiling - Ceiling Front.

Rear table

 Place the projector on a table behind the projection screen. A special rear projection screen is required.




2 To adjust projection to the correct position, select on the upper right of the home screen, and press OK, then go to Projector Settings - Image - Ceiling - Rear.

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Rear ceilina

1 Mount the projector on ceiling with upside up behind the projection screen. To mount the projector on ceiling behind the screen, a projector mount and a special rear projection screen is required.



2 To adjust projection to the correct position, select on the upper right of the home screen, and press OK, then go to Projector Settings - Image - Ceiling - Ceiling Rear.

Tripod mount

The projector comes with a tripod which allows more choices for placement through stabilizing the projector.

Locate the tripod socket on the bottom of the projector, then mount and secure the projector on the tripod.

Notice



DO NOT mount the projector directly to the tripod. Use the included ball mount attachment

Connect power supply

The projector can be operated by either external power or built-in battery.

CAUTION!



Always use the \bigcirc button to turn the projector on and off.

Operation by external power

 Using the supplied USB-C cable, connect the USB-C (POWER) port on the projector to the supplied power adapter. Then connect the power adapter to the wall outlet.



If needed, select an appropriate power plug for connecting to the wall outlet.

To attach a supplied power plug to the power adapter, align the slots on the power plug with the two pins of the power adapter, then slide the power plug in.

Operation by built-in battery

The projector can be also operated on built-in battery for portability.

Charge the projector

Charge the projector for 1.5 hours before first use.

Charge the projector when the low battery icon appears in the projection screen.

- To charge the projector, connect the projector to an external power supply as described in the section of "Operation by external power".
- When charging, the LED on the projector turns red. When fully charged, the red LED turns off.
- When powered on, the external power will be used first to run the projector and unused power will charge the battery.
- For faster charging, charge while the projector is powered off.

Notice



The capacity of the built-in battery diminishes with time. If the projector functions only with external power supply, the built-in battery is defective. Contact an authorised service centre to replace the built-in battery.

Prepare the remote control

CAUTION



The improper use of batteries can lead to overheating, explosion, risk of fire and injury. Leaking batteries can possibly damage the remote control.

Never expose the remote control to direct sunlight.

Avoid deforming, dismantling or charging the batteries.

Avoid exposure to open fire and water. Replace empty batteries immediately. Remove the batteries from the remote control if not in use for long periods of time

- 1 Open the battery compartment.
- 2 Insert the supplied batteries (type AAA) with correct polarity (+/-) indicated.
- 3 Close the battery compartment.







Notice



When using the remote control, point the remote control at the IR sensor located on the back of the projector, and make sure there is no obstacle between the remote control and the IR sensor.

Power on and setup

- 1 Press and hold (1) on the projector (or (1) on the remote control) for 1 second to switch the projector on or off.
 - When the projector is switched on, the LED on the projector turns blue if the projector is not being charged.
 - When charging, the LED on the projector turns red regardless of the projector switching on or off.

Change screen size

The projection screen size (or size of images) is determined by the distance between the lens of the projector and the projection surface.

- The projection distance needs to be 1.2 times the width of your desired screen size.
- You can also use the digital zoom to reduce the screen size up to 80%. On the home screen, select no on the upper right of the home screen, and press OK, then go to Projector Settings - Image - Digital Zoom.

Image focus adjustment

Auto focus adjustment

The projector can automatically adjust image focus or clearness when you reposition the projector or the projected image is detected not clear.

To enable auto focus adjustment, select on the upper right of the home screen, and press OK, then go to Projector Settings - Image - Autofocus Settings.



Manual focus adjustment

Press ⊕ on the remote control to turn focus adjustment on, then press ◀/▶ on the remote control to adjust image clearness. After adjusting image clearness, press → to turn focus adjustment off.

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Image shape correction

Auto correction (vertical keystone)

The projector can automatically correct the image to be rectangular when you tilt the projector upwards or downwards.

To enable auto vertical keystone correction, select on the upper right of the home screen, and press **OK**, then go to *Projector Settings - Image - Keystone Correction - Auto Keystone Correction.*



Calibration

Correct the image to be rectangular when the projector is placed level, or if the auto keystone correction does not correct the image ideally. Perform image shape calibration as follows.

- 1 Place the projector on the floor, or a straight (level) surface.
- 2 Enable auto vertical keystone correction, select on the upper right of the home screen, and press OK, then go to Projector Settings - Image - Keystone Correction -Auto Keystone Correction.
- 3 Select *Calibration* under *Keystone Correction*, then press **OK** to perform calibration.



Customized correction (4-corner correction)

You can manually adjust the image shape by re-positioning four corners of the projection image. This also lets you correct for left or right position of the projector.

- Select on the upper right of the home screen, and press OK, then go to Projector Settings - Image - Keystone Correction -4-Corner Correction.
- 2 In the 4-corner correction interface, press OK to select an image corner, then press and hold ◀/▶ to adjust the horizontal positioning values, and ▲/▼ to adjust the vertical positioning values. Repeat the same step to adjust positioning values of the other image corners if desired.



Notice



4-corner correction is not available when using HDMI or USB-C video input.

Screen size adjustment (digital scalling)

You can manually reduce the screen size up to 80%

- Select 🌺 on the upper right of the home screen, and press **OK**, then go to *Projector Settings Image Digital Zoom*.
- 2 In the zooming interface, press ▲/▼ to adjust screen size with 80-100% scaling range.



Notice



Digital zooming is not available when using HDMI or USB-C video input.

Basic setup

Step 1: set up the language

Select no note in the upper right of the home screen, and press OK, then go to Projector Settings - Language/Input. The following Language & Input menu appears. Use the Navigation buttons and OK on the remote control to make changes.



- Language: Select your desired language for on-screen menus.
- Time Zone: Select your time zone.
- Keyboard Input Method: Select English keyboard or other input methods.

Step 2: activate on-screen pointer

Activate the on-screen pointer (mouse cursor) to replace the function of the **Navigation buttons** on the remote control. The on-screen pointer is useful when you input text through pop-up virtual keyboard, browse the Internet, or use some certain apps.

Before you can use the on-screen pointer, pair the remote control with the projector.

- 1 Go to the Bluetooth settings interface. Select no n the upper right of the home screen, and press OK, then go to Projector Settings - Bluetooth On. Enable Bluetooth by selecting Switch Bluetooth if not enabled.
- 2 Press and hold **OK** and on the remote control until the LED on the remote control flashes red. Bluetooth on the remote control is activated.
- 3 Select Scan for devices in the Bluetooth settings interface to search for Bleutooth devices available.
- 4 Select Philips AirMote from the Bluetooth device list, and press OK. Then the remote control is paired with the projector.

To use on-screen pointer

- When the remote control is paired with the projector, press not the remote control to display or cancel the on-screen pointer.
- When the pointer (angled arrow) is displayed on the projection screen, move the remote control in the air then the pointer moves across the screen correspondingly.
- 3 Press the ► button on the remote control to confirm selection (the OK button is disabled).
- 4 The on-screen pointer is disabled if you press the **Navigation button** on the remote control. To enable the on-screen pointer again, press .





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Step 3: set up the Wi-Fi network


Set up the Wi-Fi network to access online applications and screen mirroring.

What you need

- A wireless network router
- For best wireless performance and coverage, use an 802.11n router ("Wi-Fi 4") and the 5 GHz band.
- 1 Go to Wi-Fi settings. Select on the upper right of the home screen, and press OK, then go to Projector Settings Wi-Fi. Then select your network name from the network list.
- 2 The network password input bar and the virtual keyboard pop up.
 - To input your password, you can use the navigation buttons on the remote control, or use the on-screen pointer (see Step 2: activate on-screen pointer, page 11).
- 3 After you input the password for the network, select *Connect* on the screen to complete the Wi-Fi setup.

4 Use home screen

The home screen provides easy access to a wide range of Internet applications, setup and other useful features on the projector.



Access system settings

You can access the system settings on the home screen.

- Press the Navigation buttons on the remote control to select the initial icon on the upper right of the home screen.
- 2 Press **OK** on the remote control to access the options, then select *Projector Settings* to access the system settings.

Access online services

Some pre-loaded Internet applications are available on the home screen.

- Before access to the applications, make sure the projector is connected to Internet.
 Select on the upper right of the home screen, and press OK, then go to Projector Settings - Wi-Fi.
- Use the Navigation buttons and OK on the remote control to select and open an application.
- You may add or remove an application on the home screen by installing or uninstalling an application.
- To browse, search and install applications, access Aptoide TV app store on the home screen.
- To uninstall applications on the home screen, select an application, then press
 on the remote control to access the Uninstall option.

Notice



The Aptoide TV store apps come from 3rd party developers. Some apps may or may not work correctly. Only the preloaded apps have been tested by Philips.

Customize home screen wallpaper

- Select on the upper right of the home screen, then press OK to access the settings options.
- 2 Select the Change Wallpaper option, then use the left and right arrow buttons on the screen to select a pre-saved picture as background on the home screen.

Screen navigation and keyboard input

The projector provides several alternative methods for you to navigate across the projection screen and input text.

Use the touchpad

The touchpad is located on the top of the projector. The touchpad area is identified with an angle mark on the four corners.

- Move your finger on the touchpad, then the on-screen pointer appears and moves in the same direction of your finger movement.
- To select an item on the projection screen, tap your finger on the touchpad.
- To scroll the screen, use two fingers and move them on the touchpad.
- To return to the previous screen interface level, press (touch button) on the top of the projection.

Use the AirMote control

Before you can use this feature, make sure that the remote control is paired with the projector for AirMote control (see Step 2: activate onscreen pointer, page 11).

Use wired keyboard/mouse

 Simply connect the USB-A plug of your wired mouse or keyboard to the USB port on the projector.

- Use the keys on the keyboard for screen navigation, selection and text input, just like the keyboard operation with a computer.
- Use the buttons on the mouse for navigation and selection.

Use Bluetooth Keyboard/mouse

- Pair your Bluetooth keyboard or mouse with the projector as follows:
 - Select on the upper right of the home screen, and press OK, then go to Projector Settings - Bluetooth On. Then enable Bluetooth by selecting Switch Bluetooth if not enabled
 - In the Bluetooth settings interface of the projector, select your Bluetooth keyboard or mouse name from the Bluetooth device list.
- 2 After pairing, you can use the Bluetooth keyboard or mouse with the projector, just like the keyboard or mouse operation with a computer.

Use home screen 13

5 Bluetooth streaming

Through Bluetooth, you can wirelessly stream audio from the projector to a Bluetooth speaker.

Before you use the projector with a Bluetooth speaker for the first time, pair it with the Bluetooth speaker.

Notice



The effective operation range between the projector and the Bluetooth device is approximately 10 meters (30 feet).

The music streaming may be interrupted by any obstacles between the Bluetooth device and the projector.

Bluetooth streaming is not available when using HDMI or USB-C video input.

For better Bluetooth performance, use a 5 GHz Wi-Fi network.

- 1 Turn on your Bluetooth speaker.
- 2 On the projector, access the Bluetooth settings.

Select ... on the upper right of the home screen, and press **OK**, then go to *Projector Settings - Bluetooth On*. Then enable Bluetooth by selecting *Switch Bluetooth* if not enabled.

- 3 In the Bluetooth settings interface of the projector, select your Bluetooth speaker name from the Bluetooth device list.
- 4 The projector is connected to your Bluetooth speaker. Audio from the projector streams to your Bluetooth speaker.



Bluetooth re-connection

The projector is re-connected to the last connected speaker automatically when the connected speaker is turned on.

Connection to a second Bluetooth speaker

You need to disable Bluetooth on the currently connected speaker, and then pair a second Bluetooth speaker with the projector.

6 Connect to playback devices

Notice




Make sure all devices are disconnected from the power outlet before establishing or changing any connections.

Connect to devices through HDMI

Connect a playback device (e.g. a Blu-ray player, gaming console, camcorder, digital camera or PC) to the projector through HDMI connection. With this connection, images are shown on the projection screen, and audio is played on the projector.

 Using an HDMI cable, connect the HDMI connector on the projector to the HDMI output on the playback device.




- 2 The projector automatically switches to HDMI input when HDMI connection is made
- To select HDMI input manually, select to the upper right of the home screen, and press OK, then go to Projector Settings Input Source HDMI.

Connect to devices through USB-C

Connect a USB-C device (e.g. a mobile phone, tablet or laptop) to the projector through USB-C connection. With this connection, images are shown on the projection screen, and audio is played on the projector.

Using a USB-C cable, connect the USB-C (VIDEO) connector on the projector to the USB-C port on the playback device.



- 2 The projector automatically switches to USB-C input when USB-C connection is made.
- To select USB-C input manually, select on the upper right of the home screen, and press OK, then go to Projector Settings -Input Source - USB-C.

Notice



The projector supports stereo audio format only. If no audio from the playback device is heard on the projector, check that the audio output format is set to stereo on the playback device.

The **USB-C (VIDEO)** port only accepts video signal. To connect other USB device (e.g. a thumb drive and keyboard), use the USB-A port.

Connect to external wire speakers or headphones

Connect external speakers or headphones to the projector. With this connection, audio from the projector is played through the external speakers or headphones.

DANGER!



Danger of hearing damage!


Before connecting the headphones, turn down the volume on the projector.

Do not use the projector over a longer time at high volume – especially when using headphones. This could lead to hearing damage.

1 Using a 3.5 mm audio cable, connect the nonector on the projector to the analogue audio input (3.5 mm jack, or red and white jacks) on the external speakers.

Or connect the \bigcap connector on the projector to your headphones.

 The speakers of the projector are deactivated automatically when the external speakers or headphones are connected to the projector.




When connecting to the headphones, use the volume control on the remote control to adjust the volume to a comfortable level.

7 Browse storage devices

Through the projector, you can access and play the pictures, audio and video files stored on the local storage and connected storage devices (e.g. a USB flash drive, HDD, camcorder or digital camera).

- Connect a USB storage device to the USB port on the projector.
 - Or connect a Micro SD card to the MICRO SD slot on the projector.



- Select the File Manager icon on the home screen to access the files stored.
 - Or select . on the upper right of the home screen, and press **OK**, then go to *File Manager*.
- 3 Select your connected device or local storage when prompted for device selection.
- 4 The file browser is displayed. Use the **navigation buttons** and **OK** on the remote control to select and open files.



Copy files to the internal storage

The projector has 16GB of internal storage. You may copy files from an external storage to the internal storage.

- Select a file or folder from the file browser, and press on the remote control to display the editing options, then select Copy to copy the file.
- 2 Press to go back to the storage selection interface, and select *Internal* to access the internal storage. Navigate to a folder, and press to the remote control to display the editing options, then select *Paste* to paste the file.

To cut or delete a file, select the file then press on the remote control to access the editing options.

Play video from storage devices

- Select a video file from the content browser, and press **OK**. Then select a video player from the app list to play video. We recommend "MX Player Pro" app to play video
- 2 To control playback, use OK or ◀/▶ on the remote control to pause/resume play or fast forward/backward (if applicable); or use the playback control bar displayed (if applicable).

During playback, press on the remote control to access more play options and settings (e.g. play mode, screen format and audio track, etc.), then use **OK** and the **navigation buttons** on the remote control to make a selection.

Play music from storage devices

- Select a music file from the content browser, and press OK. Then select a music player from the app list to play music.
- 2 To control playback, use the playback control bar displayed (if applicable).

During play, press on the remote control to access more play options (e.g. play mode), then use **OK** and the **navigation** buttons on the remote control to make a selection.

Play photo from storage devices

- Select a photo file from the file browser, and press **OK**. Then select a photo player from the app list to display the photo.
- When a photo is displayed, use the navigation buttons on the remote control to rotate or select a photo (if applicable).

During play, press on the remote control to access more play options (if applicable), such as zoom in/out and music play, then use **OK** and the **navigation buttons** on the remote control to make a selection.

8 Wireless projection

This projector allows you to wirelessly mirror the following devices to the projection screen.

- iOS devices
- Mac
- Android devices
- Windows PC

Screen mirroring for iOS devices and Mac

You can share the screen contents of your iOS device or Mac on the projection screen.

What you need

- Turn on Wi-Fi on your iPhone/Mac
- Make sure the projector and your iPhone/ Mac are in the same Wi-Fi network.
- 1 Make sure that the iOS media receiver for AirPlay is enabled on the projector via the following:

Select 💑 on the upper right of the home screen, and press **OK**, then go to *Projector Settings – Mirroring – iOS – AirPlay*. Once enabled, you do not need to enable it again later.

Or directly select the *AirPlay* icon on the home screen. The *AirPlay* icon appears when you move the on-screen pointer or press **\(\)** in the area above the app list on the home screen.

- 2 On your iPhone, access 'Control Center' by sliding the screen up, and select the 'Screen Mirroring' option. Then select the projector name under 'Screen Mirroring' to connect your iPhone to the projector.
 - Or on your Mac, access the screen mirroring option located on the top of the computer screen, then select the projector name to connect your Mac to the projector.
- 3 After successful connection, the screen contents of your iPhone/Mac are casted to the projection surface.

Cast video for iOS devices

You can cast videos from your iOS device on the full projection screen.

What you need

- · Turn on Wi-Fi on your iPhone
- Make sure the projector and your iPhone/ Mac are in the same Wi-Fi network.
- 1 Make sure that the iOS media receiver for AirPlay is enabled on the projector via the following:

Select ... on the upper right of the home screen, and press **OK**, then go to *Projector Settings - Mirroring - iOS - AirPlay*.

Or directly select the *AirPlay* icon on the home screen. The *AirPlay* icon appears when you move the on-screen pointer or press **A** in the area above the app list on the home screen.

View online video on your iPhone, and tap the TV icon on the video picture to access Apple TV mode. The video is now cast and played on the full projection screen.

- Select no note upper right of the home screen, and press OK, then go to Projector Settings - Mirroring - Android. The projector starts searching Android devices (or Windows PC) for connection.

Built-in battery care

The capacity of the built-in battery diminishes with time. You can prolong the life of the battery if you observe the following points:

- Without a power supply, the projector operates on the built-in battery. When the battery does not have sufficient power, the projector turns off. In this case connect the projector to the power supply.
- Charge the battery regularly. Don't store the projector with a completely discharged battery.
- If the projector is not used for several weeks, discharge the battery a little by using the projector before storing it.
- Keep the projector and the battery away from sources of heat.
- If the projector cannot be charged after connecting to the power supply, use a small pin to press the reset key (a small hole) located near the USB port of the projector.

Note about deep discharge of battery

When the built-in battery is in deep discharge, it may take longer for the actual charging process to start. In this case, charge the projector for at least five hours before using it.

Do not try to replace the built-in battery yourself.

Cleaning

Instructions for cleaning!

Wipe over the surfaces gently. Be careful that you do not scratch the surfaces.
