2 Important

Safety

- Risk of electric shock or fire!
 - Never expose the TV to rain or water. Never place liquid containers, such as vases, near the TV. If liquids are spilt on or into the TV, disconnect the TV from the power outlet immediately. Contact Philips Consumer Care to have the TV checked before use.
 - Never place the TV, remote control or batteries near naked flames or other heat sources, including direct sunlight.

To prevent the spread of fire, keep candles or other flames away from the TV, remote control and batteries at all times.



- Never insert objects into the ventilation slots or other openings on the TV.
- When the TV is swivelled ensure that no strain is exerted on the power cord. Strain on the power cord can loosen connections and cause arcing.

Screen care



3 TV overview


This section gives you an overview of commonly used TV controls and functions.

Side controls and indicators



- ① POWER: Switches the product on or off. The product is not powered off completely unless it is physically unplugged.
- (2) P/CH +/-: Switches to the next or previous channel.
- (3) + SOURCE: Selects connected devices.
- 4 VOLUME +/-: Increases or decreases volume.

Remote control



- 1 (Standby-On)
 - Switches the TV to standby if it is on.
 - Switches on the TV if it is in standby.
- (2) MHEG/TELETEXT

Toggles teletext on or off.

(3) D SOURCE

Selects connected devices.

4 Colour buttons

Selects tasks or options.

(5) AD (Audio Descriptor) (For RF Digital TV only)

UK only: Enables audio commentary for the visually handicapped.

(6) 📤 (Home)

Toggles the home menu on or off.

(7) © OPTIONS

Accesses options relating to the current activity or selection.

(8) OK

Confirms an entry or selection and displays the channel grid, when watching TV.

(9) ▲▼**∢►** (Navigation buttons)

Navigates through the menus.

(10) **INFO**

Displays programme information, when available. If the information spans multiple pages, press **OPTIONS** to go to the next page .

(11) ◀◀ (Backward)

Searches backward.

(12) **▶▶** (Forward)

Searches forward.

(13) ► II (Play/Pause)

Starts, pauses or resumes playback.

● (Record) (only used for Easylink features (see 'Use Philips EasyLink' on page 35))

Starts or stops video recording.

(Stop) ■ (Stop)

Stops playback.

(16) **★** (Mute)

Mutes or restores audio output.

17) P +/- (Programme +/-)

Switches to the next or previous channel. When the TV menu is on, this functions as Page Up/Down.

(18) ED FORMAT

Selects a picture format.

(19) **0-9 (Numeric buttons)**Selects a channel or setting.

(20) □ PICTURE

Launches the picture menu. (Not supported on all models.

(21) → SOUND

Launches the sound menu. (Not supported on all models.)

22 ∠ +/- (Volume +/-)

Increases or decreases volume.

② → BACKP/P (Previous channel)

Returns to a previous channel or menu screen.

(24) IIII GUIDE

Switches between channel grid and programme list.

25 SCENEA (Wallpaper)

Displays wallpaper on your TV screen.

(26) DEMO

Toggles the demonstration menu on or off.

(27) TV

Switches back to the aerial source.





4 Use your product

This section helps you perform basic operations (see 'Use more of your product' on page 11).

Switch your TV on/off or to standby





To switch on

- If the standby indicator is off, press \circ POWER at the side of the TV.
- If the standby indicator is red, press \circ (Standby-On) on the remote control.

To switch to standby

- Press \circ (Standby-On) on the remote control
 - → The standby indicator switches to red.

To switch off

- Press **OPOWER** at the side of the TV.
 - → The standby indicator switches off.





 Though your TV consumes very little power when in standby, energy continues to be consumed. When not in use for an extended period of time, disconnect the TV power cable from the power outlet.



 If you cannot locate your remote control and want to switch on the TV from standby, press P/CH +/- or SOURCE at the side of the TV.

Switch channels





- Press P +/- on the remote control or
 P/CH +/- on the side of the TV.
- Enter a channel number using the Numeric buttons.
- Use the channel grid (see 'Switch channels with the channel grid' on page 9).



• When you use a favourite list, you can only select those channels in the list.

Switch channels with the channel grid

The channel grid allows you to view all available channels in a grid format.



- 1 Press OK.
 - → The channel grid appears.
- Press ▲▼◀▶ to browse the channel grid and preview a channel.
 - → The channel content is displayed after a lapse of approximately two seconds.
- When you find a channel of your choice, press **OK** to watch.
 - → The selected channel appears.







Adjust TV volume






To increase or decrease volume

- Press **VOLUME** +/- on the side of the TV.

To mute or unmute sound

- Press **★** to mute the sound.
- Press **★** again to restore the sound.

Use teletext



- 1 Press MHEG/TELETEXT.
 - → The main index page appears.
- 2 Select a page as follows:
 - Press the Numeric buttons to enter a page number
 - Press P +/- or ▲▼ to view the next or previous page
 - Press the Colour buttons to select a colour coded item
 - Press SACK to return to a previously viewed page
- **3** Press MHEG/TELETEXT to exit teletext.



5 Use more of your product

Access TV menus

Menus help you to install channels, change picture and sound settings and access other features.

- 1 Press **♠** (Home).
 - → The menu screen appears.



- Press ▲▼◀▶ to select and navigate through one of the following menus.
 - [Watch TV] Switches back to the aerial source if another source is selected.
 - [Setup] Accesses menus that allow you to change picture, sound and other TV settings.
 - [Add new device] Adds new devices to the home menu.
- **3** Press **OK** to confirm your choice.
- **4** Press **♠** (**Home**) to exit.



Tip

 After selecting [Add new device], follow the on-screen instructions to select the correct device and connector.

Remove devices from the home menu

If a device is no longer connected to the TV, remove it from the home menu.

- 1 Press **♠** (Home).
- 2 Press AV to select a device to remove.
- 3 Press © OPTIONS.
 - → The [Remove device] list appears.
- 4 Press **OK** and select **[Remove]** to remove the device.
 - → The selected device is removed from the home menu.

Change picture and sound settings

Change picture and sound settings to suit your preferences. You can apply pre-defined settings or change settings manually.

Use settings assistant

Use the settings assistant to guide you through the best picture and sound settings.

- 1 Press **★** (Home).
- Press ▲▼◀▶ to select [Setup] > [Picture] > [Settings assistant].
- 3 Press OK.
 - → The [Settings assistant] menu appears. Follow the on-screen instructions to choose your preferred picture settings.

Use smart picture


Use smart picture to apply pre-defined picture settings.

- 1 Press \square PICTURE.
 - → The [Smart picture] menu appears.
- Press ▲▼ to select one of the following smart picture settings.

- **[Personal]**Lists customised personal picture settings.
- [Vivid] Maximises picture settings.
- [Standard] Adjusts picture settings to suit most environments and types of video.
- [Movie] Applies picture settings ideally suited for movie viewing.
- [Game] Applies picture settings maximised for fast-moving games.
- [Energy saving] Applies low-energy picture settings.
- **3** Press **OK** to confirm your choice.
 - → The selected smart picture setting is applied.

Manually adjust picture settings

- 1 Press ♠ (Home).
- Press ▲▼◀▶ to select [Setup] > [Picture].



- 3 Press ▲▼◀▶ to select one of the following picture settings.
- [Smart picture] Accesses pre-defined smart picture settings.
- [Contrast] Adjusts the intensity of bright areas, keeping dark areas unchanged.
- [Brightness] Adjusts the intensity and details of dark areas.
- [Colour]Adjusts colour saturation.
- [Hue]Compensates colour variations in NTSC encoded transmissions.
- [Sharpness] Adjusts the level of sharpness in image details.
- [Noise reduction] Filters and reduces noise in an image.

- [Tint] Adjusts the colour balance in an image.
- [Custom tint] Make a customised tint setting. (Only available if [Tint] > [Custom] is selected)
- [Pixel Plus HD] Fine-tunes each pixel to match surrounding pixels. This produces a brilliant, high-definition image.
 - [Dynamic contrast] Automatically enhances contrast in an image. A [Medium] setting is recommended.
 - [Dynamic backlight] Adjusts the brightness of the TV backlight to match lighting conditions.
 - [MPEG artifact reduction] Smoothes out transitions on digital pictures. You can switch this feature on or off.
 - [Colour enhancement] Makes colours more vivid and improves the resolution of details in bright colours. You can switch this feature on or off.
- **[PC mode]**Adjusts the picture when a PC is connected to the TV via HDMI or DVI.
- **[Light sensor]** Dynamically adjusts picture settings to match lighting conditions.
- [Picture format] Changes the picture format.
- [Horizontal shift] Adjusts the picture horizontally for PC-VGA, DVI, HDMI or YPbPr.
- [Vertical shift] Adjusts the picture vertically for PC-VGA, DVI, HDMI or YPbPr.

Change picture format

- 1 Press FORMAT.
 - → A picture format bar appears.
- Press ▲▼ or FORMAT to select a picture format.
 - → The selected picture format is activated.
- **3** Press **OK** to confirm your choice.






[Auto format] (Not for PC mode.) Enlarges the picture automatically to best fit the screen. The subtitles remain visible.




[Super zoom] (Not for HD and PC mode.) Removes the black bars on the side of 4:3 broadcasts. There is minimal distortion.



[4:3] Shows the classic 4:3 format.



[Subtitle zoom] Displays 4:3 pictures over the full area of the screen, with sub-titles visible. Part of the top of the picture is clipped off.



[Movie expand 14:9] (Not for HD and PC mode.) Scales 4:3 format to 14:9.



[Movie expand 16:9] (Not for HD and PC mode.) Scales 4:3 format to 16:9.



[Wide screen] Stretches the classic 4:3 format to 16:9.



[Unscaled] For HD and PC mode only, and in selected models only. Allows maximum sharpness. Some distortion may be present due to the broadcaster's systems. Set your PC resolution to wide screen mode for best results.


Use smart sound

Use smart sound to apply pre-defined sound settings.

- 1 Press ♪ SOUND.
 - → The [Smart sound] menu appears.
- Press ▲▼ to select one of the following smart sound settings.
 - [Standard] Adjusts sound settings to suit most environments and types of audio.
 - [News] Applies sound settings ideally suited for spoken audio, such as the news.
 - [Movie] Applies sound settings ideally suited for movies.
 - [Personal]Applies the settings that were customised in the sound menu.
- **3** Press **OK** to confirm your choice.
 - → The selected smart sound setting is applied.

Adjust sound settings

- 1 Press **♠** (Home).
- 2 Press ▲▼◀▶ to select [Setup] > [Sound].→ The [Sound] menu appears.



- Press ▲▼◀▶ to select one of the following sound settings.
 - [Smart sound] Accesses pre-defined smart sound settings.
 - [Bass]Adjusts the bass level.
 - [Treble] Adjusts the treble level.
 - [Volume] Adjusts the volume.
 - [Vol.vis impaired] Sets the mix of visually impaired audio with regular audio. When available, visually impaired audio includes audio descriptions of on-screen action. You can also enable this by pressing AD (Audio Descriptor).
 - [Balance] Adjusts the balance of the right and left speakers to best suit your listening position.
 - [Audio language] Available for digital channels, when multiple languages are broadcast. Lists available audio languages.
 - [Dual I-II]Selects between audio languages if dual sound is broadcast.
 - [Mono/Stereo]Selects between mono or stereo if stereo is broadcast.
 - **[TV speakers]**Turns TV speakers on or off
 - **[Surround]**Enables spatial sound.
 - [Headphone volume]Adjusts headphone volume.
 - [Auto volume] Automatically reduces sudden volume changes, for example, when switching channels.

- When enabled, this produces a more consistent audio volume.
- [Delta volume] Levels out volume differences between channels or connected devices. Switch to the connected device before you change the delta volume.



 For [Vol.vis impaired] audio, toggle AD or press ▲▼ to select speaker, headphone or both. Select [Off] to disable Audio Descriptor. (Applies to UK only)

Use advanced teletext features

Access the teletext options menu

Most of the advanced teletext features are accessed via the teletext options menu.

- 1 Press MHEG/TELETEXT.
 - → The teletext screen appears.
- 2 Press © OPTIONS.
 - → The teletext options menu appears.
- 3 Press ▲▼ to select one of the following options.
 - **[Freeze page]** Freezes the current page.
 - [Dual/Full screen] Enables and disables dual screen teletext, which splits the current channel or source to the left of the screen, with teletext on the right.
 - [Reveal] Hides or reveals hidden information on a page, such as solutions to riddles or puzzles.
 - [Cycle subpage] Cycles through subpages automatically if subpages are available.
 - [Language] Switches to a different language group to display a language correctly when that language uses a different character set.
- **4** Press **OK** to confirm your choice.
- 5 Press MHEG/TELETEXT to exit the teletext options menu.

Select teletext subpages

A teletext page can hold several subpages. Subpages are displayed on a bar next to the main page number.

- 1 Press MHEG/TELETEXT.
 - → The teletext screen appears.
- 2 Press ▲▼ to select a teletext page.
- **3** Press **♦** to enter a subpage.

Select T.O.P. teletext broadcasts

Table Of Pages (T.O.P.) teletext broadcasts allow you to jump from one subject to another without using page numbers. T.O.P. teletext is not broadcast on all TV channels.

- 1 Press MHEG/TELETEXT.
 - → The teletext screen appears.
- 2 Press 🛈 INFO.
 - → The T.O.P. overview appears.
- 3 Press ▲▼◀▶ to select a subject.
- 4 Press **OK** to view the page.

Use Teletext 2.5

Teletext 2.5 offers more colours and better graphics than normal teletext. If Teletext 2.5 is broadcast by a channel, it is switched on by default.

- 1 Press **♠** (Home).
- Press ▲▼◀▶ to select [Setup] >
 [Installation] >[Preferences] > [Teletext
 2.5].
- 3 Press ▲▼ to select [On] or [Off].
- **4** Press **OK** to confirm your choice.

Create and use lists of favourite channels

You can create lists of your preferred TV channels and radio stations so that you can find those channels easily.



 You can create and store up to four favourite lists on your TV.

Select a favourite list

- 1 When watching TV, press **OK** to display the channel grid.
- 2 Press © OPTIONS.
 - → The channel options menu appears.
- Press ▲▼ to select [Show fav. ch.] and press OK.
 - → The favourite lists appear.
- 4 Press ▲▼ to select a favourite list and press OK.
 - Only channels in the favourite list appear in the channel grid.



Note

• The favourite channel grid is empty until you add channels into the favourite lists.

View all channels

You can exit a favourite list, and view all installed channels.

- 1 When watching TV, press **OK** to display the channel grid.
- 2 Press © OPTIONS.
 - → The channel options menu appears.
- 3 Press ▲▼ to select [Show fav. ch.] > [All].
- 4 Press OK.
 - → All channels are displayed in the channel grid.

• All favourite channels are marked by an asterisk in the channel grid.

Add a channel to a favourite list

- View all channels before adding a channel to a favourite list.
- 1 When watching TV, press **OK** to display the channel grid.
- Press ▲▼◀▶ to select a channel you want to add to a favourite list.
- 3 Press © OPTIONS.
 - → The channel options menu appears.
- 4 Press ▲▼ to select [Mark as favourite] and press OK.
 - → The favourite lists appear.
- Press ▲▼ to select a favourite list to add the channel to.
- 6 Press OK.
 - → The channel is added to the favourite list.

- When watching TV, save the current channel in a favourite list by pressing © OPTIONS > [Mark as favourite].

Remove a channel from a favourite list

- 1 When watching TV, press **OK** to display the channel grid.
- 2 Press © OPTIONS.
 - → The channel options menu appears.
- 3 Press ▲▼ to select [Show fav. ch.] and press OK.
- Press ▲▼ to select a favourite list and press OK to edit.
 - → The favourite channel grid appears.
- 5 Press ▲▼◀▶ to select a channel that you wish to remove from the list.
- 6 Press © OPTIONS.

- 7 Press ▲▼ to select [Unmark as fav.] and press OK.
 - → The channel is removed from the favourite list.

Use the Electronic Programme Guide

EPG is an on-screen guide available for digital channels. EPG allows you to:

- View a list of digital programmes being broadcast
- View upcoming programmes
- Group programmes by genre
- Set reminders when programmes start
- Set up preferred EPG channels

Switch on EPG

- 1 When watching TV, press @ GUIDE.
 - → The EPG planner screen appears displaying information about the scheduled programmes.



• EPG data is available only in selected countries and can take some time to load.



• Press **© GUIDE** to switch between EPG and channel grid.

Use EPG

- 1 When watching TV, press @ GUIDE.
 - → The EPG planner screen appears.
- 2 Press ♠ (Home).
 - → The programme guide menu appears.
- Press ▲▼◀▶ to select an option, and then press **OK** to confirm it.
- 4 Press \triangle (Home) to exit the EPG menu.



• Only the channels marked with [x] in the [Pref. EPG channel] list, appear in the EPG menu.

Use the EPG options menu

Use the EPG options menu to set or clear reminders, change day and access other useful EPG options.

- 1 Press III GUIDE.
- 2 Press © OPTIONS.
 - → The EPG menu appears.
- 3 Press ▲▼ to select one of the following options.
 - [Set remind]/ [Clear remind]
 - [Change day]
 - [Show info]
 - [Search by genre]
 - [Schedule reminders]
 - [Pref. EPG channel]
- 4 Press **OK** to enter or activate the option.
- 5 Press → BACK to exit the EPG menu.



• Press **(III)** GUIDE to switch between EPG and channel grid.

Watch TV in dual view

You can use the Dual View feature to display the TV channels and the input from a device with VGA or DVI connector (such as a computer or a satellite box) simultaneously on your TV.

- 1 Select VGA or DVI as the source for your TV input.
- 2 Press © OPTIONS.
- 3 Press ▲▼ to select [Dual View ON].
- 4 Press **OK** to activate dual view.

- → The main screen displays the input source from DVI or VGA.
- → The auxiliary screen displays the last viewed channel.
- Press OK or OPTIONS > [Dual View OFF] to exit dual view.



Note

- [Dual View] is available only when the TV is connected to a device, such as a PC, via VGA or DVI connection.
- When in Dual view mode, press

 → +/- to
 adjust volume in the main screen and press P
 +/- or Numeric buttons to switch between
 the TV channels in the auxiliary screen.

Use timers

You can set timers to switch the TV on or switch to standby at a specified time.

Automatically switch the TV to standby (sleeptimer)

Sleeptimer switches the TV to standby after a pre-defined period of time.



Tip

- You can always switch off your TV earlier or reset the sleeptimer during the countdown.
- 1 Press **★** (Home).
- Press ▲▼◀► to select [Setup] > [Features] > [Sleep timer].
 - → The bar appears.

 - [Activate] Selects the frequency to [Off] or [Once] or [Daily].
 - [Time] Sets the starting time to switch on the TV automatically.
 - [Programme no.] Selects the channel.
- 4 Press ♠ (Home) to exit.



• Select [On timer] > [Activate] > [Off] to disable [On timer].

Use TV lock and parental ratings

You can prevent your children from watching certain programmes or certain channels by locking the TV controls and by using ratings.

Set code

- 3 Press OK or ▶ to enter [Set code].
- 4 Enter your code using the **Numeric** buttons.

Use subtitles

You can enable subtitles for each TV channel. Subtitles are broadcast via teletext or DVB-T digital broadcasts. With digital broadcasts, you have the additional option of selecting a preferred subtitle language.



Display a single picture with Scenea

Use a Conditional Access Module

A Conditional Access Module (CAM) is provided by digital TV service operators to decode digital TV channels.



Note


• If required, refer to documentation from your operator on how to insert a smart card into the Conditional Access Module.

Insert and activate a CAM



Caution

- Be sure to follow the instructions described below. Wrong insertion of a CAM may damage both the CAM and your TV.
- **1** Switch off the TV.
- 2 Following the directions printed on the CAM, gently insert the CAM into the COMMON INTERFACE at the side of the TV.



- **3** Push the CAM in as far as it will go.
- 4 Turn on the TV and wait for the CAM to be activated. This may take several minutes. Do not remove the CAM from the slot when in use removing the CAM will deactivate digital services.

Access CAM services

1 After inserting and activating the CAM, press **△** (Home).

Press ▲▼◀▶ to select [Setup] > [Features] > [Common interface].

→ Applications provided by the digital TV service operator appear on the screen.



Note

 This menu option is available only if the CAM is inserted and activated correctly.

Use Philips EasyLink

Your TV supports Philips EasyLink, which uses the HDMI CEC (Consumer Electronics Control) protocol. EasyLink-compliant devices that are connected through HDMI connectors can be controlled by a single remote control.



Note

- The EasyLink-compliant device must be switched on and selected as the source.
- Philips does not guarantee 100% interoperability with all HDMI CEC devices.

EasyLink features

Your TV supports the following Easylink features :

- One-touch play: When you connect your TV to devices that support one-touch play, you can control your TV and the devices with one remote control. For example, when you press 'Play' on your DVD remote control, your TV automatically switches to the correct channel to show the DVD content.
- One-touch standby: When you connect your TV to devices that support standby, you can use your TV remote control to put your TV and all connected HDMI devices in standby mode.
- System audio control (One-touch audio): When you connect your TV to HDMI CEC compliant amplifier (such as, a

Home theatre system or an AV receiver), your TV can switch automatically to play audio from the connected amplifier. To use one-touch audio, you must map the audio input from the connected amplifier to your TV. You can use the remote control of the connected amplifier or your TV to adjust the volume.

- Remote control pass-through (RC key forwarding):RC key forwarding allows you to control EasyLink-compliant devices using your TV remote control.
- Pixel Plus Link: Overrides the settings of connected devices and uses the settings of the TV.

Enable or disable EasyLink



Note

- Do not enable Philips EasyLink if you do not intend to use it.
- 1 Press ♠ (Home).
- Press ▲▼◀▶ to select [Setup] > [Installation] > [Preferences] > [EasyLink].
- 3 Select [On] or [Off].

Use one-touch play

- **1** After enabling EasyLink, press play on your device.
 - → The TV automatically switches to the correct source.

Use one-touch standby

- 1 Press and hold **Standby** on the TV's or device's remote control for at least three seconds.
 - → The TV and all connected HDMI devices switch to standby.

System audio control

When enabled, this feature automatically turns off TV speakers when content from an EasyLink-compliant home theatre system is played. Audio is played only from the amplifier's speakers such as home theatre system's speakers or AV receiver.



Note

- Follow the instructions in the user manual of the connected devices to map the audio input to your TV correctly (see 'Connect an amplifier' on page 36).
- 1 Enable one-touch play and one-touch standby between your Easylink compliant devices by following the instructions in the previous section (see 'Enable or disable EasyLink' on page 35).
- Press ♠ (Home).
- 3 Press ▲▼◀▶ to select [Setup] > [Sound]> [TV speakers] > [Auto EasyLink].
 - → The TV speakers are turned off automatically when content from an Easylink compliant system is detected.
- Press ▲▼◀▶ to select [Setup] > [Sound] > [TV speakers] > [On] to disable system audio control and enable the TV speakers.


• If you select [TV speakers] > [Off], the TV speakers and amplifier's speakers are muted.

Connect an amplifier


An amplifier such as Home theatre System or AV receiver can be used to play audio from an Easylink compliant device connected to your TV.

An amplifier can be connected in the following different ways:

 An amplifier with only one HDMI output.
 Audio can be played by the amplifier from the device or TV.



 Amplifier with one HDMI input and several HDMI outputs. Audio can be played by the amplifier via HDMI connector from your device.





Note

• You must map the audio input from the connected device to your TV in order to use this feature.

Enable or disable remote control pass-through

- 1 Enable one-touch play and one-touch standby between easylink compliant devices by following the instructions in the previous section (see 'Enable or disable EasyLink' on page 35).
- Press ♠ (Home).
- Press ▲▼◀▶ to select a device with HDMI connector from your home menu.
- 4 Press © OPTIONS.
- Press ▲▼ to select [Enable RC pass-through] and press OK.
 - → RC pass-through is enabled on the selected device with HDMI connector.
- 6 Repeat the steps 1 to 5 to disable remote control pass-through.

 Easylink compliant device must be connected to the TV via HDMI connector.


Access menu after enabling RC passthrough

- 1 Enable remote control pass-through by following the instructions in the previous section (see 'Enable or disable remote control pass-through' on page 37).
- Press ▲▼◀▶ to select a device that has been enabled to support RC pass-through and press OK to enter.
- Press OPTIONS to access one of the following menus for TV or the active device connected to the TV:
 - **[TV setup]**Accesses menus that allow you to change picture, sound and other TV settings.
 - [Clock] Displays the clock on the TV screen.

- **[TV speakers]**Turns TV speakers on or off. Setting TV speakers to automatic mode turns off the speakers when content from an EasyLink-compliant home theatre system is detected.
- [Dev. root menu] Accesses the root menu of the CD/DVD/game disc.
- [Device setup menu] Accesses the main menu of the connected device such as DVD player, HDD recorder, or game console.
- [Dev. content menu]Accesses the content menu of the CD/DVD/game disc.
- 4 Press **OK** to enter or activate your selection.

Use a Kensington lock

There is a Kensington security slot at the back of the TV. Prevent theft by looping a Kensington lock between the slot and a permanent object, such as a heavy table.

9 Troubleshooting

This section describes commonly encountered issues and accompanying solutions.

General TV issues

The TV does not switch on:

- Disconnect the power cable from the power outlet. Wait for one minute then reconnect it.
- Check that the power cable is securely connected.

The remote control is not working properly:

- Check that the remote control batteries are correctly inserted according to the +/- orientation.
- Replace the remote control batteries if they are flat or weak.
- Clean the remote control and TV sensor lens.

The standby light on the TV blinks red:

 Disconnect the power cable from the power outlet. Wait until the TV cools down before reconnecting the power cable. If the blinking reoccurs, contact Philips Consumer Care.

You forgot the code to unlock the TV lock feature

Enter '8888'.

The TV menu is in the wrong language.

 Change the TV menu to your preferred language.

When turning the TV on/off/to standby, you hear a creaking sound from the TV chassis:

 No action is required. The creaking sound is normal expansion and contraction of the TV as it cools down and warms up. This does not impact performance.

TV channel issues

Previously installed channels do not appear in the channel list:

• Check that the correct channel list is selected.

No digital channels were found during the installation:

 Check that the TV supports DVB-T or DVB-C in your country. See the listed countries on the back of the TV.

Picture issues

The TV is on, but there is no picture:

- Check that the antenna is properly connected to the TV.
- Check that the correct device is selected as the TV source.

There is sound but no picture:

• Check that the picture settings are correctly set.

There is poor TV reception from an antenna connection:

- Check that the antenna is properly connected to the TV.
- Loudspeakers, unearthed audio devices, neon lights, high buildings and other large objects can influence reception quality.
 If possible, try to improve the reception quality by changing the antenna direction or moving devices away from the TV.
- If reception on only one channel is poor, fine tune this channel.

There is poor picture quality from connected devices:

- Check that the devices are connected properly.
- Check that the picture settings are correctly set.

The TV did not save your picture settings:

• Check that the TV location is set to the home setting. This mode offers you the flexibility to change and save settings.

The picture does not fit the screen; it is too big or too small:

• Try using a different picture format.

The picture position is incorrect:

• Picture signals from some devices may not fit the screen correctly. Check the signal output of the device.

Sound issues

There is a picture but sound quality is poor:



Note

- If no audio signal is detected, the TV automatically switches the audio output off — this does not indicate malfunction.
- Check that all cables are properly connected.
- Check that the volume is not set to 0.
- Check that the sound is not muted.

There is a picture but the sound quality is poor:

 Check that the sound settings are correctly set.

There is a picture but sound comes from one speaker only:

Verify that sound balance is set to the centre.

HDMI connection issues

There are problems with HDMI devices:

- Note that HDCP support can delay the time taken for a TV to display content from a HDMI device.
- If the TV does not recognize the HDMI device and no picture is displayed, try switching the source from one device to another and back again.
- If there are intermittent sound disruptions, check that output settings from the HDMI device are correct.

 If a HDMI-to-DVI adaptor or HDMI to DVI cable is used, check that an additional audio cable is connected to AUDIO L/R or AUDIO IN (mini-jack only).

Computer connection issues

The computer display on the TV is not stable:

- Check that a supported resolution and refresh rate is selected on the computer.
- Set the TV picture format to unscaled.

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

Television in the UK is going digital, bringing us all more choice and new services. Starting in late 2007 and ending in 2012, television services in the UK will go completely digital, TV region by TV region.

Please see the next page to find out when your area switches to digital.

Digital UK is the independent, non-profit organisation leading the process of digital TV switchover in the UK. Digital UK provides impartial information on what people need to do to prepare for the move to digital, and when they need to do it.

How the switchover affects your TV equipment:

Your new TV has a digital tuner built in, which means it is ready to receive the Freeview signal by simply plugging it into your aerial socket (check if you can get digital TV through your aerial now, or whether you'll have to wait until switchover, at www.digitaluk.co.uk).

When the TV switchover happens in your area, there are at least two occasions when you will need to re-tune your TV in order to continue receiving your existing TV channels, and also to pick up new ones.

get set for digital 🚺

Digital UK, the body leading the digital TV switchover, will advise you when you need to re-tune during the switchover.

If you choose to connect your TV to satellite or cable with a digital box then it will not be affected by switchover, and you won't need to re-tune.

How to re-tune:

To find out how to re-tune your TV, check this user manual for details.

Go to section 6 Install channels.

If you do not re-tune your channels when advised to do so by Digital UK, you may lose some or all of your channels until you do re-tune. You should re-tune your TV every few months to check for any new channels.

If you are missing any channels, it may be that they are not available in your area, or that your aerial needs upgrading.
