
Read this user manual before you start to use this product.

Pay close attention to this section and follow the safety and screen care instructions. The product warranty does not apply if damage is caused by failing to follow these instructions. The model and serial number of your TV can be found on the back of the TV as well as on the packaging.

Safety

- Two people are required to lift and carry a TV that weighs more than 25 kilos (55lb).
 Improper handling of the TV can result in serious injury.
- If transporting the TV in low temperatures (less than 5°C), open the box and wait until the TV matches the ambient temperature of the room before unpacking.
- To avoid short circuit, do not expose the TV, remote control or remote control batteries to rain or water.
- To avoid risk of fire or electric shock, do not place the TV, remote control or remote control batteries near naked flame sources (e.g. lighted candles) and other heat sources including direct sunlight.
- Do not place vessels filled with water on top of or near to the TV. Spilling water into the TV can result in electric shock. If you spill water into the TV, do not operate the TV. Immediately disconnect the TV from the power and have the TV checked by a qualified technician.
- Do not install the TV in a confined space such as a bookcase. Leave a space of at least 10cm (four inches) around the TV for ventilation. Be sure air flow is not obstructed.

- If placing the TV on a flat, solid surface be sure to use only the supplied stand. Do not move the TV if the stand is not properly screwed to the TV.
- Wall mounting of the TV should only be performed by qualified personnel. The TV must only be mounted on an appropriate wall bracket and on a wall that can safely hold the weight of the TV. Improper wall mounting can result in severe injury or damage. Do not attempt to wall mount the TV yourself.
- If the TV is mounted on a swivel base or swivel arm, ensure no strain is placed on the power cord when the TV is swivelled. Strain on the power cord can loosen connections and cause arcing or fire.
- Disconnect the TV from the mains and antenna before lightning storms. During lightning storms do not touch any part of the TV, mains cord or antenna cable.
- Be sure that you have full access to the mains cord for easy disconnection of the TV from the mains.
- When disconnecting the TV from the mains, be sure to:
- Turn off the TV, then the mains power (if available).
- 2 Unplug the mains cord from the mains socket outlet.
- **3** Unplug the mains cord from the power connector at the back of the TV. Always pull the mains cord by the plug. Do not pull the mains cord.



 Permanent hearing loss can occur if you use earphones or headphones at high volumes. Though high volume may sound








normal over time, it can damage your hearing. To protect your hearing, limit the amount of time you use earphones or headphones at high volume.

Screen care

- To avoid deformations or colour fading, wipe off water droplets as soon as possible.
- Do not touch, push, rub or strike the screen with hard objects as this may damage the screen permanently.







Position the TV



Warning


- Do not insert the power plug into the wall socket before all the connections are made.
- Large screen TVs are heavy. Two people are required to carry and handle a large screen TV.
- Before you move the TV, disconnect the cables to prevent breakage.

In addition to reading and understanding the safety instructions (see 'Safety' on page 5), consider the following before positioning your TV:

- Ensure that you always have easy access to the power cord or plug to disconnect the TV from the power.
- If the TV is mounted on a swivel base, ensure that no strain is placed on the power cord when the TV is swiveled.
 Strain on the power cord can loosen connections.
- The ideal viewing distance for watching TV is three times its screen size.
- Position the TV where light does not fall on the screen.
- Connect your devices before you position the TV.

Use a Kensington lock

There is a Kensington security slot at the back of the TV. If you connect a Kensington lock (not supplied), position the TV near a heavy or immovable object that you can attach the cable to.



Wall mount the TV



Warning

The minimum bolt length is 10mm. If you use a spacer, the bolt length should be the spacer length plus 10mm. For example, if you use a 40mm spacer, the bolt length should be 50mm (40mm + 10mm).


Connect the antenna cable

Connect the antenna cable to the TV antenna socket (75Ω) at the back of the TV.










To connect the power cord



Warning

- Verify that your mains voltage corresponds with the voltage printed at the back of the TV. Do not insert the mains cord if the voltage is different.
- 1 Locate the power connector at the back of the TV.
 - The location of the power connector varies according to TV model.
- Insert the power cord fully into the power connector.
- 3 Connect the power cord plug to the power outlet. Ensure that the cord is tightly secured at both ends.



To disconnect the TV from the power

Disconnect the TV from the power in one of the following ways:

- Unplug the power cord from the power connector at the back of the TV.
- Unplug the power cord from the power socket outlet.

Pull the power cord by the plug; do not pull on the power cord.

Insert the remote control batteries

- 1 Slide the battery cover off the back of the remote control.
- 2 Insert the 2 supplied batteries (AAA). Be sure the + and ends of the batteries line up with the markings inside the case.
- 3 Slide the cover back into position.








5 Use your TV

This section helps you perform basic TV operations.

Switch your TV on/off or to standby



To switch on

- If the standby indicator (2) is off, press \circ POWER (1) at the side of the TV.
- If the standby indicator (2) is red, press \circ on the remote control.

To switch to standby

- Press O on the remote control.
 - → The standby indicator (2) switches to red.

To switch off

Press OPOWER (1) at the side of the TV.

Switch channels





- Press CH + / or key in the number on the remote control.
- Press CHANNEL + / on the side of the TV

Adjust volume

To increase or decrease volume

 Press VOL + / - on the remote control or press VOLUME + / - on the side of the TV.

To mute or unmute sound

- Press **K** again to restore the sound.

To adjust headphone volume

 Press VOL + / - on the remote control or press VOLUME + / - on the side of the TV.
 When headphones are plugged into the TV, the loud speakers are automatically muted.

Adjust picture and sound settings

This section describes how to adjust picture and sound settings.

Adjust picture settings

- 1 Press MENU/BACK and select [Picture].
- 2 Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight [Picture].
- 4 Press ◀ or ▶ to adjust the settings.



5 Press MENU/BACK to return to the previous menu, or press STATUS/EXIT to exit

The following smart picture settings can be configured. Depending on the format of the picture source, some picture settings are not available.

- [Brightness]: Adjusts the intensity and details of dark areas.
- [Contrast]: Adjusts the intensity of bright areas, keeping dark areas unchanged.
- **[Tint]**: Adjusts the color balance in an image.
- [Color]: Adjusts color saturation.
- [Sharpness]: Adjusts the level of sharpness in image details.

- [Color Temp.]: Makes colors more vivid and improve the resolution of details in bright colors. You can switch this feature on or off.
- [Noise Reduction]: Filters and reduces noise in an image.

Use smart picture settings

You can use smart picture instead of the manual picture adjustments to set your TV to a predefined setting.

The settings are pre-defined to suit different viewing environments.

- 1 Press MENU/BACK and select [Picture].
- 2 Press OK.
- Press ▼ to highlight [Smart Pic] and press ◀ or ▶ to select a setting.
- 4 Press MENU/BACK to return to the previous menu, or press STATUS/EXIT to exit.



Press

SMART PIC on the remote control repeatedly to toggle the available settings.



- Press ▲ or ▼ to select an item and press ◀ or ▶ to adjust the setting.



4 Press MENU/BACK to return to the previous menu, or press STATUS/EXIT to exit.

Summary of sound settings

- [Smart Sound]: Pre-defined sound settings to suit your listening environment.
- [Treble]: Adjusts the high frequency sound levels.

- [Bass]: Adjusts the low frequency sound levels
- [Balance]: Adjusts the balance of the right and left speakers to best suit your listening position.
- [AVL]: Reduces sudden changes in volume, for example, during commecials or when switching channels. Set on or off.
- [MTS]: Multi-channel TV sound. Select mono, stereo or a Secondary Audio Program (SAP).

Use Back Light

Adjust the brightness of the TV backlight to suit your surrounding ambient lighting.



Use Contrast +

Optimizes the contrast settings for overall picture quality.

- 1 Press MENU/BACK and select [Features] > [Contrast +].
- Press ◀ or ▶ to turn on [Contrast +].



3 Press MENU/BACK to return to the previous menu, or press STATUS/EXIT to exit.

Use timers

This section describes how to set the clock and switch the TV on or off at a specified time.

Automatically switch the TV to standby (Sleeptimer)

Sleeptimer switches the TV to standby after a delay. You can always switch off your TV earlier or reset the sleeptimer during the countdown.

Toggle SLEEP on the remote control to cycle through the sleep timer settings: off, 15, 30, 45, 60, 90, 120, 180 and 240 minutes.



 Press SLEEP once to view the remaining time before the TV switches to standby. Press SLEEP repeatedly to change the setting or to turn off sleep timer:

Set the clock

- 1 Press MENU/BACK and select [Features] > [Timer].
- 2 Press OK.
- 3 Press ▼ to highlight [Current Time] and press ◀ or ▶ to select the hours or minutes.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to adjust the hours or minutes.



Press MENU/BACK to return to the previous menu, or press STATUS/EXIT to exit.









Activate the timer

- Press MENU/BACK and select [Features] > [Timer].
- Press OK.
- Press ▼ and select [Activate] > [On].



Set the TV timer

- Press MENU/BACK and select [Features] > [Timer].
- Press **OK**.
- Press ▼ to highlight [Start Time].
- Press ▶ to select the hour field, then press ▲ or ▼ to adjust the hours.
- Press ▶ to select the minute field, then press ▲ or ▼ to adjust the minutes.
- Press ▼ to highlight [Stop Time].
- Press ▶ to select the hour field, then press
 - ▲ or ▼ to adjust the hours.
- 8 Press ▶ to select the minute field, then press ▲ or ▼ to adjust the minutes.
- Press to highlight [Source].
- **10** Press **◄** or **▶** to select the source.

or ▶ to select the number.

11 If you select the TV source, set the channel for the TV to switch to from standby. Press ▼ to highlight [Channel No.], then press ◀



12 Press MENU/BACK to return to the previous menu, or press STATUS/EXIT to exit.

Check timer status

Check the status of the timers that you set for current time, sleep timer and TV timer.

Press **TIMER** on the remote control.

→ The TV timer status is displayed.



You can change the timer settings from this screen.

Press TIMER again to exit the timer display.



Create and use your favorite list

- 1 Press MENU/BACK and select [Install] > [Fav. Channel].
- 2 Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the favorite channel number:
- 4 Use the number keys to key in the channel number:
 - → The channel number is displayed beside the favorite list number. Enter up to six favorite channels in the list.



- Press MENU/BACK to return to the previous menu, or press STATUS/EXIT to exit.
- 6 Press SURF repeatedly to cycle through the favorite channels.

View closed captions (subtitles)

The caption service displays transmitted closed caption text. The captioned text can be displayed permanently or only when the TV is muted.



- This television provides a display of television closed captioning that conforms with the EIA-608 standard and in accordance with Sections 15.119 of the FCCrules.
- If you connect your set-top box via HDMI or component video input, you cannot select closed caption through the TV.You can select closed caption through the set-top box only.
- The captions do not always use correct spelling and grammar.
- Not all TV programs and product commercials include closed caption information. Refer to your area TV program listings for the TV channels and times of closed caption shows. The captioned programs are usually noted in the TV listings with service marks such as 'CC'.

Turn on Closed Caption

- 1 Press MENU/BACK and select [Features] > [Closed Caption].
- 2 Press OK.
- 3 Press ◀ or ▶ to turn on [CC Setting].



- 4 Press ▼ to highlight [CC Mode] and press ◀ or ▶ to select a setting.

Use child control and rating locks

Change your password


Follow these steps to set your PIN or to reset your PIN if you have forgotten it.

- 1 Press MENU/BACK and select [Features] > [Parental Control].
- 2 Press OK.
 - → You are prompted to enter a password.
- 3 Enter your 4-digit PIN on the number keys of the remote control.
 - If you have never set your PIN before, enter 0000.
 - If you have set your PIN but have forgotten it, enter 0711.
 The [Parental Control] menu is displayed.
- 4 Select [Change Password] and press OK.
- 5 Enter a new PIN, and then enter the PIN again to confirm.
- 6 Press MENU/BACK to return to the previous menu, or press STATUS/EXIT to exit.

Turn on parental control

- 1 Press MENU/BACK and select [Features] > [Parental Control].
- 2 Press OK.
 - You are prompted to enter your password.
- 3 Enter your PIN on remote control.
 - If you have never set a PIN before, enter **0000**.
 - If you have forgotten your PIN, reset it (see 'Change your password' on page 19).

Use TV ratings lock

Your TV is equipped with a V-chip that allows you to control access to individual programs based on their age rating and content rating. The program content advisory data are from the broadcaster or by the program provider. If you receive channels through a set-top box or cable box connected by HDMI, you cannot use the TV ratings lock. Your set-top box or cable box must be connected through RF or AV connectors.





- 4 Press ▼ to highlight a rating and press ▼ or ▶ to change the setting to [View] or [Block].



When you block a movie rating, all items for ages below that movie rating are automatically blocked.

Press MENU/BACK to return to the previous menu, or press STATUS/EXIT to exit.



Rating	Description
All	All items in the ratings list are locked.
NR	Not rated.
G	Movies with a mild content, suitable for all ages.
PG	Movies for which parental guidance is recommended. They may contain a few racy or violent scenes or maybe some bad language.



- Press MENU/BACK to return to the previous menu, or press STATUS/EXIT to exit.

You can configure the following display settings for PC mode:

- [Auto Adjust]: Synchronizes the phase and clock on the TV and PC.
- [Horizontal Shift] and [Vertical Shift]:
 Adjusts the horizontal and vertical position
 of the picture.
- [Clock] and [Phase]: Fine-tunes the TV to match the display settings of the PC.









8 Use your TV in HDTV mode

Not all models can be configured in high definition (HD) mode. For information about your set, see the specification.

When you connect an HD device to your TV, configure the display format of your TV. You might also have to configure the display format of your HD device. For information about configuring your device, see the documentation of the device.

Configure your TV in HD mode

- 1 Connect your HD device to the TV. Refer to the Quick Start.
- Press SOURCE and select HDMI or YPBPR, then press OK.
- Press MENU/BACK and select [Features] > [Mode Selection].
- 4 Press OK.
- 5 Press ◀ or ▶ to select a mode.



6 Press MENU/BACK to return to the previous menu, or press STATUS/EXIT to exit.

9 Install channels

The first time you setup your TV, you are prompted to select a menu language and to install TV and digital radio channels (if available). This chapter provides instructions on how to reinstall and fine-tune channels.

Select your language

1 Press MENU/BACK and select [Install] > [Language].



- Press ◀ or ▶ to select a language, then press OK.
- ③ Press MENU/BACK to return to the previous menu, or press STATUS/EXIT to exit.


Automatically install channels

This section describes how to search and store channels automatically. Instructions are for both digital and analogue channels.

- 1 Press MENU/BACK and select [Install] > [Ch. Setup] > [Tuner Mode].
- Press

 or

 and select [Antenna] or
 [Cable].



- 3 Press ▼ and select [System].
- 4 Press ◀ or ▶ and select [AUTO], [PAL M], [PAL N] or [NTSC].



- Press ▼ to highlight [Auto Program] and press OK.
 - The TV detects the [Antenna] or [Cable] signal that you have selected and search for all the available channels.
 - When the search completes, the TV switches to the first channel found.
- 6 Press MENU/BACK to return to the previous menu, or press STATUS/EXIT to exit.

Fine tune channels

You can manually fine tune channels when the reception is poor.


1 Press CH + / - or use the number keys to select the channel to fine tune.







- 2 Press MENU/BACK and select [Install] > [Ch. Setup] > [Fine Tune].
- 3 Press ◀ or ▶ to adjust the frequency setting.



4 Press MENU/BACK to return to the previous menu, or press STATUS/EXIT to exit.

Exclude channels from a list

You can exclude a channel from your list of channels. Excluded channels are not accessed when you press CH + / - on the remote control or CHANNEL + / - on the side of the TV. Excluded channels can be accessed, however, by pressing the number keys on the remote control. It can be useful to exclude channels with weak signals.

- 1 Press MENU/BACK and select [Install] > [List].
- 2 Press OK.
- Press ◀ or ▶ to select a channel number.
- 4 Press ▼ to highlight [In List], and press ◀ or ▶ to select [Off].



Press MENU/BACK to return to the previous menu, or press STATUS/EXIT to exit.









10 Troubleshooting

This section describes commonly-encountered issues and accompanying solutions.

Some problems you encounter with your TV can be corrected by consulting the following list:

No picture, no sound

- 1 Check if the fuse or circuit breaker works.
- Plug another electrical device into the outlet to make sure it works or is turned on.
- 3 Power plug is in a bad contact with the outlet.
- 4 Check the signal source.

No color

- 1 Change the color system.
- 2 Adjust the saturation.
- 3 Try another program. Black-white program may be received.

Remote control does not work

- 1 Change the batteries.
- 2 Batteries are not installed correctly.
- 3 Main power is not connected.

No picture, normal sound

- 1 Adjust the brightness and contrast.
- 2 Broadcasting failure may happen.

Normal picture, no sound

- Press the VOLUME + button to increase volume.
- Volume is set to mute, press MUTE to restore sound.
- **3** Change the sound system.
- 4 Broadcasting failure may happen.

Ripples on the picture

Usually caused by local interference such as cars, daylight lamps and hair driers. Adjust the antenna to minimize the interference.

Blank screen in VGA(PC) mode

Perhaps the TV can not recognize the resolution set by the PC. Change to the best resolution or other standard resolutions of the PC system.

Check the connections.

Set the PC refresh rate to 60Hz.

Snowy dots and interference

If the antenna is located in the fringe area of a television signal where the signal is weak, the picture may appear snowy. When the signal is weak, it may be necessary to install a special antenna to improve the reception.

- Adjust the position and orientation of the indoor/outdoor antenna.
- Check the connection of antenna.
- Fine tune the program.
- Try another program. Broadcasting failure may happen.

Ghost

"Ghosting" occurs when the television signal follows two paths. One is the direct path, the other is reflected from tall buildings, hills, or other objects. Changing the direction or position of the antenna may improve the reception.

Radio frequency interference

This interference produces moving ripples or diagonal streaks, and in some case, loss of contrast in the picture. Find out and remove the radio interference source.
