Safety

Risk of electric shock or fire!

- Never expose the TV to rain or water. Never place liquid containers, such as vases, near the TV. If liquids are spilt on or into the TV, disconnect the TV from the power outlet immediately. Contact Philips Consumer Care to have the TV checked before use
- Never place the TV, remote control or batteries near naked flames or other heat sources, including direct sunlight. To prevent the spread of fire, keep candles or other flames away from the TV, remote control and batteries at all times.



- Never insert objects into the ventilation slots or other openings on the TV.
- When the TV is swiveled, ensure that no strain is exerted on the power cord.

Strain on the power cord can loosen connections and cause arcing.

Risk of short circuit or fire!

- Never expose the remote control or batteries to rain, water or excessive heat
- Avoid force coming onto power plugs.

 - [Watch DTV]: When other source is selected, choose this setting to switch to digital TV channels.
 - [Watch ATV]: When other source is select, choose this setting to switch to analog TV channels.
 - [Scan USB]: You can view photos or play music and videos on TV from a USB storage device.
 - [Source]: Opens the source menu.
 - [Setup]: Changes picture, sound and other settings.

Change language

You can select to change the menu language.

Change menu language

- 1 Press Setup
- 2 Select [Option] > [OSD language]; then press ► to enter.
- 3 Select your desired language.

Change picture and sound settings

Change picture and sound settings to suit your preferences. You can apply pre-defined settings or change settings manually.

Use smart picture

Use smart picture to apply pre-defined picture settings.

- 1 Press Setup; select [Picture] > [Smart picture].
- 2 Select one of the following settings, and then press **OK**:
- [Vivid]: Enhances picture contrast and sharpness.
- [Standard]: Adjusts picture settings to suit most environments and types of video.
- **[Soft]:** Adjusts picture softness.
- **[Personal]:** Users can customize the settings here.

Manually adjust picture settings

- 1 Press Setup.
- 2 Select [Picture]; then press ▶ to enter.
- 3 After selecting [Picture], select one of the following settings, and then press ► to enter:
 - [Smart picture]: Accesses pre-defined settings.
 - [Contrast]: Adjusts backlight; increases backlight intensity difference between bright and dark areas (0~100).
 - [Brightness]: Adjusts the intensity

- and details of darker areas $(0\sim100)$.
- [Saturation]: Adjusts color saturation (0~100).
- [Sharpness]: Adjusts sharpness in the image (0~100).
- [Picture Format]: Adjusts display scale of picture.
- [Color Temperature]: Adjusts overall color temperature of picture.
- [Noise Reduction]: Filters and reduces noise from the image signals.

Change picture format

- Press the button for instant access to picture format (FORMAT).
- Press ▲ ▼ to select a picture; then press OK.

Summary of picture formats

[Wide screen]: Adjusts the classic standard format to widescreen.



[4:3]: Shows the classic 4:3 format.



[Movie 16:9]: Scales the picture format to 16:9.



[Subtitle zoom]: Displays 4:3 pictures over the full area of the screen, with subtitles visible. Part of the top of the picture is clipped off.

Use smart sound

Use smart sound to apply pre-defined sound settings.

- 1 Press Setup; select [Sound] > [Smart sound].
- 2 Select one of the following settings, and then press **OK**.
 - **[Standard]:** Applies to settings for most environments and types.
 - [Music]: Applies to sound settings for music.
 - [Movie]: Applies to sound settings for movies.
 - [Personal]: Uses the settings that were customized in the sound menu.

Manually adjust sound settings

- [Auto Volume Levelling]: Reduces abrupt volume change when switching channels.
- [Virtual surround]: Turns on or off virtual surround sound.

Change other settings

- 2 After selecting [Option], select one of the following settings, and then press ► to enter
 - [OSD language]: Changes the menu language.
 - **[OSD duration]:** Sets the display period of system menu: 15/30/45/60 sec.
 - [OSD transparency]: Changes the level of transparency for menu display (0~100).
 - [Blue screen]: Enables or disables blue screen display.
 - [Sleep timer]: Sets the sleep time (0~180 min).
 - [Eco]: Enables or disables Smart Eco.
 - [Backlight]: Sets the level of backlight (0~100).
 (The functions of Smart Eco and Backlight are subject to the actual model)

 [Reset all]: Restores picture and sound settings to factory default.

Use timers

You can set timers to switch the TV to standby at a specified time.

Automatically switch the TV to standby (sleep timer)

Sleep timer switches the TV to standby after a pre-defined period of time.



Tip

- You can switch off your TV earlier or reset the sleep timer during the countdown.
- 1 Press Setup.
- 2 Select [Option] > [Sleep timer].
 - → The sleep timer appears.
- 3 Select a preset time from 0-180 min.
 - The sleep timer can be set in steps of ten minutes. If set to 0, the sleep timer is switched off.

Use TV locks

You can prevent your children from watching certain programme or channels by locking the TV controls

Set or change your code

- 1 Press Setup.
- 2 Select [Child lock] > [Change code].
- 3 Enter your code using the **Numeric** buttons.

Follow the on-screen instructions to set or change your code.



Tip

- If you forget your code, enter 3448 in [Change code] to override any existing codes.
- When [Change code] is used to set a new code, this code may be needed for some settings.

Lock or unlock one or more channels

- 1 Press Setup.
- Select [Child lock] > [channel Lock]; then enter your code.
 - → The channel list appears.
- 3 Select a channel to be locked or unlocked, and press the color button (green).
 - → If you access a locked channel for the first time, you will be prompted to enter your code.



Note

 The function of Child lock is available only in TV mode.

DTV programme guide

The programme guide is available on digital TV

- Press the Electronic Programme Guide (EPG) button to open the programme guide list.
- Press ▲ ▼ to select time and channels.
 Press corresponding color buttons to view information/ scheduled list/ scheduled programme.



Note

- Programme information is provided by Broadcasting Company; the programme entry may be empty or cannot show date. When new information is available, the on-screen display will be updated automatically.
- The start time of a scheduled programme must be later than the current time; or else, the schedule is invalid.

Edit channels

- 1 Press Setup.
 - Select [Channel] > [Channel edit].
- 3 Press ▲ ▼ to select channels; press color buttons to delete/move/FAV/skip channels.



9 Troubleshooting

This section introduces the common problems and their corresponding solutions.

General

The TV does not switch on:

- Disconnect the power cord from the power outlet. Wait for one minute, and then reconnect it.
- Check that the power cord is securely connected.

The remote control works abnormally:

- Check that the remote control batteries are properly installed with +/- terminals in right positions.
- Replace the remote control batteries in case of battery exhaustion or leakage.
- Clean the remote control and the TV sensor lens.

The standby light on the TV blinks:

 Disconnect the power cord from the power outlet. Wait until the TV cools down before reconnecting the power cord. If the blinking reoccurs, contact Philips Consumer Care.

You forgot the code to unlock the child lock feature:

 Select [Child lock] > [Change code]; enter3448 to override any existing code.

The TV menu is in the wrong language:

• Change the TV menu to your preferred language.

When turning the TV on/off/to standby,

you hear a creaking sound from the TV chassis:

 No action is required. The creaking sound is normal expansion and contraction of the TV as it cools and warms up. This does not impact its performance.

Picture

The TV is on, but there is no picture:

- Check that the antenna is properly connected to the TV.
- Check that the correct device is selected as the TV source.

There is sound but no picture:

 Check that the picture settings are correct.

There is poorTV reception from an antenna connection:

- Check that the antenna is properly connected to the TV.
- Loud speakers, unearthed audio devices, neon lights, high buildings and other large objects can influence reception quality. If possible, try to improve the reception quality by changing the antenna direction or moving devices away from the TV.
- If reception on only one channel is poor, fine tune this channel.

There is poor picture quality from connected devices:

- Check that the devices are connected properly.
- Check that the picture settings are correct.

The TV did not save your picture settings:

 Check that the TV location is set to the home setting. This mode offers you the flexibility to change and save settings.

The picture does not fit the screen; it is too big or too small:

- Try using a different picture format. The picture position is incorrect:
- Picture signals from some devices may not fit the screen correctly. Check the signal output of the device.

Sound

There is picture but sound quality is poor:



Note

If no audio signal is detected, the TV automatically switches the audio output off this does not indicate malfunction.

- Check that all cables are properly connected.
- Check that the volume is not set to 0.
- Check that the sound is not muted.

There is picture but sound quality is poor:

 Check that the sound settings are correct.

There is picture but sound comes from one speaker only:

 Verify that sound balance is set to the centre.

HDMI connection

There are problems with HDMI devices:

 Note that HDCP (High-bandwidth Digital Content Protection) support can delay the time taken for a TV to display content from a HDMI device.

- If the TV does not recognize the HDMI device and no picture is displayed, try switching the source from one device to another and back again.
- If there are intermittent sound disruptions, check that output settings from the HDMI device are correct.
- If you use an HDMI-to-DVI adapter or HDMI to DVI cable, check that an additional audio cable is connected to AUDIO (mini-jack only).

Computer connection

The computer display on the TV is not stable:

- Check that your PC uses the supported resolution and refresh rate.
- Set the TV picture format to unscaled.
