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## 1 Important

Read this user manual before you start to use this product.

Pay attention to this section and closely follow the instructions. The warranty does not apply to damage caused by not taking into account the instructions.

## 1.1 Safety

- To avoid short circuit, do not expose the product to rain or water.
- To avoid a risk of fire or electric shock do not place naked flame sources (e.g. lighted candles) close to the TV.
- Leave a space of at least 10cm (4 inches) all around the TV for ventilation.
- Keep away from radiators or other heat sources.
- Do not install the TV in a confined space such as a book case. Make sure that curtains, cupboards and so on cannot obstruct the air flow through the ventilation slots.
- To prevent damage, do not insert any object into the ventilation slots.
- Make sure the TV cannot fall down. Place the TV on a solid and flat surface and only use the stand provided with the TV.
- To prevent damaging the mains cord, do not place the TV, or anything else, on the cord. Damage the cord may cause a fire or electric shock.
- When mounted on a swivel stand or VESA wall bracket avoid force coming on the mains plugs. Mains plugs that are partly loosened can cause arcing or fire.

## 3.1 Position the TV

Carefully read the safety precautions in section 1.1 Safety before you position the TV.

- Large screen TVs are heavy. Carry and handle the TV with at least two persons.
- The ideal distance from which to watch TV is three times its diagonal screen size.
- Position the TV where light does not fall directly on the screen.
- Your TV is equipped with a Kensington Security Slot at the back of the TV for an anti-theft lock (not supplied).

## 3.2 Wall mounting - VESA

### () Warning

#### Step 1 Purchase a VESA-compatible wall bracket

Depending on the size of your TV screen, purchase one of the following wall brackets:

#### Step 2 Remove the TV stand

#### Note

These instructions are only applicable to TV models with mounted stands. If your TV stand is not mounted, skip to **Step 3 Secure the VESA-compatible wall bracket to the TV**.

Carefully place the TV face down on a flat, stable surface that is covered by soft cloth. The cloth should be thick enough to protect your screen.



2 Using a cross-head screwdriver (not supplied), unscrew the four bolts that secure the stand to the TV.



**3** Firmly pull the stand from the bottom of the TV. Place both the stand and bolts in a secure location for future reinstallation.



## Step 3 Secure the VESA-compatible wall bracket to the TV

Locate the four mounting nuts at the back of the TV.



2 Continue with the instructions provided with your VESA-compatible wall bracket.

When securing the VESA-compatible wall bracket to your TV, use M6 bolts for 32 inch models or M8 bolts for larger models (bolts not supplied).

## 3.3 Remote control batteries

#### Balance

Sets the balance of the left and right loudspeakers to fit best your listening position.

- 2 Press the red key to show all favourite lists.
- **3** Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  to select a list.

4 Press OK.

- Press the green key to enter the Edit mode. The selected list brings up a full channel list.
- 6 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight a channel.
- Press OK to mark (or unmark) the highlighted channel. The channel is added to (or removed from) the selected list.
- 8 Press the green key again to leave the Edit mode.

The modified channel list appears again.

## **5.5.3** Select a channel from a favourite list Press OK.

The last selected channel list appears.

- **2** Use  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\checkmark$  to highlight a channel.
- Press OK.

The TV tunes to that channel.

#### 🗘 Tip

- Use -P+ to go through the TV channels of the selected favourite list.
- With the number keys you can still select channels which are not marked as favourite.



### 5.6 Electronic Programme Guide - EPG -

The Electronic Programme guide is an on screen guide to scheduled digital TV programmes. You can navigate, select and view programmes by time, title or genre. There are two types of EPG, 'Now and Next' and '7 or 8 day' EPG.

When digital channels are installed and broadcasted, EPG is available. **'Now and Next'** is always available but the **'7 or 8 day'** EPG is only available in some countries.

With the EPG menu you can...

- see a list of current broadcasted programmes
- see the next programme
- group programmes by genre
- set reminders when programmes will start
- set up preferred EPG channels
- etc.

#### 5.6.1 Switch on EPG

**1** Press **D**. The following type of EPG appears:



#### 'Now and Next' EPG

Detailed information about the current programme is shown.

#### '7 or 8 day' EPG

It may take some time to receive the EPG data. The list of TV programmes will show.

- **Info**: to display information on a selected programme (if available).
- **3** Press 🛄 to quit the EPG.

#### 5.7 Timers and locks

This section describes how to switch the TV on or off at a specified time and to lock or unlock the TV.

#### 5.7.1 Automatically switch to standby

Sleeptimer switches the TV to standby after a time.

- Press Menu on the remote control and select Features > **Sleeptimer** and press ► to enter the sleeptimer bar.
- 2 Press ▲ or ▼ to set the time up to 180 minutes in steps of 5 minutes. If set to 0 minutes, the Sleeptimer is switched off.

You can always switch off your TV earlier or reset the time during countdown.

#### Automatically switch the TV on 5.7.2

On timer switches the TV on automatically to a specified channel at a specified time, from standby.

- Press Menu on the remote control and select Features > On timer and press ► to enter the On timer menu.
- **2** Use  $\triangleleft$  or  $\triangleright$ ,  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\checkmark$  to select and enter the menu items one by one to set a channel, a day of the week or daily, and a starting time.
- 3 Press OK to confirm.
- 4 Press Menu to guit the menu.

#### 🗘 Tip

To switch off the On timer, select **Off** in the On timer menu.

#### 5.7.3 Lock TV channels and programmes

Lock TV channels and/or programmes from connected devices to prevent children from watching them. Lock and unlock with a four number code.

- 2 Enter your code with the number keys. The Features menu reappears with a message confirming that your code has been created or changed.

- 5 Confirm your new entered code. The previous code is erased and the new code is stored.

For each TV channel, subtitles can be set, coming from Teletext or DVB-T (digital) broadcasts. If digital channels are installed and broadcasted, you can select your preferred subtitle language.

- 2 Press **Teletext** to switch on Teletext.
- 3 Enter the three number pagenumber of the subtitle page.

#### 5.8.2 Activate or deactivate subtitling

## 5.11 Software update

Philips continuously tries to improve its products. It may be recommended for you to update the TV's software. To update your TV software you need a USB Memory device (not supplied).

#### Note

The device must have at least 48Mb free space. Make sure the write protection is turned off. Some USB devices do not work with our TV. Contact your dealer.

#### 5.11.1 Update assistant

The Update assistant helps you to update the  $\mathsf{TV}\mathsf{'s}$  software.

#### **TV** identification

The TV will identify itself to your USB memory device.

1 Switch the TV on.

- 2 Press Menu.
- 3 Press ►.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to select Software update.
- 5 Press ►.
- 6 Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\checkmark$  to select Update assistant.

#### 7 Press ►.

- 8 Press OK to activate.
- Insert a USB memory device to the USB connector at the side of the TV. The main menu appears.

- 11 Press the green key again to finish.
- 12 Remove the USB memory device from the TV.

## 5.11.2 Software download from the PC to the USB device

- Insert the USB memory device into a PC linked to the internet.
- 2 Locate and open the file "update.htm" on your USB device.
- **3** Read the instructions on screen and click on the **Send ID** button.

The software update is downloaded on the USB memory device.

4 Remove the USB memory device from your PC.

# 5.11.3 Transfer of the downloaded software update to the TV

The downloaded software on the USB memory device must now be uploaded to your TV.

#### Caution

- Do not remove the USB memory device during the software update.
- If a power drop occurs during the update, do not remove the USB memory device from the TV. The TV will continue the update as soon as the power comes back.
- 1 Insert the USB memory device to the USB connector at the side of the TV.



2 The TV switches off. The screen stays black for about 10 seconds. Wait and do not use the power switch (1) on the TV.



**3** The update process starts automatically. Please wait.



The update is finished when the message 'Operation successful' appears on the screen.



4 Remove the USB memory device from the TV.



**5** Press () on the remote control.



#### Note

Do not press more than once and do not use the **Power** (1) switch on the TV.

6 The TV switches off. The screen stays black for about 10 seconds. Please, wait.



7 The TV switches back on again. The update is done.



#### 5.11.4 Verify the current software version

Updating software is only possible if the version of the new available software is different from the current one. You can verify your current software version.

- **1** Select **Software update** in the TV menu.
- 2 Press ►.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Current software info. The version and the description of the current software appears.

# 5.11.5 Software update by digital broadcast (DVB-T)

Your TV might receive new software from the digital broadcast system automatically. If you receive an update message on screen it is strongly advised to update the software immediately - select **Now**.

Select **Later**, if you want to be reminded later on. Select **Cancel** to quit the update (not recommended). If you cancelled the update you can still update yourself from the TV menu > Software update > Local update.

## 6 Channel installation

The first time you switched on your TV you've selected the language of the TV menus and allthe available channels have been installed.

This chapter will help you if you find it necessary to re-do the initial installation or if you want to tune in a new analogue TV channel.

#### Notes:

- You do not have to follow every step described if it is not necessary.
- Re-installation will modify the All channels list and new added channels will not be added to any favourite list.

## 6.1 Automatic installation

This section describes how to search for and store all available channels automatically.

#### Step 1 Menu language

Sets the language of the TV menus.

Go to a next step if your language settings are correct.

- Press Menu on the remote control and select TV menu > Installation > Languages and press
  - ► to enter Menu language.
- **2** Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  to select your language.
- 3 Press OK to confirm.
- 4 Press ◀ to return to the Installation menu.

When digital TV channels are found, the list of installed channels may show some empty channel numbers.

## 6.3 Rearrange stored channels

To rename, reorder, uninstall or reinstall stored channels.

#### 6.3.1 Rename a channel

Assign or change a channel name to a channel for which a name has not yet been entered.

- 6 Press the green key or **OK** to finish.

With the yellow key all characters can be deleted. With the blue key you can delete the character which is highlighted.

#### 6.3.2 Uninstall or reinstall a channel

To uninstall a stored channel so that it is no longer possible to tune to.

- 2 Press ► to enter the Installation update menu.
- 3 Press OK.
- 4 Press the green key to start.
  - The update starts and may take a few minutes.
- 5 When the update is completed, press the red key to return to the Channel installation menu.
- 6 Press Menu to quit the menu.

## 6.5 Digital reception test

If you receive Digital TV broadcasting you can check the quality and signal strength of a specific channel.

- **1** Select a channel.
- Press Menu on the remote control and select TV menu > Installation > Channel installation > Digital:Test reception.
- 3 Press ► to enter
- 4 Press OK.

The channel frequency, the network name, the signal quality and strength appear.

- Press the green key to start or directly enter the frequency of the channel you want to test. If the signal quality and strength are poor, reposition the antenna.
- 6 Press the yellow key to store the frequency if the signal quality and strength are good.
- 7 Press the red key to return to the Channel installation menu.
- 8 Press Menu to quit the menu.

#### 🗘 Tip

To achieve the best results, contact a specialised antenna installer.

## 6.6 Factory settings

If you are lost in the picture and sound settings, you can reset the TV to the factory settings of picture and sound.

Press Menu on the remote control and select TV menu > Installation > Factory settings.

- 2 Press ► to enter the Factory settings menu.
- 3 Press OK.
- 4 Press **Menu** to quit the menu.

#### Note

The channel installation settings are not changed.

Additional HDMI connector for mobile high-definition devices.

#### 15 COMMON INTERFACE

Slot for Conditional Access Modules. Not currently supported by service providers in Australia.

## 7.2 About connections

#### 7.2.1 What you need to know

Connect your device with the highest possible quality connection.

Look for the highest quality connection on your device. Use that connection to your TV.

#### HDMI - Highest quality $\star \star \star \star \star$

An HDMI connection has the best picture and sound quality. One cable combines video and audio signals. Use HDMI for HD (High Definition) TV signals. HDMI with EasyLink offers easy operating of your connected devices when these have the HDMI CEC standard. See section **7.2.2 EasyLink** A device connected with HDMI to the TV can only send out audio and video signals to your TV. The device cannot receive or record audio and video from your TV.

#### ◆ Tip DVI to HDMI – Higher quality ★★★★

Use a DVI to HDMI adaptor if your device has only a DVI connection.

Connect an Audio L/R cable to Audio In (HDMI to DVI) for sound.

You need to assign this Audio In (HDMI to DVI) connector to the HDMI 1, 2 or 3 connector you are using for this device. See section **7.4.2 Audio setup**.

#### Note

HDMI supports HDCP (High-bandwidth Digital Contents Protection). HDCP is a copy protection signal that comes with HD content (DVD disc or Blu-ray Disc).

#### **YPbPr** – Higher quality $\star \star \star \star$

Use the Component Video YPbPr connections together with Audio Left and Right. Match the cable colours when you connect.

YPbPr can handle HD TV signals.

#### **Scart** - Good quality $\star \star \star$

One cable combines video and audio signals. Scart connectors can handle RGB video but no HD TV signals.

#### 7.2.2 HDMI with EasyLink

Connected devices that are compliant with the HDMI CEC standard can work together.

1 Press Menu > TV menu > Installation >

**Preferences** and press  $\blacktriangleright$  to enter the list.

- **2** Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  to select **EasyLink**.
- B Press ► to enter.
- 4 Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\checkmark$  to select **On** or **Off**.
- **5** Select **On** to activate EasyLink.

EasyLink might not work with devices from other brands.

#### One touch play

Insert a DVD disc and press Play. The TV switches on from standby and shows the DVD programme automatically.

#### System standby

Press the 0 key on the remote control for more than 2 seconds to switch the connected devices in standby.

### 7.2.3 Display synchronised audio out

For the best match of image and sound in speech on screen, connect a Home Theatre System to Audio Out L/R or SPDIF OUT. See diagram **7.3.7**. Do not connect the audio signal of a DVD player, digital receiver or other audio/video device directly to the Home Theatre System.

## 7.3 Connect your devices

The connections shown in this section are recommendations for the most used cases. Other solutions are possible.

When a device is connected the TV needs to know what connection you made. See section **7.5 Setup** devices.

#### 7.3.1 Blu-ray Disc player

For full high-definition video, connect a HDMI cable as illustrated:



#### 7.3.2 DVD player

For DVD video, connect a SCART cable as illustrated:



#### 7.3.3 Satellite receiver

To receive analogue channels via antenna and digital channels via a satellite receiver, connect an antenna cable and SCART cable as illustrated:



#### 7.3.4 HD digital receiver

To receive analogue channels via antenna and digital channels via a HD digital receiver, connect two antenna cables and HDMI cable as illustrated:



## 7.3.5 Combined DVD recorder and digital receiver

To receive analogue channels via antenna and record programs on a combined DVD recorder and digital receiver, connect two antenna cables and one SCART cable as illustrated:



#### 7.3.6 Separate DVD recorder and receiver

To receive analogue channels via antenna and record programmes on a separate DVD recorder and receiver, connect three antenna cables and three SCART cables as illustrated.



## 7.3.7 DVD recorder and home theatre system

To receive analogue channels via antenna, output sound to a home theatre system and record programmes on a DVD recorder, connect two antenna cables, one SCART cable and two digital audio cables as illustrated:



#### 7.3.8 Game console or camcorder

The most practical connection for a mobile game console or camcorder may be at the side of the TV. You can, for example, connect the game console or camcorder to VIDEO/S-Video and AUDIO L/R connectors at the side of the TV. A HDMI connector is also available for high-definition devices.



A permanent game console or camcorder can be connected to a HDMI connector or EXT 3 (component) connectors at the back of the TV.

#### 7.3.9 Personal Computer

Before connecting the PC:

- Set the PC monitor refresh rate to 60Hz. See Section **8 Technical specifications** for a list of computer resolutions.
- Change the TV picture format to **Unscaled** as described in Section **5.3.4. Change picture** format.

#### To connect a PC to the back of the TV

- Using a HDMI to DVI cable or a HDMI-to-DVI adaptor (attached to a HDMI cable), connect a HDMI connector on the back of your TV to the DVI connector on your PC.
- 2 Connect an audio cable from your PC to the AUDIO IN mini-jack connector at the back of the TV.

#### Note

You must assign the AUDIO IN mini-jack connector to the HDMI connector as described in Section **7.4.3 Assign the AUDIO IN mini-jack connector**.



## 7.4 Setup devices

When all devices are connected, you must select the type of device attached to each connector.

#### 7.4.1 Assign devices to connectors

For easy selection and best signal handling, assign the device connected to the connectors on your TV.

- **2** Press  $\blacktriangleright$  to enter the list.
- **3** Press  $\checkmark$  or  $\blacktriangle$  to select a connector.

If you connect audio from a PC to the AUDIO IN mini-jack connector at the back of the TV, you must associate it to the HDMI connector.

## 9 Troubleshooting

#### Television and remote control

#### The TV does not switch on

- Verify the mains cord connection.
- Verify if the batteries of the remote control are flat or weak. Verify their + / - orientation. You can use the keys on the TV to switch the TV on.
- Unplug the mains cord, wait for one minute and plug in the mains again.

#### The TV does not react on the remote control

- Verify if the batteries of the remote control are not empty or weak. Verify their + / orientation.
- Clean the remote control and TV sensor lens.
- Use the side control keys to change some of the basic settings of picture and sound.
- 1 Press Volume and + to adjust the volume.
- Press **Program/Channel** and + to go through the channels marked as favourites.
- Press Menu to show the main menu. Press Program/Channel - and + to select and adjust picture and sound menu items.

#### The red light on the TV blinks

 Unplug the mains cord for half a minute and insert it again. Verify if there is enough space for ventilation. Wait until the TV has cooled down.
 When the TV does not restart to standby and the blinking occurs again, call our Customer Support Centre.

#### You forgot your code to unlock Child lock

• See section 5.8.3 Set code / Change code.

#### Wrong language in the TV menu ?

Follow these steps to change the language.

- 1 Press Menu on the remote control.
- 2 Press ►.
- **3** Use  $\checkmark$  to highlight the third line.
- 4 Press ► three times.
- **5** Press  $\checkmark$  or  $\blacktriangle$  to select your language.
- 6 Press OK.
- **7** Press **Menu** to quit the menus.

#### TV channels

#### Some TV channels are gone

- Verify if the correct channel list is chosen.
- A channel could be uninstalled in the **Rearrange menu**.

#### Picture

#### The blue light is on, but there is no picture

- Verify if the antenna is connected properly.
- Verify if the correct device is selected.

#### The sound is on, but there is no picture

• Verify the contrast or brightness setting in the menu.

#### The TV picture is poor

- Verify if the antenna is connected properly.
- Loudspeakers, non-earthed audio devices, neon lights, high buildings or mountains can influence the picture quality. Try to improve the picture by changing the antenna direction or place devices away from the TV.
- Verify if the correct TV system is chosen in the Manual installation menu.
- If only a certain channel is poor, try to fine tune this channel in the **Fine tune** menu. See section **6.2.3**.

#### The picture has poor colour

- Verify the colour settings in the Picture menu. Select any of the Reset to standard settings in the **Reset smart settings** menu. See section **5.3.2**.
- Verify the connections and cables of the connected devices.

## The TV did not remember my settings when I switch back on

• Verify if the TV is set to **Home** in the TV menu > Installation > Preferences > **Location** menu.

## The picture does not fit the screen, it is too big or too small

• Select a more fitting picture format in the Picture format menu.

See section 5.3.4 Widescreen picture format.

 Name your connected device in the Connections menu to obtain the best signal handling.
 See section 7.4.1 Assign devices to connectors.

#### The picture position on screen is not correct

• Some picture signals from some devices do not fit the screen correctly. You can shift the picture

with the navigation key left, right or up,down on the remote control. Check the signal output of the device.

#### Sound

#### There is a picture but no sound

- Verify the volume is not set to 0.
- Verify if all cables are connected properly.
- If no sound signal is detected, the TV automatically switches off the sound. This is proper operation and does not indicate malfunction.

#### The sound is poor

- Verify if the sound is set to Stereo.
- Verify the Equalizer settings.
- Select any of the Reset to standards settings in the Reset smart settings menu. See section 5.3.2.

#### The sound comes from one speaker only

• Verify if the Balance is not set to extreme left or right.

#### **HDMI** connections

#### Trouble with devices connected with HDMI

- The HDMI HDCP procedure might take a few seconds before the TV shows the picture from a device.
- If the TV does not recognise the device and the screen shows no picture, try switching from one device to another and back again to restart the HDCP procedure.
- If sound interruptions occur persistently, see the user manual of the device to verify the output settings. If that does not help, connect an additional audio cable.
- If a DVI to HDMI adaptor is used, verify if an additional audio connection is in place to complete the DVI connection.
- HDMI with EasyLink does not work
  - Verify if the connected device supports the HDMI CEC standard. See the user manual that comes with the device.
  - Verify if the HDMI cable is properly connected.
  - Verify if Easylink is activated in the TV menu, Installation, Preferences menu.
  - Ensure that the System audio control in your HDMI CEC audio devices is properly set up. See the user manual that comes with your audio device.

#### USB connection

#### The TV does not show the USB device content

- Set your device (camera) to 'Mass Storage Class' compliant.
- The USB device may need specific driver software. Unfortunately this software can not be downloaded to your TV.
- I can not see my files in the Multimedia menu.
- Not all audio and picture files are supported. See section **8 Technical data**.

#### Audio and picture files do not playback smoothly

• The transfer performance of the USB device limits the transfer rate.

#### **Personal computer**

## The PC display on my TV is not stable or is not synchronised

• Verify if the correct resolution mode is selected on your PC. See section **8 Technical data**.

#### If your problem is not solved

Switch your TV off and on again. If the problem is not solved, call the Customer Support Centre or consult our website www.philips.com/support.
