Safety

Risk of electric shock or fire!

- Never place the TV, remote control or batteries near naked flames or other heat sources, including direct sunlight.





Side controls and indicators



- 1) VOL +/-: Increases or decreases volume.
- 2 CH ▲/▼: Switches to the previous or next channel (source).
- (3) MENU: Toggles the home menu or confirm selected item.
- (4) INPUT: Selects connected devices.
- (5) (Power): Switches the product on or off. The product is not powered off completely unless it is physically unplugged.
- (6) Remote control sensor.

Remote control



- (1) (Standby-On)
 - Switches the TV to standby if it is on.
 - Switches on the TV if it is in standby.
- (2) MENU

Toggles the main menu on or off.

(3) TELETEXT

Toggles teletext on or off.

- (4) + SOURCE

Selects connected devices.

- (5) Color buttons
 - Selects tasks or options.



Remote control usage

When using the remote control, hold it close to the TV and point it at the remote control sensor. Make sure that the line-of-sight between the remote control and TV is not blocked by furniture, walls or other objects.




4 Use your TV

This section helps you perform basic TV operations.

Switch your TV on / off or to standby





To switch on

- If the standby indicator is off, press
 O (Power) at the side of the TV.
- If the standby indicator is red, press
 (Standby-On) on the remote control.

To switch to standby

- Press \circ (Standby-On) on the remote control.
 - → The standby indicator switches to red.

To switch off

- Press & (Power) at the side of the TV.
 - → The standby indicator switches off.



 Though your TV consumes very little power when in standby, energy continues to be consumed. When not in use for an extended period of time, disconnect the TV power cable from the power outlet.



 If you cannot locate your remote control and want to switch on the TV from standby, press CH ▲/▼ on the side of the TV.

Switch channels

- Press CH +/- on the remote control or CH ▲/▼ on the side of the TV.
- Enter a channel number using the Numeric buttons.
- Press **OK** to use the channel grid.
- Press S BACK A/CH on the remote control to return to the previous channel.



Switch channels with the channel grid

The channel grid allows you to view all available channels in a grid format.

Access TV menus

Menus help you to install channels, change picture and sound settings and access other features.

 - → The consumer menu appears.



- Press ▲▼◀▶ to select and navigate through one of the following menus.
 - [Picture]: Adjusts the picture setting for optimal viewing.
 - [Sound]: Adjusts the sound setting.
 - [Features] : Accesses different features like timer and TV lock.
 - [Installation] : Selects channel installation menu, adjusts preferences and resets the TV to factory settings.
 - [Software update] : Updates the TV software.
- Press **OK** to confirm your choice.
- Press **MENU** to exit.



• In PBS mode, the Guest Menu simply provides Picture, Sound, Feature, and Multimedia (Only available if USB device is plugged.) items.

Change picture and sound settings

Change picture and sound settings to suit your preferences. You can apply pre-defined settings or change settings manually.

When watching TV or using external devices, press © OPTIONS then select [Picture and sound] for quick access to picture and sound settings.

Use smart picture

Use smart picture to apply pre-defined picture settings.

- [Hue]: Compensates for color variations.
- [Sharpness]: Adjusts sharpness in the image.
- [Noise reduction]: Filters and reduces noise in an image.
- **[Color Temperature]**: Sets the color temperature to cool, normal, or warm.
- [Digital Crystal Clear]: Fine-tunes each pixel to match surrounding pixels. This produces a brilliant, high-definition image.
 - [Dynamic contrast]: Enhances contrast. A [Medium] setting is recommended.
 - [Dynamic backlight]: Adjusts brightness of the TV backlight to match lighting conditions.
 - [Color enhancement]: Makes colors more vivid and improves the details in bright colors. You can switch this feature on or off.
- [PC mode]: Adjusts the picture when a PC is connected to the TV via HDMI or DVI.

- [Picture format]: Changes the picture format.
- [Picture size]: Adjusts the viewing area. (When set to maximum, you might see noise or a rough edge of an image.)
- [Horizontal shift]: Adjusts the picture horizontally for PC-VGA or HDMI input.
- **[Vertical shift]**: Adjusts the picture vertically for PC-VGA or HDMI input.

Change picture format

- Press FORMAT.
 - → A picture format bar appears.
- Press ▲▼ to select a picture format.
 - → The selected picture format is activated.
- 3 Press **OK** to confirm your choice.

Summary of picture formats

[Super zoom]: (Not for HD and PC mode.) Removes the black bars on the side of 4:3 broadcasts There is minimal distortion.



[4:3]: Shows the classic 4:3 format.



[Subtitle zoom]: (Not for HD and PC mode.) Displays 4:3 pictures over the full area of the screen. with sub-titles visible. Part of the top of the picture is clipped off.



[Movie expand 14:9]: (Not for HD and PC mode.) Scales 4:3 format to 14:9.



[Movie expand 16:9]: (Not for HD and PC mode.) Scales 4:3 format to 16:9.



[Wide screen]: Scales 4:3 format to 16:9.



[Unscaled]: For HD and PC mode only, and in selected models only. Allows maximum sharpness. Some distortion may be present due to the broadcaster's systems. Set your PC resolution to wide screen mode for best results.

 - → The selected smart sound setting is applied.

Manually adjust sound settings

 - [Auto volume levelling]:
 Automatically reduces sudden volume changes, for example, when switching channels.
 - [Delta volume]: Levels out volume differences between channels or connected devices. Switch to the connected device before you change the delta volume.

Access the teletext options menu

Access the teletext features through the teletext options menu.

 - [Freeze page] : Freezes the current page.
 - [Reveal]: Hides or reveals hidden information on a page, such as solutions to riddles or puzzles.
 - [Cycle subpage]: Cycles through subpages automatically if subpages are available.
 - [Menu language]: Switches to a different language group to display a language correctly when it uses a different character set.
- 4 Press ▲▼◀▶ to make a selection, then press **OK** to confirm.
- 5 Press SACK to exit the teletext options menu.

Select teletext subpages

A teletext page can hold several subpages. Subpages are displayed on a bar next to the main page number.

Select T.O.P. teletext broadcasts

Table Of Pages (T.O.P.) teletext broadcasts allow you to jump from one subject to another without using page numbers. T.O.P. teletext is not broadcast on all TV channels.

- 2 Press INFO.
 - → The T.O.P. overview appears.
- 3 Press ▲▼◀▶ to select a subject.
- 4 Press **OK** to view the page.

Create and use list of favorite channels

You can create a list of your preferred TV channels so that you can find those channels easily.

Select a favorite list

 - ightharpoonup The channel options menu appears.

Automatically switch the TV to standby (sleep timer)

Sleep timer switches the TV to standby after a pre-defined period of time.

Use TV locks

You can prevent your children from watching certain programs or channels by locking the TV controls.

Set or change your PIN code

- 7 Press ▲▼ to select [Store as new channel], , then press ▶ to enter.
- 8 Select [Yes], then press OK to store the new channel.
- 9 Press MENU to exit.

- **9** Press **MENU** to exit.

Skip channels

- 1 When watching TV, switch to the channel that you want to skip.

7 Professional mode instruction

Introduction

Included in this TV is a special functional mode that allows the TV to be configured for commercial application. This feature is called Professional mode.


This section has been designed to help install and operate this TV in Professional mode. Before reading this section, please read section 3 to 6 to set the basic functionality of this TV.

Benefits of Professional mode

This TV is specially designed to operate in Professional Mode. Professional Mode offers the following benefits:

- Access to the [Consumer Menu] can be blocked. This prevents users (e.g. guests) from deleting or changing channel settings and / or modifying picture and sound settings. This ensures that TVs are always set up correctly.
- A switch-on volume and channel can be selected. After switching on, the TV will always start on the specified volume level and channel.
- The maximum volume level of the TV can be limited in order to prevent disturbance to other guest.
- Channels can be blanked (Video only).
- The TV local buttons can be locked.
- Screen information can be suppressed.

Professional Setup Remote control (2573 optional)



- ① C button (OPTIONS)

 Accesses options relating to the current activity or selection (Faulals to the
 - activity or selection. (Equals to the function of © **OPTIONS** on Guest remote control).
- ② E button (OK)
 Confirms an entry or selection.
- (Enters Professional setup menu)
 - Selects **SETUP** mode first.
 - Press M button to enter the Professional setup menu.



SETUP mode should be selected for hotel installer.

Activating the Professional mode setup menu

- 1 Switch on the TV and select a TV channel.

PBS settings

[PBS Mode]

Enables / disables the Professional mode.

- [On]: All settings in the Professional mode Setup menu are in effect.
- [Off]: The TV operates as a normal (consumer) TV.

[Consumer Setup]

A shortcut to enter the full TV menu. This allows the installers to do all the TV setup settings.

[Store]

Selects **[Yes]** to save the changes in Professional mode. Restarts the TV mains power for the changes to take effect.

[Reset]

Selects **[Yes]** to reset all settings in Professional mode and consumer mode to factory default.

Switch on setting

[Maximum volume]

This option specifies the maximum allowable volume level of the TV.

[Picture format]

Sets available picture format when the TV is switched on.

[Power on]

The power on function allows the TV to enter a specific mode ([On], [Standby], or [Last status]) of operation after the mains power is activated.

- [On]: When set, the TV will always turn on after the mains power is activated.
- [Standby]: When set, the TV will always turn to standby after the mains power is activated.
- [Last status]: When set, the TV will always turn to the last status (either On or Standby) whenever the mains power is activated.

[Smart power]

Adjusts the picture backlight to achieve the following power saving mode.

[Selectable AV]

Allows the installer to define which external sources to be displayed on the source list when pressing **SOURCE** button on the Guest remote control.

Only the sources marked with [X] appear in the source list.

[ESP] (Energy saving program)

Selects the period of time to switch the TV off automatically when TV does not receive any user input. The time is between 0 to 24 hours. Selects "0" to disable this feature.

Speaker Settings

[TV Speaker Enable]

- [Off]: Disables the TV speaker. The headphone volume functions normally.









10 Troubleshooting

This section describes commonly encountered issues and accompanying solutions.

General TV issues

The TV does not switch on:

- Disconnect the power cable from the power outlet. Wait for one minute then reconnect it.
- Check that the power cable is securely connected.

The remote control is not working properly:

- Check that the remote control batteries are correctly inserted according to the +/- orientation.
- Replace the remote control batteries if they are flat or weak.
- Clean the remote control and TV sensor lens.

The standby light on the TV blinks red:

 Disconnect the power cable from the power outlet. Wait until the TV cools down before reconnecting the power cable. If the blinking reoccurs, contact Philips Consumer Care.

You forgot the code to unlock the TV lock feature

Enter '8888'.

The TV menu is in the wrong language.

• Change the TV menu to your preferred language.

When turning the TV on / off / to standby, you hear a creaking sound from the TV chassis:

 No action is required. The creaking sound is normal expansion and contraction of the TV as it cools down and warms up. This does not impact performance.

TV channel issues

Previously installed channels do not appear in the channel list:

Check that the correct channel list is selected.

Picture issues

The TV is on, but there is no picture:

- Check that the antenna is properly connected to the TV.
- Check that the correct device is selected as the TV source.

There is sound but no picture:

 Check that the picture settings are correctly set.

There is poor TV reception from an antenna connection:

- Check that the antenna is properly connected to the TV.
- Loudspeakers, unearthed audio devices, neon lights, high buildings and other large objects can influence reception quality.
 If possible, try to improve the reception quality by changing the antenna direction or moving devices away from the TV.
- If reception on only one channel is poor, fine tune this channel.

There is poor picture quality from connected devices:

- Check that the devices are connected properly.
- Check that the picture settings are correctly set.

The TV did not save your picture settings:

 Check that the TV location is set to the home setting. This mode offers you the flexibility to change and save settings.

The picture does not fit the screen; it is too big or too small:

• Try using a different picture format.

The picture position is incorrect:

 Picture signals from some devices may not fit the screen correctly. Check the signal output of the device.

Sound issues

There is a picture but sound quality is poor:



Note

- If no audio signal is detected, the TV automatically switches the audio output off this does not indicate malfunction.
- Check that all cables are properly connected.
- Check that the volume is not set to 0.
- Check that the sound is not muted

There is a picture but the sound quality is poor:

 Check that the sound settings are correctly set.

There is a picture but sound comes from one speaker only:

Verify that sound balance is set to the center.

HDMI connection issues

There are problems with HDMI devices:

- Note that HDCP (High-bandwidth Digital Content Protection) support can delay the time taken for a TV to display content from a HDMI device.
- If the TV does not recognize the HDMI device and no picture is displayed, try switching the source from one device to another and back again.
- If there are intermittent sound disruptions, check that output settings from the HDMI device are correct.
- If you use an HDMI-to-DVI adapter or HDMI-to-DVI cable, check that an additional audio cable is connected to AUDIO (mini-jack only).

Computer connection issues

The computer display on the TV is not stable:

- Check that your PC uses the supported resolution and refresh rate.
- Set the TV picture format to unscaled.
