1.1 Safety

- Two people are required to lift and carry a TV that weighs more than 25 kilos (55lb). Improper handling of the TV can result in serious injury.
- If transporting the TV in low temperatures (less than 5°C), open the box and wait until the TV matches the ambient temperature of the room before unpacking.
- To avoid short circuit, do not expose the TV, remote control or remote control batteries to rain or water.
- Do not place vessels of water or other liquids on top of or near the TV. Spilling liquids on the TV can cause electric shock. If liquids are spilt on the TV, do not operate

the TV. Immediately disconnect the TV from the mains and have the TV checked by a qualified technician.

- To avoid risk of fire or electric shock, do not place the TV, remote control or remote control batteries near naked flame sources (e.g. lighted candles) and other heat sources including direct sunlight.
- Do not install the TV in a confined space such as a bookcase. Leave a space of at least 10cm (four inches) around the TV for ventilation. Be sure air flow is not obstructed.
- If placing the TV on a flat, solid surface be sure to use only the supplied stand. Do not move the TV if the stand is not properly screwed to the TV.
- Wall mounting of the TV should only be performed by qualified personnel. The TV must only be mounted on an appropriate wall bracket and on a wall that can safely hold the weight of the TV. Improper wall mounting can result in severe injury or damage. Do not attempt to wall mount the TV yourself.
- If the TV is mounted on a swivel base or swivel arm, ensure no strain is placed on the power cord when the TV is swivelled. Strain on the power cord can loosen connections and cause arcing or fire.
- Disconnect the TV from the mains and antenna before lightning storms. During lightning storms do not touch any part of the TV, mains cord or antenna cable.
- Be sure that you have full access to the mains cord for easy disconnection of the TV from the mains.
- When disconnecting the TV from the mains, be sure to:
- 1. Turn off the TV, then the mains power (if available).
- 2. Unplug the mains cord from the mains socket outlet.

 Unplug the mains cord from the power connector at the back of the TV. Always pull the mains cord by the plug. Do not pull the mains cord.



 Permanent hearing loss can occur if you use earphones or headphones at high volumes. Though high volume may sound normal over time, it can damage your hearing. To protect your hearing, limit the amount of time you use earphones or headphones at high volume.

1.2 Screen care

 Turn off and unplug the mains cord before cleaning the screen. Clean the screen with a soft, dry cloth. Do not use substances such as household cleaning agents as these may damage the screen.



- To avoid deformations or colour fading, wipe off water droplets as soon as possible.
- Do not touch, push, rub or strike the screen with hard objects as this may damage the screen permanently.
- Where possible, avoid stationary images that remain on-screen for extended periods

of time. Examples include screen menus, teletext pages, black bars or stock market tickers. If you must use stationary images, reduce the screen contrast and brightness to avoid screen damage.

1.3 Environmental care

Recycling your packaging

3 Get started

This section helps you position and install the TV and supplements the information provided in the **Quick Start**.

Note

Refer to the **Quick Start** for stand mounting instructions.

3.1 Position the TV

In addition to reading and understanding the safety instructions in Section 1.1, consider the following before positioning your TV:

- The ideal viewing distance for watching TV is three times its screen size.
- Position the TV where light does not fall on the screen.
- Connect your devices before you position your TV.
- Your TV is equipped with a Kensington Security Slot at the back of the TV.



If connecting an anti-theft Kensington lock (not supplied), position the TV within reach of a permanent object (such as a table) that can be easily attached to the lock.

3.2 Wall mount the TV

WARNING

Wall mounting of the TV should only be performed by qualified installers. Koninklijke Philips Electronics N.V. bears no responsibility for improper mounting that results in accident or injury.

Step 1 Purchase a VESA-compatible wall bracket

Depending on the size of your TV screen, purchase one of the following wall brackets:

TV screen size (inches/ cm)	VESA- compatible wall bracket type (mm)	Special instructions
32"/81cm	Adjustable 300 x 300	The VESA- compatible bracket must be adjusted to 200 x 300 before securing to the TV
37"/94cm	Fixed 300 x 300	None
42"/107cm or larger	Fixed 400 x 400	None

Step 2 Secure the VESA-compatible wall bracket to the TV

1. Locate the four mounting nuts at the back of the TV.



2. Continue with the instructions provided with your VESA-compatible wall bracket.

When securing the VESA-compatible wall bracket to your TV, use M6 bolts for 32 inch models or M8 bolts for larger models (bolts not supplied).

3.3 Connect the antenna cable



- Locate the TV ANTENNA connector at the back of the TV.
- Connect one end of an antenna cable (not supplied) to the **TV ANTENNA** connector. Use an adaptor if the antenna cable does not fit.

 Connect the other end of the antenna cable to your antenna outlet, ensuring that the cable is tightly secured at both ends.

3.4 Connect the mains cord

WARNING

Verify that your mains voltage corresponds with the voltage printed at the back of the TV. Do not insert the mains cord if the voltage is different.

To connect the mains cord

Note

The location of the mains connector varies according to TV model.



- Locate the AC IN mains connector at the back or on the bottom of the TV.
- 2. Connect the mains cord to the **AC IN** mains connector.
- Connect the mains cord to the mains, ensuring that the cord is tightly secured at both ends.

3.5 Insert the remote control batteries



- 1. Slide the battery cover off the back of the remote control.
- Insert the two supplied batteries (Size AAA, Type LR03). Be sure the + and - ends of the batteries line up with the markings inside the case.
- 3. Slide the cover back into position.

Solution Note

Remove the batteries if not using the remote control for an extended period of time.

3.6 Switch on the TV

The first time you switch on the TV, check that the mains cord is properly connected. When ready, turn on the mains (if mains switch is available), then press **POWER** on the side of the TV.

3.7 First time setup

1. The first time the TV is switched on, a **Country** selection menu appears.

3. Press OK to enter the Language menu.



- 4. Press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown to select your language.
- 5. Press **OK** to enter the **Location** menu.

- 6. Press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown to select your location.
- 7. Press **OK** to start the installation. The installation takes a few minutes. When complete, the first tuned channel appears on the TV.

4 Use your TV

This section helps you perform basic TV operations. Instructions on advanced TV operations are provided in Section 5 Use more of your TV.

4.1 Switch your TV on/off or to standby

4.1.1 Switch on your TV



• If the power indicator (1) is off, press **POWER** on the side of the TV.

4.1.2 Switch off your TV



• Press **POWER** on the side of the TV. The power indicator (1) switches off.

4.1.3 Switch your TV to standby



Press () (standby) on the remote control. The power indicator switches to standby (red).

🚱 Tip

Though your TV consumes very little power when in standby, energy continues to be consumed as long as the mains remain connected and powered. When not in use for extended period of time, switch off and disconnect the TV from the mains.

4.1.4 Switch on the TV from standby



 If the power indicator is in standby (red), press () on the remote control.

B Note

If you cannot locate your remote control and you want to switch on the TV from standby, press **PROGRAM +/-** on the side of the TV.This switches off your TV.

4.2 Watch TV

4.2.1 Switch channels



 Press a number (1 to 9) or press P +/- on your remote control.

- Press PROGRAM +/- on the side controls of the TV.
- Press P\$P on the remote control to return to the previously-viewed TV channel.

4.2.2 Adjust volume



- Press ∠ (volume) + or on the remote control.
- Press VOLUME + or on the side controls of your TV.
- Press K (mute) on the remote control to mute the sound. Press K (mute) again to unmute the sound.

4.3 Watch connected devices



- 1. Switch on the device.
- Press SOURCE on the remote control then select the input your device is connected to.
- 3. Press **OK** to select the device.

4.4 Use teletext

Most TV channels broadcast information via teletext.



- 1. Press **TELETEXT** on the remote control. The main index page appears.
- 2. To select a page with the remote control:
 - Enter the page number with the number keys.
 - Press **P** +/- or ▲/▼ to view the next or the previous page.
 - Press a colour key to select one of the colour coded items at the bottom of the screen.
- Press TELETEXT again to switch off teletext.

5.1 Remote control overview

This section provides a detailed overview of remote control features.

Switches the TV on from standby or back to standby.

2. SOURCE

Selects connected devices.

3. 💽

Selects a picture format.

4. DUAL I-II

Switches **Stereo** and **Nicam Stereo** to **Mono** or selects first language (**DUAL I**) or second language (**DUAL II**) in bilingual programmes.

- Colour keys Selects tasks or teletext pages.
- 6. **INFO**

Displays programme information, if available.

7. **OK**

Accesses a menu or activates a setting.

8. Navigation keys

Up \blacktriangle , Down \blacktriangledown , Left \triangleleft and Right \blacktriangleright keys navigate the menu.

9. INCR. SURR

Enables Incredible Surround with stereo sources or spatial mode with mono sources.

10. **P +/-**

Switches to the next or previous channel.

- 11. Number keys Selects a channel, page or setting.
- 12. **P\$₽**

Returns to the previously-viewed channel.

13. ACTIVE CONTROL Selects On or Off.

14. 🖎

Mutes or restores sound.

15. ⊿ **+/-**

Increases or decreases volume.

16. **MENU**

Toggles the menu on or off.

17. BACK

Returns to the previous menu.

18. SMART MODE

Toggles through predefined picture and sound settings.

19. **DEMO**

Toggles the **Demo** menu on or off.

20. **TELETEXT**

Toggles teletext on or off.

21. 1

Splits the current channel or source on the left of the screen. Teletext appears on the right.

Use TV menus

On-screen menus help you install your TV, adjust picture and sound settings and access other features. This section describes how to navigate the menus.

5.2.1 Access the main menu

The main menu offers the following items:

Picture Setting

To adjust picture settings such as Brightness, Colour, Contrast, Sharpness and Colour Temp. (Colour Temperature). See Section 5.3 Adjust Picture and Sound settings.

Advanced Picture

To turn on and off advanced picture settings such as Contrast+, Active Control, and Noise Reduction. See Section 5.3 Adjust Picture and Sound settings.

Sound

To adjust sound settings such as Equalizer, Balance, Auto Vol. Leveller (Auto Volume Leveller), and Incr. Surround (Incredible **Surround). See** Section 5.3 Adjust Picture and Sound settings.

Features

To turn on or off and to adjust special features such as Timer, Child Lock, and Parental Control. See Section 5.6 Use Timers and Child Lock.

• Install

To select and display Language, Country, Auto Store, Manual Store, Sort, Name, and Fav. Program (Favourite Program). See Section 6 Install channels.

Location

To change your TV location to Home or Shop mode. See Section 5.4 Change to Shop or Home mode.

5.2.2 Use the main menu

- 2. Press ► to enter.
- 3. Press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown to select a setting.
- Brightness Changes the level of light in the picture.
- **Colour** Changes the level of saturation.
- **Contrast** Changes the level of bright parts in the picture keeping the dark parts unchanged.
- Sharpness
 Changes the level of sharpness of fine details.
- Colour Temp. Sets the colours to Normal, Warm

(reddish) or Cool (bluish).

Contrast+

Changes the level of bright parts in the picture keeping the dark parts unchanged.

Active Control

Corrects all incoming signals to provide the best picture possible. Switches Active control **On** or **Off**.

Noise Reduction

Filters and reduces the noise in the picture. Set the level to **Minimum**, **Medium**, **Maximum** or **Off**.

5.3.2 Use Smart Mode

Apart from manually adjusting picture settings, you can use smart settings to set your TV to a predefined picture and sound setting.

 Press SMART MODE on the remote control to toggle through a selection of predefined picture and sound settings.



Summary of smart modes

Vivid

Applies brilliant picture and sound settings suitable for bright surroundings.

Standard

Applies natural picture and sound settings suitable for most living room conditions.

Movie

Applies dynamic picture and sound settings suitable for a complete cinematic experience.

• Game

Optimise for PCs, game consoles and play stations.

Power Saver

Eco friendly settings to reduce power consumption.

Personal

Based on the settings you customised in the **Picture Setting** menu.

5.3.3 Change picture format

Change the picture format to suit your content.

Stretches the classic 4:3 format to 16:9.

Displays the classic 4:3 format.

Movie Expand 14:9

Subtitle Zoom



Displays 4:3 pictures using the full surface of the screen leaving the sub-titles visible. Part of the top of the picture is clipped off.

Super Zoom



Removes the black bars on the side of 4:3 broadcasts with minimal distortion.

• Unscaled (only for PC)



Maximum sharpness though distortion may appear on borders. Also black bars may appear with pictures from your PC.

5.3.4 Adjust sound settings

This section describes how to adjust sound settings.

- Press MENU on the remote control and select Sound.
- 2. Press ► to enter the list.



- Press ▲ or ▼ to select one of the following settings:
- Equalizer Adjusts each individual frequency (tone).
- Balance

Sets the balance of the left and right speakers to best fit your listening position.

Auto Vol. Leveller

Controls the sudden sound level increase when changing channels or during commercial break.

Incr. Surround

Enhances stereo effect. Select **Incr. Surround** or **Stereo** (when in stereo mode) or **Mono** or **Spatial** (when in mono mode).

5.4 Change to Shop or Home mode

- 1. Press **MENU** on the remote control and select **Location**.
- 2. Press ► to enter the Location menu.



- 3. Use \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown to select the TV mode:
 - Shop

Sets smart settings to **Vivid**, ideal for a shop environment. The flexibility to change settings is limited.

- Home Gives home users the full flexibility to change all TV settings.
- 4. Press OK to confirm.
- 5. Press MENU to exit.

5.5 Use teletext features

Your TV has a 1,000 page memory that stores broadcasted teletext pages and sub pages. The teletext memory reduces page loading time.

5.5.1 Select teletext sub pages

A teletext page can hold several sub pages. Sub pages are displayed at the bottom of the page.

- 1. Press **TELETEXT** on the remote control.
- 2. Select a teletext page.
- 3. Press ◀ or ► to select a sub page.

5.5.2 Use dual screen teletext

Enabling dual screen teletext displays your channel or source on the left of the screen. Teletext is displayed on the right.

- 1. Press (12 (Dual screen) on your remote control to enable dual screen teletext.
- 2. Press **TELETEXT** to switch off teletext.

5.5.3 Enlarge teletext pages

For more comfortable reading, you can enlarge the teletext page.

- 1. Press **TELETEXT** on the remote control and select a teletext page.
- Press ▲ or ▼ on the remote control to enlarge the top half of the page.
- 3. Press again to enlarge the bottom half of the page.
- 4. Press again to return to normal page size.

5.5.4 Hold teletext pages

Certain pages contain sub-pages which are automatically displayed successively.

- 1. Press TELETEXT on the remote control.
- 2. Press HOLD to stop or resume sub-page

progression.



5.5.5 Reveal hidden information

You can hide or reveal hidden information on a page, such as solutions to riddles or puzzles.

- 1. Press **TELETEXT** on the remote control.
- 2. Press **REVEAL** to reveal or hide information.



5.6 Use timers and Child lock

This section describes how to switch the TV on or off at a specified time and to use Child lock.

5.6.1 Automatically switch the TV to standby (Sleep timer)

Sleeptimer switches the TV to standby after a defined period of time.

 Press MENU on the remote control and select Features > Timer > Sleep.

- 2. Press ► to enter the **Sleep** menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to set the sleep time. If set to Off, the Sleep timer is switched off.
- 4. Press **OK** to activate the **Sleep** timer.

B Note

You can always switch off your TV earlier or reset Sleep timer during the countdown.

5.6.2 Automatically switch the TV on (Timer)

On timer switches the TV to a specified channel at a specified time, from standby.

- Press MENU on the remote control and select Features > Timer.
- 2. Press ► to enter the **Timer** menu.
- Use ▲ or ▼, ◄ or ► to select and enter the menu items to set a time, start time, stop time, program no., and frequency.
- 4. Press **OK** to confirm.
- 5. Press MENU to exit.

To switch off On timer, select **Off** in **Features > Timer > Activate**.

7.2 Select connection quality

This section describes how you can enhance your audio visual experience by connecting your devices with the best possible connectors.

After connecting your devices, be sure to enable them as described in Section 7.4 Setup devices.

7.2.1 HDMI - Highest quality $\star \star \star \star \star$



HDMI produces the best audio visual quality possible. Both audio and video signals are combined in one HDMI cable, providing an uncompressed, digital interface between your TV and HDMI devices. You must use HDMI to experience full high-definition video. You must also use HDMI cables to enable Philips EasyLink as described in Section 7.5 Use Philips EasyLink.

🚱 Tip

If your PC only has a DVI connector, use a DVI-HDMI adaptor to connect your device to a HDMI connector at the back of the TV. You must connect a separate audio cable from the device to the AUDIO IN mini-jack connector.

🖨 Note

Philips HDMI supports HDCP (Highbandwidth Digital Contents Protection). HDCP is a form of Digital Rights Management that protects high definition content in DVD or Blu-ray Discs.

7.2.2 Component (Y Pb Pr) - High quality ★★★★

Component (Y Pb Pr) video provides better picture quality than S-Video or composite video connections. Though component video supports high-definition signals, picture quality is lower than HDMI and is analogue.

When connecting a component video cable, match the cable colours to the connectors on the side of the TV. Also, connect a Audio L/R cable to the red and white Audio L/R input connectors here.

7.2.3 SCART - Good quality ★★★



SCART combines audio and video signals in one cable. Audio signals are stereo, while video signals can be composite or S-Video quality. SCART does not support high-definition video and is analogue. Two SCART connectors are provided on the TV, EXT 1 and EXT 2.

7.2.4 S-Video - Good quality **

An analogue connection, S-Video provides better picture quality than composite video. When connecting your device with S-Video, plug the S-Video cable to the S-Video connector on the side of the TV.You must connect a separate Audio L/R cable from the device to the red and white Audio L/R connectors on the side of the TV.

7.2.5 Composite - Basic quality 🖈

Composite video provides basic analogue connectivity, usually combining a (yellow) video cinch cable with (red and white) Audio L/R cinch cable. Match the cable colours when connecting to the composite Video and Audio L/R input connectors on the side of the TV.

7.3 Connect devices

This section describes how to connect various devices with different connectors and supplements examples provided in the **Quick Start**.

Caution

Disconnect the mains cord before connecting devices.

Different types of connectors may be used to connect a device to your TV, depending on availability and your needs.

7.3.1 Blu-ray Disc player

For full high-definition video, connect a HDMI cable as illustrated:



7.3.2 DVD player

To playback DVD, connect a SCART cable to EXT 1.



7.3.3 S-Video device

To playback a S-Video device, connect a SCART cable to EXT2 or S-Video connector at the side of the TV.



7.3.4 Combined DVD recorder and receiver

To receive channels via antenna and record programs on a combined DVD recorder and receiver, connect two antenna cables and one SCART cable as illustrated:



7.3.5 Separate DVD recorder and receiver

To receive channels via antenna and record programmes on a separate DVD recorder and receiver, connect three antenna cables and three SCART cables as illustrated:



7.3.6 Camcorder, digital camera, game console, or headphones

The most practical connection for a mobile devices may be at the side of the TV. You can, for example, connect the game console to the Y Pb Pr, digital camera or camcorder to VIDEO/S-Video and AUDIO L/R connectors at the side of the TV.



7.3.7 Personal Computer

Before connecting the PC:

- Set the PC monitor refresh rate to 60Hz. See Section 8 Technical specifications for a list of computer resolutions.
- Change the TV picture format to Unscaled as described in Section 5.3.3 Change picture format.

To connect a PC to the back of the TV

- Using a HDMI to DVI cable or a HDMI-to-DVI adaptor (attached to a HDMI cable), connect a HDMI connector on the back of your TV to the DVI connector on your PC.
- Connect an audio cable from your PC to the AUDIO L and R at the side of the TV.



7.4 Setup devices

When all devices are connected, you must select the type of device attached to each connector.

7.4.1 Select connectors

To select the device connected to the connectors on your TV.

1. Press **SOURCE** on the remote control.



- 2. Press \checkmark or \blacktriangle to select a connector.
- 3. Press OK to confirm.
- 4. Repeat the procedure to select another connector.
- 5. Press **SOURCE** to exit.

7.5 Use Philips EasyLink

Your TV supports Philips EasyLink, which enables one-touch play and one-touch standby between EasyLink-compliant devices. Compliant devices must be connected to your TV via HDMI and assigned as described in Section 7.4.1 Select connectors.

7.5.1 Use one-touch play

When you connect your TV to devices that support one touch play, you can control your TV and the devices with one remote control For example, when you press **one touch play** on your DVD's remote control, your Philips TV will automatically switch to the correct channel to show the DVD content.

7.5.2 Use one-touch standby

When you connect your TV to devices that support one-touch standby, you can use your TV's remote control to put devices to standby. Press and hold the () button on the TV's remote control for 3-4 seconds.

9 Troubleshooting

This section describes commonly-encountered issues and accompanying solutions.

9.1 General TV issues

The TV does not switch on:

- Unplug the mains cord, wait for one minute and plug in the mains again.
- Verify that the mains cord is properly connected and that the mains are powered.

The remote control is not working properly:

- Verify that the remote control batteries are correctly inserted according to the +/orientation.
- Replace the remote control batteries if they are flat or weak.
- Clean the remote control and TV sensor lens.

The standby light on the TV blinks red:

 Turn off the TV and unplug the mains cord. Wait until the TV cools down before reinserting the mains cord and turning on the TV. If the blinking occurs again, contact our Customer Support Centre.

You forgot your code to unlock Child lock

• Enter '0711' as described in Section 5.6.3 Lock TV channels (Parental Control).

The TV menu is in the wrong language

 See Section 6.1 Automatically install channels for instructions on how to change the TV menu to your preferred language.

When turning the TV on/off/to standby, you hear a creaking sound from the TV chassis:

 No action is required. The creaking sound is normal expansion and contraction of the TV as it cools and warms up. This does not impact performance.

9.2 Picture issues

The power indicator is on, but there is no picture:

- Verify if the antenna is connected properly.
- Verify if the correct device is selected.

There is sound but no picture:

• Verify that picture settings are correctly set. See Section 5.3.2 Adjust picture settings.

You receive poor TV reception from an antenna connection:

- Check that the antenna is properly connected to the TV.
- Loud speakers, unearthed audio devices, neon lights, high buildings or mountains can influence the picture quality. Try to improve the reception quality by changing the antenna direction or moving devices away from the TV.
- Verify if the correct TV system is selected for your region. See Section 6.2 Manually install channels.
- If reception on only one channel is poor, try to fine tune this channel. See Section 6.3 Fine tune channels.

You receive poor picture quality from connected devices:

- Check that the devices are connected properly. Also, be sure to assign devices to connectors as described in Section 7.4.1 Select connectors.
- Verify that picture settings are correctly set. See Section 5.3.1 Adjust picture settings.

The TV did not save my settings:

• Verify that the TV is set to Home mode, which offers you complete flexibility to change settings. See Section 5.4 Change to Shop or Home mode.

The picture does not fit the screen, it is too big or too small:

- Try using a different picture format as described in Section 5.3.3 Change picture format.
- Assign your device to connectors as described in Section 7.4.1 Select connectors.

The picture position on screen is not correct:

• Picture signals from some devices do not fit the screen correctly. Check the signal output of the device.

9.3 Sound issues

There is picture but no sound from the TV:

B Note

If no audio signal is detected, the TV automatically switches off audio output and does not indicate malfunction.

- Check that all cables are properly connected.
- Check that the volume is not set to 0.
- Check that the sound is not muted.

There is picture but sound quality is poor:

• Check Sound settings as described in Section 5.3.4 Adjust sound settings, verifying that Stereo selected and Equalizer settings are correct. If needed, try resetting audio settings to standard.

There is picture but sound comes from one speaker only:

• Verify that **Balance** correctly set as described in Section 5.3.4 Adjust sound settings.

9.4 HDMI connection issues

You encounter problems with HDMI devices

- HDCP support can delay the time taken for a TV to display content from a device.
- If the TV does not recognise the device and the screen displays no picture, try switching from one device to another and back again to restart.
- If you experience intermittent sound disruptions, check the user manual of the HDMI device to verify that output settings are correct. Alternatively, try connecting the audio signal from the HDMI device to the TV via AUDIO IN at the back of the TV.
- If a HDMI-to-DVI adaptor or HDMI to DVI cable is used, check that an additional audio cable is connected to AUDIO IN.

9.5 PC connection issues

The PC display on my TV is not stable or is not synchronised:

 Check that a supported resolution and refresh rate is selected on your PC.
 See Section 8 Technical specifications for supported resolutions and refresh rates
