Change the Language

Adjust the Picture Settings Manually

Change the Aspect Ratio

[Zoom in Subtitle]: display the image in 4:3 format, zoom in the subtitles to fit the width of the screen, but part of the image will be cut off on the top.



[16:9]: adjust the aspect ratio from 4:3 to 16:9.

Use the Smart Sound

You can use the predefined sound settings.

- 1. Press the ightharpoonup key.
- 2. Select one of the following options and then press the OK key.
 - [Standard]: suitable for most environments and signal sources.
 - [Music]: suitablefor music files.
 - [Film]: suitable for video files.

Adjust the Sound Settings Manually

Change the Other Settings

- Select one of the following options and then press ▶ to enter:
 - [Menu Language]: change the menu language.
 - [Menu Timeout]: set the time for displaying menu to 15s/30s/45s/60s.
 - Menu Transparency]:
 change the menu transparency
 (0~100).

- [Blue Screen] :enable or disable the blue screen display function.
- [Sleep Timer]: set the time period before the TV is switched to standby mode (0~180 min).
- [Dynamic Backlight]: turn on/off the dynamic backlight (this optional function may vary depending on the actual products).
- [System Reset]: restore the image and sound settings to the factory default settings (the channel settings will not be reset).

Use the Sleep Timer

You can switch the TV to the standby mode after a preset amount of time. Auto Switch to Standby Mode (Sleep Timer)

You can use the sleep timer to switch the TV to the standby mode when the preset time is out.



Tips:

• You can turn off the TV before

the preset time or reset the sleep timer in the countdown process.

- 1. Press the Menu key.
- Select [Setup] → [Options] →
 [Sleep Timer].
 - → The sleep timer will be displayed.
- 3. Select a preset time from $0^{\sim}180$ min.
 - The preset time is available in multiple of 10 minutes. If you set it to "0 min", the sleep timer will be disabled.
- 4. You can also press the Sleep key on the remote control to set the sleep time.

 Press the OK key to start the sleep timer.
 - → The TV will enter standby mode when the preset time is out.

Use the Lock Function

This function can prevent your child watching certain programs or channels.

Set or Change the Password

- 1. Press the Menu key.
- 2. Select [Setup] → [Child Lock].
- 3. Press the numeric keys on the remote control to input your password.

→ Follow the instructions on the screen to set or change your password.



Tips:

- If you've forgotten your password, please input "3448" to overwrite it.
- After setting a new password, you may need it when making some settings.

Lock/Unlock Channels

- 1. Press the Menu key.
- 2. Select [Setup] → [Child Lock]
 - → [Lock Channel] and then nput your password.
 - → The channel list will be displayed.
- Select the channel to be locked or unlocked and then press the OK key.
 - → You are required to input the password when you watch the locked channel for the first time.
- 4. Exit the main menu, and the lock settings will come into effect immediately.

 The child lock function works in TV mode only.

 - Select the USB device you've inserted and then press the OK key.
 - → Enter the USB browser.

View Photos

- Select [Photo] on the USB browser and then press the OK key.
- 2. Select a photo or folder and then press the OK key. The photo will be auto played in full screen.

View Photos as Slide Show

- When a photo is played in full screen, you can press the OK key:
 - → To view photos as slide show starting from the current photo.

Auto Scan

Step 1: Select a menu language

- Select [Setup] → [Options] →
 [Me nu Language] and then press
 to enter.
- 3. Select your desired language.

Step 2: Channel auto scan

- 1. Press the Menu key.
- Select [Setup] → [Channel] →
 [Auto Scan] and then press ▶. to
 enter.
- 3. Press the OK key to start the auto scan.

Manual Scan

Step 1: Select your TV system.



Note:

- If your system has been set correctly, you can skip this step.
- 1. Press the Menu key.
- 2. Select [Setup] → [Channel].
- 3. Select your [Color System] and [Sound System].

Step 2: Search and save new channels.

- 1. Press the Menu key.
- Select [Setup] → [Channel] →
 [Manual Scan].

- Select [Channel] and then press
 ▲▼ to select a channel number.
- Select [Search] and then press
 ▲▼ to start channel scanning.
- 3. When searching is finished:
- Select [Done] to save the searched channel as the current channel.

Step 3: Fine tune the analog channels.

- 1. Press the Menu key.
- Select [Setup] → [Channel] →
 [Fine Tune].
- Press ▲▼ to adjust the channel frequency.
- 4. Select [Done] to exit the fine tuning.

Channel Edit

 [Watch], [Delete] or [Skip].

9. Trouble Shooting

In case of trouble, before you ask for services, please conduct simple troubleshooting as below.

Common Troubles

Power - on failure:

- Unplug the power cord from the socket. Reconnect it after one minute.
- Check if the mains lead is connected firmly.

Abnormal operation of remote control:

- Check if the battery electrodes
 (+/-)in the remote control are
 proper.
- If the battery gets exhausted or leaks, replace it.
- Clean the remote control and the TV sensor.

Standby indicator light flashes:

 Unplug the power cord from the socket, and reconnect it when the TV cools down.
 If this trouble still exists, please contact with the Philips customer service.

Forget the unlock password:

 Select [Child Lock]>[Change Password], and input 3448 to overwrite the current password.

Menu displayed in foreign language :

• Set the menu to your desired language.

When the TV is starting or switched to standby mode, it makes squeak sound:

 No operation is needed. This is normal when the TV cools down or gets preheating.

Channel Troubles

Image Troubles

No image after powering on the TV:

- Check if the antenna has been connected properly.
- Check if a proper device is selected as the signal source.

Sound without Image:

 Check if the image setting is correct.

Poor signal receiving may be caused by improper antenna connection.

- Check if the antenna has been connected with the TV properly.
- The receiving quality may be affected by loudspeakers, audio device without grounding, neon light, high-rise buildings, and other massive

objects. If possible, please try to change the antenna direction or keep the said devices away from the TV to improve the receiving quality.

 In case of poor receiving quality in only one channel, please make a fine tuning for this channel.

Poor image qualityfor devices connected:

- Check if the device is properly connected.
- Check if the image setting is correct.

Image setting not saved:

 Check if the TV setting has been set to Home Mode. You can change and save settings flexibly in this mode.

Image Size does not fit the Screen:

• Try to use another aspect ratio for image.

Improper image position:

 The image signal from certain devices may not fit the screen.
 Please check the signal output of the device.

Audio Troubles

Image without sound:



- If no audio signal can be detected, the TV will disable the audio output automatically, which doesn't mean trouble.
- Check if all cables are connected properly.
- Check if the volume is set to 0.
- Check if the sound is muted.

Image with poor sound quality:

 Check if the sound setting is correct.

Only one speaker works:

• Check if the Sound Balance is set to Middle.

HDMI Connection

Trouble in HDMI Devices:

- Please notice that HDCP support may cause delay to display the content of HDMI devices.
- If the TV doesn't identify the HDMI device and display no image, please try to switch the signal source to another device, and then switch back.
- In case of intermittent sound, please check if the output setting of the HDMI device is correct.

 If you use a HDMI – DVI adaptor or a HDMI – DVI cable, please check if the additional audio cable has been connected to AUDIO port (only for the mini – jack).

Computer Connection

Unstable Display on TV

- Check the resolution and refresh rate is supported by your PC.
- Set the TV image format to Uncompressed.
