- [Menu language]: Selects the onscreen display menu language. Due to specification differences, the number of menu languages available on the disc player varies from that on the TV.
- [Screen saver]: Enables or disables screen saver mode. If enabled, the screen enters idle mode after 5 minutes of inactivity (for example, in pause or stop mode).
- [Disc lock]: Selects [On] to lock the disc in the disc compartment. If locked, you need to enter the password to access the disc every time you play the locked disc.

- [Password setup]: Sets or changes a PIN code to play a restricted disc.
 - [Password mode]: Enables or disables password settings.
 - [Password]: Sets or changes the password for locked disc and restricted disc playback.
- [Default]: Resets the disc player to the default settings programmed at the factory.
- **[Version info.]**: Displays the current software version of the disc player.



Note

 You cannot reset disc lock, password (PIN code) and parental control settings to their default values.

Update the disc player software

To check for new updates, compare the current software version of your disc player with the latest software version (if available) on the Philips web site.



Rename devices from the home menu

- [Custom tint]: Customises tint setting. (Only available if [Tint] > [Custom] is selected)
- [Digital Crystal Clear]: Fine-tunes each pixel to match surrounding pixels. This produces a brilliant, high-definition image.
 - [Dynamic contrast]: Enhances contrast. A [Medium] setting is recommended.
 - [Dynamic backlight]: Adjusts brightness of the TV backlight to match lighting conditions.
 - [MPEG artifact reduction]:
 Smoothes out transitions on digital pictures. You can switch this feature on or off.
 - [Colour enhancement]: Makes
 colours more vivid and improves
 the details in bright colours. You can
 switch this feature on or off.

- [PC mode]: Adjusts the picture when a PC is connected to the TV via HDMI or DVI.
- [Picture format]: Changes the picture format.
- [Picture size]: Adjusts the viewing area.
 (when set to maximum, you might see noise or a rough edge of an image.)

- 1 When watching TV, press **OK** to display the channel grid.

Rename channels

You can rename channels. The name appears when you select the channel.

10 Troubleshooting

This section describes commonly encountered issues and accompanying solutions.

General issues

The TV does not switch on:

- Disconnect the power cable from the power outlet. Wait for one minute then reconnect it.
- Check that the power cable is securely connected.

The remote control is not working properly:

- Aim the remote control directly at the sensor on the front panel.
- Check that the remote control batteries are correctly inserted according to the +/- orientation.
- Replace the remote control batteries if they are flat or weak.
- Clean the remote control and TV sensor lens.

The standby light on the TV blinks red:

 Disconnect the power cable from the power outlet. Wait until the TV cools down before reconnecting the power cable. If the blinking reoccurs, contact Philips Consumer Care.

You forgot the code to unlock the lock feature.

Enter '8888'.

The TV menu is in the wrong language.

• Change the TV menu to your preferred language.

When turning the TV on / off / to standby, you hear a creaking sound from the TV chassis:

 No action is required. The creaking sound is normal expansion and contraction of the TV as it cools down and warms up. This does not impact performance.

TV channel issues

Previously installed channels do not appear in the channel list:

Check that the correct channel list is selected.

No digital channels were found during the installation:

 Check that the TV supports DVB-T, DVB-T Lite or DVB-C in your country.

Some channels are not automatically installed on my TV:

 During installation, make sure that you select the country where you are installing the TV (see 'Step 2 Select your country' on page 33).

Picture issues

The TV is on, but there is no picture:

- Check that the antenna is properly connected to the TV.
- Check that the correct device is selected as the TV source.
- Check that the TV is switched to the disc source. Press n, then select [Play disc].

There is sound but no picture:

 Check that the picture settings are correctly set.

There is poor TV reception from an antenna connection:

- Check that the antenna is properly connected to the TV.
- Loudspeakers, unearthed audio devices, neon lights, high buildings and other large objects can influence reception quality.
 If possible, try to improve the reception quality by changing the antenna direction or moving devices away from the TV.
- If reception on only one channel is poor, fine tune this channel.

There is poor picture quality from connected devices:

- Check that the devices are connected properly.
- Check that the picture settings are correctly set.

The TV did not save your picture settings:

 Check that the TV location is set to the home setting. This mode offers you the flexibility to change and save settings.

The picture does not fit the screen; it is too big or too small:

• Try using a different picture format.

The picture position is incorrect:

 Picture signals from some devices may not fit the screen correctly. Check the signal output of the device.

Cannot remove 'e-sticker' banner displayed on the TV.

- To remove the logos and images, set the location of your TV to home.
- 1. Press f.
- 2. Select [Setup] > [Installation] > [Preferences] > [Location].
- 3. Select [Home] and press OK.

Sound issues

There is a picture but sound quality is poor:



Note

- If no audio signal is detected, the TV automatically switches the audio output off — this does not indicate malfunction.
- Check that all cables are properly connected.
- Check that the volume is not set to 0.
- · Check that the sound is not muted.

There is a picture but the sound quality is poor:

 Check that the sound settings are correctly set.

There is a picture but sound comes from one speaker only:

Verify that sound balance is set to the centre.

Disc player issues

Disc cannot be played.

- Clean the disc.
- Check that the disc player supports the disc format.
- Check that the disc player supports the region code of the DVD.
- For DVD±RW or DVD±R, ensure that the disc is finalised.
- Check that the disc is inserted correctly, with the disc label facing up.

The menu of the disc player does not appear when the disc is ejected.

 Press ♠ or • SOURCE to access the main menu.

No response from the disc player.

 The operation is not possible. Check the instructions on the disc.

HDMI connection issues

There are problems with HDMI devices:

- Note that HDCP (High-bandwidth Digital Content Protection) support can delay the time taken for a TV to display content from a HDMI device.
- If the TV does not recognise the HDMI device and no picture is displayed, try switching the source from one device to another and back again.
- If there are intermittent sound disruptions, check that output settings from the HDMI device are correct.
- If you use an HDMI-to-DVI adapter or HDMI-to-DVI cable, check that an additional audio cable is connected to AUDIO (mini-jack only).

Computer connection issues

The computer display on the TV is not stable:

- Check that your PC uses the supported resolution and refresh rate.
- Set the TV picture format to unscaled.



Information about how to re-tune your TV during the digital TV switchover.

Keep this user manual safe – you'll need it.





Television in the UK is going digital, bringing us all more choice and new services. Starting in late 2007 and ending in 2012, television services in the UK will go completely digital, TV region by TV region.

Please see the next page to find out when your area switches to digital.

Digital UK is the independent, non-profit organisation leading the process of digital TV switchover in the UK. Digital UK provides impartial information on what people need to do to prepare for the move to digital, and when they need to do it.

How the switchover affects your TV equipment:

Your new TV has a digital tuner built in, which means it is ready to receive the Freeview signal by simply plugging it into your aerial socket (check if you can get digital TV through your aerial now, or whether you'll have to wait until switchover, at www.digitaluk.co.uk).

When the TV switchover happens in your area, there are at least two occasions when you will need to re-tune your TV in order to continue receiving your existing TV channels, and also to pick up new ones.

Digital UK, the body leading the digital TV switchover, will advise you when you need to re-tune during the switchover.

If you choose to connect your TV to satellite or cable with a digital box then it will not be affected by switchover, and you won't need to re-tune.

How to re-tune:

Go to section 6 Install channels.

If you do not re-tune your channels when advised to do so by Digital UK, you may lose some or all of your channels until you do re-tune. You should re-tune your TV every few months to check for any new channels.

If you are missing any channels, it may be that they are not available in your area, or that your aerial needs upgrading.
