# Softkeys

The left and right soft keys  $\Box$  and  $\Box$  located at the top of the keypad allow you to select the corresponding options that appear on the screen immediately above them, including in-call options. The functions associated with these keys may vary

according to the current context.

Presented in the form of a grid, the Main Menu enables access to the various features available in your mobile phone. The table above summarises the arrangement of the *Main Menu*.

Press in idle mode to access the *Main Menu* and use the navigation keys of which the directions are represented in this user guide as •, •, • or • to browse the icons and lists. Within lists, press it to access the options associated with the selected item, press *Back* to go back one level.

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# I. Getting Started

Please read the safety instructions in the "Precautions" section before using your phone.

To use your phone, you must insert a valid SIM card supplied by your network operator or retailer. The SIM card contains your subscription information, your mobile phone number and a memory in which you can store phone numbers and messages. For more information, see "Phone Book" on page 12.


# Insert the SIM card and Battery

Follow the steps below to insert your new SIM card.

Remember to switch off your mobile phone before removing the battery.


### Remove the battery

To insert the SIM card, you must first remove the battery. Lift up the battery from the bottom to remove it.



### Insert the SIM card

Slide the SIM card into the SIM card slot, making sure that the clipped corner of the card is pointing the right direction and that the gold contacts are facing downwards.



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Place the battery back into its slot, with the gold contacts of the battery facing the corresponding gold contacts on the side of the phone. The gold contacts on the phone are positioned on the right hand side of the phone, besides the SIM card slot.

# Switch on the phone

To switch on the phone, long press key. Enter the PIN code if required. The PIN code is a 4- to 8-digit secret code of your SIM card. It is preconfigured and communicated to you by your network operator or retailer. For more information on PIN codes, see "Security Setup" on page 29.

If you enter an incorrect PIN code three times in succession, your SIM card will be locked. To unlock it, you must obtain the PUK code from your network operator.

# Charge the battery

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable battery. A new battery is partially charged and a sound alert will warn you when the battery reaches low. Once you have installed the battery, you can start charging the phone.

Plug in the charger connector as shown below. Then plug the other end into a mains AC power socket.



The battery symbol indicates the state of charge. During charging, the charge indicators will scroll. When all the scroll bars are steady, the battery is fully charged. You can then disconnect the charger.

Keeping the charger plugged to the mobile phone when the battery is fully charged will not damage the battery.

The only way to turn off the charger is to unplug it, so use an easily accessible AC power socket. If the mobile phone automatically shuts down, or indicates Battery is low, you should immediately charge the battery. If the battery power has not been entirely used up before recharging, the recharging duration will be automatically reduced.

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### **Shortcuts function**

Your phone provides 10 quick access to the functions on your phone. You can modify the shortcuts according to your needs. For more information, see "Shortcuts" on page 44.

# 2. Calling

#### Make a call

#### From idle screen

- In idle mode, enter the phone number with the keypad. To correct an error, press \( \subseteq \).
- 2. Press To dial the number.
- 3. Press 🔻 to hang up.

To make an international call, quickly press twice to insert the international prefix "+".

### Using the phonebook

- Press in idle mode.
- Select a contact from the list, press ☐ and select
   Dial or press ☐ to dial the selected number. To
   select a different number, press ▲ or ▼ (see
   "Phone Book" for more information).
- 3. Press 🔻 to hang up.

### Answer and end a call

When there is an incoming call, the number of the caller may be displayed if the caller has chosen to display his or her identity. If the number is stored in the phonebook, the corresponding name will be displayed instead of the number.

- To answer the call: press  $\Box$  or  $\overline{o}$ K.
- To reject the call: press 

  . If you have activated Call
  Divert, the call will be diverted to another number or
  your voice mail.
- To hang up: press or close the slider of the phone.

The phone will not ring when it is in silent mode.

If you have selected *Any Key*, you can answer a call by pressing any key, except  $\overline{P}$  and  $\overline{P}$ .

### Call handsfree

For your own comfort and safety, ensure that you move the phone away from your ear when calling handsfree, especially when increasing the volume.

Press Option and select H-Free during a call to activate handsfree mode. To deactivate handsfree, press again and select H-Free to switch off handsfree mode.

# Options during a call

During a call, press Option to access the following options:

# Mute (On/Off)

This option allows you to mute or unmute the microphone so that your correspondent cannot hear you.

#### Sound Recorder

In most countries, recording of telephone conversation is subject to legislation. We advise you to notify the caller if you intend to record the conversation and only do so if they agree. You should also ensure confidentiality of the recordings.

To record a conversation during a call, press and select Sound Recorder. Recorded sound is saved in \*.amr or \*.wav formats and stored in Sound Recorder of Multimedia menu.

# Other options during a call

Press Option to carry out the following operations during a call.

Put the call on *Hold*, make a *New call*, access *Phone Book* to search for an entry, send or read *SMS*.

# Adjust earpiece volume

During a call, press the volume up or down side keys to increase or decrease the volume

# Speed Dial

# Speed dial via SIM phonebook

If you know the memory location number of the contact you wish to call (for example: memory location 5), you can simply enter 5# in idle mode to automatically dial the pre-set contact.

# Speed dial via call logs

In idle mode, press  $\Box$  to access *Call Logs*. Select a number you wish to call and press  $\Box$  to dial the number.

# Make an emergency call

#### Without SIM card

When you switch on your phone, the screen will prompt you to insert the SIM card. To dial the emergency number, simply press  $\Xi$  SOS.

#### With SIM card

In idle mode, enter 112 with the keypad and press to dial.

# Handle multiple calls

You can handle two or more calls at the same time, as well as make conference calls with your phone. The availability of this feature is dependent on your network operator and/or your subscription.

#### Make a second call

You can make a second call when there is an active call or with a call on hold. While on the phone, dial the number (or select a contact from the phonebook) and press . The first call is put on hold and the second number is dialled. You can then press - to access the following options:

- Swap to toggle between 2 calls.
- Conference to introduce the caller into a conference call.

#### Answer a second call

When you receive a second call while already in communication, the phone will emit a beep tone and the screen displays information about the incoming call. You can then:

Press -To answer the call (the first one is put on hold).

Press 🖃 or 🕝 To reject the call.

Press Option To access the options list. You can select End to end the current call and answer the incoming call.

To receive a second call, you must first deactivate Call Divert and activate Call Waiting.

# 3. Text or number Entry

# **Input Method**

Your phone supports 4 types of input methods: Multitap ABC/abc Smart ABC/abc Numeric Symbols

You can select in the option list the appropriate input method to enter English letters, words, symbols and numbers. Icons appearing on the screen indicate the active input mode.

# **Function keys**

- Delete the characters on the left of the cursor or exit from editing mode.
- ▲/▼/•/► Move the cursor, select a letter, word or symbol from the list, or scroll down a list.
- Return to idle mode.
- Select the highlighted word from the list or enter Options menu.
- Enter symbols.
- Switch input mode.

# Multitap ABC/abc Input

- Press once on the numeric key ( ) to enter the first letter on the key, press twice to enter the second letter on the key, so on and so forth. If the letter you wish to enter and the one you have just entered are on the same key, just wait for a few seconds for the cursor to re-appear.
- Press 

  to delete the characters on the left of the cursor.

You can press key . to insert a space in ABC/abc Multitap input mode.

# **Smart ABC/abc Input**

Smart English input method offers a faster way for you to enter English words.

- Press to delete the entries on the left of the cursor.
- Use the navigation key to select the desired word and press to enter it.

# **Numeric input**

- Press the numeric keys ( to enter the numbers corresponding to the keys.
- 2. To delete a number, press :

# **Symbol Input**

Select *Input Symbols* from the input method list or press to enter punctuation or symbols. Use the navigation keys to select the desired punctuation or symbol and press to enter it. Press to scroll down the list of punctuation or symbols.

### 4. Phone Book

Contacts are stored in one of the two available phonebooks: SIM phonebook (located on your SIM card, by which the number of entries you can store depends on the card capacity) or the Smart Phonebook (located on your phone, which allows you to store up to 500 names). When adding new contacts, the contacts will only be added to the phonebook you have selected.

# Search for a contact in the phonebook

# **Quick Search option**

- Enter Phone Book in idle mode and select Quick Search.
- 2. Enter the name of the contact.

## Search Entry option

- Enter Phone Book in idle mode and select Search Entry.
- 2. Enter the name of the contact, press Option and press —.

#### Phone Book List

Press • in idle mode to access phone book list and press the key that corresponds to the letter you wish to search (e.g. press by key three times to access the letter U). The first record starting with this letter in the list will be selected.

# Add new entry

- Enter Phone Book in idle mode and select Add New Entry. Select the storage location and press .
- 2. If you select To SIM, you need to enter the Name and Number. After you have entered the name, press . Then enter the phone number and press . You can enter the telephone numbers saved in the SIM phone book into different groups according to your relation to the people.

3. If you select To Phone, the procedures will be the same as above. You can enter the contact's Name, Number, Home Number, Company Name, E-mail Address, Office Number, Fax Number and Birthday. You can also Associate Picture, Associate Sound, Associate video as well as Associate Caller Group to the contact. Press To confirm. The phone will display a notification to confirm that the contact has been saved.

# Copy all

You can copy all the contacts in your phone to your SIM card and vice-versa.

- Enter Phone Book in idle mode, select Copy All and press .
- 2. Select From SIM or From Phone, and press .
- Confirmation prompts will be displayed on the screen. Select Yes to confirm the operation or select No to cancel the operation.

When you copy telephone number entries from your mobile phone onto your SIM card, only the names and telephone numbers will be copied.

# Copy or move a phonebook entry

- 1. Select a contact from the Phone Book List and press [-] Option.
- 2. Select Copy/ Move/ Duplicate and press -.

Copy Copy the contact to another phonebook.

Move Move the contact to another phonebook.

Duplicate Duplicate the contact within the same phonebook.

#### **Delete**

You can select *From SIM* or *From Phone* to delete all the entries in the SIM card or mobile phone phonebook respectively. You can select *One By One* to delete a telephone number.

Delete all the entries from SIM card or phone. You need to input a password for the delete all feature. The default password is "0000".

# **Caller Group**

This option allows you to group the contacts in the phonebook for more efficient management of your contacts.

- Enter Phone Book in idle mode and select Caller Group.
- 2. Select a group and press  $\overline{-}$ .
- Select the option for which you wish to modify its settings.

You can set the following options:

Group name Set group name.

Ring type Set the ring tone for incoming calls from the contacts in the caller group.

Picture Set the icon to be displayed on the screen when there is an incoming call

from the contacts in the caller group.

Video

Set the video to be played on the

screen when there is an incoming call from the contacts in the caller group.

#### Extra Number

#### Owner Number

The *Owner Number* option should contain your own phone number. If not, we recommend that you enter your own mobile phone number and other relevant information.

#### Service Dial Number

This service is provided by your network operator. For more information regarding the corresponding function, please contact your network operator.

#### SOS Number

This SOS number will call the emergency services number in your country. In most cases, you can call this number even if you have not yet inserted a SIM card or entered your PIN.

Depending on your network operator, you may be able to dial the emergency number even without inserting the SIM card.

# **Memory Status**

Displays the total number of contacts you have stored in each phonebook and the total memory used.

### **Preferred Storage**

Allows you to set the default phonebook in which you save your contacts.

#### **Fields**

Allows you to select the items such as Home Number, Company Name, Email Address, Office Number, Fax Number, Birthday, Associate Picture/Video/Sound and Caller Group to be displayed in the Smart Phonebook.

### My vcard

Allows you to edit or send your personal details.

## **Caller Picture**

Allows you to assign a picture from the picture folder in *File Manager* menu as the caller picture.

# **Caller Ring Tone**

Allows you to assign a ring tone saved in the mobile phone or delivered to you and saved in the *User Profiles* menu as the caller ring tone.

#### Caller Video

Allows you to assign a video from the video folder in File Manager menu as the caller video.

### **SMS**

This menu allows you to send text messages using Short Messaging Service (SMS), as well as manage the messages you have sent and received.

When you send a message via the SMS network, your phone may display "Sent". This means the message has been sent to the SMS center which you have set in your SIM card. However, this does not imply that the message has been sent to its destination.

#### Delete

This menu allows you to delete all the messages in *Inbox*, *Outbox* and all storage locations where the messages are saved.

### Template

This menu allows you to preset up to 10 messages that you use most frequently. Select a template and press  $\Box$  to access the following options:

Enter a new message or edit the

### Message Settings

This menu allows you to configure the SMS settings. The options include:

#### **Profile Setting**

messages will be stored in the SMS centre. This is useful when the recipient is not connected to the network (and thus cannot receive

#### **Common Setting**

Delivery Report When On, this option will notify

you via SMS whether your recipient has received your SMS. This feature

is subscription dependent.

#### **Memory Status**

Displays the memory status of the messages saved in the SIM card and the phone.

#### Pref. Bearer

This option allows you to set the preferred transmission mode. For further details, please contact your network operator.

### **MMS**

Cc

Your mobile phone can also send and receive MMS (Multimedia Messaging Service) messages. With MMS, you can send messages that contain pictures, sound and text.

When sending MMS messages, your recipient must also have an MMS-enabled phone in order to view your messages.

### Write Message

Follow the steps described below to compose and send an MMS:

#### Chat

This menu allows you to chat with your contact via SMS.

- 3. Select Start New, enter the message, then send the message to start chatting with your contact.

### Voice Mail Server

This menu allows you to set your voice mail server number, as well as retrieve your voice mails. When you receive a voice mail, your network operator will send a notification to your phone.

You can enter two sets of voice mail server numbers which are supplied by your network operator.

Select a voice mail box and press  $\Box$  to access the following options:

Fdit

Edit voice mail server number.

Connect to Voice Retrieve your voice mail.

You can quickly access your voice mail server by long pressing key in idle mode.

# **Broadcast Message**

Broadcast messages are public messages broadcasted to a group of mobile users. The messages are broadcasted on coded channels. Generally, one broadcast channel can transmit one type of message. Please contact your network operator for a list of channel numbers and their respective broadcast information.

#### Receive Mode

This menu allows you to set the reception of broadcast messages. When On, you can receive broadcast messages. When Off, you cannot receive broadcast messages.

### Read Message

To read broadcast messages after you have activated receive mode

### Languages

To set the language of the broadcast messages that can be received.

### **Channel Setting**

Press To access channel settings. You can Select, Add, Edit or Delete channels.

# 6. Call History

Your mobile phone can provide you with a list of outgoing and incoming calls, attempts at auto redialling, as well as call details. The different types of calls (Dialed Calls, Missed Calls and Received Calls) are represented by different icons. They are displayed in chronological order with the most recent call on top. If the correspondent is stored in your phonebook, the corresponding name is displayed.

### **Missed Calls**

This menu allows you to view the recent unanswered calls. You can view the date, time and the number of times you have missed each call.

Select an item and press to view the date, time and number. Press Option to access the following options:

Delete the number.

Save to Phone book Save the number.

Dial Dial the number.

IP Dial If the IP number.

If the IP number has been set, select IP Dial will automatically add the IP number before the number and dial it.

Send SMS Send an SMS to the missed

Edit the missed number.

### **Dialed Calls**

This menu allows you to view the recent dialled calls, including dialling attempts or calls that were successfully connected.

#### **Received Calls**

This menu allows you to view the recent calls received.

# **Delete Call Log**

This menu allows you to delete Missed Calls, Dialed Calls, Received Calls or Delete All.

### **Call Time**

This menu allows you to view Last Call Time, Total Sent and Total Received (displayed in hours, minutes, seconds). You can select Reset All Time to reset all the call timers.

Depending on your network, rounding-off for billing purposes, taxes etc, the actual time invoiced for calls and services by your service provider may vary.

#### Call Cost

#### Last Call Cost

Displays the cost of the last call.

#### **Total Cost**

Displays the total cost of all calls since the cost counter was last reset. If the total cost exceeds the maximum cost set in the *Max Cost* option, you will not be able to make any more calls until you reset the counter.

#### Reset Cost

Reset the cost counter. You need to enter your PIN2 code and confirm.

#### Max Cost

Set the maximum cost of your calls (PIN2 code is required).

#### Price Per Unit

Allows you to set the unit price for the call cost. This unit price shall be used for calculating the cost of your calls (PIN2 code is required).

Displays the number of messages that have been sent and received

### **GPRS** Counter

Tabulates the amount of data sent and received via GPRS. You can also reset the counter. The unit of measurement is Byte.

This menu allows you to change the settings associated with each available option in your phone (time and date, security, call divert, etc.).

# Phone Setup

#### Time and Date

Allows you to set the time and date with the keypad or navigation keys. You can set the following:

Set Home City Select the city you are currently situated.

Set Time/Date Enter the time/date with the keypad or navigation keys.

Set Format Set Time Format and Date Format.

## Schedule Power On/Off

This menu allows you to set the time to power on or off your phone automatically. Select an item and press [ ] to access the following options:

Status You can select Enable (Activate the setting) or Disable (Deactivate the

setting).

Power On/Off Select whether to power on or off your phone at the specified time.

Time Enter the time with the keypad.

### Language

This menu allows you to select a language for all the menu texts. Press • or • to browse the list of languages and press  $\Box$  to select.

### Preferred Input Methods

This menu allows you to set the default input method.

### Default Encoding Type

You can select "BIG5" or "GB2312". Select "BIG5", traditional Chinese encode type; Select "GB2312", simple Chinese encode type. If some Chinese can't be displayed, please convert the encoding type, then view it.

Note: When traditional Chinese and simple Chinese both can be displayed, you need to select the encoding type

### **Greeting Text**

Turn On or Off, and edit the greeting text of the phone.

### Speed Dial

This menu allows you to quickly dial the number stored in your phonebook. You can set a maximum of 8 speed dial numbers, so that a long press on the numeric key will dial the number associated with that numeric key. You need to set *Enable Speed Dial* and *Set Number*.

#### Shortcuts

This menu allows you to quickly enter the 10 preset menu items. You can also modify the preset menu items according to your needs.

To access the shortcuts menu, select Main Menu > Settings > Phone Setup > Shortcuts in idle mode. Press Option to access the following options:

Add To add a new shortcut.

Edit To edit an existing shortcut.

Delete To delete an existing shortcut.

Delete All To delete all the shortcuts.

Disable To disable the shortcut. You can press

this option a second time to enable the

shortcut.

Change To change the order of the shortcuts. For example, you can change the first shortcut

to become the third shortcut in the list.

### **Dedicated** key

In idle mode, you can quickly access certain preset functions by pressing the navigation keys. This menu allows you to modify the preset functions according to your needs.

# Flight Mode

This menu allows you to set your menu to Normal Mode or Flight Mode. You can also select Query When Power On so that you will be asked which mode you prefer when the phone is powered on. If Flight Mode is activated, network function will be closed and all related network operations will be prohibited.

# Misc. Setting

This menu allows you to set the *Brightness* and *Time* of the LCD Backlight.

# **Display Characteristics**

Themes Select menu colour: Blue, Green or Red

then activate the current theme, and

change the menu colour.

Wallpaper Set the background image of the main

screen displayed in idle mode: Choose

System to select a predefined image or choose

User Define to select a

downloaded image.

Screen Saver

Select Setting to set the status and waiting time of the screen saver. Enter Select to choose System or User Define. The operation of this function is similar to Wallpaper.

Power On Display

Allows you to set the image displayed during power on: Choose *System* to select a predefined image or choose *User Define* to select a downloaded image.

Power Off Display

The operation is the same as Power On Display.

Main Menu Style Allows you to set the Main Menu style to *Matrix* or *Page*.

Show Date and Time

Set whether or not to display the date and time in idle mode by turning this option *On* or *Off*.

Show Owner Number If you have set the name and number in *Phone Book > Extra Number > Owner Number* menu, then the name will be displayed in idle mode. (Note: When the wallpaper is set as *Analog Clock* and *Digital Clock*, show owner number will not be displayed). You can turn this option *On* or *Off*.

Show Operator Name Set whether or not to display the network operator's name by turning this option *On* or *Off*.

# **Call Setup**

### Caller ID

Depending on your network, you may choose to show or hide your identity from your correspondent by selecting Set By Network, Hide ID or Send ID.

# **Call Waiting**

This option allows you to *Activate* or *Deactivate* call waiting. When this option is active, you will hear a beep tone when someone tries to call you while you are already on the phone. If this option is inactive, your phone will not emit any alert and the caller will hear a busy tone. If you have activated *Divert If Busy* option, the call will be diverted to another phone. Select *Query Status* to check the status of the call waiting option.

#### Call Divert

To divert incoming calls to your voice mailbox or to another phone number (regardless of whether or not the number is in your phonebook).

Divert All Voice Calls Divert all incoming calls. If you select this option, you will not receive any calls until you deactivate it.

Divert If Busy

Divert when you are already on the phone.

Divert If No Answer Divert when you did not answer the

Divert If Unreachable Divert when your phone is switched off or out of the service area

Divert All Data Divert all data calls.

Calls

Cancel All Cancel all call divert options.

Select Activate and enter the number to foward your calls to. Select Query Status to check the status of the corresponding call divert options.

Before diverting your calls to your voice mailbox, you must enter your voice mailbox number. This feature is subscription dependent.

## Call Barring

Allows you to limit the use of your phone to specific calls. This can be applied to Outgoing Calls (All Calls, International Calls or International Except Home) and/or to Incoming Calls (All Calls or When Roaming). In both

cases, Cancel All option applies to all calls at once.

Change Barring PW allows you to change the call barring password. Query Status allows you to check whether or not a particular type of call has been barred.

This feature is network dependent and requires a specific call barring password supplied by your service provider.

#### **Call Time Reminder**

This menu allows you to set whether or not the phone will emit a beep tone after a certain call duration. You can select Off (does not emit a beep tone), Single (select a value from 1 to 3000 seconds, which is the duration after which the phone will emit a beep tone) or Periodic (select a value from 30 to 60 seconds, which is the periodic time after which the phone will emit a beep tone after each periodic time during a call).

### Call Time Display

This menu allows you to set whether or not to display the call time during a call.

#### **Auto Redial**

If the call you have dialled is not answered, your phone will automatically redial this number at intervals. Press 🖻 or 🖃 to cancel auto redial.

#### IP Number

This menu allows you to store 3 groups of IP number so that you need not enter the number before you make an IP call. Press — Option to Activate or Edit the IP Number.

The IP number has to be supported by your network operator before you can make an IP call. When you change a new SIM card, the IP number you have stored will be cleared. The phone does not validate the IP number you have entered. Therefore, please ensure that the numbers are correct.

# **Network Setup**

#### **Network Selection**

This menu allows you to select the service network (we recommend that you select *Automatic*).

Automatic Your phone will automatically select and register to an available network.

Manual

Provides you with a list of available network in the area. Select the network you wish to register with and press 
to confirm.

You can select a network other than your home network only if it has a valid roaming agreement with your home network. If you change the network, some problems may arise during the operation of your phone.

### **Preferred Networks**

Allows you to build a network list in order of preference. Once defined, the phone will try to register to the network according to your preference.

#### **GPRS** Connection

This menu allows you to set the GPRS connection mode. You can select *Always* or *When Needed*.

# **Security Setup**

#### SIM Lock

When SIM Lock is activated, you must enter the PIN code (PIN code is supplied by your network operator together with the SIM card). If you enter an incorrect PIN code three times in succession, you need to enter the PUK code (PIN unlocking code). The PUK code is used to unlock or change the locked PIN code. If you are not supplied with the PUK code or have lost the number, please contact your network operator. Enter the PIN code and press . If SIM Lock is currently Off, the status will change to On and vice-versa.

#### Phone Lock

This menu allows you to set a password for your phone. The default setting is Off. Once you have set Phone Lock, you must enter the password each time you switch on your phone.

Enter the password and press  $\Box$ . If Phone Lock is currently Off, the status will change to On and vice-versa.

The default phone lock code is 0000.

### Auto Keypad Lock

This menu allows you to lock your keypad automatically. The default setting is Off.

Select the time interval after which the keypad will be locked and press [ ] to confirm.

The keypad will be locked/unlocked automatically when you close/open the slider.

#### Fixed Dial

This menu allows you to restrict your outgoing calls. You need to enter PIN2 code, which has to be supplied / supported by your network operator.

Mode

There are two modes: *On* (you only dial the numbers stored in the Fixed Dial List) and *Off* (you can dial any number).

Fixed Dial Displays the fixed dial list. Press Add, enter the name and phone number, then press f, enter PIN2 code and press f.

Not all SIM cards support PIN2 code. If your SIM card does not have a PIN2 code, this option is not available.

#### **Barred Dial**

This menu allows you to restrict different types of outgoing calls. You can activate or deactivate this feature if your SIM card supports it.

### **Change Password**

This menu allows you to change the PIN code, PIN2 code and Phone Lock Password.

#### PIN

It is supplied together with the SIM card. The default PIN code is supplied by your network operator.

If you enter an incorrect PIN code three times in succession, the PIN code of your SIM card will be locked automatically and you will be prompted to enter the PUK code to unlock it. You can obtain the PUK code from your network operator. If you enter an incorrect PUK code ten times in succession, the SIM card will be locked permanently. When this happens, please contact your network operator or retailer.

#### PIN<sub>2</sub>

It is used to access certain network functions such as call charges or fixed dial, etc. If you enter an incorrect PIN2 code three times in succession, the PIN2 code of your SIM card will be locked. To unlock PIN2 code, you need to obtain the PUK2 code from your network operator. If you enter an incorrect PUK2 code ten times in succession, the SIM card will be locked permanently. When this happens, contact your network operator or retailer.

#### **Phone Lock Password**

It protects your phone against unauthorised use by other parties. To protect your data, you need to enter the phone lock password before you restore factory settings. The default phone lock password is 0000.

# **Restore Factory Settings**

This menu allows you to reset your phone to its factory settings.

Enter the phone lock password and press [ ] to confirm.

Once you have entered the correct password (same as your Phone Lock Password, default value is 0000), your phone will be restored to its factory settings.

### Equalizer

This menu allows you to set the audio frequency when playing music.

#### Camera

Your phone provides the stopwatch function. There are two types of stopwatches available: *Typical Stopwatch* and *nWay Stopwatch*. When you select *Typical Stopwatch*, you can access the following options:

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#### II. Organizer

This menu contains features and options that are designed to help you get organised and be kept informed at all times.

#### Calendar

This menu allows you to view the calendar, and add tasks in the To Do List.

You can press the navigation keys to view the calendar.

Select a date that you wish to view and press [-] Option to access the following options:

Allows you to set date, time, notes and alarm for the task Press - to add new tasks, or edit and view existing task (for details, please refer to "To Do List").

This option allows you to access the internet. Your phone has been pre-configured with a number of internet access modes. You can start browsing the internet once you have activated an access mode.

#### Homepage

You can store a homepage for each access mode. When you access the internet with the WAP browser, the homepage of the access mode which you have selected will be displayed first.

#### **Bookmarks**

You can save the URL as a bookmark in your phone. Select a bookmark and press — Option to access the following options:

This menu allows you to set the properties of all WAP access mode. Please contact your network operator to obtain the correct settings.

This option allows you to set *Homepage*, *Gateway*, *Port* and *Data Account*.

#### **Color Setting**

This option allows you to set the colour of Normal Text, Link Text, Link Background, Active Text and Active Background.

#### **Advanced Setting**

This option allows you to manage your Cache Setting, Cookie Setting and Display Setting.

#### **Data Account**

This menu allows you to set your account information. The existing account information is supplied by the manufacturer.

#### **GSM Data**

You can set: Account Name, Number, User Name, Password, Line Type, Speed and DNS.

#### **GPRS**

You can set: Account Name, APN, User Name, Password, Auth. Type.

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### Icons & symbols

In idle mode, several symbols can be displayed simultaneously on the main screen.

If the network symbol is not displayed, the network is currently not available. You may be in a bad reception area; moving to a different location may help.

- Battery The bars indicate the battery level (4 bars=full, 1 bar=low).
- **GSM Network** your phone is connected to the GSM network. **Reception quality** the more bars are shown the better the reception is.
- Keypad lock The keypad has been locked.
- Alarm The alarm clock has been activated.
- **Ring** The phone will ring when there is an incoming call.
- **Vibration only** The phone will vibrate when there is an incoming call.
- Vibra and ring The phone will vibrate and ring when there is an incoming call.

- Vibra then ring The phone will vibrate then ring when there is an incoming call.
- Roaming Displayed when your phone is registered to a network other than your own (especially when you're abroad).
- GPRS network

  GPRS network
- Voice mail You have received a new voice mail.
- *Call divert* Your phone is in call divert state.
- Missed call You have a missed call.
- SMS message You have received a new SMS message.
- Headset The headset is plugged into the phone.
- MMS message You have received a new MMS message.
- Wap message You have received a Wap message.
- Recording Sound recording mode is activated during a call.

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#### **Precautions**

#### **Radio Waves**



Your cellular mobile phone is a **low power** radio transmitter and receiver. When it is operating, it sends and receives radio waves. The radio waves carry your voice or data

signal to a base station that is connected to the telephone network. The network controls the power at which the phone transmits.

- Your phone transmits/receives radio waves in the GSM frequency (900 / 1800 MHz).
- The GSM network controls transmission power (0.01 to 2 watts).
- Your phone complies with all relevant safety standards.
- The CE mark on your phone shows compliancy with European electromagnetic compatibility (Ref. 89/336/EEC) and low voltage directives (Ref. 73/ 23/EEC).

Your cellular mobile phone is your responsibility. To avoid damage to yourself, to others or to the phone itself, read and follow all the safety instructions and make them known to anyone borrowing your phone. Furthermore to prevent unauthorised use of your phone:



Keep your phone in a safe place and keep it out of small children's reach.

Avoid writing down your PIN code. Try to remember it instead.

Switch off the phone and remove the battery if you are going to leave it unused for a long time.

Change your PIN code after purchasing the phone and to activate call restriction options.



The design of your phone complies with all applicable laws and regulations. However your phone may cause interference with other electronic devices. Consequently you

should follow all local recommendations and regulations when using your cellular phone both at home and when away. Regulations on the use of cellular phones in vehicles and aircraft are particularly stringent.

Public concern has been focused for some time on the possible health risks for users of cellular phones. The current research on radio wave technology, including the GSM technology, has been reviewed and safety standards have been drawn up to ensure protection from exposure to radio wave energy. Your cellular telephone complies with all applicable safety standards and the Radio Equipment and Telecommunications Terminal Equipment Directive 1999/5/EC.

#### Always switch off your phone...

Inadequately protected or sensitive electronic equipment may be affected by radio energy. This interference can lead to accidents.



Before boarding an aircraft and/or when packing the phone in your luggage: the use of mobile phones in an aircraft may be dangerous for the operation of the aircraft, disrupt the mobile phones network and may be illegal.



In hospitals, clinics, other health care centres and anywhere else where you may be in the close vicinity of medical equipment.



In areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere (e.g. petrol stations and also areas where the air contains dust particles, such as metal powders).

In a vehicle transporting flammable products (even if the vehicle is parked) or a vehicle powered by liquefied petroleum gas (LPG), check first that the vehicle complies with the applicable safety rules.

In areas where you are requested to turn off radio transmitting devices, such as quarries or other areas where blasting operations are in progress.

#### Hearing aids

If you are a user of a hearing aid, consult your physician and hearing aid manufacturer to learn whether your particular device is susceptible to cellular phone interference.

#### Improved performance

In order to improve the performance of your phone, reduce radio energy emission, reduce battery consumption and ensure safe operation adhere to the following guidelines:



For the optimal and satisfactory operation of the phone you are recommended to use the phone in the normal operating position (when not using in hands-free mode or with a hands-free accessory).

- Do not expose your phone to extreme temperatures.
- Treat the phone with care. Any misuse will void the International Guarantee.
- Do not immerse the phone in any liquid; if your phone is damp, switch it off, remove the battery and let them dry for 24hrs before using them again.
- To clean the phone, wipe it with a soft cloth.
- Placing and receiving calls consumes the same amount of battery energy. However, the mobile consumes less energy in idle screen when kept in the same place. When in idle screen and while you are moving, your phone consumes energy to transmit updated location information to the network. Setting the backlight for a shorter period of time as well as avoiding unnecessary navigating in the menus will also help to save the battery's energy for longer phoning and stand-by performances.

#### **Battery information**

- Your phone is powered by a rechargeable battery.
- Use specified charger only.
- · Do not incinerate.
- Do not deform or open the battery.
- Do not allow metal objects (such as keys in your pocket) to short circuit the battery contacts.
- Avoid exposure to excessive heat (>60° C or 140° F), moisture or caustic environments.

#### Your mobile phone and your car



Studies have shown that speaking on the telephone while driving lowers your concentration, which can be dangerous. Adhere to the following guidelines:

- Give your full attention to driving. Pull off the road and park before using the phone.
- Respect the local regulations in countries where you drive and use your GSM phone.
- If you want to use your phone in a vehicle, install the hands-free car kit which is designed for that purpose.
- Ensure that your phone and car kit do not block any air bags or other security devices fitted in your car.

The use of an alarm system to operate a vehicle's light or horn to indicate incoming phone calls is prohibited on public roads in some countries. Check local regulations.

#### **EN 60950 Norm**

In hot weather or after prolonged exposure to the sun (e.g., behind a window or a windscreen), the temperature of your phone's casing might increase, especially when featuring a metallic finish. Be very careful in this case when picking up your phone and also avoid using it with an ambient temperature over 40° C or below 5° C.

### **Troubleshooting**

#### The phone does not switch on

Remove/reinstall the battery. Then charge the phone until the battery icon stops scrolling. Unplug the charger and try to switch on the phone.

#### Your phone doesn't return to idle screen

Long press the hangup key or switch off the phone, check that the SIM card and the battery are installed correctly and switch it on again.

#### The network symbol is not displayed

The network connection is lost. Either you are in a radio shadow (in a tunnel or between tall buildings) or you are outside the network coverage area. Try from another place, try to reconnect to the network (especially when abroad), check that the antenna is in place if your mobile phone has an external antenna, or contact your network operator for assistance/information.

## The display doesn't respond (or the display responds slowly) to key presses

The display responds more slowly at very low temperatures. This is normal and does not affect the operation of the phone. Take the phone to a warmer place and try again. In other cases, please contact your phone supplier.

#### Your battery seems to over heat

You might be using a charger that was not intended for your phone. Make sure you always use the Philips authentic accessory shipped with your phone.

## Your phone doesn't display the phone numbers of incoming calls

This feature is network and subscription dependent. If the network doesn't send the caller's number, the phone will display *Call I* or *Withheld* instead. Contact your network operator for more information.

#### You can't send text messages

Some networks don't allow message exchanges with other networks. First check that you have entered the number of your SMS centre, or contact your operator for more information.

#### You can't display pictures

A picture may not be accepted by your mobile phone if it is too large, if its name is too long, or if it doesn't have the correct file format.

## You have the feeling that you missed some calls

Check your call divert options.

#### The display shows INSERT SIM

Check that the SIM card has been inserted correctly. If the problem remains, your SIM card may be damaged. Contact your network operator.

## When attempting to use a feature in the menu, the mobile displays NOT ALLOWED

#### Your phone is not charging

#### Charger

Charges your battery in any AC outlet. Small enough to carry in a briefcase/handbag.

Your phone will activate headset mode automatically when you plug in the headset. And you can select "auto" option in answer mode. If this option's status

is "on", your phone will automatically answer the incoming call in 5 or 10 seconds.

#### **USB** cable

The USB cable enables high speed communication between your phone and your computer. You can then manage the information stored in your phone such as image, animation, photo, video and music. You can also use the cable to connect your phone to a Webcam or charge the battery (this charging mode is compatible with most computers).

#### Webcam

Your mobile phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy defined by the international standards. These recommendations have been established by the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP) and, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers - Standards Associations (IEEE-SA) that forcast a substantial safety margin for assuring the protection of all persons, regardless of age and health.

Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR levels of the mobile phone while operating are generally below the maximum SAR value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a base station antenna, the lower the power output.

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the international protection standards for exposure to radio waves.

The highest SAR value for this Philips 390 model phone when tested for compliance against the standard was 0,147W/kg for ICNIRP recommendation and 0.186W/kg for IEEE Standard.

For limiting the radio waves exposure, it is recommended to reduce the mobile phone call duration or to use a headset. The purpose of those precautions is to take the mobile phone away from the head and the body.
