Discover Your Phone



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user guide and the product described. The device is meant to be connected to GSM network.

How to...

Switch On/ Off	Press and hold .
Enter PIN code	Enter PIN code with the keypad and press (OH) to confirm.
Make a call	Enter phone number with the keypad and press to dial.
Make an IP call	Enter the phone number with the keypad. Press Options softkey and select IP call (if the IP prefix is already stored in the phonebook, it will be added automatically) and the number will be dialed.
Answer a call	Press Answer softkey or press when your phone rings, or tap the onscreen Handsfree button with your stylus pen.

Activate/deactivate handsfree mode	During a call, long press to activate/deactivate handsfree mode.
End a call	Press End softkey or to end a call. Closing the flip can also end a call (provided the headset is not inserted)
Reject a call	When the flip is opened, press Reject softkey or to reject a call, or tap the onscreen Busy button with your stylus pen. You can also long press left sidekey Mode/Menu or right sidekey [Multimedia] or Up/Down to reject a call.
Access the main menu	Press (III) in idle mode.
View phonebook	Press ▼ in idle mode.
Use phonebook	Press • or • to scroll up or down in the phonebook and press to dial the selected entry.

Access Call list	Press • in idle mode.
Return to previous menu	Press _c.
Quickly return to idle mode when browsing menu	Press to return to idle screen. The application you have last used will remain active, except for certain applications such as synchronization.
View the last call	Press in idle mode.
Access the menu functions	Press of and use , , , or to select a menu, then press of to enter the sub-menu. Repeat the process until you reached your desired function.
Start voice recording	During a call, press right sidekey [Multimedia].
End voice recording	During call recording, press right sidekey [Multimedia] .

Adjust conversation volume	During a call, press left sidekey [Mode] to increase the volume, or press left sidekey [Menu] to decrease the volume.
Activate Camera or Video functions	In idle mode, when the flip is opened, long press right sidekey [Multimedia] .
Close the camera function	Press _ in camera mode.

Touch screen

Warning! The stylus pen supplied with your product is the only tool that you can use when tapping the touch screen. Do NOT use any other tool on the touch screen.

Your mobile phone features a touch screen which provides a faster and more intuitive way for you to navigate through lists and menus. The touch screen is operated with a stylus pen located at the side of the phone. It becomes available as soon as you enter any of the available menus. Use the stylus pen to tap once or twice on any available screen zone to carry out the corresponding operations (such as menu page header, menu items, lists, left and right softkeys, options

menu, function keys, text input area, selection area, pull-down menu box, selection box, etc).

You will not be able to use the touch screen in some cases, as they are not able to replace the keys to carry out certain operations.

The screen will display lists and menus that can be selected with the stylus pen. You can select an item, move up and down or select a few items simultaneously.

SD Card

Your phone supports SD card. You can insert the card and browse its contents or manage the files with your phone. However, please do not remove your SD card while it is active or when you are browsing files in the card, as this may result in data loss. To remove the card, you must first end your current operation, then tap the SD card icon at the top of the screen with the stylus pen to disconnect it. You may then safely remove the SD card after it has been disconnected.

Your phone can only access the multimedia files located under "Philips" directory of your SD card. Please move or copy your multimedia files (such as pictures, videos and music) to the respective folders under "Philips" directory of your SD card via Resource Manager > File Manager menu of your phone before access.

Matrix

Matrix is a graphical representation of the menus, featuring icons. Each icon represents a feature or an operation of your phone.

You can access the phone's matrix by pressing (ok) in idle mode, then use the stylus pen or the navigation keys to select or activate a menu or option, or press to cancel.

Press or or vo switch between two options, such as Activate/Deactivate, Increase/ Decrease a value, etc.

Browse the matrix icons and lists until you have reached the desired feature or option. When navigating in a list, a scroll bar located on the right of the screen shows your actual position in the list. You can then select or modify the phone's functions with the stylus pen and the navigation keys as described in the relevant chapters of this user guide.

New events

Some events may modify the idle screen (missed calls, new messages, etc.). Press (or) to access the corresponding menu or _c to close the alert window

Status indicator lights

There is an indicator light on the top right of the phone. The colours of the indicator light change according to the current phone status:

When switching The indicator light flashes in red. on/off

is on

When the phone The indicator light flashes in blue

intermittantly.

When charging

The indicator light is in purple and will remain lighted until charging is complete, where the phone return to its original mode. (When charging with the phone on, the indicator light will flash in blue when charging is complete; when charging with the phone off, the indicator light will go off when charging is complete). When there is an incoming call during charging, the indicator light will flash accordingly.

Incoming call

When there is an incoming call, the indicator light will flash in the order of blue, purple and red at very short intervals

Low battery warning

If the battery level is low, the indicator light will flash in red intermittantly.

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I • Getting Started

Read the safety instructions in the «Precautions» section before use.

To use your phone, you must insert a valid SIM card supplied by your GSM operator or retailer. The SIM card contains your subscription, your mobile number, and a memory in which you can store phone numbers and messages (see "Phone book" on page 25)

The phone's battery is attached to its back cover. There is a slot at the side of the back cover to hold the stylus pen.

Insert the SIM card

Before you insert or remove the SIM card, you need to remove the stylus pen from its slot.

Make sure that the phone is switched off Hold the phone on vour palm with the front of the phone facing downwards as shown the diagram. Use your free hand to pull the release button located the the hottom speaker. The back will he cover detached from the phone and you may now remove it.



2. Insert SIM card with the metallic contacts facing down (towards the phone) and the bevelled corner at the bottom left. Slide the SIM card horizontally into the card slot completely.



Replace the back cover of the phone: Hold the phone the front with facing down, hook the bottom of the phone cover to the bottom left of the phone where the the stylus pen is located. Once the bottom of the back cover is aligned with the bottom of the phone, press down the top of the back cover until it locks into place.





When inserting the battery, be careful not to damage the metallic connectors of the SIM card slot.

4. Remove the protective film covering the screens before using the phone.

Switch on the phone

Press to switch on the phone. Long press when charging. You may be requested to enter your PIN code, which is the 4 to 8 digit security code of your SIM card to protect it from authorized use. It is preconfigured and provided to you by your network operator or retailer. To change your PIN code, see "Change code" on page 35.

If you enter a wrong PIN code 3 times in succession, your SIM card is blocked. To unblock it, you must request the PUK code from your network operator.

Set date and time

At first switch on, the date and time on the phone are in the factory default settings. You need to reset the date and time. Set the date by pressing the corresponding numeric keys on the keypad (press to erase a number). Then, proceed in the same way to set the time.

For complete date and time options, please see page 84.

Calibrate the touchscreen

It is advisable to carry out screen calibration in order to obtain better accuracy when using it with the stylus pen. Press and follow the screen instructions. You have to tap all the 5 symbols on the screen with the stylus pen one after another to complete the process.

Charge the battery

Your phone is powered by a standard or an ultra-slim rechargeable battery (depending on your country of purchase). An alarm will warn you when the battery reaches low. When the battery is completely flat, the charging icon will only appear after a few minutes of charging.

We recommend that you do not remove the battery when the phone is switched on as you may lose all your personal settings as a result. If you do remove it, the date and time settings are only memorized for a short while. As such, you need to reset the information after you have installed the battery back again.



- Once the battery and back cover is attached to the phone, plug the charger connector (supplied with the phone, in the box) into the charger socket at the base of the phone (arrow side up), and plug the other end of the charger to an easily accessible AC power socket.
- 2. The battery icon indicates the state of charge: During charging, the 4 charge indicator bars change constantly and it normally takes around 2 - 4* hours to fully recharge the battery. (when the phone is switched off, the screen will display a charging animation)
- When all 4 bars are steady, the battery is fully charged and you can disconnect the charger. Depending on the network and condition of use, the maximum talk time of a fully-charged standard battery or ultra-slim battery goes from

3 to 5 hrs* and 2 to 3 hrs* respectively; whilst the maximum stand-by time goes from 200 to 240 hrs* and 150 to 180 hrs* respectively.

*The data was derived from a test conducted at our France laboratory when the battery is fully-charged for the first time. Depending on the network condition, user settings, method of use, etc the actual results may differ.

Keeping the charger plugged to the mobile when the battery is fully charged will not damage the battery. The only way to turn off the charger is to unplug it, so it is advisable to use an easily accessible AC power socket.

If you do not intend to use your phone for several days, we recommend that you remove the battery.

You can use the phone while it is charging (note that the vibra alert goes Off when the charger is connected). If the battery is completely flat, the battery icon will only reappear after a few minutes of charging.

2 • Main Features

Switch on the phone

Press (long or short press) to switch on the phone. During charging, long press to switch on the phone.

Enter PIN code

You may set a security code (PIN code) on your phone to protect it from unauthorised use. When you have set a security code, you will be prompted to enter the corresponding PIN number when you switched on the phone.

- Enter PIN code. For security reasons, the screen will use "*" to represent the numbers you have entered. If you have entered the wrong number, press to clear it.
- Press (08). The phone will validate the PIN code and commence network registration.
- Once a network name is flashed on the screen, you are ready to make or answer a call. If no network name is displayed on the screen, you need to re-register.

If you enter a wrong PIN code 3 times in succession, your SIM card will be blocked. To unblock it, you must request the PUK code from your operator. If you enter a wrong PUK code 10 times in succession, your SIM card will be permanently blocked and cannot be used anymore. If this happens, please contact your network operator.

Switch off the phone

Long press to switch off the phone.

Make a call

You may use this function only when the screen displays a network name.

- 1. Enter the phone number.
 - Press to dial the number directly; or press Options and select Call, IP call or Call handsfree. The call function is exactly the same as pressing If you have selected IP call, and the IP service number is already in the phonebook (eg, the IP service number for China Mobile is 17951) your phone will automatically add the IP service number and dial the number.

10 Main Features

End a call

Press End softkey or press to end a call. You may close the flip to end the call if you are not using the headser.

Make an international call

- 1. Long press ** until "+" appears on the screen.
- 2. Enter the country code.
- 3. Enter the area code (normally without the "0" in front) followed by the phone number.
- 4. Press to dial directly; or press Options and select Call, IP call or Call handsfree.

Make a second call (Network dependent)

You can make a second call by putting the active call on hold:

- When you are on a call with Party A, you may enter Party B's phone number directly with the keypad.
- Press or left softkey Options and select Call to dial Party B's number. Party A will be put on hold automatically.

Switch calls (Network dependent)

If you currently have two calls, where one is put on hold, while the other is active, you may use the Switch menu in Call options to toggle between the two calls.

Call recording

During a call, you may press right [Multimedia] sidekey to start/end recording. When you start recording, the screen will show a recording icon. The longest recording duration is 99 minutes. Recording will stop when the call ends, and the recorded voice will be stored automatically.

Call Handsfree

During a call, long press to activate/deactivate handsfree.

Answer a call

Press Answer softkey or press to answer the call, or tap the onscreen Handsfree button with the stylus pen.

Note that you cannot activate handsfree when you are using the headset.

Main Features I I

Reject a call

Press Reject softkey or press to reject an incoming call, or tap the onscreen Busy button with the stylus pen.

Answer a second call (Network dependent)

If you have activated Call waiting, you will be alerted when there is a second incoming call. You can:

- Tap the onscreen Answer button or press to answer the second call, whereby the first call will be put on hold automatically; or
- Tap the onscreen Reject button or press to reject the second call and continue with the current call; or
- Tap the onscreen Hold button to put the second call on hold and continue with the current call; or
- 4. Press */ */ */ * to select one of the three onscreen button and then press (as) to confirm.

When one call is active and another call is put on hold, you may press Options and select Unhold to activate the call on hold; select Hold to put the current active call on hold; or select Switch to toggle between the two calls.

Multi-party call (Network dependent)

Your phone supports multi-party call of up to 5 members. When an incoming call is put on hold, you may enable multi-party call by using the up and down navigation keys or the stylus pen to select the incoming call party, press Options, and then select Add to add the party into your current call.

If you wish to disconnect a member from the multiparty call, select the member, press Options and then select Remove to remove the member.

Fotocall

This feature allows you to link a name in your phonebook to a photo you have taken using the Camera function, or a picture you have downloaded using WAP or data cable.

When the name in the phonebook calls, the linked picture will appear in the incoming call background. This feature is referred to as "Fotocall".

4 • Text or number entry

The input methods described in this chapter do not apply to E-mail function.

Input method

Your mobile phone supports handwriting, keypad input and seven input methods including:

- T9 Pinyin: Input chinese characters with T9 Pinvin:
- T9 Traditional Chinese Zhuyin: Input Traditional Chinese characters with T9 Zhuvin:
- T9 Stroke: Input Chinese characters with T9 wubi and stroke components;
- T9 Traditional Chinese stroke: Input Traditional Chinese characters with Wubi or stroke components;
- T9 English (T9eng/T9Eng): Input English text using T9 English;
- Multi-Tap (abc/ABC): Press the keys that are marked with the corresponding letter you wish to input. Press once to get the first letter on the key, press twice quickly to get the second letter and so on until the letter you want is displayed on the screen.
- 123: Input numbers

This phone features T9 Simplified Chinese association input method.

*Note

During text editing, you may long press *** to toggle between handwriting and keypad input mode. When you have switched to keypad input mode, short press *** will change the input mode to handwriting. The status bar at the bottom of the screen will display your current input mode. 『拼』 represents Simplified Chinese Pinyin input mode; 『笔』 represents Simplified Chinese stroke input mode; represents Traditional Chinese Zhuyin input mode; 『筆』 represents Traditional Chinese stroke input mode; [en] represents T9 English input mode; [abc] represents English alphabets input mode; [123] represents number input mode. In addition, you may press punctuations. If the bottom right of the screen display a pencil icon, you are in the handwriting input mode. You can use the stylus pen to tap the icon to switch to keypad entry mode. Tap again to switch back to handwriting input mode.

Before you start handwriting input, you need to select the type of text you wish to enter. Use the stylus pen to tap 中文, 123, Aa, 词组, ## at the bottom of the screen to confirm the type of text, then start writing on the centre area of the screen with your stylus pen. Pause for a moment to allow the phone to automatically select the recognized word on the text editor. If the selected word is not your choice, you may tap on the candidate row to select another word

to replace it.

The text editor remembers the last input method you have used before you exit the editing screen. When you access the editor again, it will automatically select the last input method you have used.

Entering texts and numbers

You can input text in the editor using 6 input methods: T9 English, 『abc』, 『拼』, 『注』, 『注』, 『注』, 『注』, 『注』 . In addition, there are two input methods for you to enter numbers and punctuations. The icon displayed on the screen shows the current input method. You can press *** to switch from one mode to another and press *** to enter punctuation or press ** to shift case.

Entering symbols

Press ** in any keypad entry mode to open/close symbols input screen. Press the corresponding number on the left of the symbol to input it and then return to the original input mode. If the symbols occupy more than one screen, press * / * to scroll up/down the pages.

Shift case

Press o.o to shift case in the English input editor.

Delete

When there are contents in the input row, press ct to delete the rightmost character or symbol. The candidate area will update accordingly until the input row is cleared.

When the input row is empty, press will delete the character on the left of the cursor in the text area. If there are no characters on the left of the cursor, the character on the right will be deleted. Long press to clear the contents in the text area.

T9[®] English input

What is it?

T9® predictive Text Input is an intelligent editing mode for messages, which include a comprehensive dictionary. It allows you to quickly enter text. You need to press only once on the key corresponding to each letter needed to spell a word: keystrokes input are analysed and the word suggested by T9® is displayed at the bottom of the screen. If several words are available according to the keys used, press 4 or

to browse the list and choose from those proposed by the T9® built-in dictionary (see example below). After you have input the word, press to insert space.

How to use it?

Alphabets and symbols represented by each key are as follows:

- To browse the list of candidate words.
- To confirm entry.
- Short press to clear one entry, long press to clear all text.
- Shift from standard, to lower, to upper case.
- *+* Select input mode.
- Activate/Deactivate punctuation mode

Basic text input

If you wish to use basic text input, press and select [ABC] basic text input. This method requires multiple key presses to reach the desired character: the letter "h" is the second letter on the week, so you must press which twice to enter "h". Using this mode requires you to press a key as many times as is equal to the order of the letter.

To enter the word «Home» in basic text input mode, you should therefore key \(\begin{array}{c} \psi_{\omega} \end{array}\), \(\begin{array}{c} \psi_{\omega} \end{array}\) (GHI) \(\begin{array}{c} \begin{array}{c} \begin{array}{

Enter the pinyin letters accordingly. Press once on the key corresponding to the pinyin letter without having to consider its position on the key. Pinyin input method will automatically select and list all possible combinations for you to select.

For example, to input the character [\(\pi\)], with the Pinyin letters [\(\pwang\)], press \(\p\) a = \(\p\) (\(\p\) 4\) and use \(\psi\) to select the desired pinyin combination for [\(\pwang\)], then press \(\psi\) to confirm combination. After that, you may press a number key to enter the intonation of the character (1-1 tone, 2-2 tone, 3-3 tone, 4-4 tone, 5- silent tone) to narrow down the candidate characters selection range. Then use \(\psi\) to select the desired character [\(\p\)] and press (\(\psi\)) to confirm the input of this character.

As soon as you have selected and entered a character, the candidate list will be updated and a list of association characters will be displayed. Press of or to select the desired association character and press on to confirm entry. This speeds up the input process further.

When you have finished editing a name on the phonebook or SMS, press to exit from association character input mode and press to confirm completion of the editing process.

Zhuyin Input

 When the zhuyin combination appears on the input row, press • / • to move the selection box over the zhuyin combination and press • to enter character selection mode.

Selection


Press • / • to move the selection box left or right, and press • / • to scroll list. When the selection box is on the desired character, press (1) to confirm the input and go into association input mode.

Association

The input area is empty and the candidate area display a list of association characters. Press the navigation keys to select an association character, or press a number key to input a new zhuyin combination.

Stroke input

Press *** to select stroke input mode. The strokes are represented on each key as follows:



The basic steps of Stroke input are as follows:

- 1 Enter strokes e iii Ol (excluding 3 and 7), press <u>to clear.</u> 2. Select from candidate list • or • /
- ▲ or ▼

(scroll list)

- 3. Confirm selection
- OK)
- 4. Select and enter association character, or return to step 1 to enter new strokes.
- 5. or press \(\subseteq \text{to exit from association input} \) mode and press or to confirm completion of editing.

The principle of stroke input is to dissect and separate every stroke of a chinese character according to sequence. When you wish to input the character, press the keys corresponding to the required strokes according to sequence to get the desired character. The stroke input method in this phone classify a chinese character into 5 basic strokes: (horizontal, vertical, left falling stroke, right falling stroke and over-down) as well as a special stroke. When the stroke you need does not correspond to the 5 basic strokes, replace it with the special stroke. The examples below will give you a clearer understanding of how to use stroke input method:

Generally, you will be able to find a desired character before you finished entering all the strokes. After you have entered the name of the phonebook or SMS, press to exit association character list and press to confirm completion of text editing.

The input mode for Traditional chinese stroke and Simplified Chinese stroke are similar, with the exception of the character coding.

5 • Phone book



Your mobile phone has two phonebooks. The SIM phonebook is located on the SIM card and the number of entries it can hold depending on the card capacity. The second phonebook is built into the phone's memory and can hold up to 2000 names. The latter is the default phonebook but the entries in the two phonebooks are combined, sorted and displayed as a list. When you add a new contact to your phonebook, the new contact will only be added to the phonebook you have selected.

You can store up to 2000 names provided other feaures in the phone such as Notepad, Calendar & Schedule, Audio recorder, Image browser, Video recorder, etc did not use up large amount of the phone's memory space.

Enter

- 1. In idle mode, press (or to enter the main menu.
- 2. Select Phone > Phone book > Enter, or press in idle mode to enter entry list. ▼

Press ▲ / ▼ to select an entry and press to dial the number directly, or press left softkey
 Options to perform the following operations:

Add new	Create a new contact.
Modify	Edit the selected entry.
Delete	Delete the selected entry.
IP Call	If you have not entered the IP prefix, you will be prompted to enter the prefix before proceeding with IP call.
Call handsfree	Allows you to carry out handsfree conversation after you have dialed the number.

Make a copy of the selected entry to create a new phone record and edit it. This option simplifies the creation of similar phone records.

Copy to phone

If the selected entry is on the SIM card. It will be copied to the built-in phonebook and the phone number will be stored in the default number field of the namecard. (it will be automatically set as the default number).

Move to phone

If the selected entry is on the SIM card. Same as Copy to phone except that the entry will be deleted from the SIM memory once it is moved to the phone.

Copy to SIM card

If the selected entry is on the built-in phonebook.

Move to SIM card

If the selected entry is on the built-in phonebook. Same as Copy to SIM card, except that the entry will be deleted from the built-in phonebook once it is copied to the SIM card. If the entry contains information fields other than telephone numbers (such as email, notes, addresses, postal code, etc), such information fields will be lost.)

You may not be able to access the phonebook immediately when you switch on your phone, as the phonebook takes some time to initialize. If it is a SIM card entry, a SIM card icon will be displayed on the right of the contact. If it is a phone entry, the group icon will be displayed on the right of the contact.

SIM phonebook

A SIM card record contains a name (maximum 14 characters) and a phone number (maximum 40 digits). Press • / v to select an entry detail in the entry list and press on to display detailed information of the entry. Press left softkey Options to carry out the following operations:

Search

You can search for the phone number you have stored in the SIM card or smart phonebook using the Search menu.

- 1. In idle mode, press (or) to enter the main menu.
- 2. There are 3 search methods as follows:

By initials

Enter the first letter or initials of the name you would like to search for, such as "TC" for Tom Cruise

By surname

The last name of all the records stored in the phone will be displayed in a table. Select the last name corresponding to the contact you would like to search for and press (DS), or tap with the stylus pen. The screen will then list all the records associated with the last name you have selected.

By keyword

If you can't recall the complete number, but only remember that it contains "8562", you may enter the numbers (you may also enter letters or words). The phone will then search for matching entries and list out all the records that has the numbers "8562"

Add new number

To the SIM card

- 1. Enter the name and phone number (press
 - ▼ to toggle between input fields).

2. Tap Fotocall with the stylus pen or when Fotocall is highlighted, press to access pictures list. You can select a picture and associate it to the contact. Press to save and press right softkey to exit.

To the phone

- Enter different types of information (such as phone number, e-mail, etc). Press [▲] / [▼] to toggle between input fields.
- 2. You can assign the namecard to a group. Press
 - ▲ / ▼ to scroll to group option and press
 - ◆ / ▶ to select a group.
- Tap Fotocall with the stylus pen, or when Fotocall is highlighted, press on to access pictures list. You can select a picture and associate it to the namecard.
- When you have finished with your input, press left softkey OK to save.
- After that, you may edit, delete, or set default number of the namecard you have just created.

A phonebook record, whether in the SIM card or on the phone has to include at least a name and a nonname field.

Capacity

This menu allows you to obtain the following information pertaining to the SIM card and phonebook:

- Used capacity
- Total capacity

New entry storage

The number you have added will be saved to the location you have selected. (SIM card or Phone).

Delete all

You can select Phone > Phonebook > Delete all to delete all the records in your SIM card and smart phonebook at once. The records cannot be recovered once they are deleted. Therefore, you will be prompted to confirm before deletion.

Copy all

From SIM to phone

As long as the phonebook memory is not full, you will be able to copy the SIM records one after another until every record is copied to the smart phonebook, or until the phone memory is full.

The name and phone number of the SIM card record will be copied to the phone, whereby the phone number will be set as the default number of the namecard. (default field)

From phone to SIM

As long as the SIM card memory is not full, you will be able to copy all the phone records one after another until every record is copied to the SIM card, or until the card memory is full.

A namecard in the smart phonebook can hold up to 5 phone numbers. Therefore, all the phone numbers in the namecard will be copied to the SIM card, whereby each number will occupy one record. The names on these records will be same as that of the name field in the namecard. If a phone record does not have a phone number field, the record will be skipped.

Move all

Similar to the Copy all operation above, except that the source records will be deleted after the records are moved to the new location.

For phone records, non-phone number fields in the namecard (such as e-mails, notes, addresses, postal codes) will be lost after they are moved to the SIM card.

Group settings

You can assign groups to the namecards in the smart phonebook. The available groups are: Default, Family, Friend, Colleague, Society and Private (you may change the group name and the corresponding group icon)

IP service number

This menu allows you to store the IP service number so that you need not enter the number before you make an IP call.

The IP service number has to be supported by your network operator before you can make an IP call. When you change a new SIM card, the IP service number you have stored will be cleared.

The phone does not validate the IP service number you have entered. Therefore, please ensure that the numbers are correct.



This menu allows you to enter, show, send, modify or delete your personal information.

6 • Phone



Phone book



The phonebook located on your phone shares the memory with other features. As such, they are interdependent: the more names you create, the less events you can store and vice-versa. If other features (such as sound, pictures, videos, etc) did not use up a large amount of the phone memory, you can store up to a maximum of 2000 names. Please refer to "Phone book" on page 25 for details.

Call list

All calls list



This menu provides you with a list of all the calls you have made or received. Dialed calls, Missed calls and Answered

calls will be displayed in a list, in chronological order. The most recent call will appear at the top of the list.

- 1. In idle mode, press (OK) to enter the main menu.
- Select Phone > Call list > All calls list, and press
 or press in idle mode to enter All calls
 list directly.
- You will see a list of all the calls you have made, received or missed. You may press left softkey Options to carry out the following operations:

Dialed call: Total duration of all outgoing calls.

Incoming call: Total duration of all

incoming calls.

Reset: Clear and reset call counter.

Call Forward (Subscription dependent)



Allows you to forward your incoming calls to a voice mailbox (see "Voice

Call forward mail" on page 43), or other numbers such as fax machine, when you are not available to answer the call. This menu also allows you to set the conditions for call forwarding.

Before you forward your calls to a voice mailbox, you need to enter your voice mailbox number. This feature is subscription dependent.

- 1. In idle mode, press (OK) to enter the main menu.
- 2. Select Phone > Call forward and press (Proposition of the selection of

Unconditional

This option will forward all your incoming calls to a designated phone number. If you activate this option, you will not be able to receive any calls on your phone until you have deactivated it.

When busy

The incoming call will be forwarded if your line is busy.

When no reply

The incoming call will be forwarded if there is no reply.

When not reachable

The incoming call will be forwarded if your number is unreachable.

Disable all

When you select this option, the phone will send a network request to deactivate call forwarding.

Status

This menu displays the status of all your call forwarding.

A call forwarding icon will be displayed on the idle screen if you have activated call forwarding.

Call settings



This menu allows you to set your call options (such as any key answer, call waiting, etc).

- 1. In idle mode, press (or) to enter the main menu.
- 2. Select Phone > Call settings and press (OK).

Minute reminder

You can select whether or not to receive alerts during a call. The alert will be emitted at every 50 seconds interval. You can press (18) to select enable/disable.

Any key answer

Allows you to press any key to answer a call, except: End key (to reject a call), Right softkey , Clear/Cancel key , Return to idle key , A / Y / 4 / P / (to select the buttons on the fotocall during an incoming call). You can press () to select enable/disable.

Auto redial

You can enable or disable auto redial function. If this option is enabled, the phone will attempt to redial the number at every set interval if the line is busy. The screen will display an alert at every redial attempt. Press
to end auto-redial.

Auto answer

You can enable or disable auto answer feature. If enabled, an incoming call will be automatically answered after a few rings. Press (to select enable/ disable. This option will not be available if the flip is closed and the headset is not connected.

Active flip

You can enable or disable Active flip feature. When activated, this option allows you to answer an incoming call by simply flipping up the phone cover. Press (OR) to select enable/disable.

Call waiting (Subscription dependent)

If enabled, the phone will display a call waiting screen when there is a second incoming call. You can choose whether or not to answer the incoming call. If disabled, you will not be prompted of a second incoming call and the calling party will hear a busy tone.

Press or to select On or Off.

GPRS

This menu allows you to enable or disable the emission of an alert when there is an incoming call during a GPRS connection. Press (M) or b to select On or Off.

Send ID

This menu allows you to select whether or not to send or hide your number from the called party.

You can select On, Off, Default or Status according to the current network support. You can also check the status of the current setting.

Security settings



This menu allows you to set PIN code, Call barring, etc.

Security settings

- 1. In idle mode, press (OK) to enter the main menu.
- 2. Select Phone > Security settings and press OK.

PIN code

Allows you to set PIN code On or Off. If set to On, you have to enter the PIN code when you switch on your phone. If you enter the wrong PIN code, you will not be able to use most of the features in this phone. Press Off. to select enable/disable. However, you have to enter the correct PIN before you can enable/disable this feature.

Call barring

This menu allows you to restrict the phone from making and receiving calls. You need to enter the password supplied by your service provider before you

can use this feature. The password will be verified by the network. The available options include:

Roaming If enabled, all incoming calls will be barred when you are roaming

network.

All incoming If enabled, all incoming calls will be calls

Local calls

If enabled, all international calls only

will be barred, except calls to home

country network.

International If enabled, all international calls will be barred.

All outgoing If enabled, all outgoing calls will be calls

Change code

Depending on the SIM card, this option allows you to change PIN code and Call barring code.

- 1. Input old barring code and confirm.
- 2. Input new barring code and confirm.
- 3. Input the new barring code again and confirm. The system will advise you if it is successful.

If you enter a wrong PIN code 3 times in succession, your SIM card will be blocked. To unblock it, you

must request the PUK code from your operator. If you enter a wrong PUK code 10 times in succession, your SIM card will be permanently blocked and cannot be used anymore. If this happens, please contact your network operator or retailer.

Guard settings



This menu allows you to set Guard settings to prevent unauthorized use of your phone.

- 1. In idle mode, press (OK) to enter the main menu.
- 2. Select Phone > Guard settings and press OK).

Power on protection

You can activate Power on protection to protect your phone. When activated, you will be requested to enter the phone code when you switch on the phone. The phone will only be switched on if the password is correct.

Select Power on protection, press (OR) to access the submenu. If you select On, you need to enter the password, and the protection will be activated only if your password is correct. If you wish to deactivate the option, select Off. You need to enter the correct passwork to deactivate it. If you have entered the wrong password, you will be notified accordingly.

Data protection ID is a 4 digit password, default ID is 0000 which can be changed. See "Change password" below for the steps to change password.

Change password

This menu allows you to change password. Enter old password and then enter new password twice to confirm.

Network settings

Network settings

The phone will display the network name in idle screen. If the network is unknown, the phone will display the country code and network number.

- 1. In idle mode, press (OK) to enter the main menu.
- 2. Select Phone > Network settings and press ON.

Preferred networks

The preferred networks list stored in the SIM card will determine the priority by which your phone attempt to register a network. You can select the following options in the menu:

Show preferred

Display preferred network list, with the most preferred network appearing at the top of the list.

Select a network, then select Preferred or press (19); you will be informed if the setting is successful. The selected network will be moved to the top of the preferred network list, implying that it has the highest priority.

Delete preferred The preferred network list will be displayed. Select a network from the list, then press left softkey Delete to delete.

Add available The phone will search for available networks and list them on the screen. Select a network from the list and press left softkey Add. The selected network will be added to the bottom of the preferred network list.

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Add existing

The screen will display a list of existing networks stored in your phone. Select a network from the list and press left softkey Add. The selected network will be added to the bottom of the preferred network list

Add code

Opens the editor. Enter the country code and mobile network number accordingly. Confirm your entry to add the network number to the preferred network list.

Attach GPRS

This menu allows you to define GPRS connection mode. You can select:

Always

Your phone will always use GPRS. This option speeds up GPRS connection but is power consuming.

During PDP session

Your phone will only use GPRS when necessary. This option is less power consuming, but takes a longer time to establish a connection.

Register again

The phone will search for an available network immediately and list the available networks on the screen. Select a network from the list and press left softkey Register. The phone will attempt to register the selected network.

In-flight mode



This menu allows you to Activate or Deactivate In-flight mode. If activated, network function will be closed and all related network operations will be prohibited.

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7 • Message center



SMS



SMS enables you to send text messages to the other party, which is a convenient affordable mode communication. Via this menu, you can send

messages to another handphone or a device that is capable of receiving SMS.

Your phone can store up to 1000 messages. Once you have reached 1000 messages, the screen will flash a SMS icon to alert you. You need to delete some messages in order to receive new messages.

- 1. In idle mode, press (or to enter the main menu.
- 2. Select Message center > SMS and press (OK), or in idle mode, press access SMS menu directly.

Write new

You need to enter the correct message centre number before you can send SMS. The number can be obtained from your network operator.

- In idle mode, press (or) to enter the main menu.
- Select Message center > SMS >Write new and press (ok) to open SMS editor.
- Enter the phone number in the recipient input box, or tap Namelist with the stylus pen to open from the list, and press (or) to select/cancel. Then, press left softkey to confirm and return to SMS editor
- 4. After you have entered the recipient, press to access SMS message editor.
- Enter your text message in the text box. After you have finished entering, press (OK) or left softkey Options to access the following:

Setting

Service centre number

To store your service centre number. You can edit the service centre number. You cannot send SMS without a service centre number.

Validity period

To select the length of time your message is to be stored in your SMS centre. This is useful when the recipient is not connected to the network (and thus cannot receive your message immediately).

This feature is subscription dependent.

Delivery status

Allows you to set this option On or Off. It will automatically inform you whether or not your SMS has been successfully sent to the recipient.

This feature is subscription dependent.

Reply path

Allows you to set this option On or Off. If set to On, when your correspondent sends a reply to you, the network will automatically send the reply via your SMS centre and not theirs. This speeds up the rate of transmission.

This feature is subscription dependent.

New entry storage

Allows you to select your preferred storage location of your messages: SIM or Phone.

Signature Edit

Allows you to set this option On or Off. If set to On, the edit box will open. You can go on editing the

signature-appended text. Afterwards, when you send your SMS next time, your signature will be automatically appended to the end of the SMS message.

If an SMS message exceeds its maximum size after including your signature, the signature will not be appended.

Broadcast SMS

It is a network service which allows you to receive a variety of text messages, such as news and traffic information. The messages are transmitted to all subscribers within the network. If this feature is activated, the network will supply you with a list of available broadcast channel number.

Reception

Allows you to set the reception of cell broadcast SMS On or Off. When Off, you will not receive any broadcast SMS even if you have set the corresponding channel numbers

When you received a broadcast SMS, the message will display on the screen directly until you press a key to exit. Broadcast SMS will not be stored in the phone or SIM card, therefore they can no longer be retrieved once you exit from the message screen.

Activating this feature will shorten the standby time of your phone.

Topics

Allows you to define new channel numbers to receive new message topics. Each channel number should not contain more than 3 digits.

Voice mail

You can activate "Call forward" feature to forward your incoming calls to a voice mailbox (a number for the caller to leave a voice message).

Voice mail number

Normally, the network operator will supply you with 2 numbers:

- To leave a voice message (you can set your incoming calls to be forwarded to this number).
- For message retrieval, to be entered with the keypad.

You can enter your "Message retrieval" number here to use "Call voice mail" feature.

Call voice mail

The phone will alert you when you received a voice mail. You can access your voice mailbox to retrieve your voice message.

- In idle mode, long press to call your voice mail number directly.
- If you have not set your voice mail number, you will be prompted accordingly.

MMS (subscription dependent)



This phone supports the sending and receiving of multimedia messages, or MMS, featuring texts, pictures, sounds

slides. Whether you send it to an e-mail address or to another mobile phone, the MMS will be played as a slide show.

- 1. In idle mode, press (OK) to enter the main menu.
- 2. Select Message center > MMS and press OK.

Write MMS

Before you can send an MMS, you need to enter a valid MMS centre number and use a set of valid network configuration profile.

- Select MMS menu to access MMS editor. The Subject field will be highlighted.
- Press ▲ / ▼ to toggle between Subject, To, cc and bcc fields.
- Subject field is optional, but To field cannot be empty. You can enter the recipient's number or

- address directly, or you can select from Namelist by pressing left softkey. Press ▲ / ▼ to select a recipient from the list and press (OK) to select/de-select.
- Press left softkey to confirm and return to MMS editor
- 5. cc and bcc allows you to send the MMS to other recipients apart from the recipient specified in the To field. Same as adding recipients in To field above, you can enter the numbers directly or press left softkey to select from the contacts list. cc and bcc are optional fields which can be left empty.
- After you have added the recipients, tap MMS text editor window with the stylus pen to enter your text message, or press left softkey Options and select Add text to activate the text editor.
- 7. After you have finished entering your text message, press (ON) or left softkey Save. Your text message will appear in the MMS text editor window. If you wish to add sound, pictures, etc. you can do so via Options. When the MMS text editor is highlighted, press (ON) or left softkey to access the following options:

Background Set the background colour of your colour MMS.

If you have added more than 1 page, you can press • / • to scroll the pages. The subject bar at the top of the screen will display the current page you are currently viewing and the total number of pages in your MMS.

Inbox

Reply

Contains a list of notifications, sent and read report, as well as your read and unread MMS. You can read and delete notifications and reports; and you can view, forward and reply your MMS, display the contents of the MMS or delete them, etc.

An icon on the left of each MMS will indicate if the message has been read.

Enter Inbox and press

/ v to select a message,

then press left softkey to access the following options:

View

View the selected MMS. You can also press (OR),

Reply to the sender. However, this option will not be available if the selected message is unread.

Reply to all If there are other recipients in the cc field of the MMS, it implies that the

sender of the MMS, it implies that the sender of the MMS has also sent the message to these recipients. If you choose this option, apart from the sender, your reply will also be sent to all other contacts in the cc field. However, this option will not be available if the selected message is

unread.

Forward the selected MMS.

Delete Delete the selected MMS.

Delete all the MMS in your Received

folder.

Refresh Inbox.

Detailed info Allows you to view details of the

selected MMS, such as subject, sender, time received, size, etc.

Back Exit Inbox.

After you have selected a MMS, press left softkey View or press (1) to read the MMS. The first screen will display basic information of the MMS such as Sender, subject, etc. Press left softkey or (1) to start playing the MMS. During the process, you can press right softkey to stop or wait for it to finish playing and stop automatically.

After you have stopped the MMS with the right softkey, the left softkey will change to Options with the following selections: Play, Back to first page, Previous page, Next page, Save image as, Save audio as, Close, etc.

The above options will also become available when the MMS has finished playing and stopped automatically.

Some of the above options are available only under certain condtions, eg, Save audio as is available only when the MMS contain sound. And Back to first page, Previous page, Next page are available only when the MMS contain multiple pages.

Draft box

Contain a list of MMS which are created and saved, but not sent yet; or MMS that are automatically saved when you quit the MMS menu before saving or sending them.

After you have selected a MMS from the list, press left softkey to access the following Options: View, Delete, Delete all, Edit, Send now, Refresh, Detailed info and Back.

If you select View, the subsequent procedures of viewing the MMS in the Draft box are the same as that of the libox.

Sent message box

Contains a list of MMS which have been sent successfully and which you have chose to save. After you have selected a MMS from the list, press left softkey to access the following Options: View, Delete, Delete all, Edit, Send now, Refresh, Detailed info and Back.

If you select View, the subsequent procedures of viewing the MMS in the Sent message box are the same as that of the Inbox.

Templates

List all MMS that are saved as templates after they are created. After you have selected a MMS from the list, press left softkey to access the following Options: View, Create message from template, Delete, Delete all, Edit, Send now, Refresh, Detailed info and Back.

If you select View, the subsequent procedures of viewing the MMS in the Templates folder are the same as that of the Inbox.

To create a MMS from a template, select a MMS from the list and press (or), or select Create from template from the Options menu. The MMS editor will display your selected template. You can edit, send and save the MMS. The subsequent procedure are the same as that mentioned in Write MMS.

Outbox

Contains a list of failed MMS. After you have selected a MMS from the list, press left softkey to access the following options: View, Delete, Delete all, Edit, Send now, Refresh, Detailed info and Back.

If you select View, the subsequent procedures of viewing the MMS in the Unsent folder are the same as that of the Received folder.

MMS settings

MMS settings menu allows you to set your MMS centre and implement personalized settings. Available options include:

Sending

Allows you to set the parameters pertaining to the sending of MMS. The options include:

Validity period

To select how long your MMS will be stored on the server, from I hour to max. This is useful when the recipient is not connected to the network (and thus cannot receive your message immediately).

Read report

This option can be set to On or Off. When set to On, will send you a read report to inform you if the MMS you have sent has been read.

Delivery report

This option can be set to On or Off. When set to On, will send you a delivery report to inform you if the MMS you have sent was received, rejected or failed.

Priority

Set the priority level of your MMS as Low, Normal or High.

Reply charging

When you request for a delivery report from your recipient to indicate that the message has been received, you can set whether or not the cost of sending the delivery report shall be borne by you, the expiry date by which you will not continue to bear the cost and the size of the reply. This feature is subscription dependent and include the following sub-options: On, Off, Text only. If you select On, it means you will bear the cost; if you select Off, it means you will not bear the cost. If you select Text only, it means you will bear the cost for text reply only.

Reply charging deadline: Allows you to select the period within which you will bear the cost. Beyond the set period, the cost will not be borne by you.

Reply charging size: Allows you to select the maximum message size within which you will bear the cost.

Show number

Allows you to select whether or not to reveal your number to the recipient when you send a MMS. If you select No, your number will not be sent with the MMS.

Auto save

This option can be set On or Off. It allows you to automatically save the successfully sent messages when set to On.

Page timing

Allows you to select the duration between each slide of the MMS.

Delivery time

Allows you to select whether or not to send the MMS via the message centre immediately or send after a set delay.

Retrieval

Allows you to select whether to ask you or to download MMS automatically when someone sends you a MMS, or to send read report etc. This feature is subscription dependent and include the following options:

Home network

There are 2 options when you are in home network: Automatic and Always ask. If you select Automatic, the MMS will be download automatically when someones sends you a MMS; if you select Always ask, you will be asked each time when you receive a MMS.

Roaming network

There are 3 options when you are roaming network: Automatic, Always ask and Restricted. If you select the last option, it means that you reject the downloading of MMS when you are roaming network

Send read report

Allows you to set whether or not to send a read report when the sender requests for it. There are 3 options:

On request, Always and Never. If you select the first option, it means you will send a reply only when requested by sender; select second option means you will always send a reply; last option means you will not send a reply.

Delivery report allowed

Allows you to select whether or not to send a delivery report when the sender requests for it. You can select Yes or No.

Allows you to set a filter for the MMS sent to you; such as, to receive MMS only from a specific server, receive MMS of a specific size only, reject MMS exceeding a specific size, reject advertisements, reject MMS that contain certain words, reject MMS from anonymous senders, etc. This feature is subscription dependent.

E-mail

Digital camera



Your phone features an integrated digital camera which allows you to take pictures of different resolutions, quality and effects. You can also send the photos to your friends via MMS.

How to take a photo

Video recorder



Your phone features an integrated digital video recorder which allows you to record videos of different resolution, quality and effects.

How to record video

- Select Multimedia > Video recorder and press ON, or when the phone is flipped open, long press right sidekey [Multimedia] to access video camera. (provided the last feature you have used is the video camera function).

When the digital camera or video camera are in preview mode, an "Exit" icon similar with the return to idle screen key, will be displayed on the screen. Tap the icon with the stylus pen to exit from preview mode. When in preview mode, press or [Multimedia] wideo take a photo or record a video. The photo or video will be automatically saved under a default name. After which, the camera or video camera will return to preview mode. Connect the Red a/v cable connector to the Red port on the TV, the White a/v cable connector to the white audio channel control port of the TV, and the Yellow a/v cable connector to the Yellow video control port of the TV. Then, connect the other end of the a/v cable to the TV socket at the bottom of the phone. Before using the TV Link, make sure you have selected the appropriate A/V channel on your TV set.

How to play a video on your TV

Once you have successfully connected your phone to the TV via the a/v cable, enter the Video Player menu, select a video by pressing (10), then press (10) again to activate the TV Link. Once the TV link is active, the video file will stop playing on the phone, and the touchscreen will not respond to any stylus operations. You can only control the TV video link with the phone's keypad. Instructions for keys' usage will be displayed on the mobile phone screen.

How to view pictures on your TV

Once you have successfully connected your phone to the TV via the a/v cable, enter the Digital Camera menu, press the [Mode] side key to select the Picture Browser mode, select a picture, and press (9) (or press the multimedia side key) to activate the TV Link. Once the TV link is active, the browsing activities of the phone will stop and the touch screen will not react to any movement of the stylus pen. You can only control the viewing of photos on the TV screen with the phone's keypad. Instructions for keys' usage will be displayed on the mobile phone screen.

Calendar&Schedule

This menu allows you to add new schedule, view schedule (today, this Calendar&Schedule month or this week), edit schedule, delete schedule, or check storage capacity. You can add up to 1000 events.

You may store up to a maximum of 1000 events if other features (Notepad, phonebook, Audio recorder, Pictures, Video recorder etc) did not use up large amount of the phone's memory space.

When a scheduled event is due, the phone will automatically go into event due screen, whereby the event title will be displayed and the Calendar & Schedule alert will sound

- 1. In idle mode, press (OK) to enter the main menu.
- Select Mobile office > Calendar&Schedule and press (as).
- The screen will display the day view, month view or week view of the scheduled events.

 When you use the feature for the first time, the default display is Monthly view. You can choose Daily view or Weekly view using the left softkey.

When a Chinese term is entered, the corresponding English translation will be provided, and when an English term is entered, the corresponding Chinese translation will be provided.

- In idle mode, press (or) to enter the main menu.
- Select Mobile office > Dictionary and press (or).

Matching word list

The screen will display the matching terms of the letters even before you finished entering the entire word or before you press (OK). For example, if you wish to search for the word "phone", when you have entered the first 3 letters p, h, o, the screen will display a list of words or phrases that start with the letters 'pho". If the list is too long, press ⁴ / ▶ to scroll down the list.

If the word you are searching for appears in the list, press ▲ / ▼ to select the word and press (OK), or use the stylus pen to tap on the word to view details (see description below regarding "Word details"). If the word you are searching for does not appear on the

list, then continue to enter the remaining letters and press (ok) to search. If you are unsure of the letters you have entered, you can press Options and select Spell check to confirm

Spell check

Select Spell check menu to list all the words which are similar in spelling to the word you have just entered, including the omission of one letter, additional letter, difference by one letter, omission of the first letter or last letter, etc. For example, if you enter the word "skale" which is not found in the dictionary, you can select Spell check to display a list of words which are similar to the word you have just entered, such as "scale", "sale", "scales", "kale" etc. You can press 🔺 /

▼ to select a word from the list and press (OK), or simply tap the word with the stylus pen.

The editing window for each operation can handle up to 9 figures. Calculator accuracy is to 7 decimal places and is rounded up to the higher decimal figure. For example, 0.123456789 will be rounded up as 0.1234568.

The calculator can also support CE, MC, MR, MS and M+ operations. You can select the operation with the stylus pen or press left softkey Options to select one of the following:

- CE Clear the editing window of the calculator and re-enter new figures. (does not affect the memory)
- MC Clear the memory.
- MR Recall the figure in the memory whereby the recalled figure remains in storage.
- MS Store the figure displayed on the screen into the memory.

Short press c to clear the figure you have entered; long press c to clear the entire editing window of the calculator.

The phone features a 24 hour alarm clock function. There are 3 groups of alarm which you can enable or disable according to your needs.

Ring type

You may change the default incoming call ringer by selecting another ringtone from the list of rings. There are 6 caller groups in your phonebook and you can associate different ringtones to each group so that you will know which group does the caller belongs to when there is an incoming call.

- 2. Select Settings > Sound settings> Ring type, and press (08).
- 3. The All rings menu lists all the ringtones by default. Power on/off tone

This menu allows you to enable or disable the emission of an alert tone when you switch the phone on or off. Press (0) to activate/deactivate.

Battery alert

This menu allow you to enable or diable the emission of a warning tone when the battery level is low. Press (ON) to activate/deactivate.



When the cursor is on a particular folder, press or left softkey Options and select Open to display the files within the folder. When the cursor is on a certain file, press Options to access the following:

Cut the selected file.

Copy Copy the selected file. You can also tap the onscreen Copy button with the stylus pen or long press 2 to copy.

Paste Paste the copied or cut file to the target destination folder. You can also tap the onscreen Paste button or long press to paste.

Delete Delete the selected file. You can also tap the onscreen Delete button or long press it to delete.

Return to the previous folder. You can also tap the onscreen Move up button or long press up to move up.

The files that are listed in the File management are user-accessible files. Certain files which are built-in or are copyright protected will not be listed in the folders.

Program management

This menu allows you to remove certain applications which are accessible and can be operated by users.

- 1. In idle mode, press or to enter the main menu.
- 2. Press Settings > Resource manager > Program management, and press (or).
- 3. The screen will list the applications that can be removed by user. You can use ▲ / ▼ to select the applications, and press left softkey Remove to remove the applications from the phone. Once removed, the applications cannot be restored. Before you carry out this operation, you will be prompted accordingly.

The applications that appear in the Program management include only those applications which are accessible and can be operated by users. Other integrated or copyright-protected applications of the phone will not appear.

Touch panel adjust

This menu allows you to calibrate your screen, in order to obtain a better accuracy when using it with the stylus pen. Enter the menu, a "+" symbol can be found on the top right/left, bottom right/left and centre of the screen. Use the stylus pen to tap on each of the "+" symbols. If the level of accuracy is within the acceptable range, the calibration will complete and you will exit from the calibration screen. Otherwise, re-calibrate the screen accordingly. If there is no action taken within 10 seconds, you will exit from the calibration screen.

Factory settings

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A set of parameters to restore the phone settings to factory default. This option

Factory settings only reset the sub menus under Settings which include Sound settings, Interface settings, Phone settings, Quick settings and Hotkey settings. Other menus, such as security code and PIN code etc will remain unchanged. Use of this menu will result in the loss of all your previous settings and reset them to factory default. As such, you will be prompted to confirm before the operation is carried out. The changes will take effect only after you have switched off and switch on the phone again after the reset.

Java manager



Your mobile phone features JAVA, which allows you to run JAVAcompatible applications such as games downloaded from the network

- Press (or in idle mode to enter the main menu screen
- Select User Defined > Java manager and press (OK).
- You may install new JAVA compatible applications via this menu. Press Install softkey to access the next screen to commence installation. (See "Install" below for details)

Install

1. You can enter the URL of the download site in the edit box. After entering the URL, press the left soft key Options and select Go to commence connection, or select Save to save the URL and clear the edit box.

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Icons & Symbols

In idle mode, several icons and symbols can be simultaneously displayed on the handphone screen.

If the network symbol is not displayed, it implies that the network is currently unavailable. You may be in a bad reception area, moving to a different location may help.



Battery - Indicates battery level with 5 battery level indicator bars. During charging, a scrolling icon will be displayed.



Network - Network icon comprises of 2 portions. The left portion indicates whether or not your phone is already registered with a network, and the right portion indicates signal strength in 5 levels. (from no signal to strongest)



Roaming - Displayed when your phone is registered to a network other than your own.



Displayed on the top left corner of the screen when the phone is not in idle mode. Tap this icon to quickly return to idle mode.



GPRS status - there are 2 GPRS status which are mutually exclusive: GPRS network is available but not in use; or GPRS network is available and in use. The icon will be displayed only when you have logged on to GPRS.



Messages (including SMS, MMS) - Indicates that you have at least 1 unread message.



Missed call - Indicates that you have at least



Audio - Indicates that the audio player is in operation.



Alarm clock - Indicates that the alarm clock is activated.



Vibration - Indicates that the phone will vibrate when there is an incoming call, or when an event or alarm clock is due.



Call forwarding - Indicates that the call forwarding function is activated.



Silent - Indicates that the silent mode is activated.



No SIM card.

Indicates whether PIN protection of the phone is activated. The top icon indicates that the feature is activated, while the bottom icon indicates that it is not activated. Tap on the respective icons to activate or deactivate PIN protection.

Precautions

Radio wave



Your cellular mobile phone is a **low power** radio transmitter and receiver. When it is operating, it sends and receives radio waves.

The radio waves carry your voice or data signal to a base station that is connected to the telephone network. The network controls the power at which the phone transmits.

- Your phone transmits/receives radio waves in the GSM frequency (900 /1800 / 1900 MHz).
- The GSM network controls transmission power (0.01 to 2 watts).
- Your phone complies with all relevant safety standards.
- The CE mark on your phone shows compliancy with European electromagnetic compatibility (Ref. 89/336/EEC) and low voltage directives (Ref. 73/23/EEC).
- The CCC mark on your phone shows compliance with China Compulsory Certification.

Your cellular mobile phone is your **responsibility**. To avoid damage to yourself, to others or to the phone itself, read and follow all the safety instructions and

make them known to anyone borrowing your phone. Furthermore to prevent unauthorised use of your phone:



Keep your phone in a safe place and keep it out of small children's reach.

Avoid writing down your PIN code. Try to remember it instead

Switch off the phone and remove the battery if you are going to leave it unused for a long time.

Use the Security menu to change the PIN code after purchasing the phone and to activate call restriction options.



The design of your phone complies with all applicable laws and regulations. However your phone may cause interference with other electronic devices. Consequently you

should follow all local recommendations and regulations when using your cellular phone both at home and when away. Regulations on the use of cellular phones in vehicles and aircraft are particularly stringent.

Always switch off your phone

Inadequately protected or sensitive electronic equipment may be affected by radio energy. This interference can lead to accidents.



Before boarding an aircraft and/or when packing the phone in your luggage: the use of mobile phones in an aircraft may be

dangerous for the operation of the aircraft, disrupt the mobile phones network and may be illegal.



In hospitals, clinics, other health care centres and anywhere else where you may be in the close vicinity of medical equipment.



In areas with a potentially explosive e.g. petrol stations and also areas where the air contains dust particles, such as metal powders).

In a vehicle transporting flammable products (even if the vehicle is parked) or a vehicle powered by liquefied

petroleum gas (LPG), check first that the vehicle complies with the applicable safety rules.

In areas where you are requested to turn off radio transmitting devices, such as quarries or other areas where blasting operations are in progress.

Performance improvement

In order to improve the performance of your phone, reduce radio energy emission, reduce battery consumption and ensure safe operation adhere to the following guidelines:



For the optimal and satisfactory operation of the phone you are recommended to use the phone in the normal operating position (when not using in hands-free mode or with a hands-free accessory).

- Do not expose your phone to extreme temperatures.
- Treat the phone with care. Any misuse will void the International Guarantee.
- Do not immerse the phone in any liquid; if your phone is damp, switch it off, remove the battery and let them dry for 24hrs before using them again.
- To clean the phone, wipe it with a soft cloth.
- Placing and receiving calls consumes the same amount of battery energy. However, the mobile consumes less energy in idle screen when kept in the same place. When in idle screen and while you are moving, your phone consumes energy to transmit updated location information to the network. Setting the backlight for a shorter

period of time as well as avoiding unnecessary navigating in the menus will also help to save the battery's energy for longer phoning and stand-by performances.

Information displayed on battery

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable battery.

- Use specified charger only.
- Do not incinerate.
- Do not deform or open the battery.
- Do not allow metal objects (such as keys in your pocket) to short circuit the battery contacts.
- Avoid exposure to excessive heat (>60°C or 140°F), moisture or caustic environments.



You should only use Philips Authentic Accessories, as the use of any other accessories may damage your phone and will make all guarantees for your Philips phone null and yoid.

Make sure damaged parts are replaced immediately by a qualified technician and that they are replaced with genuine Philips replacement parts.

Do not use your phone while driving



It lowers concentration, which can be dangerous. Adhere to the following guidelines:

- Give your full attention to driving. Pull off the road and park before using the phone.
- Respect the local regulations in countries where you drive and use your GSM phone.
- If you want to use your phone in a vehicle, install the hands-free car kit which is designed for that purpose, still ensuring you give full attention to driving.

Troubleshooting

The phone does not switch on

Remove/reinstall the battery. Then charge the phone until the battery icon stops scrolling. Unplug from charger and try to switch the mobile on.

The display shows BLOCKED when you switch on

Somebody tried to use your phone but didn't know the PIN code nor the unblocking code (PUK). Contact your service provider.

The display shows IMSI failure

This problem is related to your subscription. Contact your operator.

Your phone doesn't return to the idle screen

Long press the hangup key or switch off the phone, check that the SIM card and the battery are installed correctly and switch it on again.

The network symbol is not displayed

The network connection is lost. Either you are in a radio shadow (in a tunnel or between tall buildings) or you are outside the network coverage area. Try from another place, try to reconnect to the network (especially when abroad), check that the antenna is in place if your mobile has an external antenna, or

contact your network operator for assistance/information.

The display doesn't respond (or the display responds slowly) to key presses

The display responds more slowly at very low temperatures. This is normal and does not affect the operation of the phone. Take the phone to a warmer place and try again. In other cases please contact your phone supplier.

Your battery seems to over heat

You might be using a charger that was not intended for your phone. Make sure you always use the Philips authentic accessory shipped with your phone.

Your phone doesn't display the phone numbers of incoming calls

This feature is network and subscription dependent. If the network doesn't send the caller's number, the phone will display Call I or Withheld instead. Contact your operator for detailed information on this subject.

You can't send text messages

Some networks don't allow message exchanges with other networks. First check that you entered the number of your SMS centre, or contact your operator for detailed information on this subject.

You can't receive and/or store JPEG pictures

A picture may not be accepted by your mobile phone if it is too large, if its name is too long, or if it doesn't have the correct file format.

You have the feeling that you miss some calls Check your call divert options.

During battery charge, the battery icon shows no bar and the outline is flashing

Only charge the battery in an environment where the temperature does not go below 0°C (32°F) or above 50°C (113°F).

In other cases please contact your phone supplier.

The display shows SIM failure

Check that the SIM card has been inserted in the right position. If the problem remains, your SIM card may be damaged. Contact your operator.

When attempting to use a feature in the menu, the mobile displays NOT ALLOWED

Some features are network dependent. They are only available, therefore, if the network or your subscription supports them. Contact your operator for detailed information on this subject.

The display shows INSERT YOUR SIM CARD

Check that the SIM card has been inserted in the right position. If the problem remains, your SIM card might be damaged. Contact your operator.

The autonomy of your phone seems lower that indicated in the user guide

The autonomy is linked to your settings (e.g., ringer volume, backlight duration) and the features you use. To increase the autonomy, and whenever possible, you must deactivate features you do not use.

Your phone doesn't work well in your car

A car contains many metallic parts that absorb electromagnetic waves which can affect the phone's performances. A car kit is available to provide you with an external antenna and enables you to make and receive phone calls without handling the handset.

Your phone is not charging
