
Soft keys

Fast Keys

- Long press to enter "+" when making international calls.
- Long press to access the voice
- Vibration on or off for incoming calls or messages.

Navigation Keys



Press navigation key to view the menu and options

You can configure the navigation keys ♠, ▼, ◀ or ▶ to access your favorite features directly.On idle screen, press the keys to access the features.

Go to Settings > General > Fast keys to check the default settings of the navigation keys ♠, ▼, ◀ or ▶ and 🖃 , 🖃 keys.

To change the default settings,

Functional displays

On the idle screen, you can switch between up to 5 displays.

With such functional displays, you can quickly check or edit to-do list (*Calendar*) or memos (*Quick notes*); or play music (*Music*) or listen to radio (*FM radio*) from the idle screen; or show clock time (if you select *Analog* or *Digital* in *Settings* > *Time* & *date* > *Time display mode*).

Customize functional displays

Select up to 5 functional displays as needed.

If you want to deselect Clock, please go to Settings > Time&Date > Time display mode, and select off.

Switch between different displays

Play music on displays

Listen to a radio station on displays

Stylus

The touch screen allows you to enter text by directly writing on the screen, or tap to select the desired option. The supplied stylus makes it easier to do so.

The first time you switch on the phone, you are asked to do calibration for the stylus. Thus,

strokes or taps by the stylus will be precisely displayed on the screen.

You can also do the calibration in Settings > General > Pen calibration by following the screen instructions.

Power-saving mode

After the set time span, the phone has the idle screen turned off automatically. To exit the power-saving mode, press any key. For power-saving purpose, set the time span to a low value in Settings > Display > Backlight duration & Backlight level.

Auto keypad lock

In the idle mode, your phone can have the keypad locked automatically after the set time span.

To set the auto keypad lock

Go to Settings > General > Auto keypad lock.

To unlock the keypad

Long press **.** or slide the lock to unlock keypad.

To lock the keypad manually

On the idle screen, long press ***.

Predictive dialing

Quickly search and list your desired phone number (saved in SIM or/and Smart phonebook and call history) on the idle screen.

*If the phone number you finding is not saved in SIM or/and Smart phonebook and call history, the funtion of predictive dialing is unavailable.

Turn the predictive dialing on/off

Go to Settings > General > Predictive dialing > On/ Off to enable or disable the function.

Use predictive dialing

- I. Press •, ▶ to turn Predictive dialing on in Settings
- > General, if necessary.
- 2. On the idle screen, enter any two consecutive numbers from the contact phone number you want to dial.

To use your phone, you must insert a valid SIM card supplied by your GSM operator or retailer. The SIM card contains your subscription information, your mobile phone number and a memory in which you can store phone numbers and messages.

Inserting the SIM card

Follow the steps bellow to insert your new SIM cards. Remember to switch off your mobile phone before removing the back cover.

 Press on the back cover and slide the cover as showm.



2. As shown, take out the battery.



You may lose all your personal settings if you remove the battery when the phone is switched on.

As shown, align your SIM card with the SIM care slot, beveled corner facing you and gold contact downwards. Insert your SIM card under the metal clip holder.



As shown, align the metallic connectors on the battery and battery slot. Insert the battery until it is locked.



5. As shown, insert the back cover from the bottom. Push the cover until it is locked.



Remove the protective film covering the screen and camera lens before using the phone.

Charging the battery

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable battery. A new battery is partially charged. The battery symbol indicates the state of the battery.

To charge the battery, plug in the connector as shown below. Then plug the other end into a power socket.



During charging, the battery symbol scrolls.

Keeping the charger plugged to the mobile phone when the battery is fully charged will not damage the battery. The only way to turn off the charger is to unplug it, so it is advisable to use an easily accessible power socket.

If you do not intend to use your phone for several days, we recommend that you remove the battery.

You can use the phone while it is charging. If the battery is completely flat, the battery symbol will only reappear after a few minutes of charging.

Set clock

Check that your phone is switched on.
 Long press if necessary. Enter the PIN
 code if required. A PIN code is a 4- to 8 digit secret code of your SIM card. It is
 preconfigured and communicated to you
 by your network or retailer.

If you enter an incorrect PIN code three times in succession, your SIM card will be blocked. To

unblock it, you must request the PUK code from your operator.

Press down the card holder and pull it until it is locked.

2 Text Entry

Your mobile phone supports a number of text entry methods, including T9 input, multi-tap input, numeric input and symbol input.

Using the supplied stylus (the handwriting recognition mode)


Write on the screen using the supplied stylus, as you do on paper using a pen.

T9[®] input



T9® predictive text input is an intelligent editing mode for messages, which includes a comprehensive dictionary. It allows you to quickly enter text.

You need to press only once on the key corresponding to each letter needed to spell a word: keystrokes input are analyzed and the word suggested by T9® is displayed at the popup window.

How to enter the word "Home":

- I. Press (4), (62), (62), (34).
 - The screen displays the first word of a list: Good.
- 2. Press ▼ to scroll and select Home.

3. Press Select to confirm.

Multi-tap input (ABC/Abc/abc)

Press the keys that are marked with the corresponding letter you wish to enter. Press once to get the first letter on the key, press twice quickly to get the second letter and so on until the letter you want is displayed on the screen.

Example: how to enter the word "home": Press $4 \stackrel{\wedge}{=} , 4 \stackrel{\wedge}{=} (GHI), 6 \stackrel{\wedge}{=} , 6 \stackrel{\wedge}{=} , 6 \stackrel{\wedge}{=} (MNO), 6 \stackrel{\wedge}{=} (MNO), 8 \stackrel{\wedge}{=} , 9 \stackrel{\wedge}{=} (DEF).$

Stroke input

The principle of stroke input is to dissect and separate every stroke of a Chinese character according to sequence. When you wish to input the character, press the keys corresponding to the required strokes according to sequence to get the desired character. The stroke input method in this phone classifies a Chinese character into 5 basic strokes: (horizontal,

vertical, left falling stroke, right falling stroke and over-down) as well as a special stroke. When the stroke you need does not correspond to the 5 basic strokes, replace it with the special strokes.

Making a call

From idle screen

- I. Enter the phone number.

Speed dial

On the idle screen, you can call a preset speed-dial number by long pressing a numeric key (2. to 9...).

Set your speed-dial number before dialing it.

To assign a speed-dial key to a contact:

- **I.** Go to Settings > General > Speed dial.
- In Set number, select one of the locations (corresponding to the numeric keys ²/₋₋₋ to ⁹/₋₋₋).
- **3.** Press Assign to assign to the location a contact from your phonebook.

Answering and ending a call

When you receive a call, the number of the caller may be displayed, depending on whether or not the calling party has chosen to display his or her ID. If the number is stored in the phonebook, then the corresponding name is displayed.

- Answer the call: Press \square or \bigcirc .
- Hang up: Press 📧.
- To answer or end a call using the supplied one-key headset, (see "Headset" on page 90).
- To reject calls from certain contacts, you can add the contacts or numbers to your blacklist. In Contacts > Options > Advanced, Messaging > Inbox or Calls > All calls, select a contact or phone number, and press Options > Add to blacklist (For more information about blacklist, (see "Blacklist" on page 42)).

The phone will not ring and vibrate if it is in Silent mode (see "Profiles" on page 70).

Options during a call

During a call, you can press to select *H*-free or *H*-held mode. Press Options to access the following options:

- Hold single call: Put current call on hold
- End single call: End current call
- Sound recorder: Record conversation during a call. (see "Record a sound memo" on page 39)
- Mute: Mute/unmute the call

Sound recorder

In most countries, recording of telephone conversation is subject to legislation. We advise you to notify the caller if you intend to record the conversation and only do so if they agree.

You should also ensure confidentiality of the recordings.

To record a conversation during a call, select *Options* and select *Sound recorder*. Recorded sound is saved in *.amr format and stored in *Audio* of *My files* menu. (see "Finding your files" on page 63).

Mute or unmute a call

During a call, select *Options* and select to set the *Mute* function *On/Off*. If you select *Mute*, the microphone will be deactivated.

Adjust the volume

During a call, press side volume key + or - to increase or decrease the volume.

Handling multiple calls (Networkdependent)

You can handle two or more calls at the same time, as well as make conference calls with your

phone. The availability of this feature is dependent on your network operator and/or your subscription.

Make a second call

You can make a second call when there is an active call or with a call on hold. While on the phone, enter the number (or select a contact from the phonebook) and press . The first call is put on hold and the second number is dialed. You can then select options to access the following options:

- Swap: To toggle between 2 calls.
- Conference: To introduce the caller into a conference call.
- End single call: To disconnect one party from the call.
- End all calls: To disconnect all party from the call.
- Transfer: Connect the two calls. You are disconnected when the transfer is completed.

 Sound recorder: Record conversation during a call.

Answer a second call

When you receive a second call while already in communication, the phone will emit a beep tone and the screen displays information about the incoming call. You can then:

- Press or to answer the call (the first one is put on hold).
- Press 📧 to reject the call.

To receive a second call, you must first deactivate *Call Divert* for (see page 73) and activate *Call waiting* (see page 73) must be activated.

Making an emergency call

Without a SIM card in phone, you can press SOS to make the emergency call.

With a SIM card in phone, you can enter the emergency number in the idle mode, then press ____.

In Europe, the standard emergency number is 112, in the UK, it is 999.

Creating messages

SMS

SMS enables you to send text messages to the other party, using Short Messaging Service (SMS). You can use the SMS menu to send messages to another hand-phone or a device that is capable of receiving SMS messages. To compose and send a SMS message, follow the steps below:

MMS

Your mobile phone can also send and receive MMS (Multimedia Messaging Service) messages. With MMS, you can send messages that contain pictures, sound and text.

When sending MMS messages, make sure that your recipient also has an MMS-enabled phone in order to view your messages. Follow the steps described below to compose and send an MMS

Memory

View the memory status of your MMS

E-mail

If not included in your mobile phone contract, you will need to subscribe to an E-mail service in order to send and receive E-mails. In this case, all parameters are communicated to you by your operator.

This menu allows you to send E-mails to one or several recipients at a time, including with an attachment such as a JPEG picture. Once received, your messages can be forwarded and the attachments can be visualized with the appropriate software.

Set up E-mail profiles

The *Email accounts* allows you to *Activate*, or *Edit* one of the available email profiles. You can also

create a new Email account. Consult the network operator for the account information. If necessary, consult your mail service provider for the mail server configuration.

Send and receive E-mail

5 Contacts



Contacts are stored in one of the two available phonebooks: SIM phonebook (located on your SIM card, by which the number of entries you can store depends on the card capacity) or the Smart Phonebook (located on your phone, which allows you to store up to 2000 names). New contacts will only be added to the phonebook you have selected.

Adding or editing contacts

Add a contact to Smart phonebook

For contacts on the Smart Phonebook, you can add detailed information, like home number and office number, and identifying features, like contact pictures and ringtones.

Radio Waves



Your cellular mobile phone is a low power radio transmitter and receiver. When it is operating, it sends and receives radio waves. The radio waves carry your voice or data

signal to a base station that is connected to the telephone network. The network controls the power at which the phone transmits.

- Your phone transmits/receives radio waves in the GSM frequency (900 / 1800 / 1900 MHz).
- The GSM network controls transmission power (0.01 to 2 watts).
- Your phone complies with all relevant safety standards.
- The CE mark on your phone shows compliancy with European electromagnetic

compatibility (Ref. 89/336/EEC) and low voltage directives (Ref. 73/23/EEC).

Your cellular mobile phone is your responsibility. To avoid damage to yourself, to others or to the phone itself, read and follow all the safety instructions and make them known to anyone borrowing your phone. Furthermore to prevent unauthorised use of your phone:



Keep your phone in a safe place and keep it out of small children's reach.

Avoid writing down your PIN code. Try to remember it instead.

Switch off the phone and remove the battery if you are going to leave it unused for a long time. Change your PIN code after purchasing the phone and to activate call restriction options.



The design of your phone complies with all applicable laws and regulations. However your phone may cause interference with other electronic devices. Consequently you should

follow all local recommendations and regulations when using your cellular phone both at home and when away. Regulations on the use of cellular phones in vehicles and aircraft are particularly stringent.

Public concern has been focused for some time on the possible health risks for users of cellular phones. The current research on radio wave technology, including the GSM technology, has been reviewed and safety standards have been drawn up to ensure protection from exposure to radio wave energy. Your cellular telephone complies with all applicable safety standards and the Radio Equipment and Telecommunications Terminal Equipment Directive 1999/5/EC.

Always switch off your phone...

Inadequately protected or sensitive electronic equipment may be affected by radio energy. This interference can lead to accidents.



Before boarding an aircraft and/ or when packing the phone in your luggage: the use of mobile phones in an aircraft may be dangerous for

the operation of the aircraft, disrupt the mobile phones network and may be illegal.



In hospitals, clinics, other health care centres and anywhere else where you may be in the close vicinity of medical equipment.



In areas with a potentially **explosive atmosphere** (e.g. petrol stations and also areas where the air contains dust particles, such as metal powders).

In a vehicle transporting flammable products (even if the vehicle is parked) or a vehicle powered by liquefied petroleum gas (LPG), check first that the vehicle complies with the applicable safety rules.

In areas where you are requested to turn off radio transmitting devices, such as quarries or other areas where blasting operations are in progress.



- Use the ear opposite to the pacemaker to minimise the potential interference.
- Switch off your phone if you suspect that interference is taking place.

Hearing aids

If you are a user of a **hearing aid**, consult your physician and hearing aid manufacturer to learn whether your particular device is susceptible to cellular phone interference.

Improved performance

In order to improve the performance of your phone, reduce radio energy emission, reduce battery consumption and ensure safe operation adhere to the following guidelines:

 Do not expose your phone to extreme temperatures.

- Treat the phone with care. Any misuse will void the International Guarantee.
- Do not immerse the phone in any liquid; if your phone is damp, switch it off, remove the battery and let them dry for 24hrs before using them again.



Tips

How to prolong the battery life of your phone

To have your mobile phone function properly, sufficient battery power is important. For the power-saving purpose, do the following, if applicable:

- Turn off the Bluetooth function of your phone.
- 2. Set the backlight level of your phone to a low value. Or, turn on the light sensor.
- Set the backlight duration of your phone to a low value.
- Turn on the auto keypad lock. When the keypad is locked, your phone goes to the power-saving mode.
- Turn off the key sounds, tap vibration, or vibration alerts.

- Establish GPRS connection when needed. Otherwise, your phone will keep searching for GPRS connection, and drain your battery power.
- Turn off your phone if there is no coverage. Otherwise, the phone will keep searching for network, and drain your battery power.

Troubleshooting

The phone does not switch on

Remove/reinstall the battery. Then charge the phone until the battery icon stops scrolling. Unplug the charger and try to switch the mobile on.

The display shows **BLOCKED** when you switch on the phone

Somebody tried to use your phone but didn't know the PIN code nor the unblocking code (PUK). Contact your service provider.

The display shows IMSI failure

This problem is related to your subscription. Contact your operator.

Your phone doesn't return to idle screen

Long press the hang-up key or switch off the phone, check that the SIM card and the battery are installed correctly and switch it on again.

The network symbol is not displayed

The network connection is lost. Either you are in a radio shadow (in a tunnel or between tall buildings) or you are outside the network coverage area. Try from another place, try to reconnect to the network (especially when abroad), check that the antenna is in place if your mobile has an external antenna, or contact your network operator for assistance/information.

The display doesn't respond (or the display responds slowly) to key presses

The display responds more slowly at very low temperatures. This is normal and does not affect

the operation of the phone. Take the phone to a warmer place and try again. In other cases please contact your phone supplier.

Your battery seems to over heat

You might be using a charger that was not intended for use with your phone. Make sure you always use the Philips authentic accessory shipped with your phone.

Your phone doesn't display the phone numbers of incoming calls

This feature is network and subscription dependent. If the network doesn't send the caller's number, the phone will display *Call I* or *Withheld* instead. Contact your operator for detailed information on this subject.

You can't send text messages

The display shows SIM failure

Check that the SIM card has been inserted correctly. If the problem persists, your SIM card may be damaged. Contact your operator.

When attempting to use a feature in the menu, the display shows NOT ALLOWED

Some features are network dependent. They are only available, therefore, if the network or your subscription supports them. Contact your operator for detailed information on this subject.

The display shows INSERT YOUR SIM CARD

Check that the SIM card has been inserted correctly. If the problem persists, your SIM card may be damaged. Contact your operator.

The autonomy of your phone seems lower than indicated on the user guide

Your phone doesn't work well in your car
