Softkeys

The left and right soft keys (\Box and \Box) are located at the top of keypad area. Pressing the soft keys allows you to select the option displayed on the screen directly above them, including options during a call. The functions of the soft keys change according to the current context.

Press ☐ in idle mode to access the main menu and press ♠, ▼, ◀ or ▶ to navigate through the icons and lists, or press ☐ keys, and ☐ or ☐ keys to access the options and functions directly. When navigating through a list, the scrolling bar on the right of the screen will indicate your current position in the list. Press ☐ Select or ☐ to access the corresponding options of the selected item in the list. Press ☐ Back to return to the previous menu.

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I. Getting Started

Please read the safety instructions in the "Precautions" section before use.

Before you start using your phone, you must insert a valid SIM card supplied by your GSM operator or retailer. The SIM card contains your subscription information, your mobile telephone number, and a small quantity of memory in which you can store phone numbers and messages (for more information, see "Contacts" on page 61).

You can also insert a memory card. This provides you with expanded memory capability, which allows you to store additional music, photo, and video files separate from the phone's built-in memory.

Inserting the SIM card

Remove the back cover

Make sure that the phone is switched off. You need to remove the back cover and the battery of your phone before you can insert the SIM card. Hold the phone with the front facing downwards as illustrated in the diagram and push the back cover in the direction as shown.

Lift up the back cover from its slot.



Remove the battery

Put your finger on the black holder located at the top of the battery and lift the battery up from its slot.



You may lose all your personal settings if you remove the battery when the phone is switched on.

Insert the SIM card

Make sure that the clipped corner of the SIM card is facing the correct direction (clipped corner at upper left) and the metallic contacts are facing downwards. Slide the SIM card into the card slot until it stops. When you remove your SIM card from its holder, make sure that you smoothen the edges, otherwise you may have difficulty sliding the card into the SIM slot.



Replace the battery

With the metallic contacts facing downwards, insert one side of the battery into the slot and press it down to lock it into place.



Replace the back cover

Align and slide the back cover into its slot as shown until it locks into place.



When inserting the battery, be careful not to damage the metallic connectors of the SIM card slot

When the phone is switched on without a SIM card, users can access the main menu by pressing \square or \square , or make SOS emergency number via \square or \square .

Switching on the phone

To switch on the phone, long-press the key. Enter the PIN code if required (the 4 to 8 digit secret code of your SIM card). It is preconfigured and provided to you by your network operator or retailer. For more information on PIN code, see "Security" on page 73.

If you enter an incorrect PIN code 3 times in succession, your SIM card will be blocked. To unblock it, you must obtain the PUK code from your network operator.

Switching off the phone

At all times, you can long press 🔊 to switch off the phone.

Charging the battery

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable battery. The new battery is partially charged. A sound alert will be emitted to warn you when the battery level becomes low

We recommend that you do not remove the battery when the phone is switched on as you may lose all your personal settings as a result. If you do remove it, the date and time settings are only memorized for a short while. As such, you need to reset the information after you have installed the battery back again.

Once the battery and battery cover are installed, you can charge the phone. Plug in the connector as shown below. Then plug the other end into an AC power socket.



The battery symbol indicates the state of charge. During charging, the charge indicators will scroll; it takes around 2.5 hours to fully charge the battery. When all the scroll bars are steady, the battery is fully charged. You can then disconnect the charger. Depending on the network and condition of use, talk time and stand-by time can go up to 8.5 hours* and 30 days* respectively.

*Depending on the network conditions, user settings, method of use, etc the actual results may differ.

Keeping the charger plugged to the mobile phone when the battery is fully charged will not damage the battery. The only way to turn off the charger is to unplug it, so it is advisable to use an easily accessible AC power socket.

If you do not intend to use your phone for several days, we recommend that you remove the battery.

You can use the phone while it is charging (note that the vibra alert goes off when the charger is connected). If the battery is completely flat, the battery icon will only reappear after a few minutes of charging.

Setting Hotkeys

You can configure the numeric keys - - - - to access your favourite features. Once they have been set, you can simply long press on the numeric key to access the corresponding features.

Majority of the hotkeys have been preset and configured. To check the hotkey settings, go to *Menu* > *Settings* > *Shortcuts* > *Hotkey*. For more information, see "Shortcuts" on page 73.

2. Calling

Make a call

You can make a call only when the network name appears on the screen. If there is no network name on the screen, you need to reregister.

From the idle screen

- In idle mode, enter the phone number using the keypad. To correct an error, press □.
- 2. Press To dial.
- 3. Press or End to hang up.

For an international call, long press on to enter the "+" sign for the international prefix.

Using the phonebook

- 1. Press ▼ in idle mode.
- 2. Select a contact in the list.
- 3. Press \square : the selected number is dialed.
- 4. Press ¬ or □ End to hang up.

Make an international call

- 1. Long press until "+" appears on the screen.
- 2. Enter the country code.
- 3. Enter the area code (normally without the 0 in front), followed by the phone number.
- 4. Press To call directly.

Answer, reject, and end a call

When receiving a call, the number of the caller may be displayed, depending on whether or not the person calling has chosen to display his or her ID. If the number is stored in the selected phonebook, then the corresponding name is displayed instead of the number.

- Answer the call: press \square .
- Reject the call: press or long press volume side keys.
- Hang up: press 🗟.

The phone will not ring if in Silent mode.

Call handsfree

For your own comfort and safety, ensure you move the phone away from your ear when calling handsfree, especially when increasing the volume.

- In idle mode, enter the phone number using the keypad or select a contact in the phonebook.
- 2. Press ☐ or ☐ Options then select Dial > Handsfree dial and press ☐ or ☐ Select.

If you are already on the phone, long press 🗀 to switch to handsfree mode and back.

Adjust speaker/earpiece volume

During a call, call on hold or call waiting, you can press \P/P or press the volume side keys to increase or decrease the volume (if you are no browsing the call options menu). When the volume has been set, the call volume will take effect immediately and the settings will be applied to your subsequent calls.

Options during a call

During a call, press \Box Options to access the following options.

Activate h/free

This option allows you to use your mobile phone's handsfree option. When the headset is plugged into the phone, you cannot activate handsfree mode.

Mute/Unmute

Allows you to mute or unmute the microphone. If you select mute, the microphone will be deactivated so that your caller cannot hear you. When you switch from one call to another, muting will be cancelled.

Record dialogue

In most countries, recording telephone conversation is subject to legislation. We advise you to notify the caller if you intend to record your conversation and only do so if they agree.

During a call, press © Options and select Record to access the 3 recording options; namely, Record both (default), Record the opposite party and Record own (applicable to two-party calls or multi-party calls). Long press of to start or end recording. When you end the call, the recording will stop and be saved automatically in AMR format under My Files > Sounds.

12 Calling

There is no limit to the length of the recording; the recording will stop only when you press \square key to stop the recording, when there is insufficient memory, or when the call has ended.

Other options during a call

Press © Options to be able to perform the following tasks while a call is ongoing:

- Put the call on hold so the caller can't hear you
- · Dial a new number
- End the current call
- Send SMS
- · Access to the contacts list

Handling a second call

Make a second call (Network dependent)

You can make a second call by putting the current call on hold.

- During a call with Party A: you can enter Party B's number using the keypad and press to dial Party B's number. Party A will be put on hold automatically.

Switch calls (Network dependent)

When you have one active call and one call on hold, you can press — Options, then select Accept all to switch between the 2 calls or select reject call to end the incoming call.

Answer a second call (Network dependent)

If you have activated Call waiting, you will be alerted when there is a second incoming call. You can:

- 1. Press T to answer the second call. The current call will be put on hold automatically.

Fotocall

This feature allows you to link a contact in your phonebook to a photo you have taken using the Camera function, or a picture you have downloaded via WAP or data cable. During a call, if the other party's name card is linked to a picture, the incoming call background will display the corresponding picture. This feature is referred to as "Fotocall".

Fotocall is only available on the phone memory. The photo size should not be larger than 128 x 160 pixels.

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3. Text and number entry

Input method

Your mobile phone supports several input methods, which include:

- T9 Pinyin: Enter chinese characters with T9 Pinyin;
- T9 Traditional Chinese Zhuyin: Enter Traditional Chinese characters with T9 Zhuyin;
- T9 Stroke: Enter Chinese characters with T9 wubi and stroke components;
- T9 Traditional Chinese stroke: Enter Traditional Chinese characters with Wubi or stroke components;
- T9 English (T9eng/T9Eng): Enter English text using T9 English;
- Multi-Tap (abc/Abc/ABC): Press the keys that are marked with the corresponding letter you wish to enter. Press once to get the first letter on the key, press twice quickly to get the second letter and so on until the letter you want is displayed on the screen.
- 123: Enter numbers

This phone supports T9 Simplified Chinese association input method as well.

The text editor remembers the last input method you have used before you exit the editing screen. When you access the editor again, it will automatically select the last input method you have used.

Entering texts and numbers

You can input text in the editor using: T9 English input, English alphabets, Pinyin, Zhuyin, Simplified Chinese Stroke or Traditional Chinese Stroke. In addition, there are two input methods for you to enter numbers and punctuations. The icon displayed on the screen shows the current input method. You can press to switch from one mode to another. Long press is required under Zhuyin mode. Long press to activate

or deactivate T9. Short press to enter punctuations or long press to select input language.

Entering symbols

In any input mode, press (e.g.) to open/close symbols input screen. If the symbols occupy more than one screen, press (T) to scroll up/down the pages. press ok to confirm the symbol input.

Shift case

Press to shift case in the English input editor.

Delete

When there are contents in the input row, press \Box *Clear* to delete the rightmost character or symbol. The candidate area will be updated accordingly until the input row is cleared. Long press \Box *Clear* to clear the input row.

When the input row is empty, press \supseteq Clear will delete the character on the left of the cursor in the text area. Long press \supseteq Clear to clear the contents in the text area.

T9[®] English input

What is it?

T9[®] predictive Text Input is an intelligent editing mode for messages, which includes a comprehensive dictionary. It allows you to quickly enter text. You need to press only once on the key corresponding to each letter needed to spell a word: keystrokes input are analysed and the word suggested by T9[®] is displayed at the pop-up window. If there are more than 3 candidates, a scroll bar is shown, press ♠ or ▼ to browse the list and choose from those proposed by the T9[®] built-in dictionary (see example below). After you have input the word, press OK or □ to confirm, press ▶ to insert space.

How to use it?



Pinyin Input

Press (***) and select Pinyin input mode. Each Pinyin letter is represented by one of the numeric keys as shown below: (Note that Pinyin input mode is solely meant for the input of Simplified Chinese characters. You cannot input Traditional Chinese characters).

The general steps of using Pinyin input method are as follows:



Enter the pinyin letters accordingly. Press once on the key corresponding to the pinyin letter without having to consider its position on the key. Pinyin input method will automatically select and list all possible combinations for you to select.

For example, to input the character \$\Bar{\textit{\mathbb{E}}}\Bar{\textit{\mathbb{g}}}\], with the Pinyin letters \$\Bar{\textit{\mathbb{w}}}\] wang \$\Bar{\textit{\mathbb{e}}}\], press \$\Bar{\textit{\mathbb{e}}}\] to select the desired pinyin combination for \$\Bar{\textit{\mathbb{w}}}\] wang \$\Bar{\textit{\mathbb{e}}}\], then press \$\Bar{\textit{\mathbb{e}}}\] to confirm combination. After that, you may press a number key to enter the intonation of the character (1-1 tone, 2-2 tone, 3-3 tone, 4-4 tone) to narrow down the candidate characters selection range. Then press \$\Bar{\textit{\mathbb{e}}}\] to select the desired character \$\Bar{\mathbb{E}}\Bar{\mathbb{e}}\] and press \$\Bar{\mathbb{e}}\] to confirm the input of this character.

As soon as you have selected and entered a character, the candidate list will be updated and a list of association characters will be displayed. Press ◀ or ▶ to select the desired association character and press to confirm entry. This speeds up the input process further.

When you have finished editing a name on the phonebook or SMS, press Back to exit from association character input mode and press to confirm completion of the editing process.

Zhuyin Input

When the zhuyin combination appears on the input row, press \P/P to move the selection box over the zhuyin combination and press \square to enter character selection mode.

Selection

Press ◀/▶ to move the selection box left or right, and press ▲/▼ to scroll list. When the selection box is on the desired character, press to confirm the input and go into association input mode.

Association

The input area is empty and the candidate area display a list of association characters. Press the navigation keys to select an association character, or press a number key to input a new zhuyin combination.

Press to select stroke input mode. The strokes are represented on each key as follows:

The basic steps of Stroke input are as follows:

1. Enter strokes

(excluding 3 and 7)

3. Confirm selection

Select and enter association character, or return to step 1 to enter new strokes.

 Or press ☐ Back to exit from association character input mode, then press ☐ to complete the editing.

The principle of stroke input is to dissect and separate every stroke of a chinese character according to sequence. When you wish to input the character, press the keys corresponding to the required strokes according to sequence to get the desired character. The stroke input method in this phone classify a chinese character into 5 basic strokes: (horizontal, vertical, left falling stroke, right falling stroke and over-down) as well as a special stroke. When the stroke you need does not correspond to the 5

basic strokes, replace it with the special stroke. The examples below will give you a clearer understanding of how to use stroke input method:

Generally, you will be able to find a desired character before you finished entering all the strokes. After you have entered the name of the phonebook or SMS, press \square *Back* to exit from association character list and press \square to confirm completion of text editing.

The input mode for Traditional chinese stroke and Simplified Chinese stroke are similar, with the exception of the character coding.

4. Entertainment



This section describes the games and additional tools installed on your mobile phone.

Games

Please ensure that the camera lens is clean before you take pictures, as small dust particles can strongly affect the picture quality.

SMS

SMS (Short Message Service) is a service that lets you to send text messages to another party. You can use the SMS menu on the phone to send messages to another mobile phone or a device that is capable of receiving SMS.

Your phone can store up to 500 messages. Once you have reached 500 messages, the screen will flash an icon to alert you. You need to delete some messages in order to receive new ones.

- 1. In idle mode, press to enter the main menu.

Create, edit and send SMS

You need to enter the correct message center number before you can send SMS. The number can be obtained from your network operator.

If your SMS is not sent successfully, you can resend it. If your SMS cannot be sent successfully after several attempts, please check if your SMS center number has been set correctly.

When editing SMS, for certain reasons (such as an incoming call, out of battery), you are forced to exit from the SMS editing screen before you managed to send or save your message successfully, the edited message will be saved automatically. The next time you enter the SMS editor, the message will be displayed on the screen.

MMS (network dependent)

Your phone allows you to send and receive multimedia messages, known as MMS, which features text, pictures, sound and video clips. MMS can comprise one or several slides. Whether you send it to an e-mail address or to another mobile phone, the MMS will be played as a slide show.

Your phone can support 50 MMS (maximum 98KB). When the maximum of 50 MMS is reached, the screen will display a MMS icon to alert you. You will need to delete some old MMS in order to receive new ones.

Before you can send MMS, you need to enter the correct MMS center number and ensure that the network profile of your MMS has been correctly configured. You can obtain such information from your network operator.

You can forward your calls to your voice mailbox (the phone number for callers to leave a message) via the Call forwarding feature.

Call voice mail

When you receive a voice mail, the phone will send you an alert. You can then call your voice mailbox number to retrieve your voice mail.

In idle mode, long press to call your voice mailbox directly. If the number is empty, you will be prompted to enter the number.

Voice mail number

Generally, you can obtain two sets of numbers from your network provider:

- number for the caller to leave a message (this number can also used for Call Forwarding)
- number for you to retrieve your voice messages

Cell broadcast

This is a network service which allows you to receive text messages of various contents, such as news, traffic, etc. These messages are provided by the network to the subscribers within a certain network area. If this service is available, the network will provide you with the broadcast channel numbers. It gives you access to the options listed below.

When you received a broadcast message, the message content will be displayed on the screen until you press \square Back. Broadcast messages will not be saved on your mobile phone or your SIM card. Once you exit from the message screen, you will not be able to read it again.

To obtain the codes corresponding to the different types, you must contact your operator.

Message Settings

SMS

Select Messages > Message settings > SMS to open the list of SMS accounts. Press (Options > Edit to edit the SMS settings.

Serivce center number

This menu allows you to save and edit the SMS service center number of your home network. If the service center number is empty, you will not be able to send any SMS.

Validity period

Allows you to select the duration by which your messages will be stored in the message center. You can select from: 12 hours, 1 day, 1 week and Maximum (default). Press ¶/ to select a value.

This option is useful when your recipient is not connected to the network and is not able to receive your messages immediately.

This feature is subscription dependent.

Delivery report

You can select Gon or Off. This option allows you to set whether or not to notify you the send status of your messages: successfully sent to the recipient, or not sent successfully.

This feature is subscription dependent.

Signature

You can select \Box On or Off (Default is Off). If set to On, the signature will be added to the end of your message before it is sent to your recipient.

If the SMS is too long after adding the signature, the signature will be shortened automatically.

Saved location

You can select the preferred storage location of your messages: SIM card (Default) or mobile phone.

MMS

This menu allows you to set your MMS center and personalize your MMS settings. The options include:

Profiles

You can select or edit the parameters.

Sender visibility

You can press Thange to set this option On or Off. It is used to set if your identity will be visible when MMS is sent.

Priority

This option allows you to set the priority level of your MMS. You can set Low, Normal (default) or *High*.

Delivery report

You can press Change to set this option On or Off. When set to On, a report will be sent to notify you if the MMS has been delivered to the recipient.

Read report

You can press \subseteq *Change* to set this option *On* or *Off*. When set to *On*, a report will be sent to notify you if the MMS has been read by the recipient.

Expiry time

Allows you to select the duration by which your MMS will be stored in the MMS center. You can choose from 6 hours, 12 hours, 1 day, 1 week or Maximum (default).

Retrieval

When downloading MMS messages, this function allows you to select:

- Automatic: New MMS are directly placed in the Inbox. Select the MMS and press of to play it.
- Deferred: You connect manually to the server by selecting a notification in the Inbox

Auto. in home network: When roaming, new MMS will be directly placed in the Inbox and you will be able to play it only by using your home network.

9. My Files



This menu allows you to store the files in different folders (*Pictures, Videos, Sounds, Others*) to facilitate more efficient management of files in your phone and the memory card. In addition, you can obtain information regarding your phone and memory card, such as number of files, memory utilised, percentage of memory utilised via the *Memory status* option.

When you enter this menu, the photos which you have taken using the phone's camera as well as pictures you have downloaded via MMS, WAP or USB will be displayed in a list.

The calendar stores the alarm date and time of every event. If the current date and time correspond with the date and time of the event, the phone will emit an alarm (if needed), and the screen will display a prompt to indicate that a new event has arrived.

You can create a maximum of 30 events. The list will display part of the contents. Once you have selected an event, you can press to view the detailed information.

- 1. Enter the menu.
- The options include: View day, View week, New event, Go to date, Advanced.

Add new event

The list of events will be displayed. When you add a new event, you need to enter the corresponding information of the event, such as subject, location, start date, start time, end date, end time, reminder and repeat method.

If the memory space for events is full, the phone will prompt you that there is no more space.

When editing date and time, the phone will display the default or the selected date and time. You can edit or confirm them directly.

The maximum length of an event is 40 characters.

The phone provides the following alert types: No reminder, On time, 5 minutes before, 15 minutes before, 1 hour before, 1 day before and Others (the reminder time can be set by you).

Repeat method

The phone provides the following repeat methods: once, daily, weekly, monthly and annually.

Delete	To delete the event.

When you change the date and time of your phone, the next alert will be repeated based on the modified date and time of the phone.

When you switch off the phone, the organizer alert will be postponed until the next time you switch on the phone. For repeated events, only the latest one will be alerted.

Alarm

This phone supports 24-hour alarm. The available options are:

Options	Description
Simple alarm	A simple alarm rings only once. Set the alarm status to <i>On</i> or <i>Off</i> by pressing (a) Change. When set to <i>On</i> , you need to specify the alarm time and press (a) to confirm.
Recurrent alarm	A recurrent alarm rings according to the day you specify in a week. For example, if you select Sunday and Monday, the alarm clock will ring every Sunday and Monday. Press to set on the alarm.

When the set alarm time is reached, the alarm will ring even if your phone is switched off. Press any key to disable the alarm and the mobile phone will be switched off automatically. If you have downloaded your own ring tones and have selected such a ring tone to be the alarm alert, then after you set the alarm and switched off the phone, the alert tone will be changed back to the original factory settings. This does not apply if the ring tone you have chosen is one that comes as default with your phone.

International clock

The International clock allows you to check the time of the major cities of the world. You can activate or deactivate the clock display in the *Clock status* submenu by pressing Change to toggle between *On* and *Off*.

Local settings

To set the local time zone. The screen displays a world map with the current date and time. A vertical highlight in orange indicates the current zone on the map, and a text bar shows the display with 'GMT' and the current cities.

Move the highlight with ◀/▶ key to update other information in real time.

Foreign settings

Stop watch

Your phone features a stop watch and the minimum unit is 0.1 second.

The starting time is 00:00.0, in the format "mm:ss.n", where mm stands for minutes of the watch, which can be any number from 0 to 59; ss stands for seconds, a number between 0 and 59; n stands for 0.x second, x being any number from 0 to 9. The stopwatch will start the timing when you press \(\sigma\) Start or \(\sigma\). You can pause the timing, press \(\sigma\) Pause, to resume press \(\sigma\)

Countdown

This feature is very similar to the alarm clock, except that you will be alerted of the remaining time, and the phone will emit an alarm at the end of the countdown. The alarm tone is the same as your alarm clock. The minimum time is 1 minute. The format of the time is hh:mm:ss, and the maximum time input is 23 hours 59 minutes 59 seconds.

Enter the time with the numeric keypad and start the countdown by pressing key or the Options > go.

To stop countdown, press \Box *Pause*, to reset, press \Box *Options* > *reset* and you can exit the menu by pressing the \Box *Back*.

When the set time is up, the alert will start to ring and the ring type is the same with the alarm.

The count-down timer will switch on automatically and emit an alarm at the end of the count-down even if your phone is switched off.

Unit converter

This application allows you to convert many types of units such as exchange rate, area, energy, mass, power, pressure, temperature and volume.

You need to enter the conversion Type, Amount I and 2, Unit I and 2. Press \triangle or ∇ to switch between the different input boxes.

Firewall

This function provides a simple and quick method for you to avoid nuisance calls and SMS. Blacklist contains a list of phone numbers from which you do not wish to receive calls or SMS.

Select *Tools* > *Firewall* > *Enable* and choose between the following options:

To add phone numbers into the black list, select *Black list*, press Add or OK to carry out the following operations:

As the method of calculation varies according to language settings, the input boxes also vary.

When the current language is Chinese, the screen will prompt you to enter the original price and *n* discount rate.

 Press ▲/▼ to switch between the two input boxes.

The maximum length for original price is 10 digits and the maximum length for n is 3 digits (including decimal point and the number after the decimal point). Long press be to enter decimal point.

- Press (***) Count or (**) to display the results on the screen.
- Press
 Reset to clear the results and continue with the next calculation.

The calculation procedure is the same when the language is English, except that the maximum length for *n* discount rate is 4 digits (up to 2 decimal points).

Shopping list

Shopping list provides a convenient way for you to record the items you wish to buy. You can view, add, modify or delete the shopping list.

- The screen displays a list of items you have already added to the list. If the list is empty, you will be prompted to create it. Press ☐ OK to create a shopping list. Press ☐ Back to exit.

For example, if today is 5 October and the date of the shopping list is 6 October, and the system date of your phone is 5 October, the list will be moved to the top of the list. When a shopping list has expired, it will be indicated with a grey icon.

My card

This menu allows you to manage your cards, such as membership cards, bank cards, credit cards, debit cards, etc. When you forgot to carry your cards, you can use this menu to check your card information or even enjoy accumulation of points, bonuses, etc you are entitled to.

Enter the menu.

2. The screen displays a list of cards which you have added. If the list is empty, you will be prompted to create it. Press ☐ OK to create a card information. Press ☐ Back to exit.

If the card information has been created, the screen will display the list of card issuers and the type of card will be indicated on the left of the card list.

 Press ▲/▼ to select a card and press ⊆ Options to carry out the following operations:

If the effective date of the card relative to the system date of the phone has expired, then the card will be moved to the bottom of the list and will be indicated with an icon.

If the date of the card information is close to the current system date (30-day limit), then the card information will be moved to the top of the list and indicated with an icon. For example, if today is 1 October and the expiry date of the card is 31 October, and the system date of your phone is 1 October, the card will be moved to the top of the list until it expires.

Create new card information

Select *Create* to enter create new card information screen. You can create a maximum of 10 card information.

 Press ◀/▶ to select a card type; after selection, press ▲/▼ to switch between the different input boxes: card issuer, card number, validity period, contact phone number and note.

The maximum length for name is 40 characters, card number is 30 digits, phone number is 41 digits, remarks is 60 characters.

Please note that except for note and phone number fields, the rest of the input boxes are mandatory and cannot be left empty.

BMI-Body Mass Index

BMI is the recommended method for measurement of overweight in adults. The borderline for overweight and obesity is determined by BMI, which is closely linked to body fat. You can measure your weight index using the BMI function.

BMI is calculated by using the weight divided by the height in squares. In the calculation, weight is in kilogrammes, while height is in metres. The formula is as follows:

BMI= [Weight (kg)]/ [(Height) metres x (Height) metres]

- 1. Enter the menu.
- The cursor will be in the weight input box.
 Use the keypad to enter your weight. Press ▲/▼
 to switch the cursor between weight and height input boxes.

The unit of measurement for weight is kilograms (kg) or pounds, and the measurement for height is centimetres (cm). However, in the calculation of BMI, your height in centimetres will be converted to metres.

Weight ranges between 10 to 200 kg. Height ranges between 10 to 300 cm.

3. After you have entered the height and weight, press (Count or to start calculation). The results will be displayed at the bottom of the screen. Besides displaying your BMI, the interpretation of your BMI results will also be displayed in the following manner:

16 or below	Cacotrophia
16 - 18.5	Underweight
18.5 - 24.99	Normal weight
25 - 29.99	Overweight
30 - 39.99	Obesity
40 or higher	Morbid Obesity

4. After you have done the calculation, press Exeset to clear the input boxes and the calculation results, so that you can perform another calculation.

Basal Metabolic Rate (BMR)

Basal Metabolic Rate is the minimal calorie requirement required to sustain life in a resting or sleeping individual that is not subject to the influence of stress, hunger, muscular activities, ambient temperature and health conditions. Basal Metabolic Rate reflects an individual's metabolic condition and has been considered as a reference for weight control and the maintenance of health.

The formula for calculating BMR provided by your mobile phone is the Harris-Benedict formula, which is as follows:

Female: BMR = 655 + (9.6 x weight in kg) + (1.8 x height in cm) - (4.7 x age in years)

Male: BMR = 66 + (13.7 x weight in kg) + (5 x height in cm) - (6.8 x age in years)

In the above method of calculation, the unit for weight is in kilogrammes and the unit for height is in centimetres. Take for example a 68 kg, 168 cm tall, 21-year-old male; his daily Basal Metabolic Rate (BMR) will be: 66 + (13.7 x 68) + (5 x 168) - (6.8 x 21) = 66 + 932 + 840 - 143 = 1695 calories.

- Enter the menu.
- The cursor will be in the gender selection box.
 Press ◄/▶ to select gender (Male/Female), press
 ▲/▼ to switch between age, weight, height input boxes and enter the values using the keypad.
 Age is in years, height is in kilogrammes and weight is in centimetres.

Weight ranges between 10 to 200 kg, age ranges between 1 to 200 and height ranges between 10 to 300 cm.

3. After you have entered the height and weight, press (and count) or (and to start calculation). The results will be displayed at the bottom of the screen. After calculation, press (and the results of the calculation to perform another calculation).

11. Contacts



This menu allows you to manage the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of your friends, family, and colleagues. Your mobile phone has two storage areas for your contacts: the SIM phonebook and the onboard phonebook. Your phone can store up to 500 contacts. Managing contacts in the onboard phonebook allows you to store more information (e-mail address, fax number, company name, etc.) than if you used the SIM phonebook.

The space available for these fields on the SIM card may vary according to your operator or SIM card provider. If you want to be able to call your contacts while outside your home country network, enter the international prefix, country and area codes. Press Options to select the storage location: SIM, phone. Press to enter contact details.

Precautions

Radio Waves



Your cellular mobile phone is a **low power** radio transmitter and receiver. When it is operating, it sends and receives radio waves. The radio waves carry your voice or data

signal to a base station that is connected to the telephone network. The network controls the power at which the phone transmits.

- Your phone transmits/receives radio waves in the GSM frequency (900 / 1800 / 1900 MHz).
- The GSM network controls transmission power (0.01 to 2 watts).
- Your phone complies with all relevant safety standards.
- The CE mark on your phone shows compliancy with European electromagnetic compatibility (Ref. 89/336/EEC) and low voltage directives (Ref. 73/ 23/EEC).

Your cellular mobile phone is your responsibility. To avoid damage to yourself, to others or to the phone itself, read and follow all the safety instructions and make them known to anyone borrowing your phone. Furthermore to prevent unauthorised use of your phone:



Keep your phone in a safe place and keep it out of small children's reach.

Avoid writing down your PIN code. Try to remember it instead.

Switch off the phone and remove the battery if you are going to leave it unused for a long time.

Change your PIN code after purchasing the phone and to activate call restriction options.



The design of your phone complies with all applicable laws and regulations. However your phone may cause interference with other electronic devices. Consequently


you should follow all local recommendations and regulations when using your cellular phone both at home and when away. Regulations on the use of cellular phones in vehicles and aircraft are particularly stringent.

Public concern has been focused for some time on the possible health risks for users of cellular phones. The current research on radio wave technology, including the GSM technology, has been reviewed and safety standards have been drawn up to ensure protection from exposure to radio wave energy. Your cellular telephone complies with all applicable safety standards and the Radio Equipment and

Telecommunications Terminal Equipment Directive 1999/5/EC.

Always switch off your phone...

Inadequately protected or sensitive electronic equipment may be affected by radio energy. This interference can lead to accidents.





In hospitals, clinics, other health care centres and anywhere else where you may be in the close vicinity of medical equipment.



In areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere (e.g. petrol stations and also areas where the air contains dust particles, such as metal powders).

In a vehicle transporting flammable products (even if the vehicle is parked) or a vehicle powered by liquefied petroleum gas (LPG), check first that the vehicle complies with the applicable safety rules. In areas where you are requested to turn off radio transmitting devices, such as quarries or other areas where blasting operations are in progress.



Check with the vehicle manufacturer that **electronic equipment** used in your vehicle will not be affected by radio energy.

Pacemakers

If you have a pacemaker:

- Always keep the phone more than 15 cm from your pacemaker when the phone is switched on, in order to avoid potential interference.
- Do not carry the phone in a breastpocket.
- Use the ear opposite to the pacemaker to minimise the potential interference.
- Switch off your phone if you suspect that interference is taking place.

Hearing aids

If you are a user of a hearing aid, consult your physician and hearing aid manufacturer to learn whether your particular device is susceptible to cellular phone interference.

Improved performance

In order to improve the performance of your phone, reduce radio energy emission, reduce battery consumption and ensure safe operation adhere to the following guidelines:



For the optimal and satisfactory operation of the phone you are recommended to use the phone in the normal operating position (when not using in hands-free mode or with a hands-free accessory).

- Do not expose your phone to extreme temperatures.
- Treat the phone with care. Any misuse will void the International Guarantee.
- Do not immerse the phone in any liquid; if your phone is damp, switch it off, remove the battery and let them dry for 24hrs before using them again.
- and let them dry for 24hrs before using them again
 To clean the phone, wipe it with a soft cloth.
- Placing and receiving calls consumes the same amount of battery energy. However, the mobile consumes less energy in idle screen when kept in the same place. When in idle screen and while you are moving, your phone consumes energy to transmit updated location information to the network. Setting the backlight for a shorter period of time as well as avoiding unnecessary navigating

in the menus will also help to save the battery's energy for longer phoning and stand-by performances.

Battery information

- Your phone is powered by a rechargeable battery.
- Use specified charger only.
- Do not incinerate.
- Do not deform or open the battery.
- Do not allow metal objects (such as keys in your pocket) to short circuit the battery contacts.
- Avoid exposure to excessive heat (>60° C or 140° F), moisture or caustic environments.



You should only use Philips authentic battery and accessories, as the use of any other accessories may damage your phone and may be dangerous, and will make all guarantees for your Philips phone null and void. The use of an incorrect type of battery may also cause an explosion.

Make sure damaged parts are replaced immediately by a qualified technician and that they are replaced with genuine Philips replacement parts.

Do not use your phone while driving



Speaking on the telephone while driving lowers your concentration, which can be dangerous. Adhere to the following guidelines:

- Give your full attention to driving. Pull off the road and park before using the phone.
- Respect the local regulations in countries where you drive and use your GSM phone.
- If you want to use your phone in a vehicle, install the hands-free car kit which is designed for that purpose.
- Ensure that your phone and car kit do not block any air bags or other security devices fitted in your car.

The use of an alarm system to operate a vehicle's light or horn to indicate incoming phone calls is prohibited on public roads in some countries. Check local regulations.

EN 60950 Norm

In hot weather or after prolonged exposure to the sun (e.g., behind a window or a windscreen), the

temperature of your phone's casing might increase, especially when featuring a metallic finish. Be very careful in this case when picking up your phone and also avoid using it with an ambient temperature over 40° C.

Environmental care



Remember to observe the local regulations regarding the disposal of the packaging materials, exhausted batteries and old phone and please promote their recycling.

Philips has marked the battery and packaging with standard symbols designed to promote the recycling and appropriate disposal of your eventual waste.

Troubleshooting

The phone does not switch on

Remove/reinstall the battery. Then charge the phone until the battery icon stops scrolling. Unplug from charger and try to switch the mobile on.

Your phone doesn't return to the idle screen

Long press the hangup key or switch off the phone, check that the SIM card and the battery are installed correctly and switch it on again.

The network symbol is not displayed

The network connection is lost. Either you are in a radio shadow (in a tunnel or between tall buildings) or you are outside the network coverage area. Try from another place, try to reconnect to the network (especially when abroad), check that the antenna is in place if your mobile has an external antenna, or contact your network operator for assistance/information.

The display doesn't respond (or the display responds slowly) to key presses

The display responds more slowly at very low temperatures. This is normal and does not affect the operation of the phone. Take the phone to a warmer place and try again. In other cases please contact your phone supplier.

Your battery seems to over heat

You might be using a charger that was not intended for your phone. Make sure you always use the Philips authentic accessory shipped with your phone.

Your phone doesn't display the phone numbers of incoming calls

This feature is network and subscription dependent. If the network doesn't send the caller's number, the phone will display *Call I* or *Withheld* instead. Contact your operator for detailed information on this subject.

You can't send text messages

Some networks don't allow message exchanges with other networks. First check that you entered the number of your SMS centre, or contact your operator for detailed information on this subject.

You can't receive and/or store pictures

A picture may not be accepted by your mobile phone if it is too large, if its name is too long, or if it doesn't have the correct file format.

You have the feeling that you miss some calls

Check your call divert options.

The display shows INSERT SIM

Check that the SIM card has been inserted in the right position. If the problem remains, your SIM card may be damaged. Contact your operator.

When attempting to use a feature in the menu, the mobile displays NOT ALLOWED

Some features are network dependent. They are only available, therefore, if the network or your subscription supports them. Contact your operator for detailed information on this subject.

Your phone is not charging

If your battery is completely flat, it might take several minutes of pre-charge (up to 10 minutes in some cases) before the charging icon is displayed on the screen.

Your phone doesn't recognize your memory card

Your phone only supports memory cards formatted in "FAT16". You can reformat your memory card in "FAT16" via a computer. Connect your phone to your computer using USB function (see chapter 13, "Connectivity" for details) and use the "format FAT16" function of your computer.
