

# Insert SIM card and Charge the battery

Learn about installing SIM card and charging the battery for the first use.

#### Insert SIM card

Follow the steps below to insert your SIM card. Remember to turn off your mobile phone before removing the back cover. Remove the back cover.





### Charge the battery

A new battery is partially charged. The battery icon in the upper-right corner shows the battery level of charging status.



### Tips:

- You can use the phone while it is charging.
- Keeping the charger plugged to the mobile phone when the battery is fully charged will not damage the battery. The only way to turn off the charger is to unplug it, so it is advisable to use an easily accessible power socket.
- If you do not intend to use your phone for several days, we recommend that you remove the battery.
- If a fully charged battery left unused, it will lost its charge over time.
- If a battery is being used for the first time or the battery has not been used for a prolonged period, it may take longer time to recharge.

# Insert a Micro SD card (Memory card)

You can expand the memory of your phone by adding a micro-SD card.

- Unlock the memory card cover.
- 2 Align your micro-SD card with the slot. Put it in place.
- 3 Press down the card holder and pull it until it is locked



### Connect to your PC

Data communication software (Mobile Phone Tools) offers instant sychronization between your phone and your computer. You can use the software for the data synchronization between your phone and PC, like phonebook, calendar, SMS messages, and audio/video/picture files.

### Install MobilePhoneTools on your PC

- I Insert the supplied Data communication software into the CD drive.
- 2 Run the autorun.exe program.
- 3 Make selections as prompted, and installation starts automatically.

### Connecting your Phone to the PC

- Connect your phone to the PC using the supplied USB cable or through the Bluetooth.
- When using the USB cable for connection, select COM port on your phone.
- 3 On your PC, double click the MobilePhoneTools icon, then the connected icon is displayed.

### **Customize your phone**

Customize your phone to match your preferences.

#### Set time & date

- On the home screen, go to Menu>Settings>Date & Time.
- 2 Select Set time/date: Enter the desired digits. SIM settings
- Check that your phone is turned on. Enter the PIN code if required.
- 2 Go to Settings>SIM settings>Dual SIM setting>SIMI settings/SIM2 settings, Name your SIM card.
- 3 Select SIM1 or SIM2 to be the primary card.
- 4 Go to Settings>SIM settings>Mode setting to set SIM mode.

#### Note:

- The PIN code is preconfigured and communicated to you by your network operator or retailer.
- If you enter an incorrect PIN code three times in succession, your SIM card will be blocked. To unblock it, you must request the PUK code from your operator.
- If you enter an incorrect PUK code ten times in succession, the SIM card will be locked permanently. When this happens, please contact your network operator or retailer.

#### **Profiles**

The profiles are defined for several scenes. They consist of the settings for ringtones, volume, and others. With preset profiles, you can easily adjust the settings for incoming calls and messages as desired.

- Go to **Profiles**, press to activate the profile.
- Press left soft key to modify ringtone, volume and others.

To activate **Meeting** mode, long press # on the home screen.

### Note:

 If you select Flight mode, you disable the connection between your phone and your mobile phone network.

## **Basic function**

### Use basic call functions

Learn to make or answer a call and use basic call functions.

#### Make a call

- Enter the phone number.
- 2 Press to dial the number.
- 3 Press To hang up.

### Tips:

 For international calls, long press \_\_\_\_ to enter the "+" sign for the international prefix.

### Answer and end a call

- Press to answer the call (Press the side volume key to adjust the volume).
- 2 Press to select hands free mode.
- 3 Press To hang up.

### ᠃ Tips:

You can use the supplied headset to answer or end a call.

### Use speed dial

On the home screen, you can call a number by long pressing a numeric icon.

To assign a contact to a speed-dial key:

- Select Settings>General>Speed dials.
- 2 Turn on the status.
- 3 Go to **Set numbers**, choose a numeric key.
- 4 Press left soft key 🖃 to add a number.

### Make an emergency call

Without a SIM card in phone, you can press right soft key  $\overline{\phantom{a}}$  to make the emergency call.

In Europe, the standard emergency number is 112; in the UK, it is 999.

### Receive and send messages

You can use the **Messaging** menu to send text message, multimedia message.

### Send a SMS message

- Select Menu>Messaging>Create SMS.
- Write your text message.
- 3 Press to send the message.

### Send a MMS message

- Select Menu>Messaging>Create MMS.
- 2 Edit contents, and press Options to add multimedia contents (photo, audio, attachment or bookmark text).
- 3 Press uto add a contact.
- 4 Press to send the Multimedia message.

#### Note:

 Copyright protected pictures and sound cannot be sent by MMS.

#### Send an F-mail

- Go to Menu>Messaging>E-mail>E-mail
  profiles>Add>New account. After setting up a
  new account, press □ to activate it.
- 2 Go to Write E-mail, enter the address (To), a copy (Cc), a blind copy (Bcc), subject and attachments.
- 3 Select the Priority, edit the E-mail contents, .
- 4 Press to send the E-mail.

### Note:

 Consult your mail service provider for the mail server configuration.

#### Receive E-mails

Select **E-mail>Send and receive**, you can receive E-mails from the Internet.

To receive E-mails automatically:

Go to Menu>Messaging>E-mail>E-mail accounts>Options>Edit>Advance settings.

2 Go to Account settings>Check interval to set the time span, then your mail box will be checked automatically after each time span.

#### **Enter text**

Your mobile phone supports a number of text entry methods, including T9 input, English input, numeric input and symbol input.

You can group your contacts as different groups, For different groups, you can use different ringtones for identification, and send messages to a group.

     Done to save editing.

To turn off the FM radio on the home screen.

Press  $\Box$ , and then press  $\Box$ .

### Record radio programs

You can record a radio program when listen to it.

- Go to **Options>Record** to the radio to start recording.
- 2 Press right soft key to stop recording and edit the filename.
- 3 Press to save the file.

### **Bluetooth**

Your phone can connect to a compatible Bluetooth device for exchanging data.

#### Connect to a Bluetooth device

- Go to Bluetooth>Activation, turn on the Bluetooth function.
- 2 Select Find device, a list of available Bluetooth devices appears.
- 3 Select the device you wish to connect.
- 4 Enter your Bluetooth password to start pairing (0000 by default). The pairing is made if your pairing request is accepted by the other part.

#### Send files via Bluetooth

- Go to My files, select the file you want to send.
- 2 Press Options>Send>Via Bluetooth.
- 3 Select a device.
- 4 Press uto start sending the file.

#### Receive files via Bluetooth

Go to **Bluetooth>Setting** to power or Bluetooth.

- 2 Enter the password and accept the request.
- The files received are saved to My files>Phone >Received.

### Tips:

If you do not use the Bluetooth feature for some time, you should deactivate it in order to conserve battery power.

#### Read E-books

You can read E-books (.txt file) on your phone.

### Start reading an E-book

- Settings: Set alignment, scroll speed, full screen.

### Manage your files

You can copy, move or delete a file in a folder.

 The insecurity audio, video files and pictures are not recommended to save to your phone.

### Use blacklist

Learn about how to set the blacklist; you can reject the incoming calls or messages from those included in the blacklist.

### Add a phone number to blacklist

You can display two clocks on the home screen: one is local time, the other is foreign time.

#### The network symbol is not displayed

# Optimizing your Philips Xenium battery performance

Here are some steps to help you optimize your Philips Xenium's battery performance.

# How to optimize the standby and talk time of your phone?

- Always ensure that your phone profile is appropriately set to meet your actual usage. Profile setting significantly impacts the phone's battery performance. In general, Outdoor Mode is the most power-draining setting while Silent Mode consumes the least amount of power.
- If you're using a Xenium phone with a dual SIM feature, try to activate the 2 SIM cards only when absolutely necessary. If you are in a country with single coverage, deactivate the non-covered SIM to prolong battery usage.
- If you're not using applications like Bluetooth, WIFI, GPS and JAVA, turn them off. And be sure to lock your phone to prevent accidental pressing of the keys with the auto-lock feature.
- Adjust the intensity and duration of your display screen's backlight to low or medium level and

- for the shortest duration. In general, the lower the backlight level and the shorter the duration, the more power you will save.
- Avoid using or placing your phone near magnetic objects (eg. a radio or television) or on metal surfaces, which will impact the network connection and ultimately drain power from your battery.

### How to extend your battery's life?

- Full charging and full running down of your battery will extend its life. Charge the battery once the low-battery warning comes on.
- Temperature will impact battery usage. Over time, heat will degrade your battery's performance. Keep your phone out of the sun or a hot car. If in low temperature, place your phone in a warmer place (eg. your pocket), as battery capacity decreases as the temperature drops.
- Always use authentic accessories as they enable your battery to perform at its peak. Nonauthentic accessories (eg. chargers) can damage your battery and even your phone.
