Please read the safety instructions in the "Precautions" section carefully before use.


Before using your phone, you must insert a valid SIM card supplied by your operator or retailer. It contains your service details and memory in which you can store phone numbers and messages.

Insert the SIM card and battery

- 1. Make sure that the phone is switched off.
- **2.** Press on the back cover and slide it downwards to remove.



3. Lift up the battery as follow.



4. Place the SIM card in its slot, with the connectors facing towards the phone.



5. Insert the battery into its slot aright, then press it into place.



Getting started

6. Replace the cover by sliding down into its slots until it stops.



Switch on/off the phone

Press and hold *[5]* until the power-on/off animation is shown on the screen.

When switch on the phone, the phone may remind you to enter the PIN code. The PIN code is predefined and supplied by your operator or retailer. To personalize the PIN code, see "Change Pwd.".

If you enter an incorrect PIN code for three times, your SIM card is blocked. To unblock it, you must request the PUK code from your operator.

Charge the battery

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable battery. A new battery is partially charged and an alarm will warn you when the battery level is low. If the battery is empty, the battery symbol indicators will reappear after the battery is charged up for 2 or 3 minutes.

- 1. Plug the port of the USB cable to the socket at the mother-base of the charger(supplied with the phone, in the box).
- 2. Once the battery and back cover are attached to the phone, plug the charger to the connector into the socket at the base of the phone on one end. Check that the arrow on the connector is facing towards the phone. Then plug the other end of the charger to an easily accessible AC power socket.

To prevent damage of the phone, do not make a telephone call or send SMS while the battery is charging!



3. The battery symbol indicates the state of charge.

4. When the battery is fully charged, you can disconnect the charger by unplugging it.



Keeping the charge plugged to the mobile won't damage the battery after it is fully charged.

Install/Remove the memory card

- **1.** Revolve and remove the gluey plug off the slot first .
- **2.** Check that the gold contacts of the card face upwards, then insert into the slot .



3. If you want to remove the card, pushing it into slot gently, then the card will rebound automatically.

2 • Main features

Make a call

make a call in idle mode

- 1. In idle mode, enter the phone number, press $\sqrt{-1}$ to correct an error.
- **2.** Press \bigcirc to dial the number.
- **3.** Press $\overline{\overline{\bullet}}$ to end the call.

For an international call, press * twice quickly to enter the "+" symbol as the international prefix.

Make a call from phonebook

- In idle mode, press ▼ to access the list.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select a contact in the list, then press
 to dial the number (To see "Phone Book" for more information).

Quickcall

Quickcall from SIM phonebook

If you know the serial number(for example:5) of your caller in SIM phonebook, you can press 5# in idle mode directly to show the corresponding name stored in SIM phonebook, then press \subseteq to dial the number.

Quickcall from call logs

In idle mode, press \bigcirc to access Call Logs list. Select a number and press \bigcirc to dial the number.

Make an IP call

This function depends on your subscription and network, contact to your operator for configuration paramaters.

You can make an IP call after setting IP number and activating the function.

- 1. In idle mode, enter number, press $\overline{}$ to correct an error.
- 2. Press and hold \subseteq to add the IP prefix and dial the number.
- 3. Press $\overline{\mathfrak{s}}$ to end the call.

Make an emergency call

Emergency numbers are the emergency service number in your local country or area. You can dial them even if you have not yet inserted a SIM card or entered your PIN.

SIM card inserted

In idle mode, enter emergency number directly, then press $\overline{\leftarrow}$ to dial.

Without SIM card

Switch on your phone, the screen shows "Insert SIM", press SOS to dial emergency call.

In Europe the standard emergency number is 112, in the UK it is 999.

Answer and end a call

If you apply the function of the caller ID, the number of the caller will be displayed while receiving a call. If the number has been stored in phonebook, then the corresponding name is displayed instead of the number.

1. Answer the call: press . During the call, press . H-Free to activate handsfree. To cancel handsfree you can press . H-Held again to deactivate it.

If you activate "Any Key" to answer, press any key(except) and) to answer the call; If you activate "Cover Answer" to answer, flip open to answer the call.

For your own comfort and safety, ensure you move the phone away from your ear by handsfree, especially when increasing the volume.

- 2. Reject the call: press 🗩. If you have activated Call Divert, the call is diverted to another number or voice mail.
- 3. Hang up: press 🔊 .

Options during a call

During a call, press *Coptions* to access the following options.

Contacts

To access the contacts.

Mute(On/Off)

You can choose mute so that your caller can't hear you or unmute the microphone when mute is on.

Sound Recorder

To record a conversation during a call, select Sound Recorder and press $\boxed{-}$. While recording you can press $\boxed{-}$ Pause/Cont. To stop recording, press $\boxed{-}$, enter the file name and press $\boxed{-}$ to save.

In most countries, recording telephone conversation is subject to legislation. We advise you to notify the caller if you intend to record your conversation and only do so if they agree.

Other options during a call

During a call, press ____Options to enter other menu for viewing or editing , for instance, messages and so on.

Handle multiple calls

The ability to handle two or more calls at one time and to make conference calls.

The function depends on your operator and subscription.

Make a second call

You can make a second call during an active call or with a call on hold. The first call is put on hold while the second number is dialled. Then you can press \Box to access the following options:

- Swap to toggle between calls.
- Conference to introduce a caller into the conference call.

Answer a second call

You can answer a second call during an active call. When you receive a second call, the phone emits a beep alert and the screen displays the information of the call. Then you can:

Press (To answer the second incoming call (while the first one is put on hold). Then press (, and select:

- Swap to toggle between calls,
- Conference to introduce a new caller into the conference call.
- Press 🔁 To reject the call.
- Press 🗩 End the current call, then answer the incoming call.
- Press To open the options list. You can select End to end the current call, then answer the incoming call.

To receive a second call, you must have deactivated Call Divert and activated Call waiting.

Lock/Unlock the keypad

To lock the keypad, you can flip close in any mode. To unlock the keypad, you can flip open in any mode or press $\$ and $\$.

Activate silent mode

To activate the silent mode, press and hold 💀 until the message of "Silent Activated" and icon 🏾 shows on the

screen.

To deactivate the silent mode, press and hold ••• again until the suggestive message shows on the screen and the icon i disappears.

How to use the memory

After insert a memory card into the slot, you have two memory.

The phone memory

Connecting the phone with a computer, the memory will be identified by the PC.

- 1. Connect the phone with PC via the USB cable.
- **2.** Copy the file from PC to the phone or edit the existent file on the phone by PC.

The memory card

This memory can be identified by PC however you shut the phone or not, and the operation is as above.

4 • Text or number entry

You can select the input methods to enter English words, symbols and numbers. The icons appearing on the screen indicate the active text mode.

Press **••** *to switch the input method in editing interface.*

Smart ABC/abc input

This is an intelligent editing mode for messages including a comprehensive dictionary. You can enter text more quickly by the smart input method. Press ... until "eZi ABC" or "eZi abc" appeared on the screen. Press only once the key corresponding to each letter needed to spell a word: keystrokes input are analyzed and the word suggested is displayed in the editing screen. If several words are available according to the keys used, you can press ▲ or ▼ to choose from those proposed in the Smart ABC/abc built-in dictionary (see example below).

Example: enter the word "home":

- 1. Press key 4, 6, 6, 3 in turn. The screen displays the first word in a list: good.
- 2. Press \checkmark to scroll and select home.
- 3. Press to confirm home.

Multitap ABC/abc input

To select multitap input method, press •• until "ABC" or "abc" appeared on the screen. This

method requires multiple key press to reach the desired character.For example, the letter "h" is the second letter on the key 4, so you must press it twice to enter "h". If two letters in turn are on the same key, just wait a few seconds for the cursor to appear.

You can press key 0 to insert a space in multitap ABC/abc input.

Last call cost

To show the cost of the last call made.

Total cost

To show the total cost of all calls made since the cost counter was last reset. If the total cost exceeds the maximum cost set via the Max Cost option, you will no longer be able to make any calls until you reset the counter.

Reset cost

To reset the cost counter.

Max cost

To set the maximum cost for your calls.

Price per unit

To set the cost of one unit; this price per unit is applied when calculating the cost of your calls.

Before setting the options of the **Reset Cost, Max Cost** and **Price Per Unit**, you need to enter the PIN2 code.

GPRS counter

To count the amount of data sent and received via GPRS and the unit is Byte. You also can reset the counter.

Precautions

Radio waves

Your cellular mobile phone is a **low power** radio transmitter and receiver. When it is operating, it sends and receives radio waves. The radio waves carry your voice or data signal to a base station that is connected to the telephone network. The network controls the power at which the phone transmits.

- The GSM network controls transmission power (0.01 to 2 watts).
- Your phone complies with all relevant safety standards.

Your cellular mobile phone is your **responsibility**. To avoid damaging yourself, to others or to the phone itself, read and follow all the safety instructions and make them known to anyone borrowing your phone. Furthermore to prevent unauthorised use of your phone:

Keep your phone in a safe place and keep it out of small children's reach.

Avoid writing down your PIN code. Try to remember it instead.

Switch off the phone and remove the battery if you are going to leave it unused for a long time.

The design of your phone complies with all applicable laws and regulations. However your phone may cause interference with other electronic devices. Consequently you should follow all **local recommendations and regulations** when using your cellular phone both at home and when away. **Regulations on the use of cellular phones** in vehicles and aircraft are particularly stringent.

Public concern has been focused for some time on the possible health risks for users of cellular phones. The current research on radio wave technology, including the GSM technology, has been reviewed and safety standards have been drawn up to ensure protection from exposure to radio wave energy. Your cellular telephone **complies with all applicable safety standards** and the Radio Equipment and Telecommunications Terminal Equipment Directive 1999/5/EC.

Always switch off your phone

Inadequately protected or **sensitive electronic equipment** may be affected by radio energy. This interference can lead to accidents.

Before boarding an aircraft and/or when 112 packing the phone in your luggage: the use of mobile phones in an aircraft may be dangerous for the operation of the aircraft, disrupt the mobile phones network and may be illegal.

In hospitals, clinics, other health care centres and anywhere else where you may be in the close vicinity of medical equipment.

In areas with a potentially explosive UB. atmosphere (e.g. petrol stations and also areas where the air contains dust particles, such as metal powders).

In a vehicle transporting flammable products (even if the vehicle is parked) or a vehicle powered by liquefied petroleum gas (LPG), check first that the vehicle complies with the applicable safety rules. Users of hearing aids

If you are a user of a hearing aid, consult your physician and hearing aid manufacturer to learn whether your particular device is susceptible to cellular phone interference.

Performance improvement

In order to improve the performance of your phone, reduce radio energy emission, reduce battery consumption and ensure safe operation adhere to the following guidelines:



For the optimal and satisfactory operation of the phone you are recommended to use the phone in the normal operating position.

Do not expose your phone to extreme temperatures.

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- Treat the phone with care. Any misuse will void the International Guarantee.
- Do not immerse the phone in any liquid; if your phone is damp, switch it off, remove the battery and let them dry for 24hrs before using them again.
- To clean the phone, wipe it with a soft cloth.
- Placing and receiving calls consumes the same amount of battery energy. However, the mobile consumes less energy in idle screen when kept in the same place. When in idle screen and while you are moving, your phone consumes energy to transmit updated location information to the network. Setting the backlight for a shorter period of time as well as avoiding unnecessary navigating in the menus will also help to save the battery's energy for longer phoning and stand-by performances.

Information displayed on the battery

- Your phone is powered by a rechargeable battery.
- Use specified charger only.
- Do not incinerate.
- Do not deform or open the battery.

- Do not allow metal objects (such as keys in your pocket) to short circuit the battery contacts.
- Avoid exposure to excessive heat (>60°C or 140°F), moisture or caustic environments.

Ensure that your phone and car kit do not . block any air bags or other security devices fitted in your car.

The use of an alarm system to operate a vehicle's light or horn to indicate incoming phone calls is prohibited on public roads in some countries. Check local regulations.

In case of hot weather or after a prolonged exposure to the sun (e.g. behind a window or a windscreen). the temperature of your phone's casing might increase, especially when featuring a metallic finish. Be very careful in this case when picking up your phone and also avoid using it with an ambient temperature over 40°C or below 5°C.

For your phone, the socket-outlet shall be installed near the phone and shall be accessible.

Troubleshooting

The phone does not switch on

Remove and reinstall the battery. Make sure you plugged the jack of the charger into the correct connector. Then charge the phone until the battery icon has stopped scrolling. Finally, unplug from the charger and try to switch the mobile on.

The display shows BLOCKED when you switch on

Somebody tried to use your phone but didn't know the PIN code nor the unblocking code (PUK). Contact your service provider.

You have the feeling that you miss some calls

To receive all calls, make sure that none of the features in "Call divert" is activated. The **Mail** symbol is not displayed

The network connection is lost. Either you are in a radio shadow (in a tunnel or between tall buildings) or you are outside the network coverage area. Try from another place, try to reconnect to the network (especially when abroad), or contact your network operator for assistance/information about the network.

The display doesn't respond (or the display responds slowly) to key presses The display responds more slowly at very low temperatures. This is normal and does not affect the operation of the phone. Take the phone to a warmer place and try again.

In other cases please contact your phone supplier.

You can't send text messages

Some networks don't allow message exchanges with other networks. First check that you entered the number of your SMS centre, or contact your operator for detailed information on this subject. When attempting to use dependent. a feature in the displays NOT ALLOWED

You phone the idle screen
