

## 1.3 CLEANING & CARE

## 2. UNPACKING AND INSTALLATION

#### 2.1 UNPACKING

- This product is packed in a carton, together with the standard accessories. Any other optional accessories will be packed separately.
- The weight of the product differs depending on the type from 27 to 53 kg. Due to the size and weight it is recommended to move it by 2 people.
- The protective glass and the glass substrate are installed on the front of the product. Since both glass can be broken and scraped easily the product has to be handled with care. Never place the product with the glass faced down unless it is protected with pads.
- After opening the carton ensure that the content is in good condition and complete.

## 2.3 INSTALLATION NOTES

- Due to the high power consumption, always use the plug exclusively designed for this product. If an extended line is required, please consult your service agent.
- The product should be installed on a flat surface to avoid tipping. The distance between the back of the product and the wall should be maintained for proper ventilation. Avoid installing the product in the kitchen, bathroom or any other places with high humidity so as not to shorten the service life of the electronic components.
- Please ensure the product is installed horizontally. Any 90 degrees clockwise or counter-clockwise installation may induce poor ventilation and subsequent component damage.
- To protect the screen and avoid screen damage, do not display a still picture for a long time.
- The product can normally operate only under 2000m in height. It might abnormally function at a place over 2000m in height and do not install and operate there.

## 3. PARTS AND FUNCTIONS



## 3.1 FRONT VIEW

## I Input Button

Use this button to switch between available inputs.

#### 2 Menu Button

Use this button to engage the On Screen Display menu.

#### 3 Volume Adjustment Buttons

Use these buttons to adjust volume up and down. These buttons also serve as navigation and adjustment buttons when On Screen Display menu is engaged.

## 4 Select Buttons

Use these buttons to navigate through the On Screen Display menu. If an optional TV tuner is installed, these buttons also function as Channel Up/Down.

## 5 Power (Standby) Button

Turns power on/off from standby mode. There is a wait period between on/off cycles.

## 6 Remote Control Signal Receiver

Point the remote control towards this spot on the monitor.


## 7 Status LED

## • Not Illuminated = No AC Power detected

If the main power switch (rear of panel) is turned off, this LED will not illuminate.

# • Red = Standby (Power OFF) with AC power detected The LED will illuminate in red color if the monitor is shut off but the main power cord is plugged into the back of the unit.

• Solid Green = Power ON



#### 3.2 REARVIEW

## I External speaker output

Connect to external speakers.

## 2 RS-232 Connector

Connect to a PC to update software.

## 3 Digital HDMI input

Connect to the HDMI output jack of an external device.

## 4 Digital DVI input

Connect to digital video signals from a Set-Top box or Computer.

## 5 RGB(VGA) input

Connect to RGB (VGA) output of Computer or Set-Top box.

## 6 Component Video inputs

Auto-detecting component video inputs (Y/Pb/Pr or Y/Cb/Cr) for connecting to the component output jacks of a DVD player or Set-Top Box.

## 7 Digital Audio output - OPTICAL

Connect to a device with digital audio input.

#### 8 S-Video input

Connect S-Video signals from external sources such as VCRs or DVD players.

## 9 Monitor output

Connect to the video and audio input of a recording VCR or DVD. Connect to the audio input of an audio system.

## 10. Video input


Connect to the video and audio output of an external device.

## II SCART (AV) Connector

Connect to external sources such as VCRs or DVD players.

#### 12 Power connection

Connect the supplied power cord to the wall outlet.



## 3.3 REMOTE CONTROL

## 3.3.1 GENERAL FUNCTIONS

#### I Sound Mute On/Off

## 2 Standby Power On/Off

Push this button to switch on the monitor from Standby mode. Push it again to turn it off to Standby mode.

#### 3 Menu

Activates the OSD (On Screen Display) menu.

#### 4 Volume +/-

Turns volume up or down.

## 5 Channel +/-

Changes the TV channels sequentially.

## 6 INPUT

Displays the available input sources.

#### 7 AUTO

- Used to adjusts the screen automatically when connected to the Digital Visual Interface (DVI) or PC input.
- Used to launch the Program Table menu while watching analog TV channels.

## 8 I.SIZE (Image SIZE)

Used to select the picture size.

#### 9 MTS

Used to select the sound mode.

#### 10 FREEZE

Freeze the display on the screen. The playback system will continue playing.

#### II Number keypad

Use number keypad to select the TV channel you want to watch.

## 12 RECALL

Display information.

## 13 SLEEP

Press this button to set timer off.

#### **14 PIP Function Buttons**

**LOCATE**: Used to select a location of the sub-picture.

It is available in **PIP** mode only.

SIZE: Used to select a size of the sub-picture. It is available in PIP

mode only.

**SWAP**: Used to interchange the main picture and sub-picture.

It is available in PIP and PBP mode only.

**A.SWAP**: Used to select the audio for the main or sub-picture.

It is available in PIP and PBP mode only.

**SPLIT**: Used to select a **PIP** mode (**NORMAL**, **PIP**, **PBP**)

S.SELECT (Screen SELECT): Used to select the main picture or sub-picture. Then you can adjust the status of selected picture. It is available in PIP and PBP mode only.



## 3.3.2 TELETEXT FUNCTION BUTTONS

#### I TEXT

Activates the TELETEXT mode.

#### 2 INPUT

Displays the TELETEXT index.

#### 3 Fastext

With Fastext, you can easily access the topic and relevant pages you want by pressing the red, green, yellow and blue buttons on the remote control.

In TELETEXT mode, volume controls remain available, but the relevant symbols are not shown on the screen.

## 4 Page Down (AUTO)

Displays the previous TELETEXT page.

## 5 Zoom (I.SIZE)

Press the **I.SIZE** button once to zoom in on the top part of the screen.

Press twice to zoom in on the bottom part of the screen and three times to return to normal display.

## 6 Page Up (MTS)

Displays the next TELETEXT page.

#### 7 FRFF7F

Freezes the current page, preventing update and subpage display.

- Press the HOLD/POSITION button on the remote control to select this function.
- Press the HOLD/POSITION button again to cancel.

#### 8 Reveal

Reveals hidden page information. Press the Reveal button to show the information again.

#### 9 Sub-page

Press to display a secondary page by entering its number.

# 3.3.3 INSERTING THE BATTERIES IN THE REMOTE CONTROL


- I Remove the cover on the rear of the remote control.
- Insert two AAA size I.5V batteries ensuring that the "+" and "-" ends of the batteries are correctly aligned.
- 3 Replace the cover.

## Note:

Do not mix battery types, e.g. alkaline and manganese.





# 4.1 CONNECTING EXTERNAL EQUIPMENT (VCR, DVD, CAMCORDER, SATELLITE RECEIVER)


## 4.1.1 USING SCART (AV) SOCKET INPUT

- I Connect the SCART socket of the external device to the SCART socket of the monitor.
- Connect the video recorder to the antenna wall socket or cable box.




#### 4.1.2 USING S-VIDEO INPUT

- I Connect the S-Video (4-pin DIN) connector of the external device to the S-VIDEO INPUT of the monitor.
- 2 Connect the red (R) and white (L) audio jacks of the device to the R and L audio-in jacks located next to the S-VIDEO connector.




## 4.1.3 USING COMPONENT VIDEO INPUT

- I Connect the green-colored (labeled as "Y") jack of the device to the green-colored "Y" jack of the monitor.
- 2 Connect the red-colored (labeled as "Pr") jack of the device to the red-colored "PR/CR" jack of the monitor.
- 3 Connect the blue-colored (labeled as "Pb") jack of the device to the blue-colored "PB/CB" jack of the monitor.
- 4 Connect the red (R) and white (L) audio jacks of the device to the R and L audio-in jacks of the monitor.




## 4.1.4 USING VIDEO INPUT

- I Connect the jack of the external device to the VIDEO INPUT of the monitor.
- 2 Connect the red (R) and white (L) audio jacks to the R and L audio-in jacks located next to the VIDEO connector.




## 4.1.5 USING MONITOR OUTPUT

- I Connect the jack of the DVD or VCR (for recording) or audio system to the MONITOR OUTPUT of the monitor.
- 2 Connect the red (R) and white (L) audio jacks to the R and L audio-out jacks located next to the VIDEO connector.



## 4.1.6 USING DVI INPUT

- I Connect the DVI-jack of the DVD, decoder or satellite receiver to the DVI INPUT of the monitor.
- 2 Connect the red (R) and white (L) audio jacks to the R and L audio-in jacks located next to the DVI connector.



## 4.1.7 USING HDMI INPUT


I Connect the HDMI-jack of the external device to the HDMI INPUT of the monitor.

## 4.2.1 CONNECTING EXTERNAL SPEAKER


Connect the speaker audio cable to the external speaker output jack on the rear of the LCD.

• Before connecting the speaker wire to the LCD, turn off your LCD.



## 4.2.2 USING DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT

Connect the optical cable to the DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT on the rear of the LCD.













## 4.3 CONNECTING A PC

## 4.3.1 USING RGB (VGA) OR DVI VIDEO INPUT

- I Connect the I5-pin D-Sub RGB(VGA) connector of the PC to the RGB-IN connector of the monitor.

  If you have a PC that is equipped with a DVI (Digital Visual Interface), you may connect the PC DVI connector from the PC to the DVI-IN connector of the monitor.
- 2 For both RGB (VGA) and DVI, connect the red (R) and white (L) audio jacks of the PC to the R and L (DVI/RGB) AUDIO IN jacks of the monitor.

## Setting Up Your Display Using Plug and Play

This display adheres to VESA Plug and Play standard to eliminate complicated and time consuming setup of monitors. This monitor identifies itself to the computer and automatically sends the PC its Extended Display Identification Data (EDID) using Display Data Channel (DDC) protocols.

## How to Set up Your PC for Use with Monitor (Windows)

The display settings for a typical Windows-based computer are shown below. However, the actual screens on your computer will differ depending on the version of Windows and video card equipped with the computer. Even though the actual screen may look different from example displayed below, basic set-up routine will apply in most cases.


- Go to the Window's CONTROL PANEL by clicking START, SETTINGS, CONTROL PANEL.
   The CONTROL PANEL Window is displayed.
- Select the DISPLAY icon from this window.The DISPLAY PROPERTIES dialog box is displayed.
- 3 Select the SETTINGS tab to display your computer's video output settings.
- 4 Set the "Screen Resolution" settings to 1024x768 PIXELS. For COLOR QUALITY, select 24 BIT COLOR (might also be expressed as 16 million colors).
- 5 If a vertical-frequency option is available, set the value to 60 or 60 Hz.
- 6 Click OK to complete the setting.

## 6.12 TELETEXT

The Teletext service is available in many countries under a variety of names (TOP Text, Fastext, FLOF test, Videotext). It is provided as a free service by some television broadcasters. This service provides a real wealth of information, available at any time, on weather, sporting results, news, games, etc. The information is presented in pages organized in topics specified in color on the screen and you can access this information by simply pressing the buttons of the same color on the remote control.

This product doesn't have a tuner inside, but an external settop box may still contain channels with teletext information.



## **Accessing Teletext**

- I Press the **CH+** or **CH-** button to select the required source.
- 2 Press the **TEXT** button (1) on the remote control. => Teletext opens on the index page (100).
- 3 Press the **TEXT** button again to exit.

## Select a specific Teletext page

- I Enter the three-digit Teletext page number using the numeric buttons.
  - => The current page is displayed. If the selected page is linked to with several secondary pages these pages are displayed in sequence.
- 2 Press the FREEZE button (1) to freeze the display on a given page.
- 3 To resume, press the **FREEZE** button again.

## **Display TELETEXT index**

Press the **INPUT** button (2) to display the TELETEXT index.

#### **Fastext**

I Press the red, green, yellow and blue buttons (3) on the remote control to easily access the topic and relevant pages you want.

## Page Down (AUTO)

I Press the **AUTO** button (**4**) to display the previous TELETEXT page.

#### Zoom (I. SIZE)

- I Press the **I. SIZE** button (**⑤**) once to zoom in on the top part of the screen.
- 2 Press twice to zoom in on the bottom part of the screen and three times to return to normal display.

## Page Up (MTS)

I Press the MTS button (6) to display the next TELETEXT page.

#### **FREEZE**

- I Press the **FREEZE** button (**7**) on the remote control to freeze the current page, preventing update and subpage display.
- 2 Press the **FREEZE** button again to cancel.

#### Reveal

I Press the Reveal button (3) to hide page information. Press the button again to unhide.

## Sub-page

I Press the sub-page button (**9**) to display a secondary page by entering its number.

#### **Subtitles**

Some channels provide subtitles for some of their program through Teletext. The numbers of the relevant pages are specified on the Teletext index page.

- I Enter the number of the relevant page to display the subtitles.
  - => The subtitles appear in the TV picture. The header disappears after a couple of seconds.
- 2 Press any button on the remote control (except **TEXT** or the volume adjustment buttons) to display the subtitles again.
- 3 Press the **TEXT** button (1) to return to TV mode.

In Teletext mode, volume controls remain available, but the relevant symbols are not shown on the screen.

## 9. CLEANING AND TROUBLESHOOTING

#### 9. I CLEANING

## Cautions When Using the Display

- Do not bring your hands, face or objects close to the ventilation holes of the display. Top of display is usually very hot due to the high temperature of exhaust air being released through the ventilation holes. Burns or personal injuries may occur if any body parts are brought too close. Placing any object near the top of the display could also result in heat related damages to the object as well as the display itself.
- Be sure to disconnect all cables before moving the display. Moving the display with its cables attached may damage the cables and thus case fire or electric shock danger.
- Disconnect the power plug from the wall outlet as a safety precaution before carrying out any type of cleaning or maintenance procedure.

## **Front Panel Cleaning Instructions**

- The front of the display has been specially treated. Wipe the surface gently using only a cleaning cloth or a soft, line-free cloth.
- If the surface is particular dirty, soak a soft, line-free cloth in a mild detergent solution. Wring the cloth to remove excess liquid. Wipe the surface of the display to remove dirt. Then use a dry cloth of the same type to dry.
- Do not scratch or hit the surface of the panel with fingers or hard objects of any kind.
- Do not use volatile substances such as insert sprays, solvents and thinners.

#### **Cabinet Cleaning Instructions**

- If the cabinet becomes dirty, wipe the cabinet with a soft, dry cloth.
- If the cabinet is extremely dirty, soak a lint-free cloth in a mild detergent solution. Wring the cloth to remove as much moisture as possible. Wipe the cabinet. Use another dry cloth to wipe over until the surface is dry.
- Do not allow any water or detergent to come into contact with the surface of the display. If water or moisture gets inside the unit, operating problems, electrical and shock hazards may result.
- Do not scratch or hit the cabinet with fingers or hard objects of any kind.
- Do not use volatile substances such as insert sprays, solvents and thinners on the cabinet.
- Do not place anything made from rubber or PVC near the cabinet for any extended periods of time.

#### WHO IS COVERED?

You must have proof of the date purchased to receive warranty service. A sales receipt or other document showing the date that you purchased the product is considered proof of purchase.

#### WHAT IS COVERED?

Warranty cover age begins the day you buy your product. For two years thereafter, all defective parts will be repaired or replaced and labor is free. After two years from the day of purchase, you pay for the replacement or repair of all parts, and for all labor charges. All parts, including repaired and replaced parts, are covered only for the original warranty period. When the warranty on the product expires, the warranty on all replaced and repaired parts also expires.

#### WHAT IS EXCLUDED?

Your warranty does not cover:

- labor charges for removal, installation or setup of the product, adjustment of customer controls on the product, and installation or repair of antenna systems outside of the product.
- product repair and/or part replacement because of misuse, accident, unauthorized repair or other cause not within the control of Philips Consumer Electronics Europe.
- reception problems caused by signal conditions or cable or antenna systems outside the unit.
- a product that requires modification or adaptation to enable it to operate in any country other than the country for which it was designed, manufactured, approved and/or authorized, or repair of products damaged by these modifications.
- incidental or consequential damages resulting from the product. (some states do not allow the exclusion of incidental or consequential damages, so the above exclusion may not apply to you. This includes, but is not limited to, prerecorded material, whether copyrighted or not copyrighted.)
- modifications or adaptations to enable the product to operate in any country other that the country for which it was designed, manufactured, approved and/or authorized, or the repair of products damaged by these modifications.
- normal wear and tear (decreased light output of LCD module) over the product's lifetime.
- phosphor burn. Do not display static images for prolonged periods, otherwise phosphor burn might appear on part of the panel.
- limited quantity of cells (fine pixel elements) that do not produce light, or that remain lit after they should have turned off.
