- If you lose the stand mounting screws, please purchase 3 Phillips head screws (M4 × 14) at your local store.

Positioning the TV

- Large screen TVs are heavy. 2 people are required to carry and handle a large screen TV.
- Make sure to hold the upper and bottom frames of the unit firmly as illustrated.
- Install the unit in a horizontal and stable position.
- Do not install the unit in direct sunlight or in a place subject to dust or strong vibration.
- Depending on the environment, the temperature of this unit may increase slightly. This is not a malfunction.
- Avoid a place with drastic temperature changes.
- Do not place anything directly on top or bottom of the unit.
- Depending on your external devices, noise or disturbance of the picture and/or sound may be generated if the unit is placed too close to them. In this case, please ensure enough space between the external devices and the unit.
- Do not insert the AC power cord into the power socket outlet before all the connections are made.
- Ensure that you always have easy access to the AC power cord or plug to disconnect the TV from the power.
- Before you move the TV, disconnect attached cables to prevent damage to connectors.
- Be sure to unplug the AC power cord from the AC outlet before moving or carrying the unit.



Installing the remote control batteries

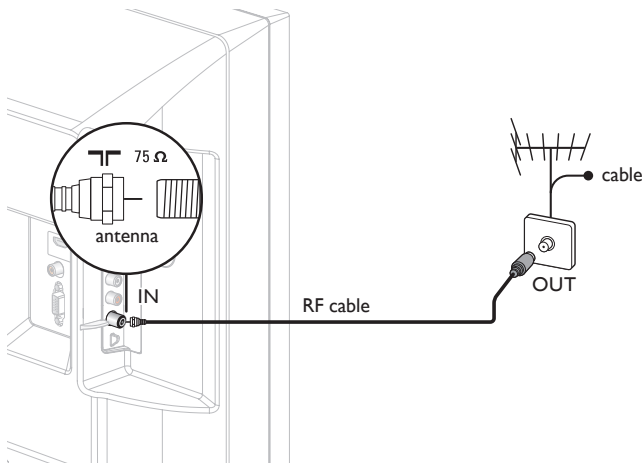


- 1 Slide the battery cover off the back of the remote control.
- 2 Insert the 2 supplied batteries (AAA, 1.5V). Be sure the + and – ends of the batteries line up with the markings inside the case.
- 3 Slide the cover back into position.

Note

- Remove the batteries if not using the remote control for an extended period of time.

Connecting the antenna or cable



If you connect to an antenna

Any DTV programs that are broadcast in your area can be received for free through an antenna connection.

Contact your local content provider or your local electronics retailer if you are unsure about what HDTV programs are available in your area.

Broadcasters are transitioning from analog to digital TV. This means that a given broadcaster can have channels available either in analog or in digital, or both analog and digital at the same time.

The TV produces stereo sound only if a stereo signal is broadcast.

If you connect to a cable

When your TV is connected to the cable socket, you might receive free digital and high definition programs (depending on your cable provider). The channel number for digital and high definition channels includes a dot "•". For example, 11.1, 46.30, 108.201. Contact your cable provider for more information.

If you connect to a DBS (Direct Broadcast Satellite)

There are two main DBS systems: DirecTV and DishNetwork. These systems require a separate, proprietary set-top box to decode signals and send them to the TV. The set-top box contains a digital TV tuner for receiving off-air digital broadcasts.

Contact your local DBS provider for more information about the connections and the TV channels.

If you connect to a set-top box

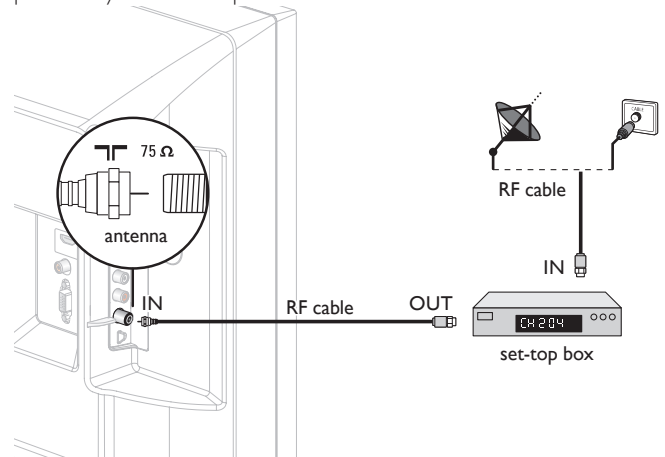
A cable box or satellite set-top box can be connected to the TV through the following connections:

- ANT
- A/V (Composite Video and Audio)
- YPbPr (Component Video Input)
- HDMI

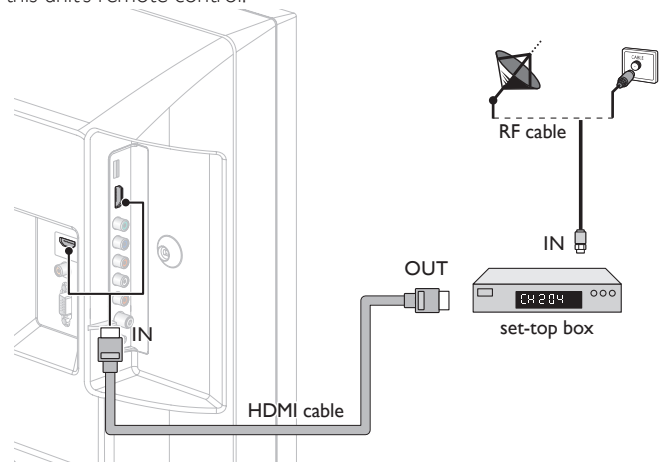
If you connect a set-top box through RF IN/OUT

If the TV is connected to a cable box or satellite set-top box via a coaxial connection, set the TV to channel 3 or 4, or to the channel specified by the service provider.



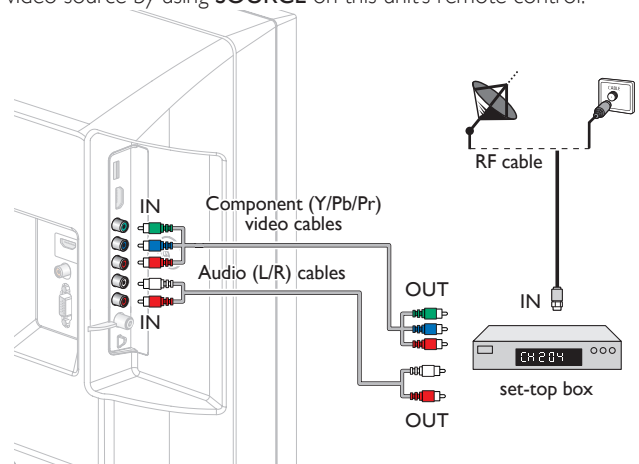
If you connect a set-top box through HDMI

If the TV is connected to a cable box or satellite set-top box via HDMI, make sure you select the correct HDMI source by using **SOURCE** on this unit's remote control.



If you connect a set-top box through component video input

If the TV is connected to a cable box or satellite set-top box via component video input, make sure you select the correct component video source by using **SOURCE** on this unit's remote control.



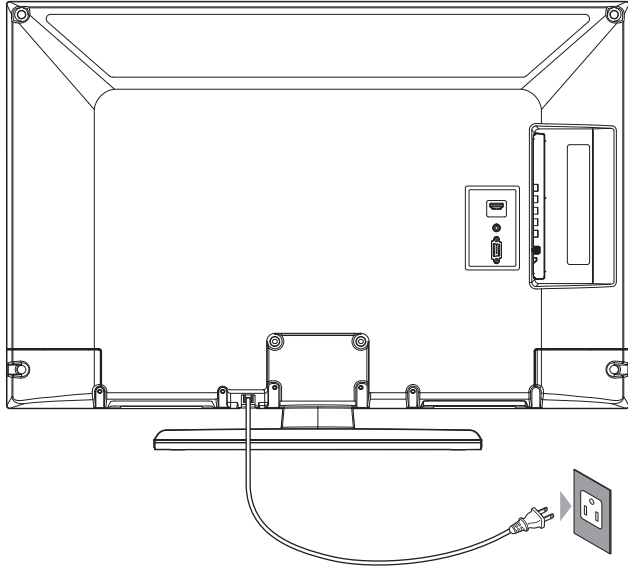
Plugging in the AC power cord



Warning

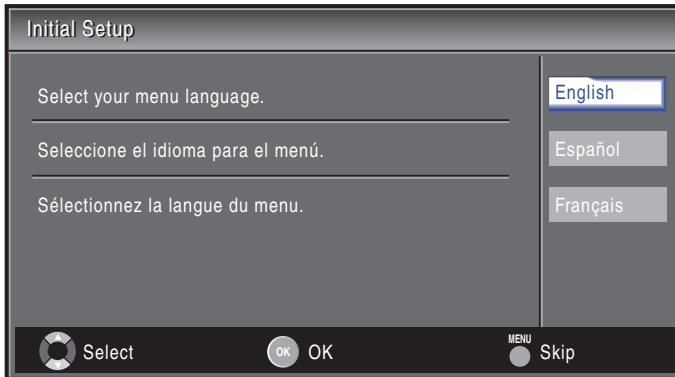
- Verify that your power voltage corresponds with the voltage printed at the back of the TV. Do not insert the AC power cord if the voltage is different.

Connect the AC power cord plug to the power outlet. Ensure that the cord is tightly secured.



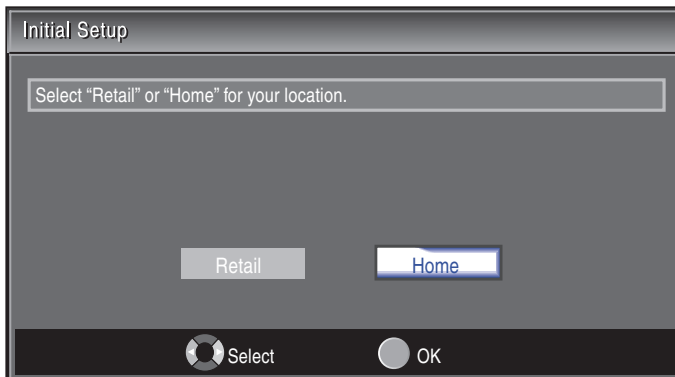
Switching on and initial setup

Before you switch on the TV, check that the AC power cord is properly connected. Press **⏻** (**POWER/STANDBY-ON**) on the front panel of the TV, or press **⏻** (**POWER/STANDBY-ON**) on the remote control. The TV normally takes 25-30 seconds to start up and the following screen appears the first time you turn on the TV.



Follow the on-screen instructions to select your language and complete your TV setup. Installation takes approximately 10 minutes.

Press **◀** or **▶** to select the desired mode for energy saving, then press **OK**.



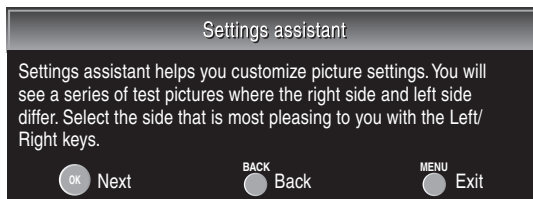
Select **[Retail]** if you want backlight to be brighter.

Select **[Home]** to reduce power consumption.

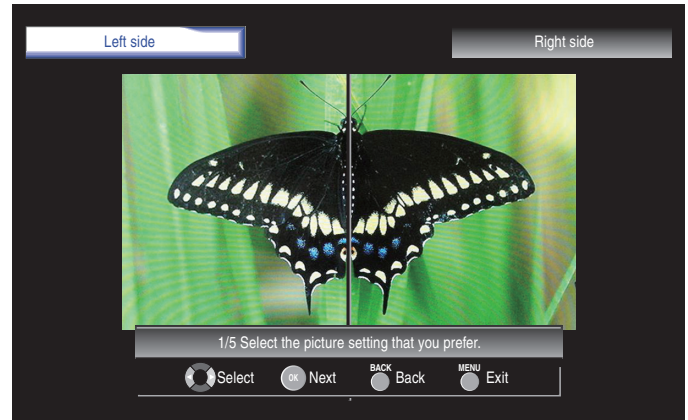
You must set **[Home]**. Otherwise, personalized picture and sound settings will not be memorized after the unit goes to standby mode.

- Select **[Retail]**, the unit will be set up with predefined setting for retail displays.
- Select **[Home]**, the unit will be set to maximize energy efficiency. Picture and sound settings can be adjusted and saved as per your personal preferences.

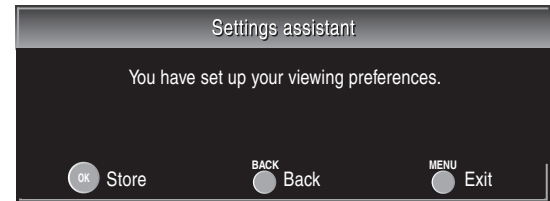
Press **OK** to begin **[Settings assistant]**.



Press **◀** or **▶** 5 times to select the side of the pictures that is the most pleasing to you, then press **OK**.



Press **OK** to finish **[Settings assistant]**.



Finish the Setup.

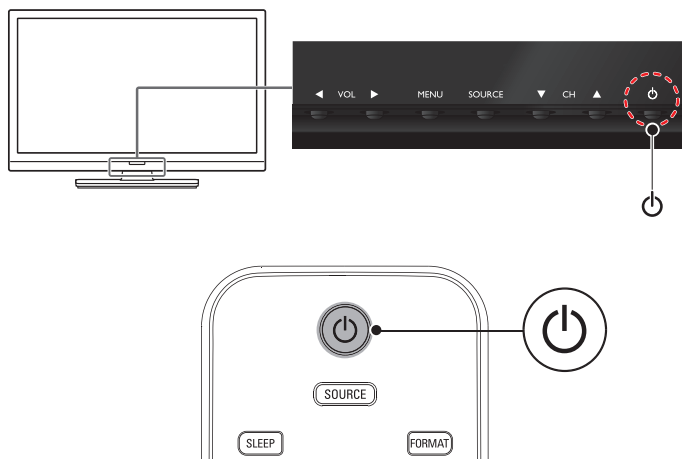
Note

- If you are not receiving a signal from your cable service, contact the CATV provider.
- If you press **⏻** or **MENU** during autoprogram, this setting will be canceled.
- The initial autoprogram function can be executed for either **[Antenna]** or **[Cable]** only once. When you change the connection (Antenna/Cable), set autoprogram again. (Refer to page 24.)
- If there is no signal input from the antenna terminal and no operation for several seconds after you turn on the TV, **[Helpful Hints]** appears. Follow the instructions listed on the TV screen.

5 Use your TV

This section helps you perform basic TV operations.

Switching on your TV and putting it in standby mode



To switch on

- Press **⏻** (POWER/STANDBY-ON) on the front panel or press **⏻** (POWER/STANDBY-ON) on the remote control.

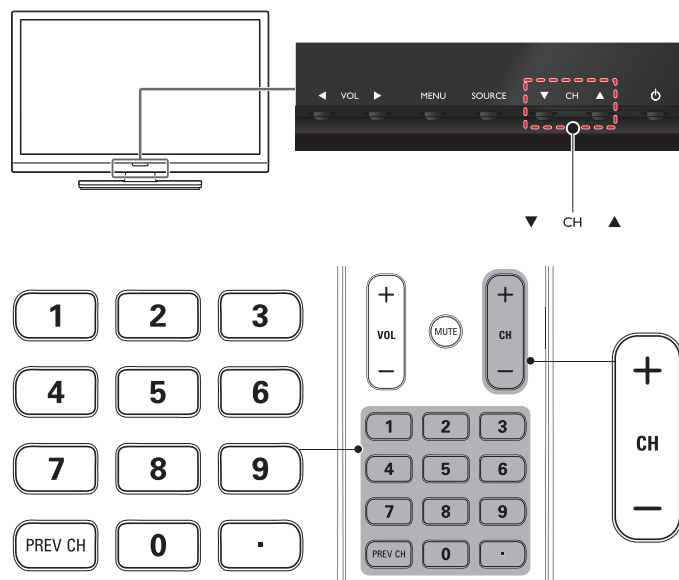
To switch to standby

- Press **⏻** (POWER/STANDBY-ON) on the front panel or press **⏻** (POWER/STANDBY-ON) on the remote control again.

Note

- Energy consumption contributes to air and water pollution. When the AC power cord is plugged in, your TV consumes energy. Your TV has very low standby power consumption.

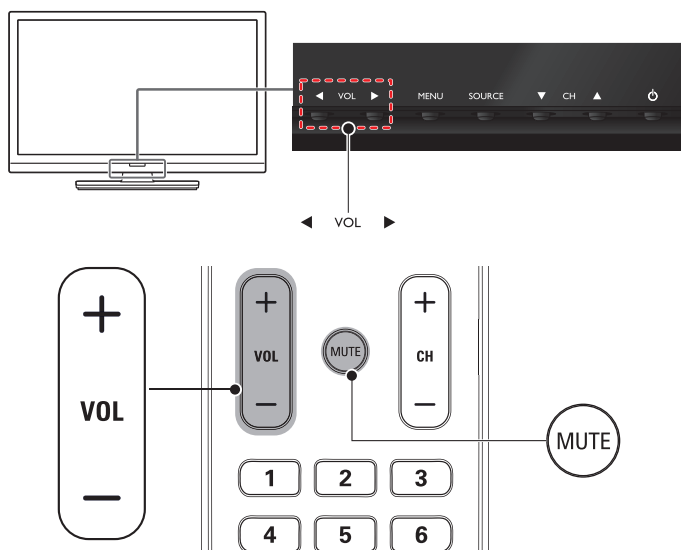
Switching channels



Press **CH ▲/▼** on the front panel. For digital channels, press a number (1 to 135) followed by a dot “.” and then the corresponding sub channel number (1 to 135). e.g. 108.30.

- Press **CH +/-** or enter a number on the remote control.
- Press **PREV CH** to return to the previously viewed channel.

Adjusting volume



To increase or decrease volume

- Press **VOL +/-** on the remote control or press **VOL** ◀(down)/▶(up) on the front panel.

To mute or unmute sound

- Press **MUTE** on the remote control to mute the sound.
- Press **MUTE** again or **VOL +/-** to recover the original sound.

Still mode

You can pause the image shown on the TV screen.

Press **FREEZE** to pause the image shown on the TV screen.



- The sound output will not be paused.
- If no signal is detected or protected signal is received during still mode, the image remains paused and the sound output will be muted.
- The still function will be released after 5 minutes.

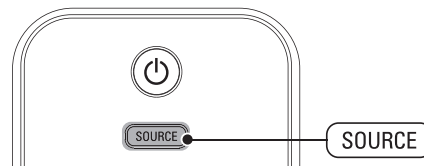
To cancel still mode, press any button except **⏻** (**POWER/STANDBY-ON**).

Watching channels from a set-top box

To watch channels from a set-top box

- Switch on the set-top box.
 - ➡ The picture from your set-top box might appear automatically on the TV screen.
- Use the remote control of your set-top box to select channels.

If the picture does not appear



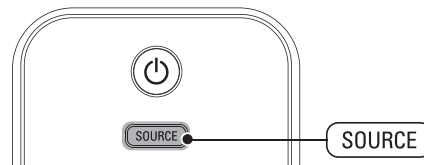
- Press **SOURCE** repeatedly to select the set-top box and wait a few seconds for the picture to appear.

Your TV is equipped with a V-chip that allows you to control access to individual programs based on their age rating and content rating. The program content advisory data are sent by the broadcaster or by the program provider.

If you receive channels through a set-top box or cable box connected by HDMI, you cannot use the TV ratings lock. Your set-top box or cable box must be connected through RF or AV connectors.

- 1 Press **MENU** on the remote control and select **[Features] > [Child Lock] > [US TV ratings lock]**.
- 2 Press **▲** or **▼** or **◀** or **▶** and then press **OK** repeatedly to switch between blocked and not blocked. Each rating has a box-graphic in front of it to indicate whether programs carrying that rating are locked:

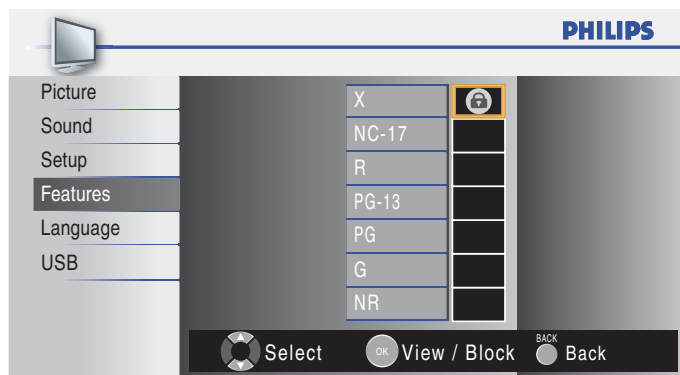

Closed caption

Closed captioning is an assistive technology that allows persons with hearing disabilities to access television programming. Closed captioning displays the audio portion of programming as text superimposed over the video.



Note

- Closed captioning service may not be controlled by this unit's menu options if you are watching television through an external cable or satellite set top box. In which case you will need to use the menu options on the external set top box to control Closed Captioning.
- The captions do not always use correct spelling and grammar. Not all TV programs and product commercials include closed caption information. Refer to your area TV program listings for the TV channels and times of closed caption shows. The captioned programs are usually noted in the TV listings with service marks such as **[CC]**.

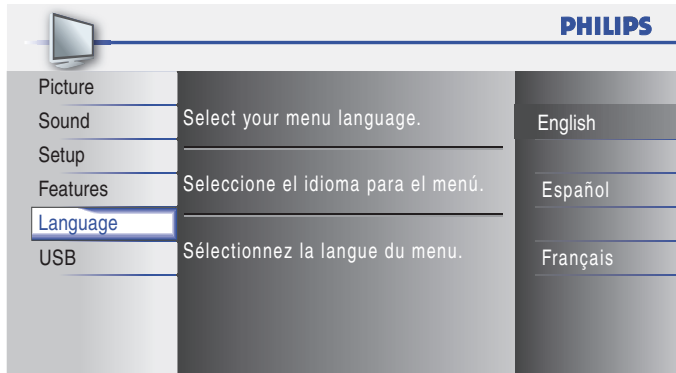
- Motion JPEG file with an extension of ".avi" can only be recognized. An extension of ".mov" is not supported.
- This unit doesn't support "pause", "forward" or "reverse" during video (Motion JPEG) playback.

7 Install channels

The first time you set up your TV, you are prompted to select a menu language and to install TV and digital radio channels (if available). This chapter provides instructions on how to reinstall and fine-tune channels.

Selecting your menu language

- 1 Press **MENU** on the remote control and select **[Language]**.

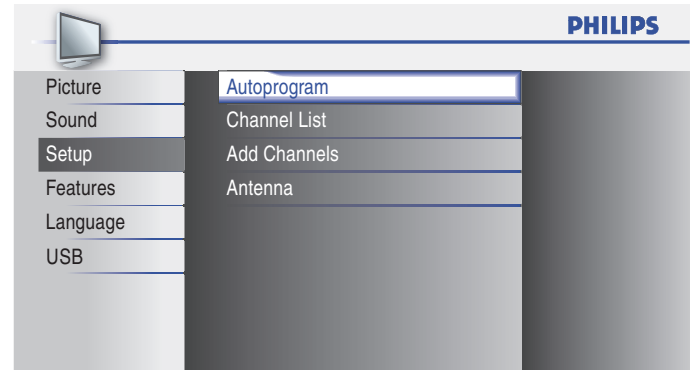


- 2 Select a language and press **OK** to confirm your choice.
- 3 Press **MENU** to exit.

Autoprogram

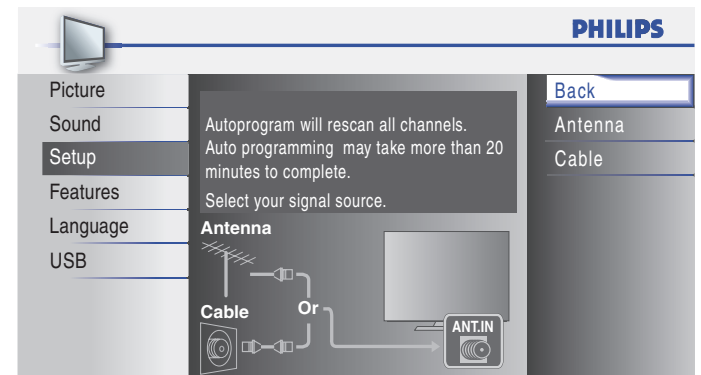
Before you install channels, ensure that you are registered with your cable TV provider and that your equipment is correctly connected.

- 1 Press **MENU** on the remote control and select **[Setup] > [Autoprogram]**.



- 2 Press **OK** to start the installation.
If you run **[Autoprogram]** when you have locked channels, a message appears asking to enter your PIN. Enter your PIN in order to complete the installation.
If you have forgotten your PIN, reset it as described in 'Changing your PIN' on page 18.

- 3 Select **[Antenna]** or **[Cable]** and press **OK**.
 - When **[Antenna]** is selected, the TV detects antenna signals. It searches for NTSC and ATSC channels available in your area.
 - When **[Cable]** is selected, the TV detects signals supplied by cable. It searches for NTSC, ATSC, and Cable channels available in your area.



- When autoprogramming is complete, the lowest memorized channel will be displayed.

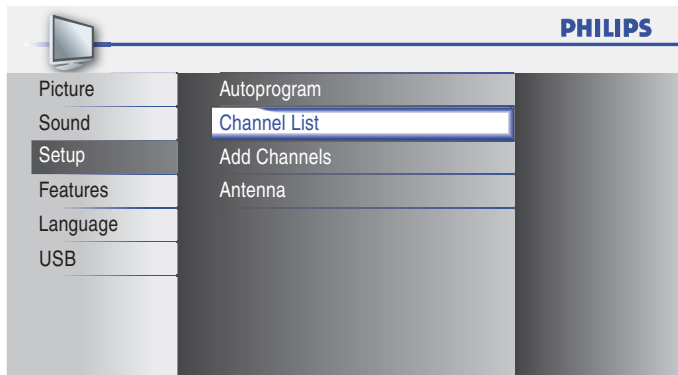
- 4 Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation.

Channel list

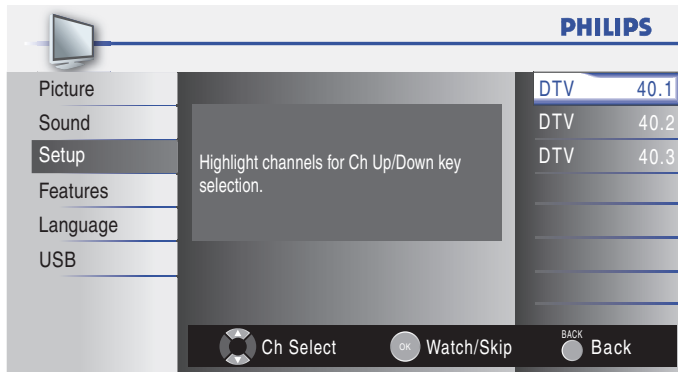
The channels selected here can be skipped when selecting the channels using **CH + / -**.

Those channels can still be selected with **the Number buttons**.

- 1 Press **MENU** on the remote control and select **[Setup] > [Channel List]**.



- 2 Press **▲** or **▼** to select the channel you want to remove, then press **OK**.



- The channel display for the removed channel darkens. You will not be able to select the channel again using **CH + / -**.
- To reactivate a removed channel, press **▲** or **▼** and press **OK**. The registered channels are highlighted.
- When you remove a major channel, its minor channels are removed as well.

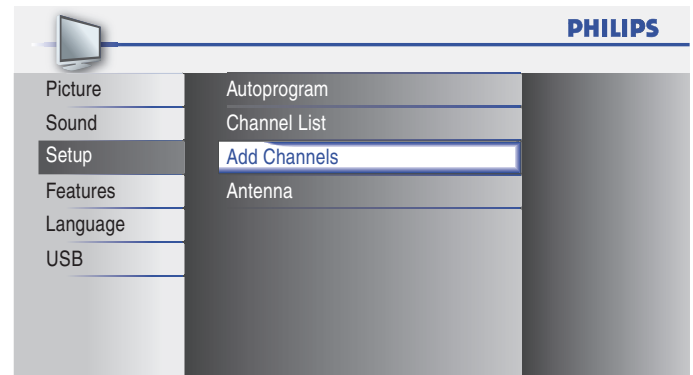
- The channel with the **[DTV]** indicated on the display is ATSC. Otherwise the channel is NTSC.

- 3 Press **MENU** to exit.

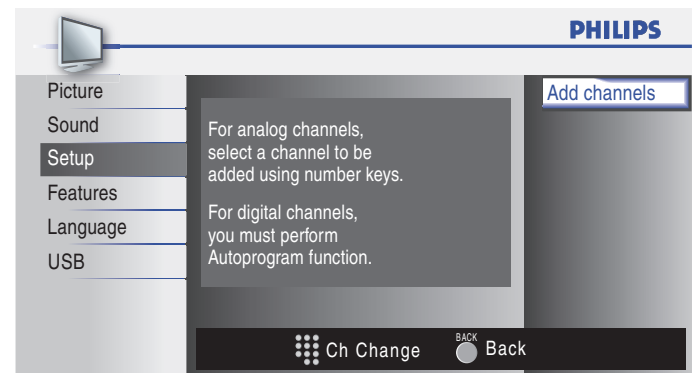
Add channels

This function lets you add the channels that were not added by the autoprogram due to the receivable condition at the initial setup.

- 1 Press **MENU** on the remote control and **[Setup] > [Add Channels]**.



- 2 Press a number (1 to 135) to enter the number of the channel you want to add, then press **OK**.



- 3 Press **MENU** to exit.

Note

- If setup completes successfully, **[Added to the channel list]** is displayed.
- If external input is used, it is not possible to register the channel and **[Unavailable]** will be displayed on the TV screen.
- By pressing **▲** or **▼** you can select the memorized channels only.
- In most cases, digital channels are not broadcast on the RF channel on which they appear on your TV. To add digital channels you need to know the RF channel on which the digital channel is being broadcast. E.g. If there is a digital channel 9.1 which is being broadcast on RF channel 25, you need to enter 25 while performing a weak channel installation. To find out the RF channel on which a particular digital channel is being broadcast, please contact your local service provider.
Installing digital channels using **[Add channels]** might not work for direct cable connections and if the digital signal is too weak for the TV to process.

Optimizing the signal quality from your antenna

You can optimize your signal quality by tuning in ATSC channels with weak signals, and adjusting the antenna.

- 1 Press **MENU** on the remote control and select **[Setup] > [Antenna]**.
- 2 Press **OK** to confirm your choice.
- 3 Press a number (1 to 135) or press **CH +** or **CH -** to select the channel for which you want to check the digital signal strength.
- 4 Press **MENU** to exit.

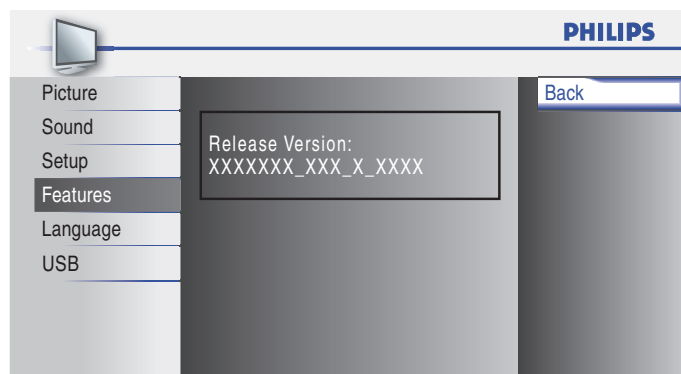
8 Upgrade your TV software

Philips continuously tries to improve its products and we strongly recommend that you upgrade the TV software when upgrades are available. New software can be downloaded from our website at www.philips.com/support using the model number of your TV (e.g. 32PFL1507) to find information.

Checking your current software version

- 1 Press **MENU** on the remote control and select **[Features] > [Current Software Info]**.

→ The version and a description of the current software is displayed, then press **OK**.



- 2 Press **MENU** to exit.

Preparing for the software upgrade

You require the following equipment:

- A PC with web browsing capability.
- An archive utility that supports the ZIP-format (e.g. WinZip for Windows or Stuffit for Mac OS).
- An empty clean formatted USB stick.

- Only FAT/DOS-formatted portable memory is supported.
- New software can be downloaded from www.philips.com/support
- Use only software upgrades that can be found on the Philips web site.

9 Connect devices

This section describes how to connect various devices with different connectors and supplements examples provided in the Quick Start Guide.

Connection overview



- ① **HDMI 1 (HDMI-DVI) Input jack**
HDMI connection for HDMI or DVI device.
- ② **Digital Audio Output jack**
Digital Audio (S/PDIF) Output to home theaters and other Digital Audio systems.
- ③ **PC Input jack**
VGA cable connection for PC.
- ④ **USB terminal**
Data Input from USB Memory Stick only.
Do not connect any device to this terminal such as; Digital camera, keyboard, mouse, etc.
- ⑤ **HDMI 2 Input jack**
Digital audio and video Input from high definition Digital devices such as Blu-ray disc players, cable boxes and satellite set-top boxes.
- ⑥ **Component (Y/Pb/Pr) / Composite Video (VIDEO) Input jacks for VIDEO**
Composite Video Input (VIDEO) jack is shared jack with Component Video Input (Y) jack.

- ⑦ **Analog Audio (L/R) Input jacks**
Connect Analog Audio signals from;
 - HDMI-DVI / Analog Audio (L/R) jacks signal
 - Component Video / Analog Audio (L/R) jacks signal
 - Composite Video / Analog Audio (L/R) jacks signal
 - PC Connection / Analog Audio (L/R) jacks signal with Stereo mini 3.5mm plug Audio cable on PC
- ⑧ **75 ohm Cable/Antenna connection**
Signal Input from an antenna, cable or satellite.



Caution

- Disconnect the AC power cord before connecting devices.

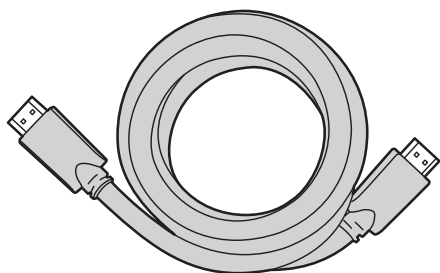

- Different types of connectors may be used to connect a device to your TV, depending on availability and your needs.

Selecting your connection quality

HDMI - Highest quality



Supports high-definition signals and gives highest picture and sound quality. Video and audio signals are combined in one cable. You must use HDMI for full high-definition video and to enable Philips EasyLink.



Tip

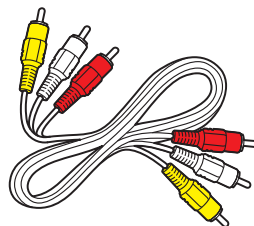
- To connect to a PC without an HDMI connector, use a HDMI-DVI adaptor and a separate audio cable.



Note

- Philips HDMI supports HDCP (High-bandwidth Digital Contents Protection). HDCP is a form of Digital Rights Management that protects high definition content in DVD or Blu-ray Discs.

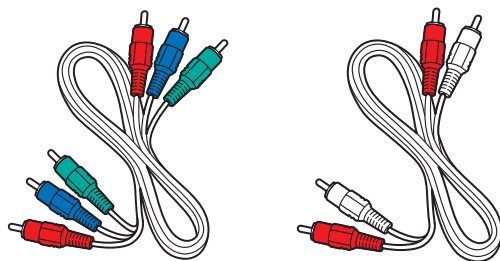
Composite - Basic quality



Composite video/audio cable (yellow/red/white)

For analog connections. Composite cables usually combine a yellow video cable with a red/white audio L/R cable. Match the audio cable colors when you connect to the TV.

Component (Y Pb Pr) - High quality

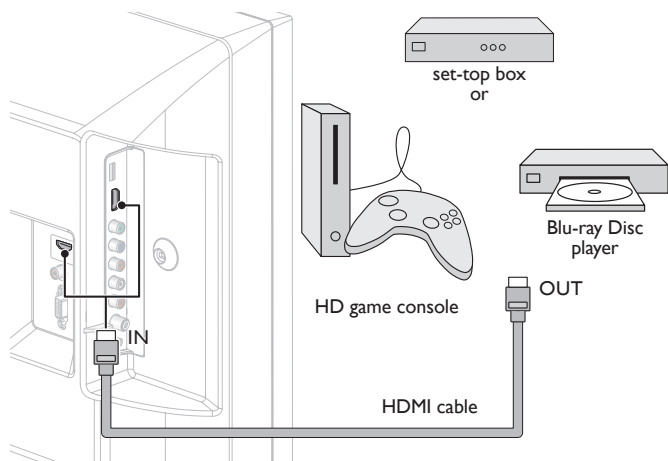


Component video cable (red/green/blue) and audio L/R cable (red/white). Supports high-definition signals but gives lower picture quality than HDMI. Component cables combine a red/green/blue video cable with a red/white audio L/R cable. Match the cable colors when you connect to the TV.

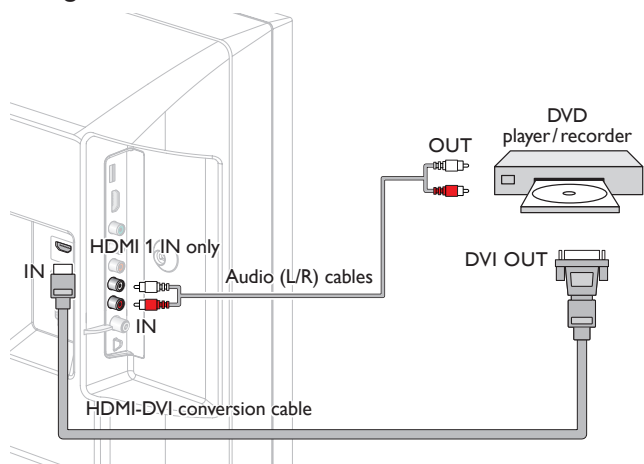

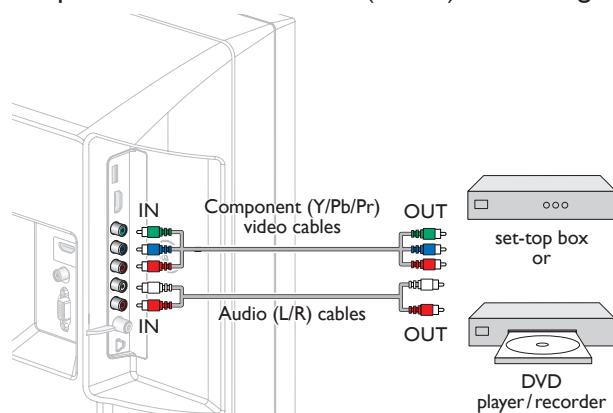

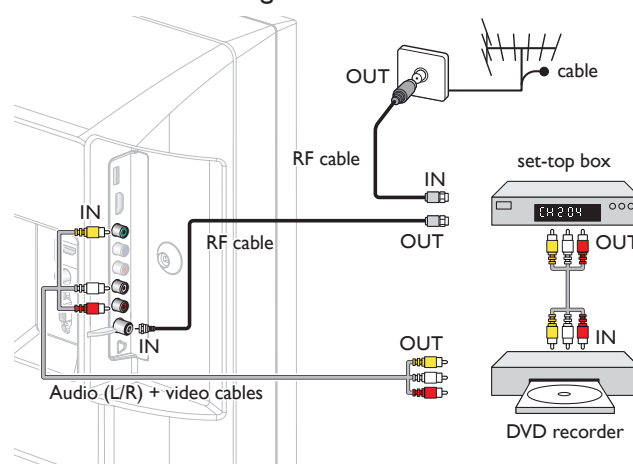

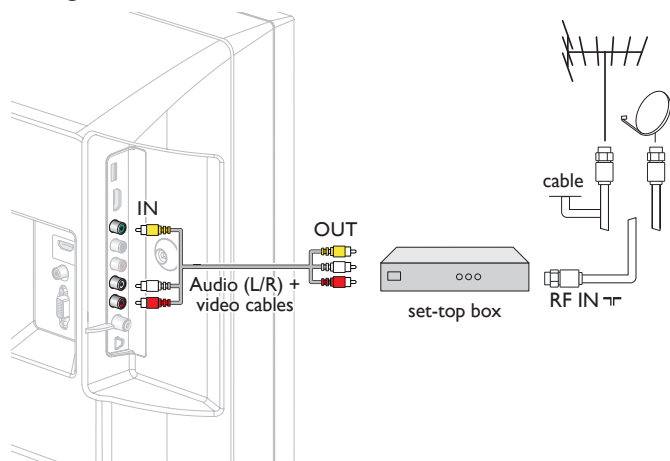

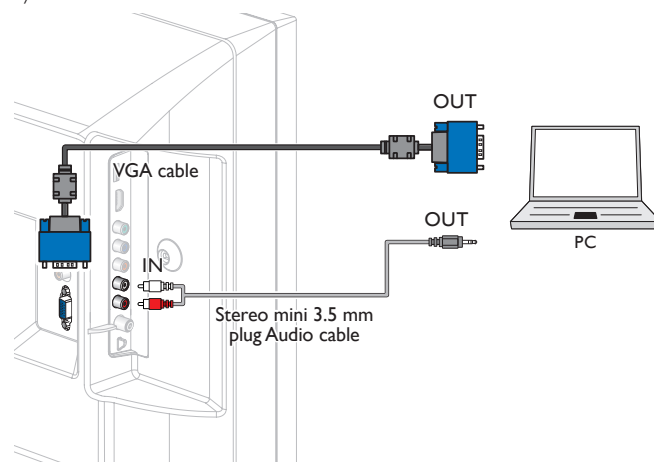

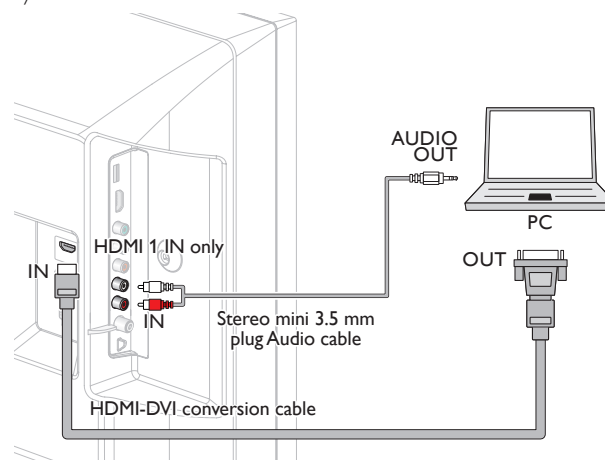

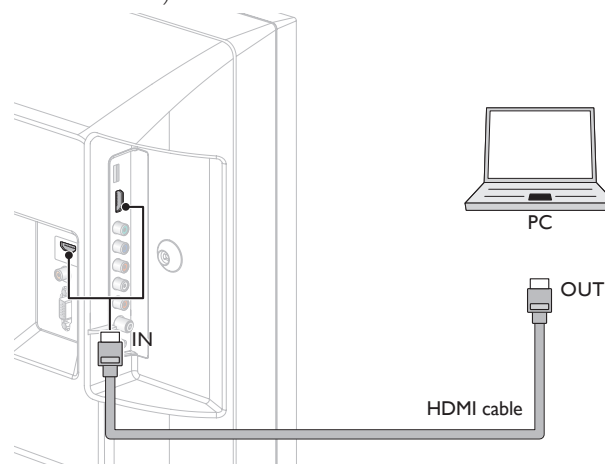

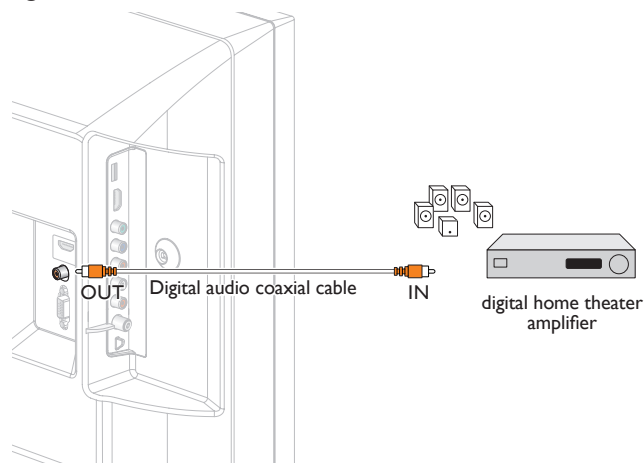

10 Troubleshooting

Problem	Possible cause and solution
No power or indicator light.	<p>The TV is not connected to the power.</p> <p>Press ⏻ (POWER /STANDBY-ON) on the front panel or on the remote control.</p> <p>Ensure that the AC power cord is connected tightly to the TV power connector and to the power socket outlet.</p> <p>Remove the AC power cord from the power socket outlet, wait 60 seconds and reconnect the AC power cord.</p> <p>Connect the TV to a different power socket outlet.</p>
Error message on the screen with HDMI connection.	<p>HDCP authentication fail.</p> <p>Ensure that your HDMI cable is certified.</p> <p>Press SOURCE on the remote control to switch to another source and then switch back to the HDMI source.</p> <p>Reset the accessory device and the TV.</p> <p>Turn on the TV.</p> <p>Select the HDMI channel.</p> <p>Turn on the accessory device.</p> <p>While the TV and the accessory device are powered on, unplug either end of the HDMI cable and then reinsert the cable.</p>
No picture or sound is detected from the PC.	<p>An incorrect HDMI input jack is connected or an audio cable is not connected.</p> <p>Connect a HDMI-DVI cable to the HDMI 1 input jack on the TV.</p> <p>Connect an audio cable to the HDMI 1-IN on the TV.</p> <p>Press SOURCE on the remote control, and select the HDMI 1 source.</p>

No picture or sound.	<p>No picture or sound - ensure you have selected the correct channel.</p> <p>Incomplete channel installation.</p> <p>If the TV receives channels via an AV connection, set the TV to the correct source input.</p> <p>If the TV is connected directly to the wall via a coaxial connection, perform the auto-installation again.</p>
No sound on the TV loudspeaker.	<p>Volume level is set to zero - increase the volume.</p> <p>Sound is muted - press MUTE on the remote control.</p> <p>Audio cable is not connected - for AV connection, ensure that the Audio L/R cable is connected as described in Connecting your devices (see 'Connecting your devices' on page 29). If you use a component cable, ensure that you have not crossed the red audio cable with the red video cable.</p> <p>Audio output setting for the accessory device is incorrect. For HDMI connections, some accessory devices have an HDMI audio output setting that must be turned on for HDMI to HDMI connections.</p> <p>Check if [Sound] > [TV Speakers] > [Off] is set to [On]. No sound will be output when [TV Speakers] is set to [Off].</p>
Bad picture quality with a coaxial connection.	Standard definition channels are not as clear as high definition channels - connect the devices via component or HDMI cables.
Cannot control your TV and connected devices with one remote control.	Confirm that the connected devices are EasyLink compliant and are connected to your TV via an HDMI cable. Not all brands of devices such as Blu-ray Disc players use the same system as Philips EasyLink. Other brands might not work with Philips EasyLink.

11 Notes for the use of USB devices

Digital Content Issues

- Only FAT (DOS) formatted (initialized) portable memory is supported. Errors in this formatting can result in unreadable content. If such problems appear try to re-format the card. Be aware that formatting the card will also delete all the content on it (pictures, videos, ...).
- Only linear JPEG picture formats are supported. Progressive JPEG and JPEG2000 encodings are not supported.
- The length of a filename or directory name is limited to the length specified by the FAT16/32 file systems.
- Max. levels of nested directories is 19.
- Never use the supported file type extensions (.jpg, .jpeg) as extensions for directories as these directories will be treated as corrupted files.
- The access and response time of the content on a device can differ depending on the type or brand of the device.
- The access and response time of the content on a device will increase the more unsupported or corrupted files are on the device.

Digital Camera Issues

- If a USB connection between your digital camera and the TV isn't working, you can try the solutions below to resolve your problem.
- Make sure your digital camera is switched on and verify if the configuration of your digital camera is correct (see the manual of your digital camera for more information).
- Some digital cameras allow you to switch off the USB interface. Make sure that the USB interface is switched on before connecting to the TV.
- If you have a digital camera with only internal memory (no removable memory) you can try to copy the content manually to a USB memory device (e.g. Philips KEY product) using a personal computer.
- Some digital cameras allow you to switch between PTP (Picture Transfer Protocol) or "PC Link" and USB Mass Storage or "PC Drive". Make sure that you select USB Mass Storage or "PC Drive" on your digital camera.
- If your camera supports different interface settings be sure to try them one by one or contact the reseller of your camera to find out the correct setting.

USB Memory Device Issues

- Devices connected to the USB port of your TV must be "Mass Storage Class" compliant. If your device (digital camera, portable hard disk, ...) is not "Mass Storage Class" compliant it will not be detected by the content browser of the TV.
- The following subsets of the Mass Storage Class specification are supported.
- The implementation of the TV is based on the "Universal Serial Bus Mass Storage Class Specification Overview" (v1.2, June 23, 2003) including all documents referenced by the document. The document can be found on the USB standardization website (www.usb.org).
- Full support of the USB Mass Storage Class Bulk-Only Transport (bInterfaceProtocol = 50h).
- Full support of SubClass Code = 05h; SFF-8070i spec.
- Full support of SubClass Code = 06h; SCSI transparent command set.
- For large USB memory devices, when you are in the Content Browser, it may take a long time before you can access your files.
- When using a USB portable hard disk, and due to the high power consumption of the hard disk, it is advised to use the external power supply of the portable hard disk to guarantee proper working under all conditions.

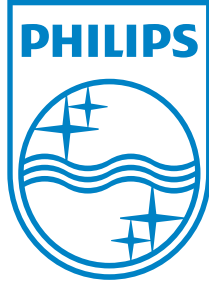
