





Safety Information

- Before operating the system, check that the operating voltage indicated on the typeplate (or the voltage indication beside the voltage selector) of your system is identical with the voltage of your local power supply. If not, please consult your dealer:
- Place the system on a flat, hard and stable surface
- Place the system in a location with adequate ventilation to prevent internal heat build-up in your system. Allow at least 10 cm (4 inches) clearance from the rear and the top of the unit and 5 cm (2 inches) from each side.
- The ventilation should not be impeded by covering the ventilation openings with items, such as newspapers, table-cloths, curtains, etc.
- Do not expose the system, batteries or discs to excessive moisture, rain, sand or heat sources caused by heating equipment or direct sunlight.
- No naked flame sources, such as lighted candles, should be placed on the apparatus.
- No objects filled with liquids, such as vases, shall be placed on the apparatus.

Preparations



Rear connections

The type plate is located at the back of the system.

(A) Power

 Before connecting the AC power cord to the wall outlet, ensure that all other connections have been made



(B) Speakers Connection

Front Speakers

Connect the speaker wires to the SPEAKERS terminals, right speaker to "RIGHT" and left speaker to "LEFT", coloured (marked) wire to "+" and black (unmarked) wire to "-".




 Fully insert the stripped portion of the speaker wire into the terminal as shown.

Notes:

- For optimal sound performance, use the supplied speakers.
- Do not connect more than one speaker to any one pair of ± 1 speaker terminals.
- Do not connect speakers with an impedance lower than the speakers supplied. Please refer to the SPECIFICATIONS section of this manual.


Before using the remote control

- 1 Pull out the plastic protective sheet.
- 2 Select the source you wish to control by pressing one of the source select keys on the remote control (for example CD,TUNER).
- 3 Then select the desired function (for example ▶, ⋈, ▶).



Replacing battery (lithium CR2032) into the remote control

- 1 Pull out the knob (A) slightly to the right.
- $\mathbf{2}$ Pull out the battery compartment \mathbf{B} .
- 3 Replace a new battery and fully insert the battery compartment back to the original position.



Notes for remote control:

- First select the source you wish to control by pressing one of the source select keys on the remote control (for example CD, TUNER).
- Then select the desired function (for example ▶, |◄, ▶|).

Basic Functions



IMPORTANT:

Before you operate the system, complete the preparation procedures.

Switching the system on

- Press **POWER** (\circlearrowleft on the remote control).
 - → The system will switch to the last selected source.
- Press SOURCE (CD, TUNER or TAPE on the remote control).
 - → The system will switch to the selected source.

To switch the system to standby mode

- Press **POWER** (\circlearrowleft on the remote control).
- If in tape mode or recording mode, press STOP•OPEN first.
 - → The volume level (up to maximum volume level of 20), interactive sound settings, last selected source and tuner presets will be retained in the player's memory.

Power-saving automatic standby

The power-saving feature automatically switches to standby 15 minutes after a tape or CD playback has ended and no control is operated.


Adjusting volume and sound

- **1** Press **VOLUME** \approx / \approx (\triangle / ∇ on remote control) to increase or decrease volume.
 - \rightarrow Display shows the volume level $U \circ L$ and a number from 0-32.
- 2 Press **DBB** to switch bass enhancement on or off.
 - → Display shows: **DBB** if the DBB is activated.



- TUNER TAYE
- To start sound playback you
- press **MUTE** 💋 again;
 - adjust the volume controls;
 - change source.

CD Operation



IMPORTANT:

The lens of the CD player should never be touched.



Playing a disc

This CD player plays Audio Discs including CD-Recordables and CD-Rewritables.

- CD-ROM, CD-I, CDV, VCD, DVD or computer CDs, however, are not possible.
- 1 Select CD source.
- 2 Lift the disc door at the edge marked **OPEN•CLOSE** to open the CD compartment.



- → GPER is displayed when you open the CD compartment.
- 3 Insert a disc with the printed side facing up and press down on OPEN•CLOSE to close the CD door.
 - → r EAd is displayed as the CD player scans the contents of a disc. The total number of tracks and the total playing time are also shown.
- 4 Press ►II to start playback.

- → Current track number followed by elapsed playing time of the track are displayed during disc playback.
- → Press **DISPLAY/CLOCK** to display total remain playing time.
- 5 To pause playback press ►II. Press ►II again to resume play.
 - → Display: The elapsed time flashes when playback is paused.
- 6 To stop disc playback, press ■.

Note: CD play will also stop when;

- the CD door is opened.
- the disc has reached the end.
- you select another source: TAPE, TUNER.
- you select standby.
- you press the tape deck PLAY ► key.

Selecting a different track

- Press I◀◀ or ▶▶I once or repeatedly until the desired track number appears in the display.
- Press ►II to start playback.

Finding a passage within a track

- 1 Press and hold down I◀◀ or ▶▶ .
 - → The disc is played at high speed and low volume.
- When you find the passage you want, release ◄ or ▶► .
 - → Normal playback continues.

Different play modes: SHUFFLE and REPEAT

You can select and change the various play modes before or during playback.

REPEATplays the current track continuously

REPEAT ALL ... repeats the entire disc/

programme

SHUFFLEtracks of the entire disc are
played in random order

- 1 To select your play mode, press PLAYMODE (SHUFFLE or REPEAT on the remote control) before or during playback until the display shows the desired function.
- 2 Press ►II to start playback if in the STOP position.
 - → If you have selected SHUFFLE, playback starts automatically.
- 3 To return to normal playback, press PLAYMODE (SHUFFLE or REPEAT on the remote control) until the various SHUFFLE/ REPEAT modes are no longer displayed.
- You can also press STOP to cancel your play mode.

Programming track numbers

Programme in the STOP position to select and store your disc tracks in the desired sequence. If you like, store any track more than once. Up to 20 tracks can be stored in the memory.

- 1 Press ► or ► to select your desired track number.
- 2 Press PROG
 - → Display shows: the selected track number.

 PROG flashes and / Pr appears briefly.
- **3** Repeat steps **1-2** to select and store all desired tracks.
 - → FULL is displayed if you attempt to programme more than 20 tracks.
- **4** To start playback of your disc programme, press ►II.

Notes:


- If you wish, you can add further tracks to your current program. Make sure you are in the STOP position, and that you have not exceeded 20 tracks.
- Display shows NOSE if there is no track selected.

Erasing the programme

You can erase the programme by:

- pressing once in the STOP mode;
- pressing twice during playback;
- opening the CD compartment;
- Select another sound source
 - →**PROG** disappears from the display.

Radio Reception



Tuning to radio stations

- Select TUNER source.
 - → TUNER is displayed.
- 2 Press STOP/BAND (on the set) or TUNER (on the remote control) once or more to select your waveband.
- 3 Press on **TUNING** I← or ►► and release button.
 - \rightarrow The radio automatically tunes to a station with sufficient reception. Display indication during automatic tuning 5 cch.
- **4** Repeat step **3** if necessary until you find the desired station.
- To tune to a weak station, press TUNING I◀◀ or ►►I briefly and repeatedly until you have found optimal reception.

Helpful hints:

To improve radio reception:

- For FM, extend coil antenna at the back of the unit fully for optimum reception.
- For AM, the set uses a built-in antenna. Direct this antenna for best reception by turning the whole set.

Programming radio stations

You can store up to a total of 20 (10 FW and 10 AM) radio stations in the memory.

Automatic programming

Automatic programming will start with a chosen preset number 1. From this preset number upwards, former programmed radio stations will be overridden.

- Press STOP/BAND (on the set) or TUNER (on the remote control) once or more to select your waveband.
- 2 Press PRESET ≈ / ≈ (△ / ▽ on remote control) to select the preset number where programming should start.

Note:

- If no preset number is selected, default is preset
 (1) and all your presets will be overridden.
- **3** Press **PROG** for more than 2 seconds to activate programming.
 - \rightarrow RUE α is displayed and available stations are programmed in order of waveband reception strength.


Manual programming

- Tune to your desired station (see Tuning to radio stations).
- 2 Press PROG to activate programming.→ PROG flashes in the display.
- 4 Press PROG again to confirm the setting.
 → PROG, the preset number and the frequency of the preset station is shown.
- 5 Repeat the above four steps to store other stations.
- You can override a preset station by storing another frequency in its place.

Tuning to preset radio stations

 Press PRESET ≈ / ≈ (△ / ▽ on the remote control) until the desired preset station is displayed.

Tape Operation / Recording



Tape playback

- 1 Select **TAPE** source.
 - → Display: shows TAPE throughout tape operation.
- 2 Pull down the plate marked "OPEN•CLOSE" at the bottom of the main set.
- 3 Press STOP•OPEN ▲ to open the tape
- **4** Insert a recorded tape and close the tape door.
- Load the tape with the open side downward and the full spool to the left.
- **5** Press **PLAY** ▶ to start playback.
- **6** To pause, press **PAUSE II**. Press again to resume.
- 7 Press or ▶▶ to fast wind tape in either direction.
- **8** To stop the tape, press **STOP-OPEN** \blacksquare \triangle .

Notes:

- During playback, the keys are automatically released at the end of a tape. To switch off the set, press **POWER**.
- During fast forwarding/rewinding, the keys will not be released at the end of a tape. To stop fast winding, press STOP/EJECT ■▲.
- The sound source cannot be changed while playing and recording a tape.

General information on recording

- Recording is permissible insofar as copyright or other rights of third parties are not infringed.
- For recording, use only NORMAL (IEC type I) tapes on which the tabs have not yet been broken. This deck is not suited for recording on METAL (IEC IV) type tapes.
- The best recording level is set automatically.
 Altering the VOLUME or DBB controls will not affect the recording in progress.
- The recording sound quality might differ depending on the quality of your recording source and the recording tape.
- At the very beginning and end of the tape, no recording will take place during the 7 seconds when the leader tape passes the recorder heads.
- To protect a tape from accidental erasure, have the tape in front of you and break out the left tab. Recording on this side is no longer possible.
 If, however, you wish to record over this side again, cover the tabs with a piece of adhesive tape.

Synchro start CD recording

- 1 Select CD source.
- 2 Insert a disc and if desired, programme track numbers.
- 3 Press STOP•OPEN ▲ to open the tape
- **4** Insert a suitable tape into the deck and close the tape door.
- **5** Press **RECORD** to start recording.
 - → Playing of the CD programme starts automatically from the beginning of the CD after 7 seconds. It is not necessary to start the CD player separately.

Tape Operation / Recording

To select and record a particular passage within a CD track:

- To interrupt CD playback press ►II.
- Recording starts from this exact point in the track when you press RECORD •.
- 6 To pause, press PAUSE II. Press again to resume.
- 7 To stop recording, press STOP•OPEN.

Recording from the radio

- 1 Tune to the desired radio station (see Tuning to radio stations).
- **3** Insert a suitable tape into the deck and close the tape door.
- 4 Press RECORD

 to start recording.
- **5** To pause, press **PAUSE II** Press again to resume.
- **6** To stop recording, press **STOP•OPEN △**.

Maintenance

Cleaning the Cabinet

 Use a soft cloth slightly moistened with a mild detergent solution. Do not use a solution containing alcohol, spirits, ammonia or abrasives.

Cleaning Discs


- When a disc becomes dirty, clean it with a cleaning cloth.
 Wipe the disc from the centre out.
- Do not use solvents such as benzene, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or antistatic spray intended for analogue records.

Cleaning the disc lens

 After prolonged use, dirt or dust may accumulate at the disc lens. To ensure good playback quality, clean the disc lens with Philips CD Lens Cleaner or any commercially available cleaner. Follow the instructions supplied with cleaner.


Cleaning the Heads and the Tape Paths

- To ensure good recording and playback quality, clean the heads (A), the capstan(s) (B), and pressure roller(s) (C) after every 50 hours of tape operation.
- Use a cotton swab slightly moistened with cleaning fluid or alcohol.
- You can also clean the heads by playing a cleaning tape once.



Demagnetising the heads

 Use a demagnetising tape available at your dealer.



Setting the clock

- 1 In Standby mode, press DISPLAY/CLOCK button.
 - → The clock digits for the hours flash.
- **2** Press **◄ / > >** Ito set the hours.
- 3 Press DISPLAY/CLOCK again.
 - → The clock digits for the minutes flash.
- **4** Press **I**◀◀ / **▶▶**I to set the minutes.
- **5** Press **DISPLAY/CLOCK** to confirm the time.

Note:

 If the clock has not been set, -:- will be displayed.

Setting the timer

- The system can be used as an alarm clock. CD or TUNER can be set to switch on at a preset time. The clock time needs to be set first before the timer can be used.
- If no button is pressed within 90 seconds during timer setup, the system will exit timer setting mode automatically.
- 1 In any mode, press **TIMER** for more than 2 seconds.
- 2 Press I → I (CD / TUNER or I → I on the remote control) to select sound source.
- **3** Press **TIMER** to confirm your desired source.
 - → The clock digits for the hours flash.
- 4 Press ◄ ✓ / ▶ ► to set the hours.
- **5** Press **TIMER** again.
 - → The clock digits for the minutes flash.
- 6 Press ► to set the minutes.
- **7** Press **TIMER** to confirm the time.
 - → The timer is now set and actiated.

Note:

- If source CD is selected and no disc is in the CD tray or the disc has an error, TUNER will be selected automatically.

Activating and deactivating TIMER

- In standby or during playback, press TIMER once.
 - → Display shows **TIMER** if activated, and disappears if deactivated.

Activating and deactivating SLEEP

The sleep timer enables the system to switch off by itself after a set period of time.

- Press SLEEP on the remote control repeatly to select desired time before system shuts off.
 - ightharpoonup Display shows **SLEEP** and series of time options for selection: \mathcal{SQ} , $\mathcal{45}$, $\mathcal{3Q}$, $\mathcal{45}$, \mathcal{Q} , \mathcal{SQ} .



 To deactivate, press SLEEP on the remote control once or more until 'Û' is shown, or press POWER / O on the system or remote control.
