





## Connect speakers







#### Note

 Ensure that the colors of the speaker wires and terminals are matched.

- 1 Hold down the socket flap.
- 2 Insert the stripped part of the wire completely.
  - Insert the right speaker wires to "RIGHT", left speaker wires to "LEFT".
  - Insert the red wires to "+", black wires to "-".
  - Release the socket flap.



## Connect power





#### Caution

- Risk of product damage! Ensure that the power supply voltage corresponds to the voltage set on the voltage selector on the back of the unit.
- Before connecting the AC power cord, ensure you have completed all other connections.



- The type plate is located on the back of the main unit.
- 1 Connect the AC power cable to:
  - the main unit.
  - the wall socket.

## Prepare the remote control




#### Caution

 Risk of explosion! Keep batteries away from heat, sunshine or fire. Never discard batteries in fire.

#### To replace the remote control battery:

- 1 Open the battery compartment.
- 2 Insert 2 AAA batteries with correct polarity (+/-) as indicated.
- 3 Close the battery compartment.





- If you are not going to use the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries.
- Do not use old and new or different types of batteries in combination.
- Batteries contain chemical substances, so they should be disposed of properly.

## Auto install radio stations

When you connect power and no radio stations are stored, the unit automatically begins to store radio stations.

- 1 Connect the unit to the power supply.
  - → [AUTO INSTALL PRESS PLAY]
    (auto install press the PLAY button)
    is displayed.
- Press ►II on the main unit to start installation.
  - → [AUTO] (auto) is displayed.
  - → The unit automatically stores radio stations with sufficient signal strength.
  - When all the available radio stations are stored, the first preset radio station is broadcast automatically.

## Set clock

- 1 Press and hold CLOCK/DISPLAY to activate the clock setting mode.
  - → The 12 hour or 24 hour format is displayed.
- 2 Press **PROG** repeatedly to select 12 hour or 24 hour format.
- 3 Press CLOCK/DISPLAY to confirm.
  - → The hour digits are displayed and begin to blink.
- 4 Press **◄**/▶ to set the hour.
- 5 Press CLOCK/DISPLAY to confirm.
  - → The minute digits are displayed and begin to blink.
- 6 Press **◄◄/▶** to set the minute.
- 7 Press CLOCK/DISPLAY to confirm.



 To view the clock during play, press CLOCK/ DISPLAY repeatedly until the clock is displayed.

## Turn on

- 1 Press POWER.
  - → The unit switches to the last selected source.

## Switch to standby


- 1 Press **POWER** to switch the unit to standby mode.
  - → The clock (if set) appears on the display panel.

# 4 Play

## Play disc

- 1 Press **DISC** to select the disc source.
- 2 Lift the disc compartment door on the top panel to open the disc compartment.
- Insert a disc with the printed side facing up, then close the disc compartment.
- 4 If the disc doesn't play, press ►II.
  - To pause/resume play, press ►II.
  - To stop play, press ■.
  - To select another track, press I√►I, or press a numeric button.
  - To select an album, press ALB/PRESET+/-.
  - To search within a track, press and hold ◄◄/▶▶, then release to resume normal play.

## Play from USB





#### Note

- Ensure that the USB device contains playable audio contents for supported formats.
- 1 Plug the USB device into the socket ← of this unit.
- Press **USB** to select the USB source.

- 3 Press ALB/PRESET+/- to select a folder.
- 4 Press **I**✓ **>**I to select an audio file.
  - If the USB device doesn't play, press ▶■.
  - To pause/resume play, press ►II.
  - To stop play, press ■.
  - To search within an audio file, press and hold ◄◄▶, then release to resume normal play.

# 5 Play options

## Repeat and random play

- 1 Press MODE repeatedly to select:
  - [REP] (repeat): the current track is played repeatedly.
  - [REP ALL] (repeat all): all tracks are played repeatedly.
  - [SHUF] (shuffle): all tracks are played randomly.
- 2 To return to normal play, press MODE repeatedly until play mode is no longer displayed.



Tip

• Shuffle play cannot be selected when you play programmed tracks.

## Program tracks

You can program a maximum of 40 tracks.

- 1 At CD/USB mode, in the stop position, press **PROG** to activate the program mode.
  - → [PROG] (program) blinks on the display.
- 2 For MP3/WMA tracks, press ALB/PRESET+/- to select an album.
- 3 Press I√ ► Ito select a track number, then press PROG to confirm.
- 4 Repeat steps 2 to 3 to select and store all tracks to program.
- 5 Press ▶II to play the programmed tracks.
  - → During play, [PROG] (program) is displayed.
  - To erase the program, in the stop position, press ■.

## Display play information

During play, press CLOCK/DISPLAY repeatedly to select different play information.

# 6 Adjust sound

## Adjust volume level

During play, press **VOL +/-** to increase/ decrease the volume level.

## Select a preset sound effect

- 1 During play, press DSC repeatedly to select:
  - [POP] (pop)
  - [JAZZ] (jazz)
  - [CLASSIC] (classic)
  - [ROCK] (rock)

## Enhance bass

- 1 During play, press **DBB** to turn on or off dynamic bass enhancement.
  - → If DBB is activated, DBB is displayed.

## Mute sound

1 During play, press MUTE to mute/unmute sound.

## Listen to radio

## Tune to a radio station

- Press **TUN** repeatedly to select FM or MW.
- Press and hold ◀◀/▶▶ for more than 2 seconds.
  - → [SEARCH] (search) is displayed.
  - → The radio tunes to a station with strong reception automatically.
- Repeat step 2 to tune to more stations.
  - To tune to a weak station, press **◄◄/▶▶** repeatedly until you find optimal reception.

## Program radio stations automatically

You can program a maximum of 40 (FM + MW) preset radio stations.

- In the tuner mode, press and hold PROG for 2 seconds to activate automatic program mode.
  - → [AUTO] (auto) is displayed.
  - → All available stations are programmed in the order of waveband reception strength.
  - → The first programmed radio station is broadcast automatically.

## Program radio stations manually

You can program a maximum of 40 (FM + MW) preset radio stations.

Tune to a radio station.

- Press **PROG** to activate program mode. → [PROG] (program) blinks on the display.
- Press ALB/PRESET+/- to allocate a number to this radio station, then press PROG to confirm.
- Repeat the above steps to program other stations.



To overwrite a programmed station, store another station in its place.

## Select a preset radio station

In tuner mode, press ALB/PRESET+/- to select a preset number.



- Position the antenna as far as possible from TV, VCR or other radiation source.
- · For optimal reception, fully extend and adjust the position of the antenna.

## Change MW tuning grid

In some countries, the MW radio frequency step between adjacent channels is 9 kHz.

- Select the MW radio source.
- Press and hold on the main unit for more than 5 seconds.
  - → The frequency step is changed to 9 kHz.
  - → All preset stations are erased and need to be re-programmed.

## 8 USB record

## =

Note

• This product supports recording to MSC devices (MTP devices are excluded).

You can record the audio files on a disc into a USB device. Audio CD tracks and MP3 files are recorded in .mp3 format, and WMA files are recorded in .wma format.

The first time you record to USB, a folder called 'PHILIPS' is automatically created in the USB device. Each time you record to USB, the recorded files are stored in a sub-folder in the 'PHILIPS' folder. Files and sub-folders are named numerically in the order in which they are created.

## Auto record from CD to USB

- 1 Press **DISC** to select the disc source.
- 2 Load a disc.
  - To select a track from which a recording starts, press the numeric buttons.
- **3** Plug the USB device into the socket ← of this unt.
- 4 Press **USB RECORD** repeatedly to select:
  - [RECORD ONE] (record one): the first/current track is recorded.
  - [RECORD ALL] (record all): all tracks/ the remaining tracks are recorded.
  - → Disc play starts automatically from the beginning of the disc/the selected track, and the recording starts.
  - To stop recording, press ■.



Note

 If the USB device does not have enough memory to store the CD track, a message about full memory is displayed.

## 9 Other features

## Set the alarm timer

This unit can be used as an alarm clock. The DISC, TUNER or USB is activated to play at a preset time.

- 1 Ensure that you have set the clock correctly.
- 2 Press and hold TIMER.
- **3** Press **DISC**, **TUN** or **USB** to select a source.
- 4 Press **TIMER** to confirm.
  - → The hour digits are displayed and begin to blink.
- **5** Press **◄◄/▶▶** to set the hour.
- 6 Press TIMER to confirm.
  - → The minute digits are displayed and begin to blink.
- 7 Press **◄/▶** to set the minute.
- **8** Press **TIMER** to confirm.
  - → The timer is set and activated.

# Activate and deactivate the alarm timer

- 1 Press TIMER ON/OFF repeatedly to activate or deactivate the timer.
  - → If the timer is activated, the display shows ⊕.
  - → If the timer is deactivated, ⊕ disappears on the display.



Note

- In MP3 link mode, the alarm timer cannot be set.
- If disc source is selected and the track cannot be played, tuner is activated automatically.

## Set the sleep timer

This unit can switch to standby automatically after a set period of time.

- When the unit is turned on, press SLEEP repeatedly to select a set period of time (in minutes).
  - → When sleep timer is activated, the display shows zz2.
- Press **SLEEP** repeatedly until "0" is displayed.
  - → When sleep timer is deactivated, zzZ disappears on the display.

## Listen to an external device

You can also listen to an external audio device through this unit.

- Press MP3 LINK to select the MP3 link source.
- Connect the supplied MP3 link cable to:
  - the MP3 LINK jack (3.5mm) on the
  - the headphone jack on an external device.
- Start to play the device (refer to the device's user manual).

## Delete files in the USB device

- During USB play, press <a>I√►</a> I to select a track.
- 2 Press USB DELETE.
  - → A confirmation message is displayed.
- When the above confirmation message is displayed, press **USB DELETE** again to confirm.
  - To cancel, press ■.
  - → After you delete the file, the USB play stops.

## Maintenance

#### Clean the cabinet

 Use a soft cloth slightly moistened with a mild detergent solution. Do not use a solution containing alcohol, spirits, ammonia or abrasives.

#### Clean discs

 When a disc becomes dirty, clean it with a cleaning cloth. Wipe the disc from the centre out.



Do not use solvents such as benzene, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or antistatic spray intended for analogue records.

#### Clean the disc lens

After prolonged use, dirt or dust may accumulate at the disc lens. To ensure good play quality, clean the disc lens with Philips CD lens cleaner or any commercially available cleaner. Follow the instructions supplied with cleaner.

## 11 Troubleshooting



### Warning

• Never remove the casing of this apparatus.

To keep the warranty valid, never try to repair the system yourself.

If you encounter problems when using this apparatus, check the following points before requesting service. If the problem remains unsolved, go to the Philips web site (www. philips.com/welcome). When you contact Philips, ensure that the apparatus is nearby and the model number and serial number are available.

#### No power

- Ensure that the AC power plug of the unit is connected properly.
- Ensure that there is power at the AC outlet.
- To save power, the unit switches to standby automatically 15 minutes after a play reaches the end and no control is operated.

#### No sound or poor sound

- Adjust the volume.
- Disconnect the headphones.
- Check that the speakers are connected correctly.
- Check if the stripped speaker wires are clamped.

#### Left and right sound outputs reversed

Check the speaker connections and location.

#### No response from the unit

Disconnect and reconnect the AC power plug, then turn on the unit again.

#### Remote control does not work

Before you press any function button, first select the correct source with the remote control instead of the main unit.

- Reduce the distance between the remote control and the unit.
- Insert the batteries with their polarities (+/- signs) aligned as indicated.
- Replace the batteries.
- Aim the remote control directly at the sensor on the front of the main unit.

#### No disc detected

- Insert a disc.
- Check if the disc is inserted upside down.
- Wait until the moisture condensation at the lens has cleared.
- Replace or clean the disc.
- Use a finalized CD or correct format disc.

#### Cannot display some files in USB device

- The number of folders or files in the USB device has exceeded a certain limit. This phenomenon is not a malfunction.
- The formats of these files are not supported.

#### USB device not supported

• The USB device is incompatible with the unit. Try another one.

#### Poor radio reception

- Increase the distance between the unit and your TV or VCR.
- Fully extend and adjust the FM antenna.

#### Timer does not work

- Set the clock correctly.
- Switch on the timer.

#### Clock/timer setting erased

- Power has been interrupted or the power cord has been disconnected.
- Reset the clock/timer.
