





#### **Placement**

You can place the unit on a flat surface or mount the unit on a wall.

#### Mount on a wall

See the wall mounting instructions included in the package.

## Prepare FM/DAB+ antenna

For better reception, fully extend and adjust the position of the FM/DAB+ antenna.



#### Note

 To prevent interference, position the antenna as far as possible from TV,VCR, or other radiation source.

### Prepare the remote control




#### Caution

- Risk of explosion! Keep batteries away from heat, sunshine or fire. Never discard batteries in fire.

#### To install the remote control battery:

- 1 Open the battery compartment.
- 2 Insert 2 AAA batteries with correct polarity (+/-) as indicated.
- **3** Close the battery compartment.



### Connect power



#### Caution


#### Vote

• The type plate is located at the back of the unit.

Connect the power adapter to:

- the DC IN socket on the main unit.
- the wall socket,

#### Set clock

- 1 Press o to switch the unit to standby mode.
  - → --:-- is displayed.
- Press and hold CLOCK SET on the remote control for two seconds.
  - → [SET CLOCK] (set clock) scrolls on the display, and then 12 or 24 hour format blinks
- 3 Press I◀◀ / ▶▶I repeatedly to select hour format.
- 4 Press CLOCK SET to confirm.
- 5 Repeat steps 3-4 to set the hour and minute respectively.
- 6 Repeat steps 3-4 to select whether to synchronize time of this unit with DAB+ stations.
  - [DAB TIME SYNC [N]]: time synchronization is deactivated.
  - [DAB TIME SYNC [Y]]: the unit synchronizes time from the DAB+ stations automatically.



#### Vote

- The accuracy of the transmitted time depends on the DAB+ station that transmits the time signal.
- If the system is idle for 90 seconds, the unit exits clock setting mode automatically.

#### Turn on

#### Press O.

→ The unit switches to the last selected source.



#### Note

 To select a source, press SOURCE repeatedly or the source selection buttons on the remote control.

#### Switch to standby mode

Press  $\circ$  again to switch the unit to standby mode.

The clock (if set) appears on the display panel.

## 4 Play

### Play disc


- 1 Press ≜ to open the disc compartment.
- 2 Insert a disc with the printed side facing up.
- 3 Press ≜ to close the disc compartment.
- 4 Press CD on the remote control to select the disc source.
  - → [Reading] (reading) blinks for a moment, then CD starts playing automatically. If not, press ▶■■.

### Play from USB



Note

- Make sure that the USB device contains playable audio content.
- 1 Insert the USB device into the ← socket.



- Press **USB** on the remote control to select the USB source.
  - → Play starts automatically. If not, press ►II.

## Play from iPod/iPhone/iPad

You can enjoy audio from iPod/iPhone/iPad through this unit.




#### Load the iPod/iPhone/iPad



- 1 Push to open the dock compartment.
- 2 Place the iPod/iPhone/iPad in the dock.

#### Install the rubber pad

If necessary, install the supplied rubber pad to keep the iPad/iPad 2 stable before you place the iPad/iPad 2.



#### Listen to the iPod/iPhone/iPad



#### Note

- Make sure that the iPod/iPhone/iPad is loaded correctly.
- 1 Press **SOURCE** repeatedly or **DOCK** on the remote control to select iPod/iPhone/iPad source.
- 2 Play tracks on the iPod/iPhone/iPad.
  - To pause or resume play, press ►II.
  - To skip to a track, press I◀◀ / ▶▶I.
  - To search during play, press and hold |◀◀ / ▶▶|, then release to resume normal play.
  - To go back to the previous iPod/ iPhone menu, press MENU.
  - To scroll through the menu, press ▲ / ▼.
  - To confirm a selection, press **OK**.

#### Remove the iPod/iPhone/iPad

Pull the iPod/iPhone/iPad out of the dock.

#### Charge the iPod/iPhone/iPad



#### Vote

 iPod with color display, iPod classic, and iPod with video are not compatible with dock charging.

When the unit is connected to power, the docked iPod/iPhone/iPad begins to charge.



#### Гір

 For certain iPod models, it may take up to a minute before the charging indication appears.

### Play options

#### Pause/resume play

During play, press ►II to pause or resume play.

#### Repeat/shuffle play

- 1 During play, press MODE/SCAN repeatedly to select a repeat option or the shuffle play mode:
  - **GONE**: play the current track repeatedly.
  - **\\$ALB**: play all tracks in this album repeatedly.
  - **\\$ALL**: play all tracks repeatedly.
  - SHUF: play all tracks randomly.
- To resume normal play, press MODE/SCAN repeatedly until no option is displayed.

#### Skip to a track

#### For CD:

Press I◀◀ / ▶▶I to select another track.

#### For MP3 disc and USB:

- 1 Press ▲ / ▼ to select an album or a folder.
- Press I ✓ / ▶►I to select a track or file.



#### Tip

 To select a track directly, you can also press a key on the numerical keypad.

#### Search within a track

- 1 During play, press and hold I◀ / ▶▶I.
- 2 Release to resume normal play.

#### Program tracks

You can program a maximum of 20 tracks.

- 1 In CD/USB mode, press to stop playback, then press PROG to activate the programming mode.
  - → [PROG] (program) is displayed.
- 2 For MP3/WMA tracks, press ▲ / ▼ to select an album.
- 4 Repeat steps 2 to 3 to program more tracks.
- 5 Press ►II to play the programmed tracks.
  - → During play, [PROG] (program) is displayed.
  - To erase the program, when playback is stopped, press ■.

### Adjust sound

During play, you can adjust volume and select sound effects.

## Display different information

During play, press **DISPLAY** repeatedly to view time and different play information.

# 5 Listen to DAB+ radio

Digital Audio Broadcasting (DAB+) is a way of broadcasting radio digitally through a network of transmitters. It provides you with more choice, better sound quality and more information.

#### Tune to DAB+ radio stations



Note

- Make sure that the antenna is fulled extended.
- 1 Press DAB/FM repeatedly to select DAB+ radio.
  - → [FULL SCAN] (full scan) is displayed.
- 2 Press **OK** to start full scan.
  - → The unit stores all the DAB+ radio stations automatically and then broadcasts the first available station.
  - → The station list is memorized in the unit. Next time when you turn on the unit, the station scan does not take place.



Note

 If no DAB+ radio station is found, [No DAB Station] (no DAB+ station) is displayed, then [FULL SCAN] (full scan) is displayed again.

## To tune to a station from the available station list:

- 1 In DAB+ mode, press ◄ / ► repeatedly to navigate through the available DAB+ stations.
- 2 Press **OK** to confirm the selection.

## Store DAB+ radio stations automatically



Note

 New stations and services will be added in DAB+ broadcast from time to time. To make new DAB+ stations and services available, perform full scan regularly.

#### In DAB+ mode, press SCAN.

→ The unit scans and stores all the available DAB+ radio stations and broadcasts the first available station.

## Store DAB+ radio stations manually



Note

- You can store a maximum of 20 preset DAB+ radio stations.
- 1 Tune to a DAB+ radio station.
- 2 Press and hold **PROG** for 3 seconds to activate the storing mode.
- 3 Press ▲ / ▼ to select a preset number.
- 4 Press **PROG** to confirm.
- 5 Repeat the above steps to store other DAB+ stations.



Note

 To remove a pre-stored DAB+ radio station, store another station in its place.

## Select a preset DAB+ radio station

In DAB+ mode, press  $\triangle$  /  $\nabla$  to select a preset channel number.

#### Show DAB+ information

While listening to DAB+ radio, press **DISPLAY** repeatedly to scroll through the following information (if available):

- → Station name
- → Dynamic Label Segment (DLS)
- → Signal strength
- → Program type (PTY)
- → Ensemble Name
- → Channel and frequency
- → Signal error rate
- → Bit rate and audio status
- → Date

#### Use DAB+ menu

- 1 In DAB+ mode, press **MENU** to access DAB+ menu.
- 2 Press I◀◀ / ▶▶I to scroll the menu options:
  - [Station list]: tune to a DAB+ radio station from a list of available DAB+ stations, or scan DAB+ stations if no station is stored in the list.
  - [Full scan]: scan and store all the available DAB+ radio stations.
  - [Manual tune]: tune to a DAB+ station manually.
  - [Prune]: remove all the invalid stations from the station list.
  - [System]: adjust system settings.
  - To select an option, press **OK**.
- 4 If a sub-option is available, repeat step 2 and step 3.

#### [System]

- [Factory Reset]: reset all the settings to factory default.
- [Software Upgrade]: update software if available.
- [SW version]: know the software version of the unit.



Note

· If no button is pressed within 10 seconds, the menu exits.

# 6 Listen to FM radio

#### Tune to FM radio stations



Note

- Position the antenna as far as possible from TV,VCR, or other radiation source.
- Make sure that you have connected and fully extended the supplied FM antenna.
- 1 Press **FM** to select FM tuner mode.
- Press and hold I◀◀ / ▶▶I for 3 seconds.
  - → [Scanning] (scanning) is displayed.
  - → The unit tunes to an FM station with strong reception automatically.
- **3** Repeat step 2 to tune to more stations.

To tune to a station with weak signal: Press I◀ / ►►I repeatedly until you find optimal reception.

## Store FM radio stations automatically



Note

You can program a maximum of 20 preset FM radio stations

In FM tuner mode, press and hold **MODE/ SCAN** for 3 seconds.

→ The unit stores all the FM radio stations automatically and then broadcasts the first preset radio station.

## Store FM radio stations manually

- In tuner mode, tune to an FM radio station.
- 2 Press PROG to activate programming mode.
  - → [PROG] (program) blinks.
- 3 Press ▲ / ▼ repeatedly to select a channel number.
- 4 Press **PROG** again to confirm.
- 5 Repeat steps 1-4 to store other FM stations



Note

 To remove a pre-stored station, store another station in its place.

### Select a preset radio station

In tuner mode, press  $\triangle$  /  $\nabla$  or the numeric buttons to select a preset number.

#### Select stereo/mono broadcast



Note

- Stereo broadcast is the default setting for tuner mode.
- For stations with weak signals: to improve the reception, change to monaural sound.

In FM tuner mode, press **OK** to switch between mono and stereo broadcast.

#### Use FM menu

- 1 In FM mode, press MENU to access FM menu.
- 2 Press (◄ / ►) repeatedly to scroll the menu options:
  - [Scan setting]
  - [Audio setting]
  - [System]
- **3** To select an option, press **OK**.
- 4 Repeat steps 2-3 if sub-option is available under one option.

#### Scan setting

- [Strong stations only]: scan FM stations with strong signals only.
- [All stations]: scan all the available FM radio stations.

#### Audio setting

- [Stereo allowed]: select stereo broadcast.
- [Forced mono]: select mono broadcast.

## Adjust system settings

- 1 In FM/DAB+ mode, when [System] menu is displayed, press I◀◀ / ▶▶ repeatedly to select an option.
- 2 Press **OK** to confirm the selection.

#### Note

- If you select to update software without downloading the latest software or connecting to PC via USB port, you need power off and restart the unit.
- If upgrade is interrupted by accident, you must restart the unit and reinstall the software, otherwise your unit cannot work normally.

### Set the alarm timer

This unit can be used as an alarm timer. You can select CD, FM tuner, iPod/iPhone/iPad, DAB, or USB as alarm source.



- Make sure that you have set the clock correctly.
- 1 In standby mode, press and hold TIMER until [SET TIMER] (set timer) scrolls on the display.
  - → [SELECT SOURCE] (select source) is displayed.
- Press SOURCE repeatedly or the source selection buttons on the remote control to select a source: disc, FM tuner, iPod/iPhone/ iPad, DAB+, or USB.
- 3 Press TIMER to confirm.
  - → The hour digits blink.
- 4 Press ◄ / ►► I repeatedly to set the hour.
- 5 Press TIMER to confirm.
  - → The minute digits blink.
- **6** Repeat steps 4-5 to set the minute.
- 7 Press I◀ / ▶►I to select the volume of the alarm sound, then press TIMER to confirm.



- If the system is idle for 90 seconds, the unit exits alarm setting mode automatically.
- If iPod/iPhone/iPad is selected as alarm source, and you have created a playlist called "PHILIPS" in iTunes and import it to your iPod/iPhone/iPad, you will wake to a random track in the playlist.
- If no "PHILIPS" playlist is created in the iPod/iPhone/iPad or no track is stored in the playlist, you will wake to your last listened track in the iPod/iPhone/iPad.

To activate or deactivate the alarm timer In standby mode, press TIMER repeatedly to activate or deactivate the alarm.

 $\rightarrow$   $\odot$  appears when the timer is activated.

 If CD/USB/dock/DAB+ radio is selected as alarm source and the audio cannot be played, FM tuner is activated automatically.

## Set the sleep timer



Note

• Make sure that you have set the clock correctly.

When the unit is turned on, press **SLEEP** repeatedly to select the sleep timer period (in minutes).

When sleep timer is activated, zZ is displayed.

To deactivate the sleep timer Press SLEEP repeatedly until [OFF] (off) is displayed.

## Play from external audio device

With this unit, you can play audio from an external audio device like MP3 player.

- 1 Connect the supplied MP3 Link cable to
  - the MP3-LINK socket.
  - the headphone socket of an external device.
- Press USB/MP3 LINK repeatedly to select MP3 link mode.
- 3 Play the external device (see the device's user manual).

## Listen through the headphone

Plug a headphone into the  $\Omega$  socket on the unit.
