 - → All available radio stations with sufficient signal strength will be stored automatically.

Manual programming



- To cancel the sleep function, either press
 SLEEP on the remote control once or more until "5L PDFF" appears, or press
 STANDBY-ON (^(b) on the remote) to switch to standby mode.

To check the remaining length of time after sleep timer is activated

• Press **SLEEP** once.

Setting the timer

 The system can switch on to CD,TUNER, or MP3 LINK mode automatically at a preset time, serving as an alarm to wake you up.

IMPORTANT!

- Before setting the timer, ensure that the clock is set correctly.

- The timer will always be switched on after it has been set.

- The timer will not start if a recording is in progress.

- The volume of the timer will increase gradually from the minimum level to the last tuned volume level (If the last tuned volume level is less than 15, it will increase gradually from the minimum level to 15).

- Press **TIMER** on the remote control.
 → The last timer setting is shown.
- 2 Press TIMER again for more than 2 seconds.→ The clock digits for the hours flash.
- 3 Press **PRESET +/-** I◀/ ►I (I◀/ ►I on the remote) to set the hours.
- 4 Press TIMER again.→ The clock digits for the minutes flash.
- 5 Press **PRESET +/-** |◀/ ▶ (|◀/ ▶ on the remote) to set the minutes.

Note:

If the last selected source is MP3-LINK/AUX, you cannot use the remote control to set the timer.

To deactivate the timer,

Press **TIMER** in active or standby mode.
→ ∴ disappears if the timer is deactivated.

- When the preset time is reached, the last selected source will be played automatically.

- During timer setting, if no button is pressed within 10 seconds, the system will exit timer setting mode automatically.

Cleaning the Cabinet

Cleaning the disc lens

RADIO RECEPTION	
Radio reception is poor.	 Increase the distance between the Micro HiFi System and your TV or VCR.
GENERAL	
The system does not react when buttons are pressed.	 Remove and reconnect the AC power plug and switch on the system again.
Sound cannot be heard or is of poor quality.	 Adjust the volume. Check that the speakers are connected correctly. Check if the stripped speaker wire is clamped.
The left and right sound outputs are reversed.	 Check the speaker connections and location.
The remote control does not function	 Reduce the distance between the remote contro and the system. Insert the batteries with their polarities (+/- signs) aligned as indicated. Replace the batteries. Point the remote control directly toward IR sensor on the front of the system.
The timer is not working.	 Set the clock correctly. Press TIMER in standby mode to switch on the timer.
The Clock/Timer setting is erased.	 If a recording is in progress, stop the recording. Power has been interrupted or the power cord has been disconnected. Reset the clock/timer.

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
