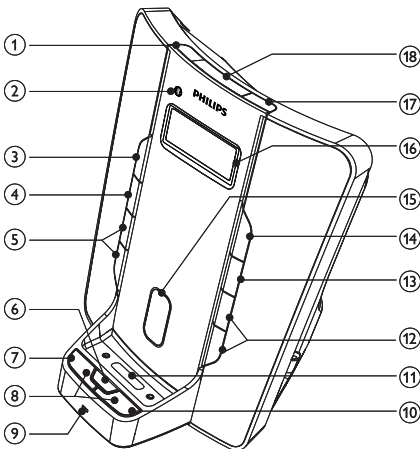

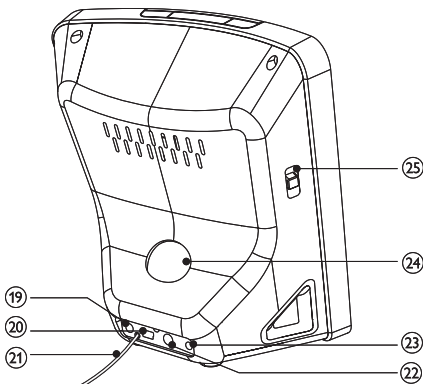

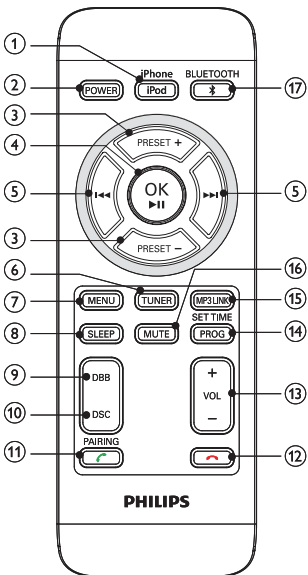

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## Prepare the remote control

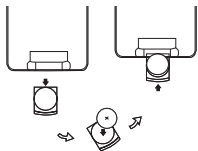

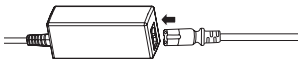
# Connect power



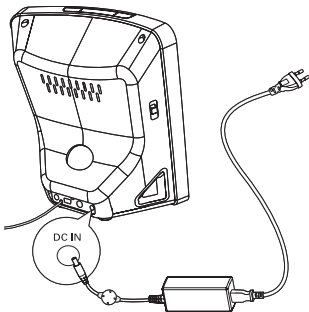
## Caution

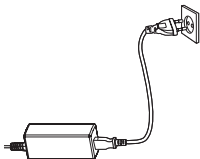

## Set clock and date

- 1 Press and hold **SET TIME** for 2 seconds.
  - 2 Press **▶||** repeatedly to select 12 hour or 24 hour format.
  - 3 Press **SET TIME** to confirm.  
↳ The hour digits are displayed and begin to blink.
  - 4 Press **◀◀▶▶** to set the hour.
  - 5 Press **SET TIME** to confirm.  
↳ The minute digits are displayed and begin to blink.
  - 6 Repeat steps 4-5 to set minute, year, month and day.

## Turn on

- 1 Press **POWER**.  
↳ The DC350 switches to the last selected source.

## Switch to standby

- 1 Press **POWER** again to switch the DC350 to standby mode.

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## Play from iPod/iPhone

You can enjoy audio from iPod/iPhone through this DC350.

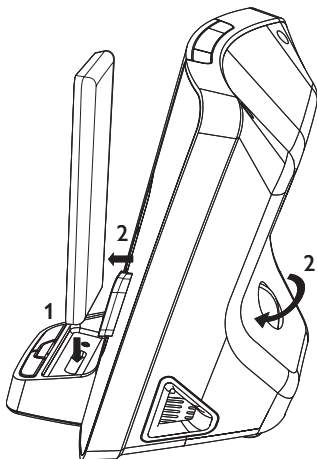
---

### Compatible iPod/iPhone

Apple iPod and iPhone models with a 30-pin dock connector:

- iPod classic, iPod touch, iPod nano, iPod 5th generation (video), iPod with color display, iPod mini.
- iPhone, iPhone 3G.

## Load the iPod/iPhone



- 1 With the connectors facing each other, place the iPod/iPhone in the dock.
- 2 Turn the tilt adjustment control to adjust the angle at which the iPod/iPhone tilts.
  - ↳ When the DC350 is connected to power, the docked iPod/iPhone begins to charge.

## Remove the iPod/iPhone

- 1 Pull the iPod/iPhone out of the dock.

## Listen to the iPod/iPhone

- 1 Ensure that the iPod/iPhone is loaded correctly. (see 'Load the iPod/iPhone' on page 15)
- 2 Press **iPod/iPhone** to select iPod/iPhone source.
  - ↳ The connected iPod/iPhone plays automatically.
    - To pause/resume play, press ►||.
    - To skip to a track, press |◀◀▶▶|.
    - To search during play, press and hold |◀◀▶▶|, then release to resume normal play.
    - To navigate the menu, press **MENU**, and press **PRESET +/-** to select, then press ►||/OK to confirm.

---

## Connect to a computer

- 1 Load the iPod/iPhone in the dock.
- 2 Press **iPod/iPhone** select the iPod/iPhone source.
- 3 Connect the mini USB cable (supplied) to:
  - the **TO PC** jack (mini USB jack) on the back of the DC350.
  - the USB jack on the computer.

↳ If iTunes is installed on the computer, the connected iPod/iPhone begins to synchronize with iTunes. Refer to the device user manual for more details.

## Charge the iPod/iPhone

When the DC350 is connected to power, the docked iPod/iPhone begins to charge.

## Play from an external device

You can also listen to an external audio device through this DC350.

- 1 Press **MP3 Link** to select MP3 link source.
- 2 Connect the supplied MP3 link cable to:

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## Adjust volume level

  - [ROCK] (rock)

## Mute sound

- 1 During play, press **MUTE** to mute/unmute sound.

## 6 Listen to radio



### Note

- Only FM radio reception is available on this DC350.

## Tune to a radio station

- 1 Press **TUNER** to select FM.
- 2 Press and hold **◀◀▶▶** for more than 2 seconds.
  - ↳ [Srch] (search) is displayed.
  - ↳ The radio tunes to a station with strong reception automatically.
- 3 Repeat step 2 to tune to more stations.
  - To tune to a weak station, press **◀◀▶▶** repeatedly until you find optimal reception.

## Program radio stations manually

You can program a maximum of 40 preset radio stations.

- 1 Tune to a radio station.
- 2 Press and hold **PROG** for 2 seconds to activate program mode.
  - ↳ "PR01" blinks on the display.
- 3 Press **PRESET +/-** to allocate a number (1 to 40) to this radio station, then press **PROG** to confirm.
  - ↳ The preset number and the frequency of the preset station are displayed.

## Select a preset radio station

Tip

- Before you use a Bluetooth-enabled with this DC350, read the user manual of the device for compatibility.

---

## Connect with a Bluetooth device



Note

- The operational range between this DC350 and a bluetooth device is approximate 10 meters (30 feet).
- Before you connect a Bluetooth device to this DC350, familiarize yourself with the bluetooth capabilities of the device.
- Compatibility with all Bluetooth device is not guaranteed.
- Any obstacle between this DC350 and a Bluetooth device can reduce the operational range by some level depending on what substance.
- Keep this DC350 away from any other electronic device that may cause interference.

## Connect a device for the first time

- 1 Press **BLUETOOTH** to select the Bluetooth source.  
↳ [BT] (Bluetooth) is displayed.
- 2 Press and hold **PAIRING** for more than 3 seconds.  
↳ [PAIRING] (Pairing) is displayed, and the Bluetooth indicator blinks.
- 3 On the device, set up the Bluetooth connection:
  - ① **Enable Bluetooth to search for other Bluetooth devices.** (Refer to the user manual on how to enable the function.)
  - ② **When “ PHILIPS DC350” is recognized and displayed, select it to start to connect.**
  - ③ **When prompted for a password, enter “0000”.**
- 4 Wait until you hear a double beep from the DC350.  
↳ The connection is complete. The Bluetooth indicator turns on.

### To connect more bluetooth devices


- 1 Disconnect the connected device. (see 'Disconnect a device' on page 19)
- 2 Repeat the steps 1-4 in “Connect a device for the first time”.



Tip

- If no connection is made within one minute, [FAILED] (failed) is displayed on the DC350.

## Disconnect a device

- 1 Press and hold  for more than 5 seconds  
↳ [DISCONNECT] (disconnect) is displayed on the DC350.
  - When you turn off the connected device or move it beyond the communication range, you hear a long beep from the DC350.

## Re-connect a device

After you have connected a device for the first time, once its Bluetooth function is enabled, it re-connects automatically. (see 'Connect a device for the first time' on page 19)

- 1 Ensure that on the device, you have turned on the Bluetooth function. (Refer to the user manual on how to enable the function.)
- 2 Turn on the DC350.
  - ↳ The Bluetooth connection is automatically made, and the Bluetooth indicator turns on.
  - ↳ When more than one previously-connected device is in the operational range: If an iPhone is docked, it is re-connected first. All other devices are re-connected sequentially. The first device that was connected for the first time will be re-connected first.



#### Tip

- This DC350 can memorize the connection information of up to 8 devices.





---

## Receive a phone call



#### Note

- You can receive phone calls through this DC350 with devices that support the HFP or HSP profile.

- 1 Connect the Bluetooth device. (see 'Connect with a Bluetooth device' on page 18)
- 2 When a call is received, you hear the incoming call alert tone. Press **PAIRING**  to accept the call.
  - To reject the call, press .
- 3 Speak into the **MIC** located on the front panel.
  - To increase or decrease the volume, press **VOL +/-**.
  - To mute the microphone, press **MUTE**. To unmute, press this button again.
  - To select to hear the audio from the device or from the DC350, press **PAIRING** .
- 4 Press  to end the call.



#### Tip

- To be heard more clearly, speak closer to the microphone.
- If an echo is heard, reduce the volume of the DC350.
- If you observe communication difficulties, position the Bluetooth device closer to this DC350.



---

## Listen to music



#### Note

- You can listen to audio through this DC350 from devices that support A2DP or AVRCP.

- 1 Connect the Bluetooth device. (see 'Connect with a Bluetooth device' on page 18)
- 2 On the Bluetooth device, start play.
  - ↳ You hear the music through this DC350.
    - To pause/resume play, press .
    - To skip to a track, press .

## 8 Other features

### Set the alarm timer

You can set two alarms which go off at different time.

- 1 Ensure that you have set the clock correctly. (see 'Set clock and date' on page 13)
- 2 Press and hold **ALM 1** or **ALM 2** on the main unit for 2 seconds.
  - ↳ Hour digits blink.
  - ↳ [AL 1] (alarm 1) or [AL 2] (alarm 2) is displayed.
- 3 Press **◀◀▶▶** repeatedly to set the hour.
- 4 Press **ALM 1** or **ALM 2** to confirm.
- 5 Press **◀◀▶▶** repeatedly to set the minute.
- 6 Press **ALM 1** or **ALM 2** to confirm.
  - To set the other alarm, repeat the steps 2 - 6.



Tip

- To view alarm time, press **ALM 1** or **ALM 2** repeatedly until alarm time is displayed.

### Set alarm mode

- 1 Adjust the **iPhone/iPod-RADIO-BUZZER** control on the main unit to select the source for the alarm.
  - ↳ When the alarm time comes, the selected Phone/iPod, or radio or buzzer turns on.



Tip

- If iPod/iPhone source is selected but no iPod/iPhone is loaded, the buzzer is selected automatically.

### Activate the alarm timer

- 1 Press repeatedly **ALM 1** or **ALM 2** on the main unit to activate or deactivate the timer.
  - ↳ If the timer is activated, [AL 1] (alarm 1) or [AL 2] (alarm 2) is displayed.
  - ↳ If the timer is deactivated, [AL 1] (alarm 1) or [AL 2] (alarm 2) disappears.

### Turn off the alarm tone

During an alarm tone, you can select one of the following to turn it off.

- Press **POWER**.
  - ↳ The alarm timer remains activated.
- Press **REPEAT ALARM** on the main unit.
  - ↳ The alarm call repeats at 9-minute intervals.

# 10 Troubleshooting

When you contact Philips, ensure that your DC350 is nearby and the model number and serial number are available (see 'Get started' on page 12).

### No power

- Ensure that the AC power plug of the DC350 is connected properly.
- Ensure that there is power at the AC outlet.
- To save power, the DC350 switches to standby automatically 15 minutes after disc play reaches the end and no control is operated.

### No sound

- Adjust the volume.

### No response from the DC350

- Disconnect and reconnect the AC power plug, then turn on the DC350 again.

### Poor radio reception

- Increase the distance between the DC350 and your TV or VCR.
- Fully extend the FM antenna.

**Clock setting erased**

- Power has been interrupted or the power cord has been disconnected.
- Reset the clock.

**Sound input to the microphone cannot be heard clearly**

- Speak closer to the microphone when talking, or talk louder.
- Reduce or remove background noise.
- Reduce the volume of the DC350 to remove an echo.

**Audio quality is poor after connection with a Bluetooth device**

- The Bluetooth reception is poor: Move the device closer to the DC350, or remove any obstacle between the device and the DC350.

**A device cannot connect with the DC350**

- The device does not support Bluetooth communication, or any of the compatible profiles required for the DC350.
- You have not enabled the Bluetooth function of the device. Refer to the user manual of the device on how to enable the function.
- It is connected for the first time. (see 'Connect a device for the first time' on page 19) It is re-connected. (see 'Re-connect a device' on page 19)
- The DC350 is already connected with another Bluetooth device. Disconnect the connected device, then try again.

**The connected mobile phone connects and disconnects constantly**

- The Bluetooth reception is poor: Move the mobile phone closer to the DC350, or remove any obstacle between the mobile phone and the DC350.
- Some mobile phones may connect and disconnect constantly when you make or end calls. This does not indicate any malfunction of the DC350.
- For some mobile phones, the Bluetooth connection can be deactivated automatically to save power. This does not indicate any malfunction of the DC350.





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
