1 Important


With the CD Soundmachine, you can:



 - Select CD USB, MW (AM), or FM source.
 - **OFF**: switch to standby mode.

 - Show current status.

 - Open or close the disc compartment.

 - Tune to radio stations.

Connect AC power





4 Play

Play CD

You cannot play CDs encoded with copyright protection technologies.

You can play commercially available audio CDs:

- CD-Recordables (CD-R)
- CD-Rewritables (CD-RW)
- MP3-CDs
- WMA-CDs
- 1 Switch the source selector to CD•USB.
- 2 Press CD to select CD source.
- 3 Press OPEN•CLOSE to open the disc compartment.
- 4 Insert a disc with the printed side facing up.
- 5 Press OPEN•CLOSE to close the disc compartment.
 - → Play starts automatically.
 - To stop play, press ■.
 - To pause or resume play, press ►II.
 - For MP3/WMA files: to select an album, press **ALBUM** +/-.
 - To skip to a track, press I◄◄ / ▶▶I.
 - To search within a track, press and hold I◀◀ / ▶▶I. Release to resume normal play.

Play from USB devices



Note

- Make sure that the USB device contains playable audio contents for supported formats.
- 1 Switch the source selector to CD•USB.
- 2 Press **USB** to select USB source.
- 3 Insert the USB connector on the device into the ← socket.
- 4 Press ALBUM + to select a folder.

- 5 Press I ✓ / ► I to select a file.
- 6 Press ►II to start play.
 - To stop play, press ■.
 - To pause or resume play, press ►II.

Listen to radio

- 1 Switch the source selector to FM or MW.
- 2 Turn **TUNING** until you find optimal reception.



- To improve FM reception, you can extend, incline, or turn the telescopic antenna for best reception.
- To improve MW reception, turn the CD Soundmachine to face a different direction.

Play options

Select play modes

You can choose different play mode.

- 1 Press MODE repeatedly to select a play mode:
 - [🗢] (repeat) repeat a track
 - [← ALL] (repeat all) repeat an entire CD/program
 - [\Longrightarrow] (shuffle) play tracks randomly
- To return to normal play, press MODE repeatedly until play mode icons are no longer displayed.



 Shuffle play cannot be selected when you play programmed tracks.

Program tracks

You can program a maximum of 20 tracks.

- In CD mode, at the stop position, press **PROG** to activate the program mode. → [PROG] (program) starts to blink.
- For MP3/WMA tracks, press ALBUM +/to select an album.
- Press | ✓ ✓ / ▶ ▶ | to select a track number, and then press PROG to confirm.
- Repeat steps 2 to 3 to program more tracks.
- 5 Press ►II to play the programmed tracks.
 - → During play, [PROG] (program) is displayed.
 - To erase the program, in the stop position, press .

Other features

Listen to an external device

You can also listen to an external audio device through this unit.

For an audio device with a headphone socket:

- Connect the supplied MP3 LINK cable to
 - the MP3 LINK socket on this unit.
 - the headphone socket on an MP3 player.
- 2 Start to play the MP3 player. (See the user manual of the MP3 player.)

Maintenance

Clean the cabinet

 Use a soft cloth slightly moistened with a mild detergent solution. Do not use a solution containing alcohol, spirits, ammonia or abrasives.

Clean discs

 When a disc becomes dirty, clean it with a cleaning cloth. Wipe the disc from the centre out.



 Do not use solvents such as benzene, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or antistatic spray intended for analogue records.

Clean the disc lens

 After prolonged use, dirt or dust may accumulate at the disc lens. To ensure good play quality, clean the disc lens with Philips CD lens cleaner or any commercially available cleaner. Follow the instructions supplied with cleaner.

No power

- Make sure that the power cord is connected securely.
- Make sure that there is power at the wall outlet.

No sound

- Adjust the volume.
- Ensure that the track played is of a compatible format.

Display does not function properly./No reaction to any operation of the controls.

- Disconnect the AC power cord.
- Connect the AC power cord after a few seconds.

Cannot play disc

- Ensure that the disc label is inserted with the printed side facing up.
- Wipe the disc with fibre cleaning cloth from the centre to the edge in a straight line.
- This disc may be defective. Play another disc.
- Ensure that the CD is a finalised CD/ CD-R/CD-RW.
- Ensure that the laser lens is clean.
- Ensure that the CD is not encoded with copyright protection technologies.

The CD skips tracks

- Ensure that the CD is not damaged or dirty.
- Ensure that program/shuffle mode is deactivated.
