3 Play

Make sure that the disc or device contains playable music or video.

Note

- For CDs recorded in multiple sessions, only the first session is played.
- Does not support MP3 Pro audio format.
- It may not support and display special characters track name (ID3) or album name properly.
- It cannot play some WMA is protected by Digital Rights Management (DRM).
- The system does not display or play the folders or files that exceed the supporting limit.




Load and eject discs







- 2 Insert the disc into the disc slot with label side facing up.
 - ➡ Play resumes from the point where it was last stopped.




- To remove the disc, press the ≜ button.
 → When the disc is ejected, the unit switches to TUNER mode automatically.
- 4 Close the front panel.
 → After a few seconds, the screen illuminates.
- For video discs, press I ◄ or ▶▶I to select an item, then press ^{oK MUTE} to start playing.
- For discs that contain MP3s, WMAs, or JPEGs, press I◀◀ or ▶▶I to select a folder, track or picture. Press ^{or MUTE} to start playing.

🔆 Tip

• If the disc is blocked in the disc compartment, press and hold the ▲ button until the disc comes out.

Insert and remove USB device


1 Slide down the USB socket cover.




- 2 Insert the USB device into the USB socket.→ The unit starts playing from the USB

- 4 Remove the USB device.

Insert and remove SD/SDHC card

1 Press 📥 to open the front panel.



 Insert SD or SDHC card into the card slot.
 → The unit starts playing from the SD/ SDHC card automatically.




- 3 To remove the SD or SDHC card, press o^{KMUTE} to turn off the unit.
- 4 Press the card until you hear a click sound.→ The card is now disengaged.


Skip/search

During video and audio disc play

• To skip to a specified chapter or track, press the numeric buttons.



• To skip to the previous or next chapter or track, press I◀◀ or ▶▶I .




- To search backward or forward quickly, press I ◀ or ▶▶I for 3 seconds.
- Press 1 ▶II to resume normal play.

During MP3/WMA play

 To select a specific song folder, press twice to display the folder list. Press or ▼ to select, and then press or ocnfirm.

To select a specific track, press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown within the folder. Press \circ^{KMUTE}_{O} to confirm.


• To skip to a specified chapter or track, press the numeric buttons.



Intro play

This feature plays the first 10 seconds of each audio track.


Press the **INTRO** 2 button to enable and disable this function.



Repeat play

Press the 3 REP button repeated to select.





- [REP ONE]: play the current chapter or track repeatedly.

- [REP ALL]: play all chapters in the title or all tracks repeatedly.
- [REP CANCEL]: cancel repeat play.

Random play

There are 3 standard modes of random play for audio and MP3/WMA.

Press the SHUF 4 button repeatedly to select.






- [SHUFFLE ALL]: start random play for all tracks.
- [SHUFFLE DIR]: start random play in current folder.
- [SHUFFLE OFF]: cancel random play.

Select Language

Subtitle

You can select the subtitle language if the DVD discs contain two or more subtitle languages.


During play, press **SUBTITLE** on the remote control repeatedly until the language is selected.



Audio


You can select the audio language if the video discs contain two or more audio channels.

During play, press **R/L** on the remote control repeatedly until the language is selected.




Dynamic Bass Boost

- Press MAX SOUND / DBB on the car audio system for 3 seconds or press DBB on the remote control.
 - → [DBB ON]: The Dynamic Bass Boost (DBB) function is on.
 - → [DBB OFF]: The DBB function is off.
- 2 Press DBB again to change the DBB setting.



MAX sound


- 1 Press MAX SOUND / DBB to produce an instant boost in bass and maximize volume.
- 2 Press MAX SOUND / DBB again to turn off.




Zoom

4 Radio

Select tuner sensitivity

Before you start to search for radio station, you can select tuner sensitivity.




Press MENU.

 \hookrightarrow The main menu is displayed.



- Press the navigation buttons to select [SETTINGS], then press SEL on remote control or OK MUTE on the car audio to confirm.
- 3 Press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown button to select $\mathbf{\hat{D}}$.




- 4 Press ►►I to select [LOC_DX],
- 5 Press ►►I again to reach the [LOC_DX] option list.
 - **[LOC]**: only broadcast local stations with strong signals.


- **[DX]**: broadcast any stations with strong and weak signals.
- 6 Press ▲ or ▼ button to select [LOC] or[DX], then press SEL on remote control or ^{oK MUTE} on the car audio to confirm.

Manual tune to a radio station

1 Press SOURCE until you select radio.



2 Press and hold ▲ or ▼ to select band.
 → [FM-1], [FM-2], [FM-3], [FM], [MW-1], or [MW-2] is display.



3 Press I ← or ►►I to tune to a radio station manually.




Auto tune to a radio station

In **[RADIO]** mode, press and hold **I44** or **>>I** for 3 seconds.

Store stations manually

You can store up to 6 stations in each band.

- **1** Tune to the station which you want to store.
- 2 Press and hold the numeric buttons (1 to 6) for 3 seconds.



Store stations automatically

You can store up to 6 stations in each band.

- 1 Press SEARCH on the remote control or press and hold $\frac{q}{ss}$ on the unit.
 - → The six strongest stations of the selected band are saved in preset channels 1-6 automatically.

Select the preset station

- Press and hold ▲ or ▼ to select band.
 → [FM-1], [FM-2], [FM-3], [FM], [MW-1], or [MW-2] is display.
- **2** Press the numeric button (1 to 6) to select the preset station.


Select stereo or mono broadcasting

1 Press MENU.

 \mapsto The main menu is displayed.



- 2 Press the navigation buttons to select [SETTINGS].
- 3 Press SEL on the remote control or ^{∞MTE} on the unit to confirm.



- 4 Press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown buttons to select the radio setting $\overrightarrow{\mathbf{o}}$.
- 5 Press ►►I to select [STEREO_MONO].
- 6 Press ►►I again to reach the [STEREO_ MONO] option list.
- 7 Press ▲ or ▼ to select [STEREO] or [MONO].
- $8 \quad \text{Press SEL on the remote control or } \overset{\text{or MUTE}}{\odot} \\ \text{on the unit to confirm.}$

5 Play with RDS

The RDS (Radio Data System) function operates only in areas with FM stations broadcasting RDS signals. If you tune to an RDS station, an RDS icon and the station name are displayed.

Activate AF/TA/REG/CT functions

- Press and hold MENU.
 → The setting menu is displayed.
- 2 Press the navigation buttons to select [Radio] > [LOC_DX] >[DX], then press ^{™™™} to select an option.
 - TA (traffic announcement): allows you to receive traffic announcements automatically no matter what source you are listening to.
 - AF (alternate frequency): automatically searches for an alternative frequency for maintaining the same station when the tuner cannot get a good reception.
 - REG (regional radio): sets AF tuning region.
 - CT (clock time): synchronizes the clock of the unit with that on the RDS station.
- 3 Turn ^{™™™} to select [ON], then press ^{™™™} to confirm.

Search for an RDS station by PTY information

The PTY (program type) function lets you find similar programming by genre, and the radio starts searching for stations broadcasting in the selected category.

- Press ♀ in radio mode.
 → The PTY menu is displayed.
- 2 Turn ^{comme} to select a program type, then press ^{comme} to start searching.
 - → The first radio station will be broadcasted automatically.
 - → NO PTY is flashed if no station is searched.
- **3** Repeat Step 1 and 2 to search for next available station.
- 4 Select a channel.





Adjust general settings

1 Press MENU.



2 Press the navigation buttons to select [SETTINGS], then press ^{okmute} to confirm.



→ The settings menu is displayed

- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ buttons to select the general setting ♥.
- 4 Press ▶▶I, and then ▲ or ▼ to select the sub-menus.

Adjust AV-In setting



Note

- AV-In source input is switched off by default to prevent blank screen when AV-In source is not connected. Activate it before using AV-In.
- Press MENU.
- 2 Press the navigation buttons to select [SETTINGS], then press ^{οκμυτε} to confirm.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ buttons to select the general setting ♣.
- 4 Press $\triangleright \triangleright I$, and then \triangle or ∇ to select [AV-In].
- 5 Press ▲ or ▼ to select [ON] or [OFF] to activate or deactivate AV-In function.



Reset

To reset the car audio system to its default setting:

- 1 Detach the front panel.
- 2 Press RESET by using a ball-point pen or similar tool.
 - \mapsto All settings are erased except clock.





Replace fuse

If the system does not power on, the fuse may be damaged and need replacement.

- 1 Detach the front panel and take out the system.
- 2 Check the electric connection.
- **3** Buy a new fuse that matches the voltage of the damaged fuse (15A).
- **4** Replace the fuse.

9 Troubleshooting

Caution

• Never remove the casing of this apparatus.

To keep the warranty valid, never try to repair the system yourself.

If you encounter problems when using this system, check the following points before requesting service. If the problem remains unsolved, go to the Philips web site (www. philips.com/support). When you contact Philips, make sure that your system is nearby and the model number and serial number are available.

No power

- Car engine has not been started. Start the car engine.
- Connections is incorrect.
- Fuse has been damaged. Replace fuse.

No sound

- Volume is too low. Adjust volume.
- Speaker connections is incorrect.

No response to the remote control

- Ensure that the path between the remote control and the unit iis clear from obstacles.
- From a close distance, point the remote control directly at the unit.
- Replace the remote control battery.
- The function does not work. Refer to the instructions.

Disc does not play

- Disc is upside down. Ensure the printed side is upwards.
- Disc is dirty. Clean the disc with a clean, soft, lint-free cloth. Wipe the disc outwards from the center.
- Disc is defective. Try another disc.
- Imcompatible disc is used. Try another disc.
- Disc rating exceeds the restrict setting. Change the rating settings to lower one.

• Disc region code is not compatible with the unit. Use disc with proper region code.

Disc is blocked in the disc compartment

• Press and hold ▲ until the disc comes out.

No image

• Parking brake wire connection is incorrect. Check the parking wiring.

Image flashes or distorted

- Video DVD settings do not match with the DVD. Adjust video DVD settings.
- Video connection is improper. Check the connections.

Noise in broadcasts.

- Signals are too weak. Select other stations with stronger signals.
- Check the connection of the car antenna.
- Change broadcast from stereo to mono.

Preset stations lost.

• Battery cable is not connected correctly. Connect the battery cable to the terminal that is always live.

Fuse is broken

- The Fuse type is incorrect. Replace it with a 15A fuse.
- Speaker wire or power wire is grounded. Check the connections.

Display show ERR-12

• USB/SD/SDHC data error. Check the USB device or SD/SDHC card.
