



CD Player

Basic operation

- To select your sound source, adjust the source selector to: TUNER, AUX, CD, iPod. or OFF.
- 2 To switch off the set, adjust the source selector to OFF position and check the cassette keys are released.

Helpful hints:

In tuner mode, if you connect a 3.5 mm aux-in cable, the source changes to **AUX** automatically.

Adjusting volume

Adjust the volume with the **VOLUME** control.

Radio reception

- 1 Adjust the source selector to TUNER.
- 2 Adjust **BAND** to **FM** or **AM** as your desired band.
- 3 Turn **TUNING** to tune to a station.
- For FM, extend and turn the telescopic antenna for best reception. Reduce its length if the signal is too strong.
- For AM, the set uses a built-in antenna.
 Direct this antenna for best reception by turning the whole set.
- **4** To switch off the radio, adjust the source selector to **OFF** position.

Playing a CD

This CD player plays Audio Discs including CD-Recordables and CD-Rewritable.

 MP3 CD-ROMs, CD-I, CDV,VCD, DVD or computer CDs are not possible for playback on this set.

IMPORTANT!

- CDs encoded with copyright protection technologies by some record companies may be unplayable by this product.
- Adjust the source selector to CD.
- 2 Open the disc door.
- Insert a CD with the printed side facing up and press the CD door gently to close.
 - → Display shows - and later, the total number of tracks. (See 2, 3)
- 4 Press ►II on the set to start playback.
 Display: and the current track number.
 (See 4)
- 5 To pause playback press ►II. To resume playback, press ►II again.
- 6 To stop CD play, press ■.

Helpful hints:

CD play will also stop when:

- you open the CD compartment;
- you select TUNER, AUX, or OFF sound source;
- the CD has reached the end of playback.

Selecting a different track

- Press

 once or repeatedly until the desired track number appears in the display.
- In the stop/pause position, press >I to start playback.

CD Player

Finding a passage within a track

- 1 During playback, press and hold down
 - **◆◆**/ **▶▶**.
 - → The CD is played at high speed and low volume.
- When you recognize the passage you want release ◄/ ▶>.
 - → Normal playback resumes.

Helpful hints:

 When your searching reaches the end of the last track, the CD goes to stop mode.

Programming track

You may store up to 20 tracks in the desired sequence. If you like, store any track more than once.

- 1 In the stop position, press **PROG** to activate programming.
 - ightharpoonup Display: **PROG** and $\mathcal{D}\mathcal{D}$ flash (see 5).
- 2 Press ✓ or ➤ to select your desired track number.
 - → Display: **PROG** and your desired track number flash.
- 3 Press PROG to store the desired track number.
 - → Display: PROG and \$\mathcal{G}\mathcal{G}\$ flash for you to program the next track.
- 4 Repeat steps 2 to 3 to select and store all desired tracks in this way.
- 5 To play your program, press ►II.
 - → Display: PROG flashes during program playback.

Helpful hints:

 If you try to store more than 20 tracks, no track can be selected and the display will show flashing - -.

To review a program

 In the stop position, press and hold PROG for two seconds to see your stored track numbers.

Erasing a program

You can erase the contents of the memory by:

- in the stop position, press PROG to enter program mode, and then press ■;
- Selecting **TUNER, AUX**, or **OFF** sound source;
- opening the CD door.
- →Display: **PROG** disappears.

Different play mode

REPEAT

You can play the current track or the whole disc repeatedly, and combine REPEAT modes with PROGRAM.

REPEAT – plays the current track continuously.

REPEAT ALL— repeats the entire CD/program.

- To select play mode, press REPEAT once or more.
 - → The display shows selected mode.
- Press MI to start playback if in the stop/pause position.
- 3 To return to normal playback, press REPEAT repeatedly until the modes are no longer displayed.
 - You can also press

 to cancel your play mode.

iPod Dock AUX

Compatible iPod players

The docking entertainment system is compatible with all the existing Apple iPod models with 30-pin connector: iPod touch (8GB, 16GB), iPod classic (80GB, 160GB), iPod video (30GB, 60GB, 80GB), and iPod nano generation 1 to 3

Playing an iPod portable player

- Correctly dock your iPod portable player in the cradle. Make sure the dock adapter is compatible.
- Make sure that you have powered on your iPod player before selecting iPod source.
- 2 Switch the source selector to **iPod**.
 - → The iPod dock icon appears.
- 3 Playback starts automatically. Playback functions play, skip, fast search and, pause are possible using the controls on this system and its remote control.

Charging iPod battery using the dock

 In iPod/Tuner/AUX mode, directly dock your iPod portable player on the cradle for charging.

Connecting an external device

You can listen to the sound of the connected external device through your DC1010's speakers.

- 1 Adjust the source selector to AUX.
- 2 Use a line-in cable (not supplied) to connect DC1010's AUX jack (3.5 mm, located on the back panel) to an AUDIO OUT or headphone jack on an external equipment (such as CD player, or VCR).

Maintenance & Safety (See 6)

CD player and CD handling

- If the CD player cannot read CDs correctly, use a cleaning CD to clean the lens before taking the set to repair.
- The lens of the CD player should never be touched!
- Sudden changes in the surrounding temperature can cause condensation on the lens of your CD player: Playing a CD is then not possible. Do not attempt to clean the lens but leave the set in a warm environment until the moisture evaporates.
- Always close the CD door to avoid dust on the lens.
- To clean the CD, wipe in a straight line from the center towards the edge using a soft, lint-free cloth. Do not use cleaning agents as they may damage the disc.
- Never write on a CD or attach any stickers to it.

Safety information

- Place the set on a hard, flat and stable surface so that the system does not tilt.
- Do not expose the set, batteries, CDs to humidity, rain, sand or excessive heat caused by heating equipment or direct sunlight.
- Do not expose the apparatus to dripping or splashing.
