Hearing Safety

Listen at a moderate volume.

- Be careful not to adjust the volume as your hearing adapts.
- Do not turn up the volume so high that you can't hear what's around you.

Mains plug

This apparatus is fitted with an approved 13-Amp plug. To change a fuse in this type of plug, proceed as follows:

- 1 Remove fuse cover and fuse.
- 2 Fix the new fuse which should be a BS1362 5-Amp, A.S.T.A. or BSI approved type.
- 3 Refit the fuse cover.

If the fitted plug is not suitable for your socket outlets, it should be cut off and an appropriate plug should be fitted in its place.

If the mains plug contains a fuse, it should have a value of 5 Amp. If a plug without a fuse is used, the fuse at the distribution board should not be greater than 5 Amp.

Note: The severed plug must be disposed, so as to avoid a possible shock hazard due to it being inserted into another 13-Amp socket.

How to connect a plug

The wires in the mains lead are colored using the following codes: blue = neutral (N), brown = live (L).

- As these colors may not correspond with the color markings identifying the terminals in your plug, proceed as follows:
 - Connect the blue wire to the terminal marked N or colored black.
 - Connect the brown wire to the terminal marked L or colored red.
 - Do not connect either wire to the earth terminal in the plug, marked E (or e) or colored green (or green and yellow).

Before replacing the plug cover, make sure that the cord grip is clamped over the sheath of the lead and not simply over the two wires.

WACS7000 comprises of a WAC7000 Center and a WAS7000 Station. Up to 5 WAS7000 Stations can be connected to a WAC7000 Center.

You can centrally store up to 1500 audio CDs* in the 80GB hard disk on WAC7000. All stored music will then be wirelessly streamed from the Center to the connected Stations via Wi-Fi**. 1.5 Maintenance

Cleaning the Set

1.6 Safety information

- Place the set on a flat, firm and stable surface.

- Place the set in a location with adequate ventilation to prevent internal heat build-up in your system. Allow at least 10 cm (4 inches) clearance from the rear and the top of the unit and 5 cm (2 inches) from each side.







3.1 Placing Center and Station

With detachable stands and by-packed wall mounting kits, the WACS7000 Center and Station can be placed in two ways: on desktops using detachable stands or on walls without using the stands.





(on desktops using stands)



(on walls without using stands)

IMPORTANT!

 Before you decide where and how to place both the Center and Station, try the Wi-Fi connection and rear connections to find a suitable location.

3.2 Setting up Wi-Fi connection between Center and Station

Wi-Fi connection starts automatically when you power up both the WAC7000 Center and WAS7000 Station

- The first time you set up a Wi-Fi connection, place the Center and Station side by side on a flat and firm surface.
- 2 a. Connect the Center to power supply
 - **b.** Connect the Station to power supply
 - → Auto installation/connection starts
 - → HD screen appears on the Center
 - → HD screen appears on the Station when the Station is connected to the Center
- 3 Unplug the Center and Station. Relocate as desired.

IMPORTANT!

- Make sure that you have already powered up the Center before powering up the Station.
- Avoid installing between thick walls.
 The Center and Station should never be blocked by 2 or more walls.
- Avoid placing the system near to large metal objects.
- For better Wi-Fi reception, turn the Wi-Fi antenna, or adjust the location of the Center and Station.
- Always press and hold ECO/STANDBY-ON (b) to switch the set to ECO POWER (power-saving mode) before removing its power plug.


3.3 Rear connections

Warning:


- Never make or change the connections when the mains is switched on.
- Install the Center and Station near AC outlets where the AC power plug can be reached easily.

3.3.1 Connecting antennas

Extend the wire antenna and fit it to the FM ANTENNA as shown below



(Optional) To improve FM reception, fit the plug of the wire antenna into the plug of the extension line (sold separately) as shown below




- Extend the extension line and move it in different positions for optimal reception (as far away as possible from the TV,VCR or other radiation sources)
- 4 Fix end of the extension line to the ceiling

3.3.2 Connecting a USB mass storage device

On Center or Station, you can playback music from a USB mass storage device. Also, you can transfer the music from the library on the Center to the USB mass storage device. Carry your favorite music with you wherever you go.

■ Insert the USB plug of the USB device into the socket → on the Center or Station



For devices with USB cable:

- Insert one end of the USB cable (not supplied)
 into the socket on the Center or Station
- Insert the other end of the USB cable into the USB output terminal of the USB device
- 2 To playback music from the USB device, press SOURCE once or more times to select USB source (see 10.External source)
- 3 To record music to the USB device, see 10.External source

Helpful hints:

The Center or Station only supports USB devices that adhere to the following standards:

- USB MSC (Type '0')
- File system in FAT12/ FAT16/ FAT32
- Operations based on simple folder based navigation (also known as a normal FAT file system), and not based on proprietary track database.


The following USB devices will not be supported by the Center or Station:

 MTP based or Dual mode (adhering to both the MSC and MTP standards) devices, as the Center or Station does not support browse, play and export functions using the MTP protocol.

 Products with database based UI (Artists, Albums and Genre based navigation) as these products normally store music files in a specific hidden folder and uses embedded proprietary track database that the Center or Station is unable to read properly.

3.3.3 Connecting to a portable hard disk audio player (sold separately)

You can connect your portable hard disk audio player to the Center or Station using Philips docking IR cradle and data/audio cable (not supplied). Now you will be able to enjoy the music library in your portable hard disk player via WACS7000's sophisticated speaker system. You can even recharge the player's battery at the same time.



To playback music from the portable hard disk player, press **PORTABLE** on the 2-way remote control (see **10.External source**)

Helpful hint:


 Make sure that the Center and Station is already connected before pressing the PORTABLE button.


3.3.4 Connecting to other additional devices

It is possible to play audio output from an external source, e.g. TV, VCR, Laser Disc player, DVD player on the Center or Station. You can also record the audio output to the music library in the hard disk of the Center.

On the additional device

 Connect one end of the audio cable (not supplied) to the AUDIO OUT terminals on the additional device





On the Center or Station

- Connect the other end of the audio cables to the AUX IN terminals on the Center or Station
- To playback audio output from the additional device, press SOURCE to select AUX mode on the Center or Station (see 10.External source)
- To record audio output to the Center's music library (hard disk), see 6.5 HD: Building music library on Center

Helpful hints:

- If the connected device has only a single audio out terminal, connect it to the AUX IN left terminal. Alternatively, you can use a "single to double" cinch cable, but the output sound still remains as mono.
- Always refer to the owner's manual of the other equipment for complete connection.

3.3.5 Connecting to an additional device with powerful speakers


To enjoy the sound effect brought by the powerful speakers on an external device, e.g. a mini Hi-Fi system, use red/white audio cables (not supplied) to connect the Center to the device

On the Center

 Connect the red plug of the red/white audio cable (not supplied) to the red socket LINE OUT R and the white plug to the white socket LINE OUT L

On the additional device

2 Connect the other end of the audio cable to the AUX IN terminals of the additional device



Select AUX mode on the connected additional device.

3.4 Using AC power

- Make sure that all connections have been made before switching on the power supply
- Connect the AC power cord to the wall socket. This switches on the power supply

When the Center or Station is switched to standby mode, they will still be consuming some power. To disconnect the system from the power supply completely, remove the power plug from the wall socket.

Helpful hint:


 Always press and hold STANDBY-ON to switch the set to power-saving mode before removing its power plug. The rating label of WACS7000 can be found on the rear of the set.

4.1 Setting clock

The time can be displayed in 24-hour or 12-hour format. You can set up your clock on either the Center or the Station.

On the Center or Station, press **MENU** to enter the menu screen.



Use the navigation controls ▲ or ▼ and ► to select Settings followed by Time



- To set clock time,
 - a. Press the navigation controls ▲ , ▼ or Numeric Keypad (0-9) and ► to select Set Time
 - → The display shows current clock setting (00:00 by default)
 - b. Press the navigation controls ▲ , ▼ or Numeric Keypad (0-9) repeatedly to set the hour followed by the minute.



c. Press OK to confirm the clock setting.

Helpful hints:

To change to 12-hour or 24-hour format

- In the Time menu, select Time Format (see the above Step 2)
- Press ▲ or ▼ and ▶ to select your option.
- The clock setting will not be saved when the set is disconnected from the power supply.



4.1.1 Viewing clock

Press and hold **VIEW** button for about 5 seconds.

→ Clock will be shown briefly on the display.

Helpful hint:

- In standby mode, you may press View button briefly to turn on the LCD backlight so as to view clock clearly.
- Reset clock if the power cord is plugged off.

4.2 Using the remote control

The WACS7000 is equipped with a 2-way remote control and a 1-way remote control. With the supplied remote control, you can operate either the Center or Station.


IMPORTANT!

- The 1-way remote control might not be able to operate the other wireless music systems from Philips (e.g.WACS700, WACS5). When that happens, please use the 2-way remote control.
- Always point the remote control directly towards the IR sensor on the Center or Station you wish to operate.
- First, select the source you wish to control by pressing one of the source select keys on the remote control (for example CDIMP3-CD, HD, SOURCE).
- Then select the desired function (for example ►/II, |◄◄ |►►I).


4.2.1 Inserting batteries into the remote control


2-way remote control

2 Insert 4 batteries (type R03 or AAA) into the remote control with the correct polarity as indicated by the "+" and "-" symbols inside the battery compartment






3 Replace the compartment door

CAUTION!

- Remove the batteries when they are exhausted or when the remote control will not be used for a long time.
- Do not use old and new or different types of batteries together.
- Batteries contain chemical substances, hence they should be disposed of properly.

4.2.2 Using 2-way remote control

You can choose to use the 2-way remote control to operate either the Center or the Station. Depending on the level of interference, you can also select your preferred operational mode: Enhanced mode or Normal mode.

Center (default): To operate the Center **Station**: To operate the Station

Enhanced Mode (default): This mode gives you better operational range (including distance and angle). Use this mode if there is no interference from a plasma TV nearby.

Normal mode: Choose this mode if there is interference from a plasma TV nearby which is distorting the display of the 2-way remote control.

Press and hold REFRESH until the Select Device screen appears on the display of the 2way remote control.





- Press the navigation controls ▲ or ▼ to select either the Station or Center, then press ▶ to confirm.
- ③ Press the navigation controls ▲ or ▼ to select Enhanced Mode or Normal Mode, then press ► to confirm.
- Press OK to confirm.


Helpful hints:

- Avoid placing the Center or Station near to a plasma TV.The interference may distort the display on your 2-way remote control.
- The status of the Center or Station will be synchronized onto the display of the 2-way remote control. With the synchronized display, it is easier to operate the remote control.
- The 2-way remote control with synchronized display consumes more power than other remote controls without a display screen. When the low battery icon (***III) appears on the display of the remote control, replace the batteries.
- If you switch on the Center or Station using the STANDBY-ON/ ECO POWER button on the set, press REFRESH on the remote control of the Center to synchronize the remote control display.
- The display of the 2-way remote control supports 6 European languages: English, French, Spanish, Dutch, Italian and German.

4.3 Using navigation controls

When selecting options on the set, you often need to use the navigation controls $\blacktriangleleft / \blacktriangleright / \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown$


- Press ▲ / ▼ to highlight an option.
- ② Enter its submenu by pressing ►
- 3 Press ◀ to return to the previous option list
- 4 Press OK or ▶ to confirm



4.4 Using alphanumeric keys

Use the alphanumeric keys to input letters or numbers.







5.2 Switching to power-saving mode

In power-saving mode, the set's display and Wi-Fi connection are turned off. The Center's hard disk also stops working. When the Center is switched to power-saving mode, you cannot stream music between the Center and Station or import music from the PC to Center.

- When the set is on, press and hold STANDBY-ON/ ECO POWER to switch it to powersaving mode (or press and hold ⁽¹⁾ on the remote control).
 - → The Red indicator lights up
 - → The display is switched off



- To switch on, press STANDBY-ON/ ECO POWER.
 - → The set switches to the last source selected

Helpful hints:


- In power-saving mode, the networking, sound, display, language, CD recording settings, the tuner presets, and the volume level (maximum: the moderate level) will be retained in the set's memory.
- To protect the hard disk, always switch the Center to standby/power-saving mode before removing its power plug from the wall outlet.

5.3 Auto-standby

When the set has reached the end of playback/ recording and remains in the stop position for more than 20 minutes, the set will switch to standby mode automatically to save power.

5.4 Volume control

- Check that playback has started
- 2 Adjust the volume with **VOL +/-** buttons
 - → Display shows the volume bar, indicating the volume level



5.5 MUTE

During playback, you can temporarily switch off the sound without switching off the set.

5.6.2 Bass adjustment


 Press DBB (Dynamic Bass Boost) once or more times to select your option: DBB OFF (by default), DBB 1, DBB 2 or DBB 3.

Helpful hint:

 Some discs might be recorded in high modulation, which causes a distortion at high volume. If this occurs, switch off DBB or reduce the volume.

5.6.3 Incredible surround

- Press INCR. SURROUND once or more times to toggle the surround sound effect on or off (or press INCR. SURR. on the 1-way remote control)
 - → Display shows IS ON or IS OFF



5.7 Display adjustment

You can adjust the backlight and contrast settings of the display.



You can preset a certain period of time after which the Center or Station will switch to standby mode..

 - → Display shows the selected option briefly and returns to its previous status. The icon Z^z appears.



6.1 Playing Hard Disk (HD)

Music is centrally stored in the 80GB hard disk on the WAC7000 Center. All the stored music can be streamed and played on the Station via Wi-Fi.

- Check that the set is switched on Station: also check that the Center is switched on or in standby mode (See 5.Basic functions)
- 2 Press **SOURCE** once or more times to select HD (or press **HD** on the remote control)
 - Display shows HD and the categories of your music library: Playlists, Artists, Albums, Genres, All tracks.



Playlists: collection of your favorite tracks sorted by the name of the playlists in alphanumeric order

Artists: collection of albums sorted by artist name in alphanumeric order

Albums: collection of albums sorted by album name in alphanumeric order

Genres: collection of albums sorted according to music style

All tracks: tracks sorted by track name in alphanumeric order

3 Press the navigation controls ▲ or ▼ and ▶ to select your option

- 4 Press ►II to start playback
- Press ►II on a highlighted artist, genre or album to start playback from the beginning of the item
 - → The playback screen appears:


on the top: HD

in the middle: current track name and some track information

at the bottom: elapsed playing time and total playing time



- **⑤** To pause playback, press ►II To resume playback, press the button again

6.2 Selecting and searching

6.2.1 Selecting a different option

- If necessary, press

 repeatedly to enter previous option lists
- Press the navigation controls ▲ or ▼ repeatedly and ▶ to select the option

6.2.2 Searching by keywords

The keyword should be the first letter or word of the title of the track you wish to search for. By inputting a keyword, you can quickly find all the items containing the word (note that it is case sensitive)







- When you recognize the passage you want, release ▲ or ▼ (or I◄◄ or ▶►) on the remote control)
 - → Normal playback resumes.



6.3 Different play modes: REPEAT, SHUFFLE

- plays the current track continuously
- repeats all the tracks (under current Artist, Genre or Album)
- repeats all the tracks (under current artist, genre or album) in random order
- tracks (under current artist, genre or album) are played in random order
- During playback, press REPEAT or/and SHUFFLE once or more times to select play modes
- To return to normal playback, press REPEAT or/and SHUFFLE repeatedly until the various modes are no longer displayed



6.4 SMART EQUALIZER

This function enables you to playback music of the current genre with the matched sound settings.


- During playback, press SMART EQUALIZER
 - → The icon 🕫 appears if SMART EQUALIZER is activated
- To deactivate SMART EQUALIZER, adjust the sound settings (DBB, Incr. Surr. or Equalizer)
 - → The icon 🕫 disappears

6.5 Building music library on the Center

You can build a music library in the hard disk of the Center by recording from CDs, importing from PC and recording from external sources.

- For CDs encoded with copyright protection technologies used by some record companies, recording will be restricted.
- The making of unauthorized copies of copy-protected material, including computer programmes, files, broadcasts and sound recordings, may be an infringement of copyrights and constitute a criminal offence. This equipment should not be used for such purposes.



6.5.1 Recording from CDs

With WAC7000 Center, you can record audio CD tracks from your CDs and store them as MP3 files in the Center's hard disk. The Gracenote® music recognition service enables your set to look up CD information (including album, artist, genre, track information) from its database. It allows the recorded CD tracks to be properly categorized (for example, under Artists, Albums, Genres or All tracks) and also merged with the existing tracks in the hard disk. To update your Gracenote® music recognition service database, see the manual Connect to your PC.





To record from CD at fast speed (for audio CDs, MP3/WMA CDs)

• Insert a CD into the CD loader on the Center, with the graphic printed side of the CD facing you.



- → Display shows: Reading CD
- → List of tracks appears.
- If it is an MP3/WMA CD, a list of file folders appears. Press ▶ on a highlighted file folder to enter the track list.

To record from CD during playback (for audio CDs only)

- During playback, press RECORD
 - → Recording and playback start from the current track
 - → Display shows CD-Rec and the current album name

- 2 Change the recording speed:
 - a. Press MENU
 - **b.** Use the navigation controls **△** or **▼** and **▶** to enter Settings menu

 - **d.** Press ▲ or ▼ and ▶ select Normal speed

Helbful hints:

6.5.2 Importing from PC

The Wireless Audio Device Manager (WADM) in the by-packed PC installer helps you organize music files on your PC and import them into the WAC7000 Center: For details, see the manual Connect to your PC.

6.5.3 Recording from Radio or external source

A maximum recording time of 3-hours can be made from the radio or external source.

In Radio mode, tune to the desired radio station (see 8.1 FM radio:Tuning to radio stations).

or

In AUX mode, start playback from the external source

 - → Recording starts

- Press STOP/ to stop recording
 - → The recording will be saved as a file under RADIO or AUX in Albums. A file name is assigned, e.g. Radio_xx, or Aux_xx (where xx denotes a number)



6.9 Backup Your Music Content On Your PC

The Wireless Audio Device Manager (WADM) in the by-packed PC Suite CD allows you to backup contents on the HD to your PC. The backup files on your PC can be subsequently restored to the Center if the files on the HD are lost or corrupted. For details, see the manual Connect to your PC.

6.10 Moving music playback between Center and Stations

You can connect up to 5 Stations to the Center via Wi-Fi network. Via Wi-Fi, music playback can be moved between the Center and Stations. Even in different parts of your home, you and your family will still be able to enjoy and share music with ease.

6.10.1 MUSIC FOLLOWS ME

As you move around at home, let the music move with you between the Center and Station or between Stations.

On the source unit (Center or Station) where music is playing:

In HD source, select and play the album or playlist you wish to play on the destination unit (see 6.2 HD: Selecting and searching)

Helpful hints:

- Press > II to interrupt playback if you want the playback to continue from where it has paused on the destination unit.
- The selected play modes (e.g. will be retained on the destination unit (see 6.3 Different play modes: REPEAT, SHUFFLE).
- Press MUSIC FOLLOWS ME to activate
 - → The icon 🖨 appears

Helpful hints:

- MUSIC FOLLOWS ME will be automatically deactivated if you do not activate MUSIC FOLLOWS ME on the destination unit within 5 minutes

- Press MUSIC BROADCAST to activate

To stop MUSIC BROADCAST, press STOP ■ on the Center

After completed editing Genre name, the LCD will shows "Updating..." first and then "Update success" (if succeed) or "System busy, please edit later" (if failed).



- For DRM protected WMA files, use Windows Media Player 10 (or later) for CD burning/ conversion. Visit www. microsoft.com for details about Windows Media Player and WM DRM (Windows Media Digital Rights Management).

7.2 Playing discs

- Insert a CD into the CD loader on the Center with the graphic printed side of the CD facing you.
 - → Display shows: Reading CD
 - → Audio CD: the list of tracks appears (track information will appear if it is available from the Gracenote Music Recognition Service database)
 - → MP3/WMA CD: the list of albums appears.



Helpful hints:


- "Others" is displayed if you have not organized your MP3/WMA files into any albums on your disc.
- "CDDA" is displayed if the disc contains both Audio CD tracks and MP3/WMA files.
- "All tracks" is displayed for a MP3/WMA CD
- 2 Press the navigation controls ▲ or ▼ and ▶ to select your option
- 3 Press ► II to start playback
- MP3/WMA CD: Press ► II on a highlighted album to start playback of the album
- MP3/WMA CD: Press ► II on All tracks to start playback of all the tracks on the disc
- To pause playback, press ► II. To resume playback, press the button again.
- 5 To stop playback, press STOP ■
- **6** To remove the disc, press **EJECT** on the Center

7. CD (on the Center only)

7.3 Selecting and searching

7.3.1 Selecting a different option


- Press the navigation controls ▲ or ▼ and ► repeatedly to select the option
- Press VIEW to return to the playback screen, if necessary



7.3.2 Searching by keywords

The keyword should be the first letter or word of the title of the track you wish to search for. By inputting a keyword, you can quickly find all the items containing the word (note that it is case sensitive)

- Use the navigation controls ◀/▶/▲/▼ to enter the desired option list of tracks, albums, artists or playlists
- ② On the remote control, press **SEARCH**→ A text box appears on the display



- Use the alphanumeric keys to enter the keywords (maximum 8 characters) (see 4.4 Preparation: Using Alphanumeric Keys)
- Press OK to start searching
 - → Display shows: Searching ... Searching starts from the beginning of the current option list
 - → The matched items appear at the top of the list

- → The option list remains unchanged if no match is found. Searching ... disappears
- **⑤** Press **STOP** to stop searching

Helpful hints:

- The searching will also stop when:
 - you select another source
 - you switch off the set
- If no match is found during the keyword search, press /◄◄ or ►►! on the remote control to find close matches.

7.3.3 Selecting a track in the current album during playback

• In the playback screen, press the navigation controls ▲ or ▼ briefly and repeatedly to select previous or next tracks (or I◄◄ or ▶►I on the remote control)

7.3.4 Finding a passage within the current track during playback

- In the playback screen, press and hold the navigation controls ▲ or ▼ (or I◄◀ or ▶►I on the remote control)
 - → The CD plays at a high speed
- When you recognize the passage you want, release ▲ or ▼ (or I◄◄ or ▶►I on the remote control)
 - → Normal playback resumes.

7.4 Different play modes: REPEAT, SHUFFLE

FIFE – plays the current track continuously

- repeats all the tracks (under current Album)

- repeats all the tracks (under current album) in random order





8.1 Tuning to radio stations

- Oconnect the supplied FM wire antenna to the Center and Station (see 3.Installation)
- ② Check that the set is switched on or in standby mode (see **5.Basic functions**)
- 3 Press **SOURCE** once or more times to select Radio
 - Playback screen appears. Display shows: Radio, the radio station frequency and a preset number (if already programmed)
- Press and hold ▲ or ▼ until the frequency in the display starts running.



- → The radio automatically tunes to a station of sufficient reception. Display shows Searching during automatic tuning
- → If a station is received in stereo. (is shown
- → When you are receiving an RDS station, **o** is shown
- S Repeat Step 3 if necessary until you find the desired radio station
- To tune to a weak station, press ▲ or ▼ briefly and repeatedly until optimal reception is detected.



8.2 Storing preset radio stations

You can store up to 60 preset radio stations in the memory.


8.2.1 Autostore: automatic programming


Autostore automatically starts programming radio stations from Preset 1. Available stations are programmed in the order of radio frequencies: RDS stations followed by FM stations. A maximum of 10 RDS stations will be stored (from Preset 01 to Preset 10).

- To select Autostore radio,
 - a. Press MENU
 - **b.** Use the navigation controls **△** or **▼** and **▶** to select Autostore radio
 - → Display shows: Autostore Please wait...
 - After all the stations are stored, the first autostored preset station will then play automatically.

8.2.2 Manual programming

- Tune to your desired radio station (see 8.1 Tuning to radio stations).
- Press **PROGRAM** on the remote control.The display shows:







- On the Center or Station, press ▲ or ▼ or the Numeric Keypad (0-9) to select your desired preset number.

8.2.3 To listen to a preset station

- Press to enter the list of preset stations
- Use the navigation controls ▲ or ▼ followed by
 to select the desired station.



8.3 RDS

RDS (**R**adio **D**ata **S**ystem) is a service that allows FM stations to send additional information along with FM radio signal.

- Tune to the desired RDS radio station (see **8.2.1** Autostore: automatic programming).
 - → The display shows the following information (if available):
 - name of the radio station
 - radio frequency
 - program type (for example: News, Pop Music)
 - RDS radio text



8.4 NEWS

You can activate NEWS while listening to HD, CD, USB, UPnP, AUX or PORTABLE source on WACS7000. The set will tune to the news radio station if the related signals are received from a RDS station.

8.4.1 Activating NEWS

 During playback in HD, CD, USB, UPnP, AUX or PORTABLE source, press RDS/NEWS on the remote control.



- → The icon appears and NEWS ON is displayed briefly
- → Playback continues when the set scans the first 10 preset stations
- → When news transmission is detected, the set will switch to the news station. The icon starts flashing

Helpful hints:

- Make sure that you have stored RDS stations in the first 10 preset locations (see 8.2.1 Autostore: automatic programming).
- If no news transmission is detected during the scanning of the set, the icon disappears and NO RDS NEWS is displayed.

8.4.2 Deactivating NEWS

- Press RDS/NEWS again on the remote control.
- Switch the set to Radio source
 - → The icon disappears and NEWS OFF is displayed briefly.

9.1 UPnP (Universal Plug and Play)

UPnP is a standard which connects multiple devices with each other and enables them to work seamlessly.

For those users who are familiar with UPnPenabled devices, WACS7000 brings additional benefits to enrich wireless music streaming experience.

For those who are not so familiar with UPnP-enabled devices, please visit www.upnp.org for details.

9.1.1 About UPnP*

In addition to the music library in the Center, an UPnP-enabled device can also serve as a music library.

The music collection on the UPnP-enabled device can be played on the Center or Station, wirelessly or through an Ethernet cable (supplied).

You can also play the Center's music library on the UPnP-enabled device. Thus expanding your home music network.

*Universal Plug and Play (UPnP™) builds on standard networking technologies and provides standardized protocols for a wide variety of home and small business devices. It allows easy interoperability of all the devices supporting the networking technologies.

9.1.2 About the UPnP-enabled device

The UPnP device can be a PC or other devices running UPnP software. To use the UPnP device with the Center or Station,

- Connect the Center or Station to the UPnP device's network (see 9.2 Connecting to the UPnP device)
- To play the music library of your UPnP device on the Center or Station, check that the UPnP server software is properly installed and enabled on the device (e.g. Philips Media Manager in the by-packed PC Suite CD, Window Media Connect[®])
- To play the Center's music library on the UPnP device, check that the UPnP device is able to receive music from other UPnP-enabled devices

9.2 Connecting to the UPnP device

When connecting to the UPnP device's network, you have the following options:

- Connect wirelessly or through an Ethernet cableConnect both the Center and Station, Center
- only or Station only
 For more information on the connection, see 11
 Network setting: Connecting to external Wi-Fi

network and Connecting to external wired network.



Important:

 It may take a longer time to connect other UPnP clients to Philips Wireless Music Center than to connect a Philips Wireless Music Station to Philips Wireless Music Center.

9.2 UPnP playback

Important:

 You can only stream music files in MP3 orWMA format when WACS7000 is in UPnP mode. You cannot stream video or picture contents.


During UPnP playback, some playback features in the Wi-Fi network on the Center will be unavailable, including Music Broadcast, Music Follows Me, Same Artist, Same Genre, Creating/ Deleting Playlist and recording.

9.3.2 Playing music from the UPnP device

- Check that the UPnP device is switched on.
 Switch off the firewall running on the UPnPenabled PC during UPnP playback
- 2 Check that the Center or Station is connected to the UPnP device's network (see 11.5 Network setting: Viewing connection status)
- 3 On the Center or Station, press **SOURCE** on the remote control to select UPnP mode
 - → The display on the set shows a list of connected UPnP devices (up to 4 UPnP devices).

9. UPnP

→ Server not found appears if there is no UPnP device found in the network



Important:

- If you cannot find your desired UPnP server on the network, please refresh Center's UPnP mode by going to other mode (press SOURCE key).
- 4 Use the navigation controls ▲ or ▼ and ► to select your desired UPnP device
 - → The music library of the UPnP device appears on the Center or Station as it does on the UPnP device
- On the Center or Station, play UPnP device's music library in the same way as you play Hard Disk (HD) (see 6.HD).



9.3.2 Playing music from Center

- Check that the Center is switched on or already in standby mode.
- 2 Check that the UPnP device is connected to the Center (see 11.5 Network setting: Viewing connection status)
 - → The Center's music library appears on the UPnP enabled device as it does on the Center
- 3 Use the function keys on the UPnP device to play Center's music library

10.1 Playing or recording to USB mass storage device

You can playback music from a USB mass storage device on the Center or Station. You can also transfer the music library in the Center to a USB mass storage device so that you can carry your favourite music with you wherever you go.

10.1.1 About the USB device

Compatible USB mass storage devices:

The following devices can be used on the Center or Station:

- USB flash memory (USB 2.0 or USB1.1)
- USB flash players (USB 2.0 or USB1.1)
- Memory cards (requires an additional card reader to work with the Center or Station)

IMPORTANT!

- In some USB flash players (or memory devices), the stored contents are recorded using copyright protection technology. Such protected contents cannot be played on any other devices (such as the Center/Station).
- MTP (Media Transfer Protocol) USB devices are not supported.

Supported formats:

- USB or memory file format FAT12, FAT16,
 FAT32 (sector size: 512 65,536 bytes)
- MP3 bit rate (data rate): 32-320 Kbps and variable bit rate
- -WMA v9 or earlier versions
- Directory nesting up to a maximum of 8 levels
- Number of albums/folders: maximum 99
- Number of tracks/titles: maximum 999
- File name in Uicode UTF8 (maximum length: 256 bytes)

The Center or Station will not play or support the following:

- Empty albums: an empty album is an album that does not contain any MP3/WMA files, and hence will not be shown on the display.
- Non-supported file formats are skipped. This means that e.g., Word documents or MP3 files with .doc and .dlf extension are ignored and will not be played.

- WAV. PCM audio files
- DRM protected WMA files
- -WMA files in Lossless format and VBR format

How to transfer music files from your PC to a USB mass storage device


You can easily transfer your favorite music from your PC to a USB mass storage device just by dragging and dropping your music files.

For a flash player, you will be able to use its music management software for the music transfer. However, WMA files cannot be played due to compatibility reasons.

How to organize your MP3/WMA files on the USB mass storage device

The Center or Station will browse MP3/WMA files in the same way as the Center reads a CD. Example

Organize your MP3/WMA files in different folders or sub-folders as needed.

Helpful hints:

- "Others" is shown as an album if you have not organized your MP3/WMA files into any albums on your disc.
- Make sure that the file names of MP3 files end with .mp3. and the file names of WMA files end with wma
- For DRM protected WMA files, use Windows Media Player 10 (or later) for CD burning/ conversion. Visit www.microsoft.com for details about Windows Media Player and WM DRM (Windows Media Digital Rights Management)

10.1.2 Playing music from the USB

- Check that the USB device is properly connected to the Center or Station (see 3.3.2 Installation: Connecting a USB mass storage device)
- Press SOURCE once or more times to select USB
 - → The screen shows "USB direct"
 - No USB Device Present appears if the USB device is not supported by the Center or Station
 - File system not supported appears if unsupported file formats are used on the USB device



- → Empty Folder appears if no audio file is found on the USB device
- 3 Play audio files on the USB as you do with the albums/tracks on a CD (see **7.CD**).

Helpful hint:

 Due to compatibility reasons, the album/track information may differ from what will be displayed through the flash player's music management software.

10.1.3 Transferring music to the USB device

IMPORTANT!

- Recording is permitted only if there is no infringement of copyrights or any other rights of third parties.
- For CDs encoded with copyright protection technologies used by some record companies, recording will be restricted.
- -The making of unauthorized copies of copy-protected material, including computer programmes, files, broadcasts and sound recordings, may be an infringement of copyrights and constitute a criminal offence. This equipment should not be used for such purposes.
- Check that the USB device is properly connected to the Center.
- On the Center, press SOURCE once or more times to select HD (or press HD on the remote control).
 - If it is in **HD** playing mode, press **STOP** to stop playing



③ Press the navigation controls ▲ or ▼ and ► to select your option and enter its corresponding list of tracks (if necessary)

4 In the track list screen, press **RECORD** (or press **REC** on the remote control)

→ The list of tracks appears.



- § Press MARK•UNMARK to select or deselect the tracks to be recorded.
- To select/deselect all tracks, press and hold MARK• UNMARK.



Helpful hint:

- Press RECORD to start recording
 The display shows transferring ...The number of tracks transferred/to be transferred appears
 - → Selected tracks are transferred to the USB device.



Press STOP ■ to stop recording

Helpful hints:

Recording will also stop when:

- the USB device is unplugged and the display shows Connection interrupt, Cancel transfer...
- the USB device has more than 99 folders and 999 titles and the display shows Device is full, Cancel transferring...

To find the transferred tracks on your USB device

All the transferred tracks are saved under the Music folder. They are named as XX-YY.mp3 (where XX denotes track number and YY denotes track name) and are located under folders and sub-folders in the same way as they are located under the genre, artist and album in the Center's hard disk.

To play the transferred tracks on other music players

You can play the transferred tracks on music players supporting USB playback. On different players, the files/folders may be browsed in different ways.

Helpful hint:

 DRM protected files might not play if they are transferred to the USB device.

10.2 Playing a portable hard disk audio player

You can enjoy the music library on your portable hard disk player via WACS7000's sophisticated speaker system.

- Check that the portable hard disk audio player is properly connected to the Center or Station (see 3.3.3 Installation: Connecting to a portable hard disk audio player)
- Check that the Center or Station is switched on or is already in standby mode (see **5.Basic functions**)

Press PORTABLE on the 2-way remote control.



- → The display on the 2-way remote control shows Portable Player mode; to change mode press other Source keys.
- External hard disk audio player:
 - **a.** turn down the volume to avoid noise distortion
 - b. press the PLAY key to start playback
- To adjust the volume, press VOL+/- on the 2way remote control or use the sound controls on your external device

Helpful hint:

 For the 2-way remote control to exit the Portable Player mode, press REFRESH or the source buttons (e.g. CD/MP3-CD, HD, SOURCE).

10.3 Playing other external sources

It is possible to play from an external source on the Center or Station after connecting the audio output, e.g.TV,VCR, Laser Disc player, DVD player. You can also record the audio output to the music library in the hard disk of the Center.

- Check that the external device is properly connected (see 3.3.4 Installation: Connecting other additional devices)
- 2 Check that the Center or Station is switched on or is already in standby mode (see **5.Basic functions**).
- On the Center or Station: press SOURCE once or more times to select AUX.
- 4 External hard disk audio player:
 - **a.** turn down the volume to avoid noise distortion.
 - b. press the PLAY key to start playback.

To adjust the sound and volume, use the sound controls on your external device or on WACS7000.

You can add WACS7000 Center and/or Station to your existing home network. Set your network according to your needs as follows:



11.1 Adding Additional Station to the Center

Up to 5 Stations can be connected to the WAC7000 Center: When adding a Station to the Center's Wi-Fi network, you can play the Center's music library on the Station or move music playback between the Center and Stations (see **6.HD**). To add a Station to the Center's Wi-Fi network, proceed as follows:

On the Center

- Check that WAC7000 Center is in HD source
- Select Add New Station
 - a. Press **MENU** to enter the menu screen
 - **b.** Press the navigation controls **△** or **▼** and **▶** to enter Station Mgnt menu
 - c. Press ▲ or ▼ and ▶ to select Add New Station
 - → You will enter Installation Mode. Searching for the new station starts
 - → Playback stops on the previously associated Station if you are playing the HD source



Helpful hints:

 If there are 5 stations connected, Add New Station option will not present. In this case, please delete a station first, and then to add new stations





11.3 Connecting to external wired network

The external wired network can be a single PC, a PC network another Center or Station

Both the Center and Station can access the wired and wireless network at the same time. Using the supplied Ethernet cable, you can connect the Center or a Station separately to a wired network while maintaining its Wi-Fi connection (e.g. the Wi-Fi connection between the Center and Stations or the Wi-Fi connection with an external network). In this way, you can play the wired network's music library only on the Center or on a single Station (UPnP playback). At the same time, you can still enjoy all the music playback features on the Wi-Fi network.

Helpful hint:

 For some wired routers, a "Cross Link" Ethernet cable should be used instead of the normal "Straight"
 Orange cable provided in the box.

11.3.1 Network setting on Center

- Check that the network device is switched on and the firewall (if applicable) is switched off.
- 2 Connect the supplied Ethernet cable to the Ethernet ports on the network device and the Center
- On the Center search for networks
 - a. Press **MENU** to enter the menu screen
 - b. Press the navigation controls ▲ or ▼ and ▶ to enter Settings, followed by Network and Wired
 - c. Press ▶ to continue.



- WACS7000 cannot shadow the IP of the network device that is not activated. Please be careful of the IP address setting to avoid IP address conflict between the wired and Wi-Fi ports.

11.5 Viewing connection status

11.5.1 Viewing Station status on the Center's Wi-Fi network

- Check that the Center is in HD source
- Select Station Status
 - a. Press **MENU** to enter the menu screen
 - **b.** Press the navigation controls **△** or **▼** and **▶** to enter Station Mgnt menu
 - c. Press ▲ or ▼ and ▶ to select Station Status
 - → A list of connected Stations or previously connected Stations is displayed on the Center.



3 Press ▶ to view the connection information.

11.5.2 Viewing the connection with external network

- Check that the Center or Station is in HD sourceCheck that the Center or Station is in HD source
- 2 Select Information on the Center or Station
 - a. Press **MENU** to enter the menu screen

12. Gracenote CD Information

The Gracenote music recognition service enables the set to look up CD track information (including album, artist, genre, track information) from its built-in database. It allows the recorded CD tracks to be properly categorized (for example, under Artists, Albums, Genres or All tracks) and also be merged with the existing tracks in the hard disk.

12.1 Gracenote music recognition database

A 800 MB CD database (contains 800,000 most popular CDs) is embedded in every WACS7000 Center for quick look-up on track information. An update file that contains newly released CDs is available quarterly on www.club.philips.com for download.

12.1.1 To update Gracenote music recognition database

- Use your PC to register your product on www.club.philips.com and go to "Show Upgrades & Support" page to download Gracenote Music recognition database update. Note that the updates are posted quarterly and each update is independent of each other, i.e. a later update could be installed without an earlier update.
- After storing the file on your PC, you can either burn a CD with the update file using your favorite CD burning software and drop the CD into the WACS7000 Center for automatic update, or you can use WADM's Gracenote update option if you have connected your PC to WACS7000 Center.


12.2 Gracenote Internet Query

If the CD track information of your new CD disc cannot be displayed on the WACS7000, the quickest and surest solution is to look it up from the internet by following steps below.

12.2.1 Connecting to the Internet

Check that you have connected the Center to an Access Point or Router with Internet access or connect the Center to an ADSL modem with internet access directly

Connect to Internet for Gracenote Internet services



Helpful hint:

- Make sure that no dial-up, user name or password is required for the Internet access.
- Set DNS and Gateway
- If you are using a DHCP* enabled Access Point, Router or ADSL modem, the DNS and Gateway can be got automatically, so you need only to set the Center to Automatic (DHCP) mode by following steps below:

*DHCP stands for **D**ynamic **H**ost **C**onfiguration **P**rotocol. It is a protocol for assigning dynamic IP addresses to devices on a network.

- a. Press MENU
- b. Press ▲ or ▼ and ▶ to select Settings
 → Network → Wired
- c. Press ▶ to continue
- **d.** Press ▲ or ▼ and ▶ to select **Automatic** (**DHCP**).
- If there is no DHCP, set the DNS and Gateway manually by following steps below:

On your PC, carry out the following steps:

- a. Click Start > Run
- b. Type cmd and click OK
- c. Type ipconfig/all



d. Write down the DNS and Gateway of the current connection

12.2.2 Looking up CD track information

When the internet connection is made, insert the CD disc that you want to look for its information into the CD loader on the Center: Searching start immediately. It will search from local Gracenote CD database firstly. If can't find the CD track information, online searching will then start. The searching results will be shown on the Center's display,

Helpful hint:

If the internet query failed due to failure in internet connection, the error message " **Check the internet setup for CD Database on-line**" will appear. Check if your internet connection is correct (see 12.2.1 above)

13. Firmware Upgrade

13.1 Upgrading firmware

The supplied PC Installer CD Wireless Audio Device Manager (WADM) helps you get the upgrades for WACS7000 Center and Station.

- Register your Philips Wireless Music Center with www.club.philips.com
- 2 Download the firmware upgrade files and store them on your PC
- Place Center and Station(s) side by side on a flat and firm surface
- Connect Center and Station(s) to power supply
 - → HD screen appears on Center
 - → HD screen appears on Station(s) when the Station is connected to Center
- Connect **Center** to your PC via the supplied ethernet cable.
- Install and lauch WADM (see Connect to your PC section B)



- Olick to enter the Firmware upgrade sub-menu
- As prompted, click **Browse** and indicate the location where you kept the firmware upgrade files on PC
- Olick Apply to start upgrading firmware

On Philips Wireless Music Center:

- → The display shows "Updating firmware, please wait..."
- → **Center** will reboot itself during the installation process
- → When Center returns to HD screen, the installation is completed

Then, on Philips Wireless Music Station:

- → Installation starts automatically
- → When **Station** returns to **HD** screen, the installation is completed

IMPORTANT!

- On Philips Wireless Music Center/Station:

 - **a.** Remove the power plug of Stations and then, connect them to the power supply again
 - → Connecting to Center appears
 - b. On the remote control, press MENU to enter the selection screen of Installation Mode and Select Server
 - c. Press the navigation controls ▲ or ▼ and ▶ to enter Installation Mode
 - → The Stations start to connect Center
- ③ Press STOP on Ce;nter when all the Stations are found

14.1 Reset

If desired, you can restore the Center or Station to their default settings (including the network settings).

Helpful hint:

Restoring to default settings does not delete any stored music tracks

When to reset the Center or Station:

- Resetting the Center or Station helps to reestablish the Wi-Fi connection between the Center and Station.
- Change the way the Center or Station connects to an external Wi-Fi/wired network.
- Check that the set is switched on (see 5.Basic functions).
- 2 Press **MENU** to enter the menu screen
- 3 Press the navigation controls ▲ or ▼ and ▶ to enter Settings followed by Restore settings.



- 4 Press ➤ to select Yes
 - → The set is rebooted. Language selection screen appears.
- Select your desired language: English, Français, Español, Nederlands, Italiano or Deutsch
 - → The set enters Installation Mode
 - → The search for Center or Stations starts. The Wi-Fi connection is being re-established

If the Center is reset and Stations are not reset:

- On the Stations, enter Installation Mode
 - **a.** Remove the power plug of the Stations and connect them to the power supply again
 - → Connecting to Center appears
 - **b.** On the remote control, press **MENU** to enter Installation Mode
 - Press the navigation controls ▲ or ▼ and ► to enter Installation Mode
 - → The Stations start to connect to the Center

If a Station is reset and the Center is not:

- On the Center, select HD mode and enter Installation Mode
 - a. Press **MENU** to enter the menu screen
 - **b.** Press the navigation controls **△** or **▼** and **►** to enter Station Mgnt menu
 - **c.** Press **△** or **▼** and **▶** to select Add New Station
 - → Searching for Stations starts

If both the Center and Stations are reset:

- 8 Select language and then enter installation mode.
- Press STOP on the Center when all the Stations are found.

Helpful hint:

 After restoration to default settings, the network mode will go back to Ad-Hoc mode.

WARNING

Never try to repair the system yourself as this will invalidate the warranty. Do not open the system as there is a risk of electric shock.

If a fault occurs, first check the points listed below before taking the system for repair. If you are unable to resolve a problem by following these hints, consult your dealer or Philips for help.

Problem Solution

During the first-time setup, the display on the Station shows "Searching for Center".

- ✓ Check that you have placed the Center and Station side by side on a flat and firm surface.
- Check that you have connected the Center to the power supply.
- When adding a new station, check that the center is in Installation mode (see 11.1 Network setting: Adding Additional Station to the Wi-Fi network on the Center).
- Turn off the wireless Access Point nearby if you encounter difficulty connecting the Center and Station.

I get interference on my wireless (Wi-Fi) link between the Center and Station.

The WACS7000 operates in the 2.4GHz radio frequency spectrum. Many other household/IT devices also operate in this frequency spectrum, for example: microwave ovens, Dect phones, bluetooth devices like bluetooth headphones, computer mouse, wireless routers, cordless phones, Wi-Fi compatible printers, PDAs. These devices can interfere with the Wi-Fi link between the Center and Station, resulting in interference such as pause during playback, slow response to your operation, etc. The severity of interference varies depending on the extent of radiation from the device and the strength of Wi-Fi signals in that position.

If you are playing the set, stop playback and take the appropriate measures as follows:

- ✓ Keep the Center or Station at least 3 meters away from such devices.
- ✓ Use the WEP/WPA key when connecting the Center and Station to an existing wireless PC network. To set WEP/WPA key, connect Center/Station to your PC using Philips Wireless Audio Device Manager (WADM) in the by-packed PC Suite CD. In WADM's Device configuration, enter the Wireless Network sub-menu, and in Device Wireless Authentication Type, select WEP or WPA.
- Change the operating channel of the Center and Station when connecting them to an existing wireless PC network. To change channels, connect the Center/Station to your PC using Philips Wireless Audio Device Manager (WADM) in the by-packed PC Suite CD. In WADM's Device configuration, enter the SSID of your Wireless Network, and select Ad-hoc mode. See the manual Connect to your PC and the WADM help file.
- ✓ If possible, change the operating channels of the other Wi-Fi devices at your home.
- ✓ Turn the devices in different directions to minimize interference.

 Keep the Center or Station at least 1 meter away from your PC.

- How do I mount the Center or Station onto walls?
- Use the by-packed wall mounting kits. It is recommended that you get a qualified personnel to fix the mounting brackets safely onto your walls before you mount the Center or Station. For details, refer to Appendix: How to mount your Center or Station onto Walls.

2-way remote control cannot work on the Center (2-way remote control entered PORTABLE mode, while the Center is powered off.) Adjust Center to AUX mode manually by pressing SOURCE.

Some WADM functions cannot be used

Press PORTABLE on the remote control again to exit PORTABLE mode.

I edited ID3 tags in WADM, but the screen does not show the updated ID3 tags. What shall I do?

- Your anti-virus software might affect the running of the WADM. Turn off your anti-virus software temporarily.
- ✓ Go to File>Refresh Content to refresh the WADM.
- ✔ Restart WADM.

Problem Solution

Backup function cannot work anymore.

This is because the previously backed up file was deleted in Windows explorer. Never delete the file this way. If you want to delete the back up file, please use WADM to manage. If the backup file is accidently deleted, please find out the file named YOURMAC.inx by using your Explorer's search tool and then delete it. Only after that you can do backup again.

I have problem installing WADM or after installation, I cannot launch WADM

- Please make sure your Operating System is either Windows 2000 with service pack 4 and above, or Windows XP.
- ✔ Please check if your PC has virus.
- ✓ Please make sure your PC has Microsoft Windows Media Player installed.

Upgrading Station wirelessly failed.

- ✓ Upgrade the Station via ethernet cable following steps below:
 - Connect the Station to your PC via the supplied ethernet cable and power on the Station.
 - 2. Download the firmware upgrade file specified for station.
 - 3. Launch WADM and click Firmware upgrade.
 - 4. Follow the on-screen information to complete the rest steps.

Problem Solution

I have done all the steps described in Connect to PC guide to connect my WACS7000 to my home wireless network, but the Center and Station are still not connected to each other.

- ✓ On the center, please go to Menu ->
 Information -> Wireless -> Status, check that
 the Center has been changed from Ad-Hoc to
 Infrastructure mode, also check that the SSID,
 WEP key or WPA key matches the setup of
 your wireless home network. Please do the
 same on the station.
- Try to change the SSID on your router to a more unique name if it is too generic, as your neighbors might be using a router with the same SSID.
- WACS7000 supports wireless and wired connection at the same time. There is a chance that your wireless IP address and wired IP address are on the same subnet and this will confuse WACS7000. Suggest to change the DHCP range of your wireless router so that the wireless IP received by WACS7000 is on a different subnet from its wired IP.
- You may have forgotten to set up the wireless network settings on the station. If you have not done so, please follow C1 in Connect to PC Guide on how to set up the Station to join the network.
- ✓ Try to change the channel of your home network settings in the router:
- On your router, suggest to use WPA key instead of WEP key. When using WEP as your encryption key, please set all 4 keys to be the same.
- Make sure that the Turbo mode of your wireless router is switched off, if your router is has this function.
- ✔ Please go to Menu->Network->Internet to check if your DNS server is correctly set up. Also make sure that you have set up proxy server if your home wireless network needs a proxy server for internet connection.
- There is a chance that you are already successfully connected to Gracenote online, but your CD is not in their database.

I see the message "Check the internet setup for CD Database on-line" even though I am sure that the WACS7000 is connected to my home wireless network with internet connection.




- To find a suitable location for mounting, try the necessary rear connections and the Wi-Fi connection between the Center and Station (see 3.Installation).

 - according to the materials of your walls, decide what type of screws you need to fix the mounting brackets that is able to withstand the weight of a Center or Station;
