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# 1 Important

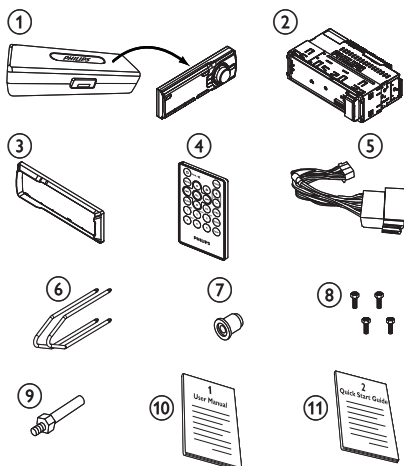

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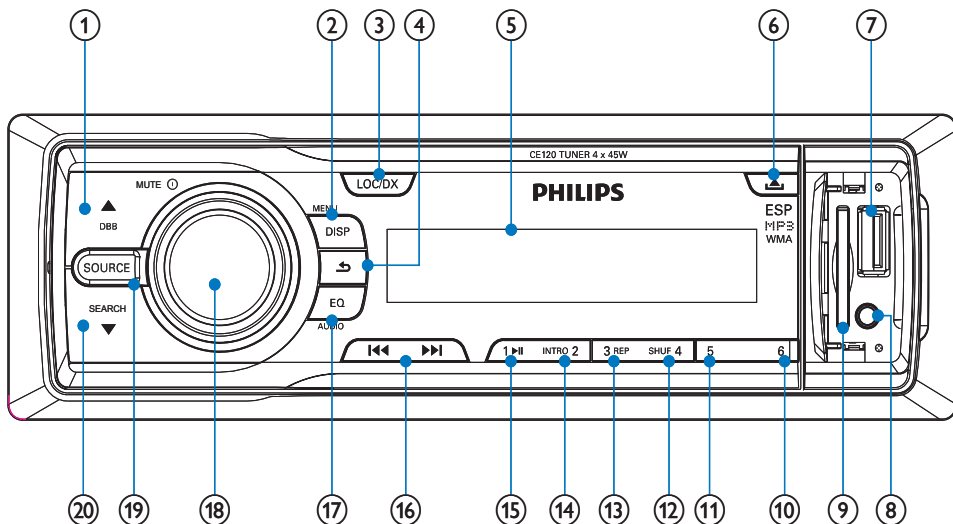

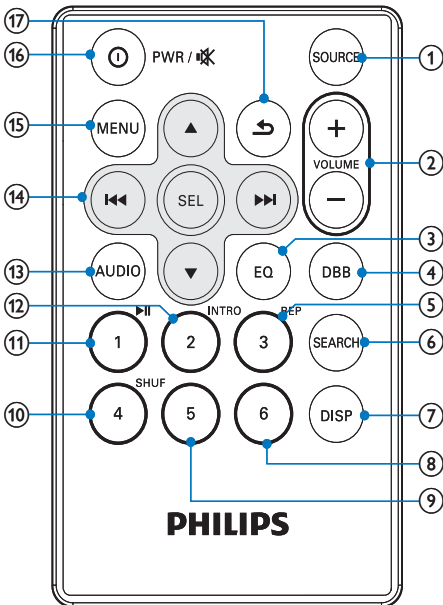

## Install the car audio

These instructions are for a typical installation. However, if your car has different requirements, make the corresponding adjustment. If you have any questions regarding installation kits, consult your Philips car audio dealer.

## ! Caution

- This unit is designed for negative ground (earth) 12 V DC operation only.
- Always install this unit in the car dashboard. Other locations can be dangerous as the rear of the unit heats up during use.
- To avoid short-circuit: before you connect, ensure that the ignition is off.
- Ensure that you connect the yellow and red power supply leads after all other leads are connected.
- Ensure that all loose leads are insulated with electrical tape.
- Ensure that the leads do not get caught under screws or in parts that will move (e.g. seat rail).
- Ensure that all ground (earth) leads are run to a common ground (earth) point.
- Use only the supplied mounting hardware for a safe and secure installation.
- Improper fuses can cause damage or fire. When you need to change the fuse, consult a professional.

**Note on the power supply lead (yellow)**

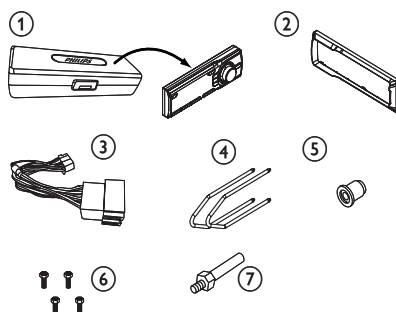
- When you connect other devices to this unit, ensure that the rating of the car circuit is higher than the total fuse value of all the connected devices.

## Notes on speaker connection

- Never connect speaker wires to the metal body or chassis of the car.
- Never connect speaker wires with stripes to one another.

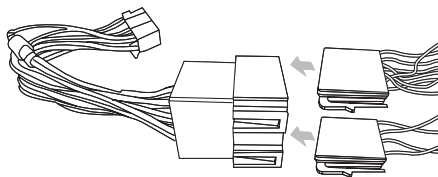

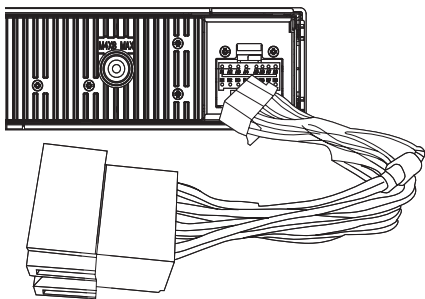

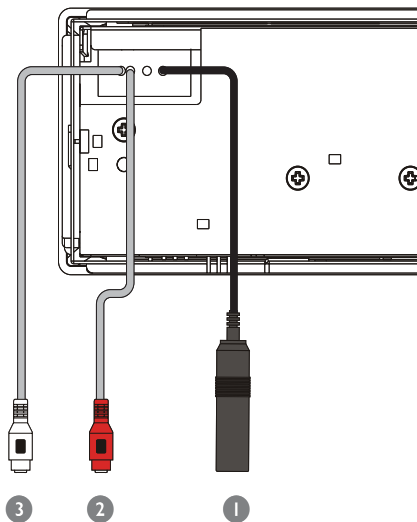
- 1 Pull out the ISO connectors from car dashboard and connect them to the bigger end of the supplied standard connector.



- 2 Connect the other end of the supplied standard connector to the unit.



- 3 Connect the antenna and amplifier as illustrated, if applicable.



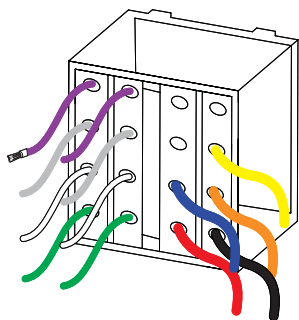

## Connect wires: without ISO connectors

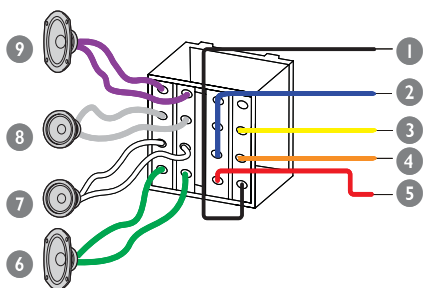
### ! Caution

- Ensure that all loose leads are insulated with electrical tape.

- 1 Cut off the bigger end of the supplied standard connector.

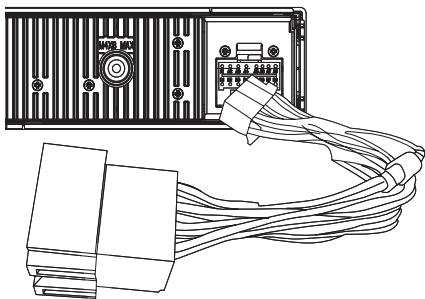


- 2 Check the car's wiring carefully and connect them to the supplied standard connector.

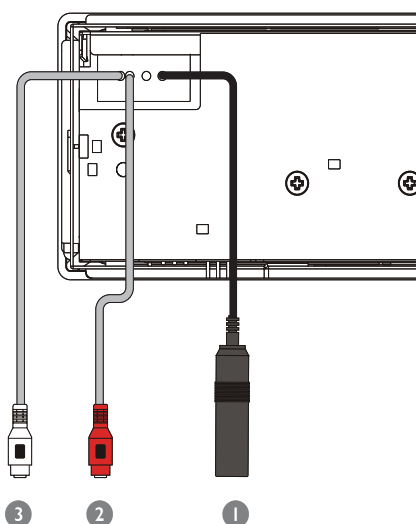


Connector	Connect to
1 Black wire	<b>A metal surface of the car</b> First connect the black ground (earth) lead, then connect the yellow and red power supply leads.
2 Blue wire	<b>The electric antenna control lead or power supply lead of the antenna booster</b> If there is no electric antenna or antenna booster, or it is manually operated telescopic antenna, it is not necessary to connect this lead.
3 Yellow wire	<b>The +12V car battery which is live at all times.</b>
4 Orange/White	<b>illumination switch.</b>
5 Red wire	<b>The +12V power terminal which is live in the accessory (ACC) position of the ignition switch</b> If there is no accessory position, connect to the +12V car battery terminal that is always live. Be sure to connect the black ground (earth) lead to a metal surface of the car first.
6 Green and green/black wires	<b>Left speaker (Rear)</b>
7 White and white/black wires	<b>Left speaker (Front)</b>
8 Gray and gray/black wires	<b>Right speaker (Front)</b>
9 Purple and purple/black wires	<b>Right speaker (Rear)</b>

- 3 Connect the supplied standard connector to the unit.

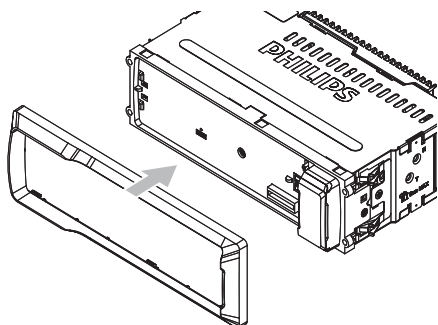


- 4 Connect the antenna and amplifier as illustrated, if applicable.

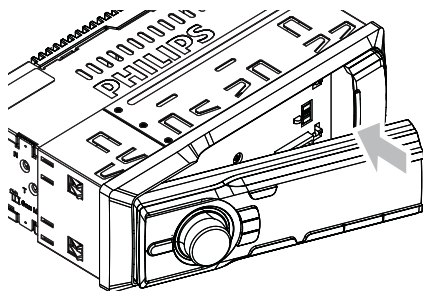


## Attach the front panel

- 1 Attach the trim plate.



- 2 Insert the left side of the panel in the chassis until it is correctly engaged.

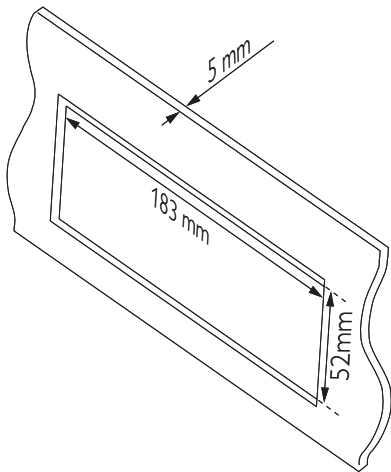


- 3 Press the right side of the panel until it is locked into place.

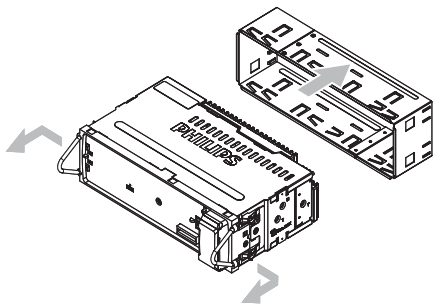
## Mount into the dashboard

- 1 Ensure that car dashboard opening is within these measurements:

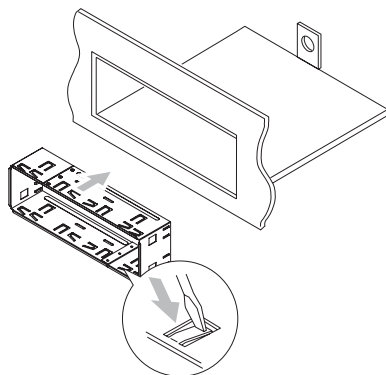

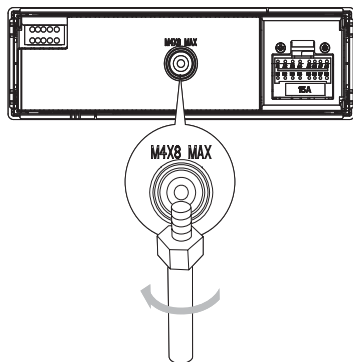
- 2 Remove the mounting sleeve with the supplied disassembly tools.



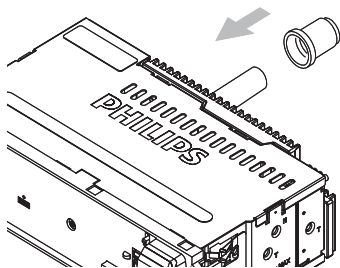
- 3 Install the sleeve into the dashboard and bend the tabs outward to fix the sleeve.
- Skip this step if the unit is not fixed by sleeve but supplied screws.



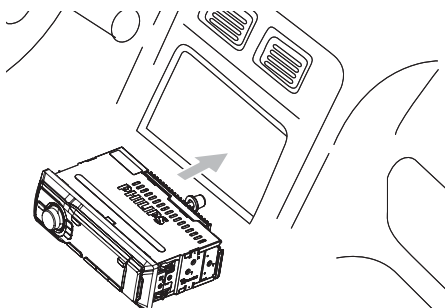
- 4 If the car does not have an on-board drive or navigation computer; disconnect the negative terminal of the car battery.
- If you disconnect the car battery in a car that has an on-board drive or navigation computer; the computer may lose its memory.
  - If the car battery is not disconnected, to avoid short-circuit, ensure that bare wires do not touch each other.
- 5 Connect the supplied mounting bolt to the unit.



- 6 Place the supplied rubber cushion over the end of the mounting bolt.



- 7 Slide the unit into the dashboard until you hear a click sound.



- 8 Reconnect the negative terminal of the car battery.

## Install remote control battery

### ! Caution

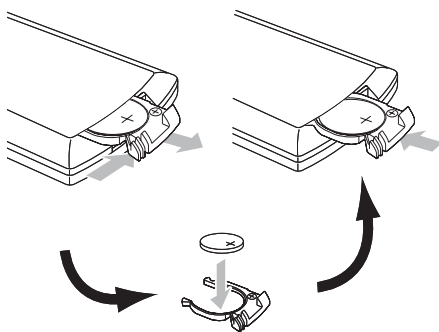

#### For first-time use:

- 1 Remove the protective tab to activate the remote control battery.

#### To replace the remote control battery:

- 1 Open the battery compartment.  
2 Insert 1 CR2025 batteries with correct polarity (+/-) as indicated.  
Close the battery compartment.



## Turn on

- 1 Press **⏻** to turn on the unit.
- To turn off the unit, press **⏻** for 3 seconds.

## Set clock

- 1 Press **MENU/DISP** for 3 seconds.  
2 Press **▲DBB** or **SEARCH▼** repeatedly until the currently clock is displayed.  
3 Turn **⏻** in clockwise direction to set hour.  
4 Press **⏻** to confirm.  
5 Turn **⏻** in anti-clockwise direction to set minute.  
6 Press **⏻** to confirm.

## View clock

- 1 Press **MENU/DISP** repeatedly until the clock is displayed.

## 4 Listen to radio

---

### Tune to a radio station

- 1 Press **SOURCE** to select Radio.
  - 2 Press **▲DBB** or **SEARCH▼** to select band: **[FM1]**, **[FM2]**, **[FM3]**, **[AM1]**, or **[AM 2]**.
  - 3 Press **LOC/DX** to select radio sensitivity:  
**[LOCAL]** (local): Only station with strong signal can be broadcast.  
**[DX]** (distance): Stations with strong and weak signals can be broadcast.
  - 4 Press **◀◀** or **▶▶** to tune to a radio station manually.
    - ↳ The radio station is broadcast.
    - To search for radio station automatically, press **◀◀** or **▶▶** for 3 seconds.
- 

### Select stereo/mono broadcasting

For stations with weak signals: to improve the reception, change to monaural sound.

- 1 Press **MENU/DISP** for 3 seconds.
  - 2 Press **▲DBB** or **SEARCH▼** repeatedly until **[STEREO]** or **[MONO]** is displayed.
  - 3 Turn **⊙** to select a setting:
    - **[STEREO]**: stereo broadcast.
    - **[MONO]**: mono broadcast.
  - 4 Press **⊙** to confirm.
- 

### Store radio stations in memory

You can store up to 6 stations in each band.

---

#### Store stations automatically

- 1 Press **SEARCH▼** for 3 seconds.

- ↳ The six strongest stations of the selected band are saved in preset channels 1-6 automatically.
- 

#### Store stations manually

- 1 Tune to the station that you want to store (see 'Tune to a radio station' on page 16).
  - 2 Press one of the numbered buttons **1** to **6** for over 2 seconds.
    - ↳ The station is saved in the selected channel.
- 

### Tune to a preset station

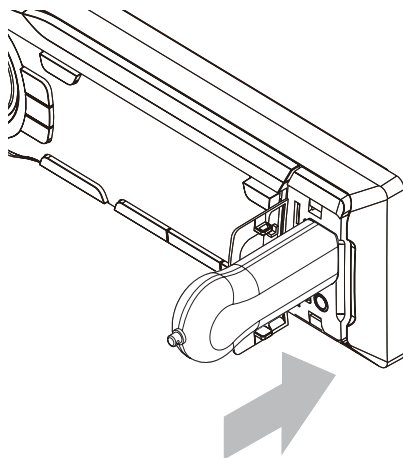
- 1 Press **▲DBB** or **SEARCH▼** to select band.
- 2 Press the number button **1** to **6** to select the preset station.




## 5 Play from USB/SD/MMC device

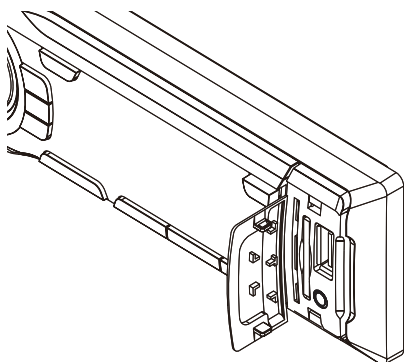
### Note

- Ensure that the USB or SD/MMC device contains playable music.




### Insert USB device

- 1 Open the cover marked  on the front panel.



- 2 Insert the USB device into the USB socket.  
↳ The unit starts playing from the USB device automatically.


### Remove the USB device

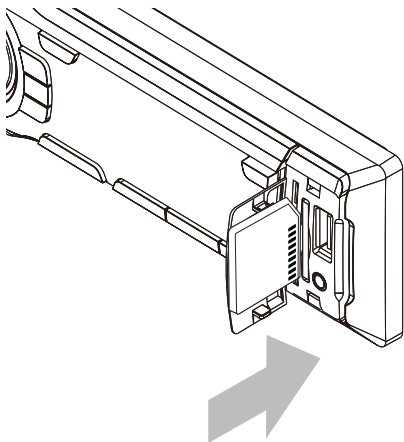
- 1 Press  to turn off the unit.
- 2 Remove the USB device.

### Insert SD/MMC card

#### Note

- The system supports SDHC cards.

- 1 Open the cover marked  on the front panel.
- 2 Insert the SD or MMC card into the card slot.  
↳ The unit starts playing from the SD/MMC card automatically.




---

### Remove the SD/MMC card

- 1 Press  $\odot$  to turn off the unit.
- 2 Press the card until you hear a click sound.  
↳ The card is now disengaged.
- 3 Remove the SD or MMC card.

---

### Control play

- To select a folder, press  $\blacktriangle$ DBB or SEARCH  $\blacktriangledown$ .
- To skip to a track, press  $\blacktriangleleft\blacktriangleleft$  or  $\blacktriangleright\blacktriangleright$ .
- To search within a track, press  $\blacktriangleleft\blacktriangleleft$  or  $\blacktriangleright\blacktriangleright$  for 3 seconds.
- To pause, press  $\blacktriangleright\|\|\blacktriangleright$ . To resume, press  $\blacktriangleright\|\|\blacktriangleright$  again.

---

### Search for an MP3/WMA track

- 1 Press SEARCH  $\blacktriangledown$  for 3 seconds.  
↳ Search menu is displayed.  
↳ [FILE SCH] : search by track name.

↳ [FOLDER SCH] : search by folder sequence.

- 2 Turn  $\odot$  to select [FILE SCH], then press  $\odot$  to confirm.
- 3 Turn  $\odot$  to enter character; then press  $\odot$ .
- 4 Repeat step 3 to enter more characters.
- 5 Press  $\odot$  for 3 seconds to start searching.  
↳ A list of matching tracks are displayed when search is finished.
- 6 Press  $\blacktriangle$ DBB or SEARCH  $\blacktriangledown$  to skip over the list.
- 7 Press  $\odot$  to select a track.

---

### View play information

- 1 During play USB/SD/MMC device, press MENU/DISP repeatedly to view:
  - Track number and elapsed play time
  - Artist
  - Album
  - Title
  - Folder
  - File
  - Clock

---

### Repeat play

During play, press **3, REP** repeatedly to select:

- [REP 1] (repeat one track): play the current track repeatedly.
- [REP FOLD] (repeat one folder): play all tracks in the current folder repeatedly.
- [REP ALL] (repeat all tracks): play all tracks repeatedly.
- [REP OFF] (repeat off): cancel repeat play.

---

### Random play

You can play the tracks in random order:

- 1 During play, press SHUF, 4 to select:

- **[SHUF ON]** : start random play for all tracks.
- **[SHUF OFF]** : cancel random play.

---

## Intro play

You can play the first 10 seconds of each track.

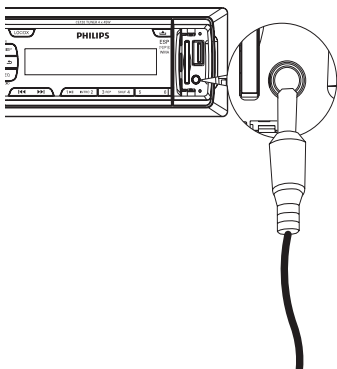
- 1 During play, press **INTRO, 2** to select:
  - **[INT ON]** : After the first 10 seconds of each track have been played, play stops.
  - **[INT OFF]** : Cancel intro play and start normal play.

---

## Listen to other devices

You can connect an external sound device to the unit.

- 1 Connect the device to the unit by using a 3.5 mm plug.
- 2 Press **SOURCE** repeatedly until **[MP3 LINK]** is displayed.



- 3 Operate the device (refer to the instructions supplied with the device).

# 6 Adjust sound

- [OPTIMAL] (optimal)

---

## Adjust volume

- 1 Turn  $\odot$  clockwise/anticlockwise to increase/decrease volume.

---

## Mute

You can turn off the sound of your audio.

- 1 During play, press **MUTE** $\odot$ .
  - To turn the sound back on, press **MUTE** $\odot$  again.

---

## Toggle Dynamic Bass Boost on/off

- 1 Press **▲DBB** for 3 seconds to display the current setting.
  - ↳ **[DBB ON]** :The Dynamic Bass Boost (DBB) function is on.
  - ↳ **[DBB OFF]** :The DBB function is off.
- 2 Press **▲DBB** again for 3 seconds to change the DBB setting.

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## Select preset equalizer

- 1 Press **EQ/Audio**.
  - ↳ The current Equalizer setting is displayed.
- 2 Press **EQ/Audio** again repeatedly to select a preset EQ:
  - **[USER]** (user)
  - **[FLAT]** (flat)
  - **[POP]** (pop)
  - **[TECHNO]** (techno)
  - **[ROCK]** (rock)
  - **[CLASSIC]** (classic)
  - **[JAZZ]** (jazz)

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## Other sound settings

You can also adjust other sound settings:

- **[BAS]** (bass) range: -7 to +7
- **[TRE]** (treble) range: -7 to +7
- **[LOUD]** (loudness): OFF, ON.
- **[BAL]** (balance) range: 10L to 10R. (L = left speaker; R = right speaker)
- **[FAD]** (fader) range: 10R to 10F. (R = rear speaker; F = front speaker)

---

### Note

- Only when you selected the **[USER]** equalizer, the sound value adjusted can be retained.

- 1 Press **EQ/Audio** for 3seconds.
- 2 Press **▲DBB** or **SEARCH▼** repeatedly to select the item to be adjusted.
- 3 Turn  $\odot$  to select a value.
- 4 Press  $\odot$  to confirm.

## 7 Adjust system settings

### Select blackout setting

You can set the screen to turn off automatically after the unit is idle for 10 or 20 seconds.

- 1 Press **MENU/DISP** for 3 seconds.
- 2 Turn  $\odot$  to select a setting:
  - **[BKO 10 S]**: Turn off the screen automatically 10 seconds after last operation.
  - **[BKO 20 S]**: Turn off the screen automatically 20 seconds after last operation.
  - **[BKO OFF]**: Never turn off the screen.
- 3 Press  $\odot$  to confirm.

### Turn demo mode on/off

When demo mode is on, when the unit is idle for more than 2 minutes, all functions are displayed.

- 1 Press **MENU/DISP** for 3 seconds.
- 2 Press **▲DBB** or **SEARCH▼** repeatedly to until **[DEMO]** is displayed.
  - ↳ The screen shows current Demo mode setting.
- 3 Turn  $\odot$  to select a setting:
  - **[DEMO ON]**: Turn on the demo mode.
  - **[DEMO OFF]**: Turn off the demo mode.
- 4 Press  $\odot$  to confirm.

### Change button backlight color

You can select blue or red for the button backlight color.

- 1 Press **MENU/DISP** for 3 seconds.
- 2 Press **▲DBB** or **SEARCH▼** repeatedly to until **[KEY BLUE]** or **[KEY RED]** is displayed.
- 3 Turn  $\odot$  to select a setting:
  - **[KEY BLUE]**: Backlight turns blue
  - **[KEY RED]**: Backlight turns red.

### Select start volume

Each time you turn on the unit, it can play at the last listened volume or at the preset volume.

- 1 Press **MENU/DISP** for 3 seconds.
- 2 Press **▲DBB** or **SEARCH▼** repeatedly to until **[V - LAST]** or **[V - ADJ]** is displayed.
- 3 Turn  $\odot$  to select a setting:
  - **[V - LAST]**: Each time you turn on the unit, the volume remains from its previous use.
  - **[V - ADJ]**: Each time you turn on the unit, the volume is at the preset level.
- 4 Press  $\odot$  to confirm.

### Store preset volume

You can turn on the unit at a preset volume.

- 1 Select **[V - ADJ]** as the start volume (see 'Select start volume' on page 21).
- 2 Press **MENU/DISP** for 3 seconds.
- 3 Press **▲DBB** or **SEARCH▼** repeatedly to until **[A-VOL]** is displayed.
- 4 Turn  $\odot$  to select a value: 0 - 47.
- 5 Press  $\odot$  to confirm.

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## Turn beep sound on/off

Each time you press a button, the unit beeps. You can turn off/on this beep sound.

- 1 Press **MENU/DISP** for 3 seconds.
- 2 Press **▲DBB** or **SEARCH▼** repeatedly to until **[BEEP ON]** or **[BEEP OFF]** is displayed.
- 3 Turn  $\odot$  to select a setting:
  - **[BEEP ON]**: Turn on the beep sound.
  - **[BEEP OFF]**: Turn off the beep sound.
- 4 Press  $\odot$  to confirm.

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## Turn display scroll on/off

For track information that is longer than the display panel: you can select to cut off the remainder of the text, or scroll to display the full text.

### Note

- If any special characters are present in the MP3 track name or album name, it may not display correctly on the screen because these characters are not supported.
- Some WMA is protected by Digital Rights Management (DRM), it cannot be played on the unit.
- Folders/files exceed the supported limit of the unit are not displayed or played.

- 1 Press **MENU/DISP** for 3 seconds.
- 2 Press **▲DBB** or **SEARCH▼** repeatedly to until **[ROLL ON]** or **[ROLL OFF]** is displayed.
- 3 Turn  $\odot$  to select a setting:
  - **[ROLL ON]** (scroll on): Auto scroll during play.
  - **[ROLL OFF]** (scroll off): No auto scroll display.
- 4 Press  $\odot$  to confirm.

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## Select shock-protect setting

You can select the shock protection setting, depending on the stability of your car and the condition of the road.

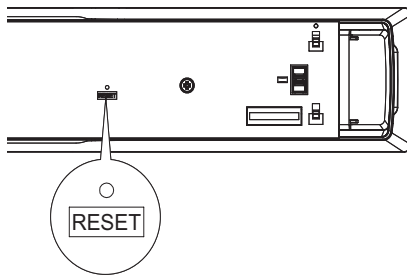
- 1 Press **MENU/DISP** for 3 seconds.
- 2 Press **▲DBB** or **SEARCH▼** repeatedly until **[ESP]** is displayed.
- 3 Turn  $\odot$  to select a setting:
  - **[ESP 12]**: select when the road is smooth and there are few bumps.
  - **[ESP 45]** select when the road is bumpy and unstable.
- 4 Press  $\odot$  to confirm the selection.

---

## Reset

You can reset the unit to its default setting.

- 1 Detach the front panel (see 'Detach the front panel' on page 24).
- 2 Press the reset button by using a ball-point pen or a similar tool.
  - ↳ All settings are erased except clock.

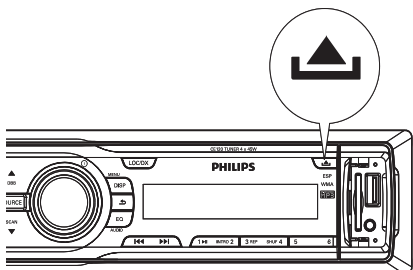

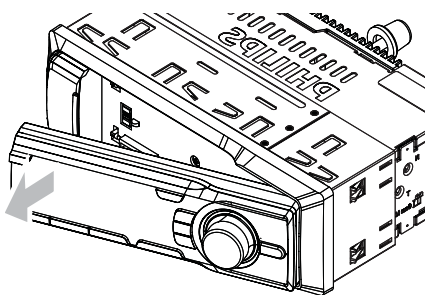
## Detach the front panel

You can detach the front panel to deter theft.

- 1 Press  to release the panel.



- 2 Pull the panel towards you to detach it from the chassis.

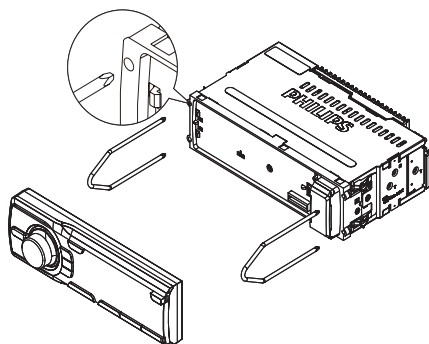


- 3 Store the panel in the supplied carry case to protect it from dirt or damage.

## Remove the unit

To repair or replace the unit, remove it from the dashboard.

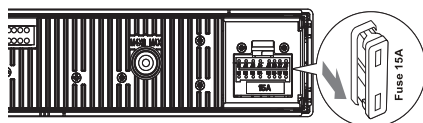
- 1 Detach the front panel.
- 2 Remove the unit with the removal keys.



## Replace fuse

If there is no power, the fuse may broke and need to be replaced.

- 1 Detach the front panel and take out the unit. (see 'Remove the unit' on page 24)
- 2 Check the electric connection.
- 3 Buy a fuse that matches the voltage of the damaged fuse (15A)
- 4 Replace the fuse.



If the fuse is broken again after replacement, there might have internal malfunction. In such case, consult your Philips dealer.

# 10 Troubleshooting



## Caution

If you encounter problems when using this unit, check the following points before requesting service. If the problem remains unsolved, go to the Philips web site ([www.Philips.com/support](http://www.Philips.com/support)). When you contact Philips, ensure that your unit is nearby and the model number and serial number are available (see 'Get started' on page 10).

### No power or no sound.

- Car engine is not on. Turn the car engine on.
- Cable is not correctly connected. Check connections.
- Fuse is burnt. Replace fuse (see 'Replace fuse' on page 24).
- Volume is too low. Adjust volume (see 'Adjust volume' on page 20).
- If the above solutions cannot help, press the RESET button.

### Noise in broadcasts.

- Signals are too weak. Select other stations with stronger signals.
- Check the connection of the car antenna.
- Change broadcast from Stereo to mono (see 'Select stereo/mono broadcasting' on page 16).

### Preset stations lost.

- Battery cable is not correctly connected. Connect the battery cable to the terminal that is always live.

### Display show ERR-12

- USB/SD/MMC data error. Check the USB device or SD/MMC card.

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## M

### **MMC**

MultimediaCard. A type of memory card with a flash memory.

### **MP3**

A file format with a sound data compression system. MP3 is the abbreviation of Motion Picture Experts Group 1 (or MPEG-1) Audio Layer 3. With the MP3 format, one CD-R or CD-RW can contain about 10 times more data than a regular CD.

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## S

### **SD**

Secure Digital. A type of memory card with a flash memory.

### **SDHC**

Secure Digital High Capacity (SDHC) is a type of flash memory card based on the SDA 2.00 specification. The SDA 2.00 specification enables SD cards to reach higher capacities from 4GB to 32GB, and growing.

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## W

### **WMA (Windows Media Audio)**

An audio format owned by Microsoft, is a part of Microsoft Windows Media technology. Includes Microsoft Digital Rights Management tools, Windows Media Video encoding technology, and Windows Media Audio encoding technology.



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
