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1 Important safety instructions

Power requirements

- This product requires an electrical supply of 100-240 volts AC. In case of power failure, the communication can be lost.
- The voltage on the network is classified as TNV-3 (Telecommunication Network Voltages), as defined in the standard EN 60950.



Warning

 The Electrical network is classified as hazardous. The only way to power down the charger is to unplug the power supply from the electrical outlet. Ensure that the electrical outlet is always easily accessible.

To avoid damage or malfunction



Caution

- Use only the power supply listed in the user instructions.
- Use only the batteries listed in the user instructions.
- Risk of explosion if battery is replaced by an incorrect type.
- · Dispose of used batteries according to the instructions.
- Always use the cables provided with the product.
- Do not allow the charging contacts or the battery to come into contact with metal objects.
- Do not let small metal objects come into contact with the product. This can deteriorate audio quality and damage the product.
- Metallic objects may be retained if placed near or on the handset receiver.
- Do not use the product in places where there are explosive hazards.
- Do not open the handset, base station or charger as you could be exposed to high voltages.

- For pluggable equipment, the socket-outlet shall be installed near the equipment and shall be easily accessible.
- Handsfree activation could suddenly increase the volume in the earpiece to a very high level: make sure the handset is not too close to your ear.
- This equipment is not designed to make emergency calls when the power fails, An alternative has to be made available to allow emergency calls.
- Do not allow the product to come into contact with liquids.
- Do not use any cleaning agents containing alcohol, ammonia, benzene, or abrasives as these may harm the set.
- Do not expose the phone to excessive heat caused by heating equipment or direct sunlight.
- Do not drop your phone or allow objects to fall on your phone.
- Active mobile phones in the vicinity may cause interference.

When using the phone as a baby monitor



Caution

- Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- Make sure the baby unit and the cord are always out of reach of the baby (at least 1 metre/3 feet away).
- Keep the parent unit at least 1.5 metres/5 feet away from the baby unit to prevent acoustic feedback.
- Never place the baby unit inside the baby's bed or playpen.
- Never cover the parent unit and the baby unit with anything (e.g. a towel or blanket). Always make sure the cooling vents of the baby unit are free.
- Take every precaution to make sure that your baby can sleep safely.
- This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
- If you place the parent unit next to a transmitter or other DECT appliance (e.g. a DECT telephone or wireless router for the internet), the connection with the baby unit may be lost. Move the baby monitor further away from the other wireless appliances until the connection is restored.



Connect the base station




Warning

- Risk of product damage! Make sure that the power supply voltage corresponds to the voltage printed on the back or underside of the phone.
- Use only the supplied power adapter to charge the batteries.




Note

- If you subscribe to the digital subscriber line (DSL) high speed internet service through your telephone line, ensure you install a DSL filter between the telephone line cord and the power socket. The filter prevents noise and caller ID problems caused by DSL interference. For further information on DSL filters, contact your DSL service provider.
- The type plate is located on the bottom of the base station.
- 1 Connect each end of the power adapter to:
 - the DC input jack at the bottom of the base station;
 - the power socket on the wall.
- 2 Connect each end of the line cord to:
 - the telephone socket at the bottom of the base station;
 - · the telephone socket on the wall.




- 3 Connect each end of the power adapter to (for multi handset versions only):
 - the DC input jack at the back of the extra handset charger.
 - the power socket on the wall.



Install the handset

The batteries are pre-installed in the handset. Pull the battery tape off from the battery door before charging.





Caution

- Risk of explosion! Keep batteries away from heat, sunshine or fire. Never discard batteries in fire.
- · Use only the supplied batteries.
- Risk of decreased battery life! Never mix different brands or types of batteries.



Note

- · Charge the batteries for 8 hours before first use.
- If the handset becomes warm when the batteries are charging, it is normal.



Warning

 Check the battery polarity when inserting in the battery compartment. Incorrect polarity may damage the product.

Configure your phone (country dependent)

- 1 When using your phone for the first time, you see a welcome message.
- 2 Press [OK].

Set the country/language

Select your country/language, then press **[OK]** to confirm.

→ The country/language setting is saved.



Note

 The country/language setting option is country dependent. If no welcome message is displayed, it means the country/language setting is preset for your country. Then you can set the date and time.

To re-set the language, see the following steps.

- Select [Menu] > ♠ > [Language], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 2 Select a language, then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The setting is saved.

Set the date and time

- Select [Menu] > ♠ > [Date & time], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 2 Select [Set date]/[Set time], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 3 Press the numeric buttons to enter the date and time.



Note

- If the time is in 12-hour format, press * to select [am] or [pm] (Country dependent).
- 4 Press [OK] to confirm.

Set the date and time format

- 1 Select [Menu] > ♠ > [Date & time], then press [OK] to confirm.
- Select [Date format] or [Time format].
- Press **@** / **B** to select [DD-MM-YYYY] or [MM-DD-YYYY] as the date display, and [12 Hours] or [24 Hours] as the time display. Then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The setting is saved.

· The date and time format setting is country dependent.

Change the remote access PIN/passcode



Note

- The default answering machine remote access PIN/ passcode is 0000 and it is important to change it to ensure the security.
- 1 Select [Menu] > > [Remote access] > [Change PIN], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 2 Enter the old PIN/passcode, then press [OK] to confirm.
- 3 Enter the new PIN/passcode, then press [OK] to confirm.
- 4 Enter the new PIN/passcode again, then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The setting is saved.

Charge the handset

Place the handset on the base station to charge the handset. When the handset is placed correctly on the base station, you hear a docking tone (see 'Set the docking tone' on page 31).

→ The handset starts charging.




Note

- · Charge the batteries for 8 hours before first use.
- If the handset becomes warm when the batteries are being charged, it is normal.
- Over time, capacity of batteries decreases. This is a normal battery behavior.

Your phone is now ready to use.

Check the battery level

If you are on the phone, you hear warning tones when the batteries are almost empty. The handset turns off when the batteries are completely empty.

What is standby mode?

Your phone is in standby mode when it is idle. When the handset is off the charging cradle, the standby screen displays the date and time. When the handset is on the charging cradle, the standby screen displays the time as a screen saver.

Check the signal strength

- The number of bars indicates
 the connection status between
 the handset and base station. The
 more bars are shown, the better
 the connection is.
- Make sure the handset is connected to the base station before you make or receive calls and carry out the functions and features.
- If you hear warning tones when you are on the phone, the handset is almost out of battery or the handset is out of range. Charge the battery or move the handset close to the base station.

Bluetooth

S8A supports Bluetooth wireless technology. You can connect it to a mobile phone which is Bluetooth compatible. Then you can make and receive calls and download the phonebook from your mobile phone with the S8A handset,



Note

- Make sure that the mobile phone with which you establish a connection supports the Bluetooth function.
- · The Bluetooth connection is subject to interference from obstructions such as walls or other electronic devices

Pair S8A with your mobile phones

Make sure the Bluetooth function of the mobile phones is activated and in searching status. Then you can do the pairing in this way:

- Place the mobile phone close to the base station, then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The mobile phone name is displayed on the screen.
- On the mobile phone, select S8A and connect.
- Enter the PIN/passcode on the mobile phone, if necessary.



- The default PIN/passcode is 0000.
 - → When S8A and the mobile phone are paired, \$12 or \$12 is displayed on the screen.



- When the Bluetooth device list is full, remove some mobile phone names before pairing can start.
- If the name of S8A exists in your mobile phone, you have to remove it from your mobile phone. Then you can do the pairing again.
- · When pairing is successful, you can add the new mobile phone name to the active list. Remove some mobile phone names if the active list is full. See 'Manage the mobile phones list' in this chapter for information.

Synchronize the phonebook

Download the phonebook from the mobile phones

- Make sure that the mobile phone is already connected to S8A with Bluetooth.
- Select [Menu] > § > [Mobile setting].
- Select a mobile phone, then press [OK] to confirm.
- Select [Phonebook] to download the phonebook, then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The phonebook from the mobile phone is updated on the base station.



- After the update is complete, the new phonebook overwrites the old one.
- If there is an incoming call when phonebook update is in progress, the update is suspended and resumes after the call ends.

Set the mobile's phonebook to privacy mode

You can set whether the mobile's phonebook is available for viewing.

- Select [Menu] > § > [Mobile setting].
- Select a mobile phone, then press [OK] to confirm

- 3 Select [Privacy mode], then press [OK] to confirm
- **4** You can select among these 3 options:
 - [Off] : no PIN/passcode is required to access the mobile's phonebook which is always available for viewing.
 - [Auto range]: no PIN/passcode is required to access the mobile's phonebook which is available for viewing only when the mobile phone is within the Bluetooth range.
 - [PIN]: follow the on-screen instruction to activate or change the PIN/ passcode.

Manage the mobile phones list

You can manage your mobile phones list in this way:

- 1 Select [Menu] > ③ > [Device list], then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The mobile phones list is displayed.
- 2 Select a mobile phone, press [Option].
- 3 Select [Connect]/[Disconnect]/[Delete]/[Delete all], then press [OK] to confirm.



Note

 You can see [Disconnect] in the option list only when the mobile phone is connected; and [Connect] only when the mobile phone is disconnected.

Connect/Disconnect the mobile phone

- 1 Select [Menu] > (Select [Menu]) > (Device list), the press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The mobile phones list is displayed.
- 2 Select a mobile phone, press [Option].
- 3 Select [Connect]/[Disconnect], then press [OK] to confirm.

→ The selected mobile phone is connected to/disconnect from Bluetooth.

Delete a device/Delete all devices on the list

- 1 Select [Menu] > ③ > [Device list], then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The mobile phones list is displayed.
- 2 Select a mobile phone, press [Option].
- 3 Select [Delete]/[Delete all], then press [OK] to confirm.



Note

 If you select to delete all mobile phones on the list, a confirmation message is displayed. Press [OK] to confirm.

Change the PIN/passcode

- 1 Select [Menu] > **§** > [Change PIN], then press [OK] to confirm.
- Press [Clear] to remove the current PIN/ passcode to confirm.
- Enter the new PIN/passcode, then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The new PIN/passcode is saved.

Recover the PIN/passcode

If you forget the PIN/passcode, refer to the following instructions:

- Access [Menu] > ≥ > [Device list], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 2 Select a mobile phone, then press [Option].
- 3 Select [Delete], then press [OK] to confirm.

- → The mobile phone is removed from the device list.
- 4 Pair S8A with the mobile phone again (see 'Pair S8A with your mobile phones' on page 14).
- 5 Access [Menu] > ② > [Mobile setting], press [OK] to confirm.
- 6 Select [Privacy mode], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 7 Select [PIN], then follow the on-screen instruction to activate or change the PIN/ passcode.

Rename your device

The name of your phone is S8A by default. You can rename it in this way:

- 2 Edit the name, then press [Save] to confirm.

 When the power fails, the phone cannot access emergency services.



 Check the signal strength before you make a call or when you are in a call (see 'Check the signal strength' on page 13).

Make a call

You can make a call in these ways:

- Normal call
- Predial call
- Call through the speed dial key

You can also make a call from the redial list (see 'Redial a call' on page 29), phonebook list (see 'Call from the phonebook' on page 25) and call log (see 'Return a call' on page 27).

Normal call

- 1 Press **ٿ** or **◁**),
- 2 Dial the phone number.
 - → The number is dialed out.
 - → The duration of your current call is displayed.



 Make sure that the line settings are set to [Home] for the landline. For information, see chapter 'Phone settings', section 'Line settings'.

 If you select [Auto] on the handset, the idle line is pre-selected for an outgoing call, with [Home] as the highest priority, then [Mobile 1] and [Mobile 2]. If you select [Manual], select an icon among these three options.

Predial call

- 1 Dial the phone number
 - To erase a digit, press [Clear].
 - To enter a pause, press and hold #/A.
- Press (/) to select the landline or mobile line (↑ / 1 / 1 / 1) from which you want to make an outgoing call.
- 3 Press ♣ or ◄» to dial out the call.



Note

 Make sure that the Line settings are set to [Home] for the landline or [Mobile 1]/[Mobile 2] for mobile line.
 For information, see chapter 'Phone settings', section 'Line settings'.



Lib

 If you select [Auto] on the handset, the idle line is pre-selected for an outgoing call, with [Home] as the highest priority, then [Mobile 1] and [Mobile 2]. If you select [Manual], select an icon among these three options.

Call through the speed dial key

You can assign and save the number of your contact to a key (see 'Set the speed dial keys' on page 25). Then you can press and hold on the key in standby mode to dial the saved phone number automatically.



- The call timer displays the talk time of your current call.
- · If you hear warning tones, the phone is almost out of battery or out of range. Charge the battery or move the phone close to the base station.

Answer a call

When there is an incoming call from the landline or mobile line, you can select from the following options:

- press or or to answer the call.
- select [Divert] to send incoming call to the answering machine.
- select [Silent] to turn off the ringer of the current incoming call.

When there are incoming calls from the landline and mobile line at the same time, press √ I on the handset to select a call, then, press. or \triangleleft to answer the call.



Warning

· When the handset rings or when the handsfree is activated, keep the handset away from your ear to avoid ear damage.



Note

· If you have subscribed for a caller ID service with the service provider, you will see the caller number displayed on the handset. If the number is saved in the phonebook, the name will be displayed.



When there is a missed call, a notification message is displayed.

End a call

You can end a call in these ways:

- Press -: or
- Place the handset to the base station or charging cradle.

Adjust the earpiece/speaker volume

Press a / 🕏 on the handset to adjust the volume during a call.

> → The earpiece/speaker volume is adjusted and the phone is back to the call screen

Mute the microphone

- Press & during a call.
 - → The handset displays [Mute on].
 - → The caller cannot hear you, but you can still hear his voice.
- Press & again to unmute the microphone.
 - → You can now communicate with the caller

Turn the speaker on or off

Press 🖘.

Make a second call



Note

- This service is network dependent.
- Press during a call.
 - → The first call is put on hold.
- Dial the second number.
 - → The number displayed on the screen is dialed out

Make a second call with the landline/mobile line

When you are in a call with the landline/mobile line, you can also make a second call through the other line (mobile line/landline).

- Press [Option], then select to switch to the line which you want to make a second call
 - → The first call is on hold.
- To switch or exit the calls from the landline and/or mobile line, select from [Option] menu.

Answer a second call



Note

This service is network dependent.

When there is a periodical beep to notify you of an incoming call, you can answer the call in these ways:

- 1 Press 🗳 and 🌊 to answer the call.
 - → The first call is put on hold, and you are now connected to the second call.
- 2 Press and 1 to end the current call and answer the first call.

Answer a second call with the landline or mobile line

When you are in a call with the landline/mobile line, you can also answer a second call through the other line (mobile line/landline).

- 1 Press [Option], then select to switch to the line which you answer a second call .
 - → The first call is on hold.
- To switch or exit the calls from the landline and/or mobile line, select from [Option] menu.

Switch between two calls

You can switch your calls in these ways:

- Press ♣ and ♣; or
- Press [Option] and select [Switch calls], then press [OK] again to confirm.
 - → The current call is put on hold, and you are now connected to the other call.

Switch between two calls on the landline and mobile line

You can switch the calls between the landline and mobile line.

- 1 Make an outgoing call with the land line.
- When there is an incoming call from the mobile line, press [Option], then select a mobile phone to answer the call.
 - → The call from the landline is on hold.
- 3 To switch or exit the calls from the landline and/or mobile line, select from [Option] menu.



Note

 For some mobile phones, when you pick up the call from the mobile phone, the Bluetooth is disconnected.
 For further information, check with the mobile phone dealer.

Make a conference call with the external callers



Note

 This service is network dependent. Check with the service provider for additional charges.

When you are connected to two calls, you can make a conference call in these ways:

Press ♣, then ➡; or

- Press [Option], select [Conference] and then press [OK] again to confirm.
 - → The two calls are combined and a conference call is established

Make a conference call on the landline and mobile line

You can make a two-line conference call through the landline and mobile line.

- Make an outgoing call with the landline.
- $\mathbf{2}$ When there is an incoming from the mobile line, press [Option], then select a mobile phone to answer the call.
 - → The call from the landline is on hold.
- 3 Press [Option] to access the menu.
- 4 Select [2 lines conf.] to start a conference call with the landline and mobile line.
- To switch or exit the calls from the landline and/or mobile line, select from [Option] menu.

8 Intercom and conference calls

An intercom call is a call to another handset that shares the same base station. A conference call involves a conversation between you, another handset user and the outside callers.

Make a call to another handset



Note

- If the base station only has 2 registered handsets, press and hold to make a call to another handset.
- 1 Press and hold **.
 - → The handsets available for intercom are displayed.
- 2 Select a handset number, then press [OK] to confirm.
 - ightharpoonup The selected handset rings.
- 3 Press on the selected handset.
 - → The intercom is established.
- 4 Press [Cancel] or to cancel or end the intercom call.



Vote

 If the selected handset is busy, [Busy] is displayed on the handset screen.

While you are on the phone

You can go from one handset to another during a call:

- 1 Press and hold *...
 - → The current caller is put on hold.
- 2 Select a handset number, then press [OK] to confirm.

→ Wait for the other side to answer your call.

Switch between calls

Press **[Extern]** to switch between the outside call and the intercom call.

Transfer a call



Note

- If the base station only has 2 registered handsets, press and hold to transfer a call to another handset.
- 1 Press and hold * during a call.
 - → The handsets available for intercom are displayed.
- 2 Select a handset number, then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The selected handset rings.
- Press when the other side answers your call.
 - → The call is now transferred to the selected handset.

Make a conference call

A 3-way conference call is between you, another handset user and the outside callers. It requires two handsets to share the same base station.

During an external call

- 1 Press and hold * to initiate an internal call.
 - → The external caller is put on hold.
 - → For multi-handset versions, The handsets available for intercom are displayed. Then go to step 2.
 - → For two-handset versions, the other handset rings. Then go to step 3.

- Select or enter a handset number, then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The selected handset rings.
- 3 Press on the selected handset.
 - → The intercom is established.
- 4 Press [Conf].
 - → You are now in a 3-way conference call with an external call and a selected handset.
- 5 Press to end the conference call.



• Press * to join an ongoing conference with another handset if [Services] > [Conference] is set to [Auto].

During the conference call

- Press [Int.] to put the external call on hold and go back to the internal call.
 - → The external call is put on hold.
- Press [Conf] to establish the conference call again.



Note

 If a handset hangs up during the conference call, the other handset remains connected to the external call.

9 Text and numbers

You can enter text and numbers for handset name, phonebook records, and other menu items.

Enter text and numbers

- 1 Press once or several times on the alphanumeric key to enter the selected character:
- Press [Clear] to delete the character. Press \(\frac{1}{2}\) to move the cursor left and right.
- 3 Press **Q** to add a space.



Note

• For information on key mapping of characters and numbers, see the chapter 'Appendix'.

Switch between uppercase and lowercase

By default, the first letter of each word in a sentence is uppercase and the rest is lowercase. Press #A to switch between the uppercase and lowercase letters.

10 Phonebook

This phone has a phonebook that stores up to 500 records. Each record can have a name up to 32 characters long and a number up to 32 digits long.

You can access the phonebook from the handset. The base station can maintain multiple phonebook directories and can transfer the phonebook from two mobile phones. You can access any phonebook entry and use that entry to make a call on the landline or either of the two mobile phones.

Access the phonebook directories

- 1 Press a or select [Menu] > 2 > [OK] to on the handset to access the phonebook directories.
- 2 Select to view a phonebook directory.



Note

 To view the mobile's phonebook, make sure that the mobile phone is already connected to S8A with Bluetooth.

Direct access memory

There are 2 direct access memories (keys 1 and 2 are preset to the voice mail number and information service number of your service provider respectively. When you press and hold on the key in standby mode, the saved phone number is dialed automatically.

11 Call log

The call log stores the call history of all missed or received calls. The incoming call history includes the name and number of the caller, call time, and date. This feature is available if you have registered to the caller ID service with your service provider.

Your phone can store up to 50 call records. The call log icon on the handset flashes to remind you of any unanswered calls. If the caller allows the display of his identity, you can view his name or number. The call records are displayed in chronological order with the most recent received call at the top of the list.



Note

 Make sure that the number in the call list is valid before you can call back directly from the call list.

The following icon shown on the screen informs you if you have missed calls.

- It is red on the standby screen when there is a new missed call.
- It is red in the incoming call list when there is an unread missed call.
- It is green in the incoming call list when there is a read missed call.

You can set if you can see all calls or missed calls from the call log.

Silent mode

You can set your phone to silent mode and enable it for a specific duration when you do not want to be disturbed. When the silent mode is turned on, your phone does not ring or send any alerts or sound.

when the silent mode is activated.

Exclude the contacts from silent mode

You can select the length of ring delay and set the contacts to be excluded from the phonebook. Ring delay is the number of rings that will be muted before the rings become audible on the phone.

Docking tone is the sound made when you place the handset on the base station or charger.

 - → The setting is saved.

Set the sound profile

You can set the sound in the earpiece or handsfree mode among 3 different profiles.

- 1 Select [Menu] > > [Sounds] > [MySound], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 2 Select a profile, then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The setting is saved.

Access the sound profile during a call

Press [Sounds] for once or several times to change the sound profile during a call.

Alarm clock

Your phone has a built-in alarm clock, Check the information below to set your alarm clock.

Set the alarm

- Select [Menu] > ♠ > [Alarm], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 2 Select [On]/[Off], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 3 Select [Alarm time], then press [OK] to confirm.

Turn off the alarm

Before the alarm rings

→ The setting is saved.

When the alarm rings

- Press[Off] to turn off the alarm.
- Press [Snooze] (or any key except [Off]) to snooze.

The **ECO** mode reduces the transmission power of the handset and base station when you are on a call or when the phone is in standby mode.

You can change the display of the phone during standby mode.

You can set the brightness of the handset screen to different levels.

- 2 Select an option, then press [OK] to confirm.

Set the clock display

You can set the clock to digital or analog display. Select [Menu] > 🍪 > [Display], then press [OK] to confirm.

- 2 Select an option, then press [OK] to confirm.

Set the backlight of the LCD screen

You can set the backlight of the LCD screen and keypad flashing on or off when the phone rings.

- 2 Select [Flashing on]/[Flashing off], then press [OK] to confirm.
 - ightharpoonup The setting is saved.

Line settings

You can select to access the landline or mobile line.

- Select [Menu] > ♠ [Line settings], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 2 Select a new setting, then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The setting is saved.

* Tip

 If you select [Auto] on the handset, the idle line is pre-selected for an outgoing call, with [Home] as the highest priority. Then [Mobile 1] and [Mobile 2]. If you select [Manual], select an icon among these three options.


14 Baby monitor

Your phone supports the baby monitor function which sends an alert if the sound level exceeds the set limit.



Caution

- Make sure that you do not leave the handset that has the active monitor in the baby room.
- Make sure the baby unit and the cord are always out of reach of the baby.
- Place the baby unit at least 1 meter/3 feet but not more than 2 meters/6 feet away from the baby.



Activate/Deactivate the baby unit

Select [Menu] > (a) > [Activate], then press [OK] to confirm.

→ The baby unit is activated.



Тір

- If you have not set the parent unit, a notification message appears. Then you are asked to select to where you send the alert: external lines or other handset number. For information, see the next section.
- To exit from the baby monitor menu, press [Off].



Note

 When the baby monitor mode is activated, the baby handset does not ring on incoming calls.

Send an alert

You can send an alert to other handsets within the home or an external line. External line can be a cell phone or another fixed line outside the house.



Note

 Make sure that any prefix digits and/or country code are included when you send an alert.

Send to other handsets

- 2 Enter a telephone number, then press [Save] to confirm.



Note

 You can still send an alert to the external line even though it is in the barred list (see 'Add new number to the barred list' on page 40).

Send to a contact from the phonebook

- 2 Select a contact from the phonebook, then press [Save] to confirm.

Set the baby cry level

15 Telephone answering machine

Your phone includes a telephone answering machine that records unanswered calls when it is on. By default, the answering machine is set to the [Answer & rec.] mode. You can also access the answering machine remotely and change the settings through the answering machine menu on the handset.

Turn the answering machine on or off

- Select [Menu] > > [Answer mode], then press [OK] to confirm.
- Select [Answer only]/[Answer & rec.]/[Off], then press [OK] to confirm.

 → The setting is saved.

Set the answering machine language



Note

 This feature only applies to models with multiplelanguage support.

The answering machine language is the language for the announcements.

- Select [Menu] > > [Voice language], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 2 Select a language, then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The setting is saved.

Set the answer mode

You can set the answering machine and select if the callers can leave messages. Select [Answer & rec.] if you allow the callers to leave messages. Select [Answer only] if you forbid the callers to leave messages.

- 1 Select [Menu] > □ > [Answer mode], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 2 Select an answer mode, then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The setting is saved.



lote

 If the memory is full, the answering machine switches to [Answer only] mode automatically.

Announcements

The announcement is the message your caller hears when the answering machine picks up the call. The answering machine has 2 default announcements: the [Answer & rec.] mode and [Answer only] mode.

Record an announcement

The maximum length of the announcement you can record is 3 minutes. The newly recorded announcement automatically replaces the old one.

- 1 Select [Menu] > > [Announcement], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 2 Select [Answer & rec.] or [Answer only], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 3 Select [Record new], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 4 Recording starts after the beep.
- Press [OK] to stop recording or the recording stops after 3 minutes.

→ You can listen to the newly recorded announcement on the handset.

Note

 Make sure that you speak close to the microphone when you record an announcement.

Listen to the announcement

- 1 Select [Menu] > > [Announcement], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 2 Select [Answer & rec.] or [Answer only], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 3 Select [Play], then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → You can listen to the current announcement.



 You can no longer listen to the announcement when you pick up an incoming call.

Restore the default announcement

- Select [Menu] > > [Announcement], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 2 Select [Answer & rec.] or [Answer only], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 3 Select [Use default], then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The handset displays a confirmation request.
- 4 Press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The default announcement is restored.

Incoming messages (ICM)

Each message can be up to 3 minutes long. When you receive new messages, the new message indicator flashes on the answering

machine and the handset displays a notification message.



Note

If you pick up the phone when the caller leaves a message, the recording stops and you can talk to the caller directly.



Note

 If the memory is full, the answering machine switches to [Answer only] automatically. Delete old messages to receive new ones.

Listen to the incoming messages

You can listen to the incoming messages in the sequence they are recorded.

Select [Menu] > \square > [Play], then press [OK] to confirm.

- → New messages start playing. Old messages start playing if there is no new message.
- Press [Back] to stop listening.
- Press [Option] to enter the options menu.
- Press (a) / (5) to increase/decrease the volume.

Delete an incoming message

- 1 When you listen to the message, press [Option] to enter the options menu.
- 2 Select [Delete], then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The current message is deleted.

Delete all old incoming messages

- 1 Select [Menu] > > [Delete all], then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The handset displays a confirmation request.
- 2 Press [OK] to confirm.

→ All old messages are permanently deleted.



 You can only delete the read messages. No deleted messages can be recovered.

Call screening

You can hear the caller while he is leaving a message. Press & to answer the call.

Set the sound quality of the message

You can adjust the sound quality of the messages received from the answering machine.

- 1 Select [Menu] > > [Msg quality], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 2 Select the new setting, then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The setting is saved.



 The sound quality can only be adjusted before recording starts.

Set the ring delay

You can set the number of times the phone rings before the call goes to the answering machine..

- 1 Select [Menu] > □ > [Ring delay], then press [OK] to confirm.
- Select a new setting, then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The setting is saved.



 Make sure that the answering machine is switched on before this feature can be applied.



When you access the answering machine remotely, you are recommended to set the ring delay to[Toll saver] mode. This is a cost effective way to manage your messages. When there are new messages, the answering machine picks up the call after 3 rings; When there is no messages, it picks up the call after 5 rings.

Remote access

You can operate your answering machine when you are away from home. Simply make a call to your phone with a touch tone phone and enter your 4-digit PIN/passcode.



Vote

 The remote access PIN/passcode is the same as your system PIN/passcode. The preset PIN/passcode is 0000.

Change the PIN/passcode

- 1 Select [Menu] > > [Remote access] > [Change PIN], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 2 Enter the old PIN/passcode, then press [OK] to confirm.
- 3 Enter the new PIN/passcode, then press [OK] to confirm.
- 4 Enter the new PIN/passcode again, then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The setting is saved.

Activate/deactivate the remote access

You can allow or block remote access to the answering machine.

- Select [Menu] > > [Remote access], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 2 Select [Activate] / [Deactivate], then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The setting is saved.

Access the answering machine remotely

- 1 Make a call to your home number with a touch tone phone.
- 2 Enter # when you hear the announcement.
- **3** Enter your PIN/passcode.

→ You now have access to your answering machine, and you can listen to the new messages.



- You have 2 chances to enter the correct PIN/passcode before your phone hangs up.
- 4 Press a key to carry out a function. See the Remote access commands table below for a list of available functions.



• When there is no message, the phone hangs up automatically if no key is pressed for 8 seconds.

Auto conference

To join an external call with another handset, press $\overset{\bullet}{\sim}$.

Activate/Deactivate auto conference

- Select [Menu] > ♠ > [Conference], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 2 Select [Auto]/[Off], then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The setting is saved.

Call barring

You can create four sets of numbers with four digits at maximum for each set of numbers. When you make a call that starts with one of these four sets of numbers, the outgoing call is then barred.

Select the barring mode

- Select [Menu] > ♠ > [Call barring] > [Barring mode] then press [OK] to confirm.
- 2 Enter the PIN/passcode. The default PIN/ passcode is 0000.
- 3 Select [On]/[Off], then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The setting is saved.

Add new number to the barred list

- 2 Enter the PIN/passcode. The default PIN is 0000
- 3 Select a number from the list, then press [OK] to confirm.
- 4 Edit the number, then press [OK] to confirm.
 - → The setting is saved.



Note

 The number in the barred list can still be sent as an external line for a baby call.

Change the PIN/passcode

- 1 Select [Menu] > \(\bigsim > \) [Call barring] > [Change PIN], then press [OK] to confirm.
- 2 Enter the old PIN/passcode, then press [OK] to confirm.
- 3 Enter the new PIN/passcode, then press [OK] to confirm.

 If you forget the PIN/passcode, you have to reset your phone (see 'Restore default settings' on page 44).

Auto prefix

This feature checks and formats your outgoing call number before it is dialed out. The prefix number can replace the detect number you set in the menu. For example, you set 604 as the detect number and 1250 as the prefix. When you have dialed out a number such as 6043338888, your phone changes the number to 12503338888 when it dials out.



Note

 The maximum length of a detect number is 5 digits. The maximum length of an auto prefix number is 10 digits.

Set auto prefix

- 1 Select [Menu] > ♠ > [Auto prefix], then press [OK] to confirm.
