



- The type plate is located on the bottom of the base station.


- 1 Connect each end of the line cord to:
 - the telephone socket at the back of the unit;
 - the telephone socket on the wall.

Insert the supplied batteries

Set the date and time

What is standby mode?

Your phone is in standby mode when it is idle. The year, date, time and incoming counter are displayed on the standby screen.

Display icons

Calls

Make a call

You can make a call in these ways:

- Normal call
- Call from the call log
- Call from the redial list

Normal call

- Pick up the handset or press ••).
- Dial the phone number.
 - → The number is dialed out.



- To erase a digit, press n.
- To enter a pause, press | |.

Call from the call log

The call log stores the call history of all incoming or outgoing calls. The incoming call history includes the number of the caller call time and date. This feature is available if you have registered to the caller ID service with your service provider. Incoming call

- Press (in standby mode.
- Press A / To select a record on the list.
- Press **REDIAL** or ••) to make the call. Outgoing call
- Press (→ in standby mode.
- Press (→ again to view the number and time of the most recent outgoing call.
- Press **REDIAL** or ••) to make the call.

Redial a call

- Pick up the handset.
- Press **REDIAL**.
 - → The most recent outgoing call is dialed.

Answer a call

When the phone rings, you can select from the following options to answer the call:

- pick up the handset;
- press •().

 If you have subscribed for a caller ID service with the service provider, you will see the caller number displayed on the screen.

Adjust the speaker volume

Press In standby mode to select the low or high volume.

Turn the speaker on or off

Transfer a call



Note

- This service is network dependent. Check with the service provider for additional charges.
- 1 Make a first call.
- 2 Press during a call.
- 3 Make a second call.
- 4 Hang up the handset when the other side answers the call.
 - → The first call is transferred to the second call.

Set the contrast of the screen

You can set the contrast of the phone screen to 5 different levels.

- 1 Press FLASH/ * in standby mode.
- 2 Pick up the handset to confirm the setting.

Temporary time setting

- You can ignore 5Et 2 [OdE and 5Et 3] P[OdE which are country dependent codes.
- 1 Press **SETTING** to enter the setting mode.
- 2 Press ▲ / ▼ to select 5EŁ 4 FLASH.
- 3 Press SETTING again to enter the temporary time setting menu.
 → FLRSH 600 is displayed.
- 4 Press ▲ / ▼ to set the time.
- **5** Pick up the handset to confirm the setting.

The caller ID does not display.

- The service is not activated. Check with your service provider.
- The caller's information is withheld or unavailable

 If the above solutions do not help, disconnect the line cord and remove the battery. Reinstall the line cord and the battery after 1 minute and try again.
