## Connect power

### Set clock



#### Note

- You can set the clock in the standby mode only.

  - → [SET CLOCK] (set clock) scrolls on the screen.
  - → [Synch On] (synch on) is displayed.

  - [N]: the unit turns off the time synchronization.
- 3 Press PROG/CLOCK SET to confirm.







## Listen to Digital Audio Broadcasts (DAB+)

Digital Audio Broadcasting (DAB+), is a way of broadcasting radio digitally through a network of transmitters. It provides you with more choice, better sound quality and more information.

- 1 Press SOURCErepeatedly to select [DAB+].
  - When you enter the DAB+ mode for the first time, the unit automatically scans DAB+ radio stations. The unit stores all available DAB+ radio stations and then broadcasts the first available station.
  - → The last selected DAB+ radio station broadcasts automatically.



 If no DAB+ service is available, [NO DAB STATION] is displayed, and then [Station list] is displayed.

## Scan DAB+ radio stations automatically

You can perform full scan to search for DAB+ radio stations.

- 1 In DAB+ mode, press MODE/SCAN.
  - The unit scans all available DAB+ radio stations and broadcasts the first available station.

## Tune to DAB+ radio station manually

- 1 Press DAB/TUNER repeatedly to select [DAB+].
- 2 Press **I**◄**/**▶►**I** to select **[Manual Tune]**.
- 3 Press ENTER to confirm.

- 4 Press **I**←**/**→**I** to navigate DAB+ radio stations.
- **5** Press **ENTER** to confirm.

## Program DAB+ radio stations manually

You can program a maximum of 30 preset DAB+ radio stations.

#### Show DAB+ information

- 1 Tune to a DAB+ radio station.

  - → Ensemble Name
  - → Time
  - → Channel and frequency
  - → Bit rate and audio status
  - → Signal error rate

#### Use DAB+ menu

1 In the DAB+ mode, press **MENU** to enter the DAB+ menu.

- 2 Press I◀◀/▶▶I to scroll the menu options:
  - [Station list]
  - [Full scan]
  - [Manual tune]
  - [DRC] (dynamic range control)
  - [Prune]
  - [System]
- 3 To select an option, press ENTER.
- 4 Repeat step 2-3 if sub-option is available under one option.

#### Full scan

Full scan is used to perform a wide range of DAB+ radio search.

- 1 In the DAB+ mode, press **MENU** to enter the menu options.
- Press I repeatedly until [Full scan] is displayed.
- 3 Press ENTER to confirm the selection.

  → Full scan starts automatically.

#### Manual tune

With this feature, you can tune to a specific channel/frequency manually. In addition to antenna orientation for better radio reception, the optimal reception can also be obtained with this feature.

- 1 In the DAB+ mode, press MENU to display the "Manual tune" option.
- 2 Press ENTER to confirm the selection.
  - → The display shows a channel and its frequency.
- 3 Press I◀◀/▶▶ repeatedly until the desired channel/frequency appears.
- 4 Press **ENTER** to confirm the selection.



- You may press **DISPLAY** to change the service information on the display.
- You may adjust the position of the antenna to obtain the optimal signal strength.
- Press MENU to exit manual tune function.

#### DRC

Dynamic range control (DRC) adds or removes a degree of compensation for the differences in the dynamic range between radio stations.

- [DRC off] (DRC is switched off.)
- [DRC high] (DRC is switched on; the default setting recommended for noisy environment.)
- [DRC low] (DRC is set to half normal level)

#### Prune

With this feature, you can clear all the invalid stations from the station list.

- 1 In the DAB+ mode, press **MENU** to enter the menu options.
- Press ► repeatedly until [Prune] is displayed.
- 3 Press ENTER to confirm the selection.→ [Y] or [N] is displayed.
- 4 Press I◀◀▶▶I to switch between [Y] and [N].
- **5** Press **ENTER** to confirm.

#### System

With this feature, you can:

- · know the software version of the unit
- 1 In the DAB+ mode, press **MENU** to enter the menu options.
- 2 Press **I**◄♦♦♦ repeatedly until **[System]** is displayed.

## Listen to FM radio

#### Tune to a radio station

- Press ◄◄/►► to tune to a specific frequency.
  - → Play starts automatically.



 You can press MODE/SCAN to tune to the next station with strong reception automatically.

## Program radio stations automatically

You can program a maximum of 30 preset radio stations (FM).

- 1 In the tuner mode, press and hold MODE/SCAN to activate automatic program mode.
  - → All available stations are programmed in the order of waveband reception strength.
  - → The first programmed radio station is broadcast automatically.

## Program radio stations manually

You can program a maximum of 30 preset radio stations (FM).

**1** Tune to a radio station.

- 2 Press PROG/CLOCK SET to activate program mode.
- 3 Press ▲/▼ to allocate a number to this radio station, then press and hold PROG/CLOCK SET to confirm.
- **4** Repeat the above steps to program other stations.



Tip

 To overwrite a programmed station, store another station in its place.

### Select a preset radio station

- 1 In tuner mode, press ▲/▼ to select a preset number.
- 2 Press ►II/ENTER to confirm.
- You can also press the numeric buttons to select a preset number directly.
- You can press **II/ENTER** to switch between mono and stereo signals.



Tip

- Position the antenna as far as possible from TV, VCR or other radiation source.
- For optimal reception, fully extend and adjust the position of the antenna.

## Pause/resume play

## Skip to a track

#### For CD:

  - To select a track directly, you can also press a key on the numerical keypad.

#### For MP3 disc and USB:

- 1 Press ▲▼to select an album or a folder.
- 2 Press ► to select a track or a file.

## Search within a track

- 1 During play, press and hold I◀◀/▶▶ .
- 2 Release to resume normal play.

## Select repeat/shuffle play options

- 1 During play, press MODE/SCAN repeatedly to select a repeat option or the shuffle play mode.
  - [+ONE]: the current track is played repeatedly.
  - [+ALB]: all tracks in the current album are played repeatedly.
  - [\hatharpoonup\delta\L]: all tracks are played repeatedly.
  - [SHUF]: all tracks are played randomly.

2 To resume normal play, press MODE/SCAN repeatedly until no option is displayed.

## Program tracks



#### Note

 You can program tracks only when the play stops.

You can program a maximum of 40 tracks.

- 1 Press PROG/CLOCK SET to activate the program mode.
  - $\rightarrow$  [P] is displayed.
- 2 For MP3/WMA tracks, press ▲/▼ to select an album.

## Set the sleep timer

This unit can switch to standby automatically after a set period of time.

#### To deactivate sleep timer

#### No sound

• Disconnect and reconnect the AC power plug, then turn on the unit again.

#### No disc detected

- Insert a disc.
- Check if the disc is inserted with the print side facing inward.
- Wait until the moisture condensation at the lens has cleared.
- Replace or clean the disc.
- Use a finalized CD or correct format disc.

#### Remote control does not work

- Before pressing any function button, first select the correct source with the remote control instead of the main unit.
- Reduce the distance between the remote control and the unit.
- Insert the battery with its polarities (+/– signs) aligned as indicated.
