- 5 To start playback of your disc programme, press ►II.

#### Note:


 If you wish, you can add further tracks to your current program.

## **Erasing the programme**

You can erase the programme by:

- pressing once in the STOP mode;
- pressing twice during playback;
- opening the CD compartment;
- selecting another sound source
  - → [LER] appears on the display.

## **Tuning to radio stations**

- 1 Press **TUNER** on the system or **TUN** on the remote control to select **TUNER** source.
- 2 Press **TUNER** on the system or **TUN** on the remote control once or more to select desired waveband: FM or AM.
- 3 Press **TUNING+/-** (or **◄** / **>>** on the remote control) to tune to a desired radio frequency.
- You can also press and hold TUNING+/- (or
   ◄ / ▶ on the remote control) for three seconds to search for a radio station.
  - → 5EAr [H is displayed.

#### Note:

The system is equipped with a built-in AM antenna and a fixed FM antenna. For optimal AM reception, adjust the position of the main set until the strongest signal is found. For optimal FM reception, fully extend and adjust the position of the FM antenna until the strongest signal is found.

### **Programming radio stations**

You can store up to 20 radio stations in the memory manually or automatically (Auto store).

## **Automatic programming**

In tuner mode, press and hold **PROGRAM** on the remote control for more than 2 seconds to activate programming.

- → All available stations are programmed in the order of waveband reception strength.
- To cancel the programming, press ■.

#### Manual programming

- 1 Tune to your desired station (refer to "Tuning to radio stations").
- 2 Press PROGRAM to activate programming.
  → □ I is displayed and PROG flashes on the display.
- 3 Press ALBUM/PRESET +/- to allocate a preset number.
- 4 Press **PROGRAM** again to confirm the setting.
- **5** Repeat the above four steps to store other stations
- You can override a preset station by storing another frequency in its place.

## Tuning to preset radio stations

 Press ALBUM/PRESET +/- until the desired preset station is displayed.

## **Using MP3 LINK**

- 1 Use the audio cable to connect the system's MP3 LINK jack (3.5 mm, located on the front panel) to the headphone jack or AUDIO OUT on an external device (such as an MP3 player, or CD player).
- 2 Press MP3 LINK to select MP3 LINK.


  → "MP∃ LINK" is displayed.

## Using an external device

- 1 Connect the system's AUX IN jacks to the AU-DIO OUT jacks on another audio/visual device (such as a VCR, Laser Disc player or cassette desk).
- Press AUX IN on the set or AUX on the remote control to select external equipment.
   → "AUX In" is displayed.

#### Note:

- All the sound control features (DSC or DBB, for example) are available for selection.
- Refer to the operating instructions for the connected equipment for details.





## **Setting the clock**

- 1 In standby mode, press and hold CLOCK/ DISPLAY.
  - → The clock digits for the hours flash.
- 2 Press  $| \blacktriangleleft | / \triangleright |$  on the system (or  $| \blacktriangleleft | > |$  on the remote) to set the hours.
- 3 Press CLOCK/DISPLAY.
  - → The clock digits for the minutes flash.
- 4 Press ◄ / ► (or ◄ / ► on the remote) on the system to set the minutes.
- 5 Press CLOCK/DISPLAY to confirm the time.

To view the clock in active mode

Press CLOCK/DISPLAY.

#### Note:

- If the clock has not been set, -:- will be displayed.
- If the last selected source is MP3-LINK/
   AUX, you cannot use the remote control to set the clock in standby mode.

### Setting the sleep timer

The sleep timer enables the system to switch off by itself after a set period of time.

- 1 In active mode, press SLEEP on the remote control repeatedly until the desired timer option appears.
  - ⇒ Selections are as follows (time in minutes):  $5LPDFF \rightarrow 5LPIDD \rightarrow 5LPDD \rightarrow 5LPDD$ ⇒  $5LPDD \rightarrow 5LPDD \rightarrow 5LPDD$
  - → Display shows <sub>zz</sub> if activated, and disappears if deactivated.
- **2** To cancel the sleep function, either press **SLEEP** on the remote control once or more until "51 PUFF" appears, or press (b) to switch to standby mode.

To check the remaining length of time after sleep timer is activated

• Press **SLEEP** once.

## Clock/Timer

## **S**etting the timer

 The system can switch on to DISC, TUNER, or MP3 LINK mode automatically at a preset time, serving as an alarm to wake you up.

#### **IMPORTANT!**

- Before setting the timer, ensure that the clock is set correctly.
- The timer will always be switched on after it has been set.
- The volume of the timer will increase gradually from the minimum level to the last tuned volume level (If the last tuned volume level is less than 15, it will increase gradually from the minimum level to 15).
- 1 Press **TIMER** on the remote control.
  - → The clock digits for the hours flash.
- 2 Press  $| \blacktriangleleft | \rangle > |$  on the system (or  $| \blacktriangleleft | > |$  on the remote) to set the hours.
- 3 Press TIMER again.
  - → The clock digits for the minutes flash.
- 4 Press ◄ / ▶ on the system (or ◄ / ▶ on the remote) to set the minutes.
- **5** Press **TIMER** to confirm the time.
  - → The timer is now activated and display shows ♠.

#### To deactivate the timer,

- Press TIMER once or more.
  - → <a> disappears if the timer is deactivated.</a>

#### Notes:

- When the preset time is reached, the last selected source will be played automatically.
- During timer setting, if no button is pressed within 6-7 seconds, the system will exit timer setting mode automatically.
- If the last selected source is MP3-LINK/AUX, you cannot use the remote control to set the timer.


## **Maintenance**

#### **Cleaning the Cabinet**

 Use a soft cloth slightly moistened with a mild detergent solution. Do not use a solution containing alcohol, spirits, ammonia or abrasives.

#### **Cleaning Discs**

- When a disc becomes dirty, clean it with a cleaning cloth.
   Wipe the disc from the centre out.
- Do not use solvents such as benzene, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or antistatic spray intended for analogue records.



After prolonged use, dirt or dust may accumulate at the disc lens. To ensure good playback quality, clean the disc lens with Philips CD Lens Cleaner or any commercially available cleaner.
 Follow the instructions supplied with cleaner.
