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# 1 Important

## Introduction

With this clock radio, you can:


- listen to FM radio.
- know the time.
- wake up to buzzer alarm or radio
- set two alarms to ring at different time.

# Overview of the main unit



- (1) TUNING
  - Tune to a radio station.
- 2 REPEAT ALARM/SLEEP OFF
  - Repeat the alarm.
  - Disable the sleep timer.

- (3) SLEEP
  - Set the sleep timer.
- 4 +/-
  - Adjust the time of clock, alarm timer and sleep timer.

- (5) AL1, AL2
  - **RADIO**: Set the current radio station as the alarm source.
  - **BUZ**: Set the buzzer as the alarm source.
  - **OFF**: Turn off the alarm timer.
- 6 VOL
  - · Adjust the volume level of radio.
- 7 Display panel
- (8) AL RESET
  - · Stop the alarm.
- (9) RADIO ON/OFF
  - Turn the radio on or off.
- (10) BRIGHTNESS CONTROL
  - Adjust brightness of the display panel.
- (11) Clock Control
  - SET TIME: Activate clock setting.
  - **SET AL1/AL2**: Activate alarm timer setting; display the set alarm time.
  - CLOCK: Display the clock time.
- (12) FM ANT
  - Attached FM wire antenna.

# 3 Get started



### Caution

 Use of controls or adjustments or performance of procedures other than herein may result in hazardous radiation exposure or other unsafe operation.

## Connect power



### Caution

- Risk of product damage! Ensure that the power supply voltage corresponds to the voltage printed on the back or the underside of the apparatus.
- Risk of electric shock! When you unplug the AC power cord, always pull the plug from the socket. Never pull the cord.
- Before connecting the AC power cord, ensure you have completed all other connections.
- Connect the power adapter to the power socket.

### Set clock

- 1 Switch Clock Control to SET TIME.
- Press + / to set the clock time (24-hour system).
- 3 Switch Clock Control to CLOCK.



#### Tip

- Press and hold + to fast increase the time digits.
- Press to decrease the time digits one by one.

# 4 Listen to radio

## Tune to a radio station

- 1 Press RADIO ON/OFF to turn on the radio.
- 2 Adjust **TUNING** slowly to tune to a radio station.
  - To turn off the radio, press RADIO ON/OFF again.

# Adjust the volume level

Rotate VOL clockwise or anti-clockwise.

# 5 Set the alarm timer

### Set the alarm time

You can set two separate alarms. For the alarm tone, you can select the buzzer or FM radio.



Note

- Before you start, make sure that the clock time has been set correctly.
- Switch Clock Control to AL1 or AL2 (on SET AL1/AL2).
- 2 Press +/- to set the alarm time.
- 3 Switch Clock Control to CLOCK.

## Turn on the alarm timer



Note

- · Make sure that the alarm time has been set successfully.
- Switch AL1/AL2 to BUZ or RADIO.
  - → A / A appears.
  - → The buzzer or FM radio is set for alarm tone.

## View the alarm time

- Switch Clock Control to AL1 or AL2 (on SET AL1/AL2).
  - → or appears.
  - → The preset alarm time is displayed.

## Repeat alarm

- When the alarm rings, press REPEAT ALARM/SLEEP OFF.
  - → The alarm repeats ringing 9 minutes later.

# Stop alarm ring

- When the alarm rings, press AL RESET.
  - → The alarm stops while the alarm settings remain.

### Turn off the alarm timer

- Switch AL1/AL2 to OFF.
  - → ♠ / ♠ disappears.

# 6 Other features

## Set the sleep timer

You can set the clock radio to turn off automatically after a certain period of time (0 to 59 minutes).



Note

- Before the setup, ensure Clock Control is switched to CLOCK and the radio is turned off.
- 1 Press and hold **SLEEP**.
  - → The time digits count down from 0:59 to 0:00.
  - → The radio turns on.
- Press + / repeatedly to adjust the time.
- Release **SLEEP** when the desired time digits are displayed.

### To turn off the sleep timer:

Press REPEAT ALARM/SLEEP OFF.

# Adjust display brightness

- Switch BRIGHTNESS CONTROL to HI or LO.
  - **HI**: High brightness
  - LO: Low brightness

### No power

### Poor radio reception

- Increase the distance between the apparatus and yourTV or other radiation sources.
- Fully extend the antenna.

### Timer does not work

- Set the clock correctly.
- Switch on the timer.

### Clock/timer setting erased

- Power has been interrupted or the power plug has been disconnected.
- Reset the clock/timer



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
