
3 Connect

Connect speakers






- Insert the stripped portion of each speaker wire into the socket completely.
- For optimal sound, use the supplied speakers only.
- Connect only speakers with impedance that is the same or higher than the supplied speakers. Refer to the Specifications section of this manual.
- 1 For the right speaker, find the sockets on the main unit marked 'RIGHT'.
- 2 Insert the red wire to the red (+) socket. To insert each speaker wire:
 - (1) Hold down the socket flap.
 - Insert the speaker wire fully.
 - 3 Release the socket flap.



- 3 Insert the black wire into the black (-) socket.
- 4 For the left speaker, find the sockets on the main unit marked 'LEFT'.

Connect power



Caution

- Before connecting the AC power cord, make sure that you have completed all other connections.


Prepare the remote control

Caution

To insert the remote control battery:

- 1 Open the battery compartment.
- 2 Insert 2 AAA batteries (not supplied) with correct polarity (+/-) as indicated.
- **3** Close the battery compartment.





- If you are not going to use the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries.
- Do not use old and new or different types of batteries in combination.

Set clock

- 1 Press and hold CLOCK/DISPLAY to activate the clock setting mode.
 - → The 12 hour or 24 hour format is displayed.
- 2 Press **PROG** repeatedly to select 12 hour or 24 hour format.
- Press CLOCK/DISPLAY to confirm.
 → The hour digits are displayed and begin to blink.
- 4 Press I◄/►I to set the hour.
- 5 Press CLOCK/DISPLAY to confirm.
 → The minute digits are displayed and begin to blink.
- 6 Press I I to set the minute.
- 7 Press CLOCK/DISPLAY to confirm.

Turn on

Switch to standby

 - → The clock (if set) appears on the display panel.

Play options

Skip to a track

1 During disc palyback, press I∢/►I to select another track.

Search within a track

- 1 During play, press and hold ◀◀/▶▶ .

Repeat play

Play all tracks or an album repeatedly

- 1 During play, press **REP ALL** repeatedly to select:
 - **[REP]**: Play the current track repeatedly.
 - [REP ALL]: all tracks are played repeatedly.
- 2 To return to normal play, press REP ALL repeatedly until repeat mode is no longer displayed.

Random play

- 1 Press SHUF.
 - → [SHUF] (shuffle) is displayed: all tracks are played randomly.

2 To return to normal play, press SHUF again.

- Note

- The repeat and shuffle functions cannot be activated at the same time.
- Shuffle play cannot be selected when you play programmed tracks.

Program tracks

You can program a maximum of 20 tracks.

- 1 At CD mode, in the stop position, press PROG to activate the program mode.
 - → [PROG] (program) blinks on the display.
- 2 Press I∢/►I to select a track number, then press PROG to confirm.
- **3** Repeat steps 2 to 3 to select and store all tracks to program.
- 4 Press ►II to play the programmed tracks.
 - → During play, [PROG] (program) is displayed.
 - To erase the program, in the stop position, press■.

6 Adjust volume level and sound effect

Adjust volume level

1 During play, press VOL +/- to increase/ decrease the volume level.

Select a preset sound effect

- 1 During play, press DSC repeatedly to select:
 - [POP]
 - [JAZZ]
 - [CLASSIC]
 - [ROCK]

Enhance bass

- 1 During play, press **DBB** to turn on or off dynamic bass enhancement.
 - → If DBB is activated, DBB is displayed.

Mute sound

1 During play, press **MUTE** to mute/unmute sound.

7 Listen to radio

Tune to a radio station

- 1 Press TUN to select radio source.
- 2 Press and hold ◀◀/►> for more than 2 seconds.
 - → [SEARCH] is displayed.
 - → The radio tunes to a station with strong reception automatically.
- **3** Repeat step 2 to tune to more stations.
 - To tune to a weak station, press ◄
 /▶ repeatedly until you find optimal reception.

Program radio stations automatically

You can program a maximum of 20 preset FM radio stations.

- 1 In the tuner mode, press and hold **PROG** for 2 seconds to activate automatic program mode.
 - → [AUTO] is displayed.
 - → All available stations are programmed in the order of waveband reception strength.
 - → The first programmed radio station is broadcast automatically.

Program radio stations manually

You can program a maximum of 20 preset radio stations.

- **1** Tune to a radio station. (See "Tune to a radio station" section.)
- 2 Press PROG to activate program mode.
 → [PROG] blinks on the display.

- 3 Press PRESET +/- to allocate a number to this radio station, then press PROG to confirm.
 - → The preset number and the frequency of the preset station are displayed.
- **4** Repeat the above steps to program other stations.



• To overwrite a programmed station, store another station in its place.

Select a preset radio station

1 In tuner mode, press **PRESET +/-** to select a preset number.

 - → The hour digits are displayed and begin to blink.
- 5 Press I∢/►I to set the hour.
- 6 Press TIMER to confirm.
 - → The minute digits are displayed and begin to blink.
- 7 Press $| \langle \rangle |$ to set the minute.
- 8 Press TIMER to confirm.
 - \hookrightarrow The timer is set and activated.

Activate and deactivate alarm timer

- 1 Press TIMER ON/OFF repeatedly to activate or deactivate timer.
 - If timer is activated, the display shows ⊕.
 - ↦ If timer is deactivated, ⊕ disappears.

- Alarm timer is not available in MP3 LINK mode.
- If DISC source is selected and the track cannot be played, tuner is activated automatically.

Set the sleep timer

This unit can switch to standby automatically after a set period of time.

- 1 When the unit is turned on, press **SLEEP** repeatedly to select a set period of time (in minutes).
 - When sleep timer is activated, the display shows ₂^{z^z}.

To deactivate sleep timer

- 1 Press SLEEP repeatedly until "0" is displayed.
 - ➡ When sleep timer is deactivated, z^{z^z} disappears.

Listen to an external device

You can listen to an MP3 player through this unit.

10 Troubleshooting

Caution

• Never remove the casing of this apparatus.

To keep the warranty valid, never try to repair the system yourself.

If you encounter problems when using this apparatus, check the following points before requesting service. If the problem remains unsolved, go to the Philips web site (www. philips.com/welcome). When you contact Philips, ensure that the apparatus is nearby and the model number and serial number are available.

No power

- Ensure that the AC power cord of the unit is connected properly.
- Ensure that there is power at the AC outlet.
- As a power-saving feature, the system switches off automatically 15 minutes after track play reaches the end and no control is operated.

No sound or poor sound

- Adjust the volume.
- Disconnect the headphones.
- Check that the speakers are connected correctly.
- Check if the stripped speaker wires are clamped.

Left and right sound outputs reversed

• Check the speaker connections and location.

No response from the unit

• Disconnect and reconnect the AC power plug, then turn on the system again.

Remote control does not work

- Before you press any function button, first select the correct source with the remote control instead of the main unit.
- Reduce the distance between the remote control and the unit.
- Insert the battery with its polarities (+/- signs) aligned as indicated.
- Replace the battery.
- Aim the remote control directly at the sensor on the front of the unit.

No disc detected

- Insert a disc.
- Check if the disc is inserted upside down.
- Wait until the moisture condensation at the lens has cleared.
- Replace or clean the disc.
- Use a finalized CD or correct format disc.

Poor radio reception

- Increase the distance between the unit and your TV or VCR.
- Fully extend the antenna.

Timer does not work

- Set the clock correctly.
- Switch on the timer.

Clock/timer setting erased

- Power has been interrupted or the power cord has been disconnected.
- Reset the clock/timer.





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
