- Place the DVD micro theater near TV.






Connect FM antenna

Connect the supplied FM antenna to the **FM ANTENNA** socket on the unit.



Connect video/audio cables

Select the best video connection that the TV can support.

Option 1: HDMI jack

Prepare the remote control



Set clock



Display play information

During play, press **RDS/INFO** repeatedly to display play information.

Zoom in/out image

During video play, press and hold ▼ (**ZOOM**) to zoom in/out the image.

- → Zoom in: 2x, 3x, 4x
- → Zoom out: 1/2, 1/3, 1/4
- When the image is zoomed in, you can press ▲ / ▼ / ◀ / ▶ to pan through the image.

If no radio station is stored, the unit can store radio stations automatically.

- 1 Press RADIO.
 - → [AUTO INSTALL PRESS PLAY, STOP CANCEL] (auto install - press play, stop cancel) (press ► II to start automatic installation, or press II to cancel) is displayed.
- 2 Press ►II.
 - → The unit automatically stores radio stations with sufficient signal strength.
 - → After all available radio stations are stored, the first stored radio station is broadcast automatically.

Tune to a radio station

- In radio mode, press and hold ◀/▶ (◀◀ /▶▶) (or |◀◀/▶➡) on the main unit)for over 3 seconds.
 - → [SEARCHING] (searching) is displayed.
 - → The radio tunes to a station with strong reception automatically.

To tune to a weak station:

Program radio stations manually

- Insert a disc.
