 - [HDMI Deep Color]: Display colors with more shades and hues when the video content is recorded in Deep Color and the TV supports this feature.
 - [Picture Settings]: Select a predefined color setting.



- If you change a setting, make sure that the TV supports the new setting.
- For settings related to HDMI, the TV must be connected through HDMI.
- For the composite connection (via the VIDEO connector), select a video resolution of 480i/576i or 480p/576p under [HDMIVideo] to enable video output.

Sound

1 Press 希.

Main unit

The buttons on this player do not work.

 Disconnect this player from the power supply for a few minutes, and then reconnect.

Picture

No picture.

- For the composite connection (via the VIDEO connector) to the TV, on this player select a video resolution of 480i/576i or 480p/576p under [HDMI Video] to enable video output.

No picture on HDMI connection.
