

Connect power

Caution

Set time and date

Time and date manually

- 1 Dock the iPod/Phone on the unit.
- 2 Open the iPod/Phone.
- 3 Time and date information on the iPod/Phone transfers to the unit automatically.

To set time and date manually

- 1 In standby mode, press and hold DATE • AUTO TUNE/TIME SET for 7 seconds.
- 2 Press TUNING +/- or ►◀► to select 12/24 hour format.
- 3 Press DATE • AUTO TUNE/TIME SET to confirm.
- 4 The hour digits begin to blink.
- 5 Press DATE • AUTO TUNE/TIME SET to confirm.
- 6 Repeat steps 4-5 to set the minute, year/month and day.

Turn on

- 1 Press POWER.
- 2 The unit switches to the last selected source.

Switch to standby


- 1 Press POWER again to switch the unit to standby mode.
- 2 The time and date [if set] appear on the display panel.


