

#### Important notes for users in the U.K.

#### Mains plug

This apparatus is fitted with an approved 13 Amp plug. To change a fuse in this type of plug proceed as follows:

- Remove fuse cover and fuse.
- Tix new fuse which should be a BS1362 3 Amp, A.S.T.A. or BSI approved type.
- (3) Refit the fuse cover.

If the fitted plug is not suitable for your socket outlets, it should be cut off and an appropriate plug fitted in its place.

If the mains plug contains a fuse, this should have a value of 3 Amp. If a plug without a fuse is used, the fuse at the distribution board should not be greater than 3 Amp.

Note: The severed plug must be disposed off to avoid a possible shock hazard should it be inserted into a 13 Amp socket elsewhere.

#### How to connect a plug

The wires in the mains lead are coloured with the following code: blue = neutral (N), brown = live (L).

As these colours may not correspond with the colour markings identifying the terminals in your plug, proceed as follows:

• Connect the blue wire to the terminal marked N or colourse.

- Connect the blue wire to the terminal marked N or coloured black.
- Connect the brown wire to the terminal marked L or coloured red.
- Do not connect either wire to the earth terminal in the plug, marked E (or ±) or coloured green (or green and yellow).

Before replacing the plug cover, make certain that the cord grip is clamped over the sheath of the lead - not simply over the two wires.

# Connect power



#### Caution

Connect one end of the AC adaptor to the DC IN socket on the main unit



Connect the other end of the AC adaptor to the wall outlet.



#### Set time and date

- In standby mode, press and hold TIME SET/AUTO SCAN for 2 seconds.
  - The hour digits are displayed and begin to blink.
  - Press TUNING +/- to set the hour
  - Press TIME SET/AUTO SCAN to confirm
  - The minute digits are displayed and begin to blink.

  - Repeat steps 2-3 to set the minute, year, month, day and 12/24 hour format

#### Turn on

- Press POWER.
  - → The unit switches to the last selected source.

#### Switch to standby

- 1 Press POWER again to switch the unit to standby mode.



- After being idled for 15 minutes in standby mode, the screen turns dim automatically.
- To light up the screen, press any button.

## Adjust volume

1 During play, press VOL +/- to increase/decrease the volume.



## Compatible iPod/iPhone


- Apple iPod and iPhone models with a 30-pin dock connector:
- iPod classic, iPod touch, iPod nano, iPod 5th generation (video), iPod with color display, iPod mini.
  - iPhone, iPhone 3G.

# Load the iPod/iPhone

1 Place the iPod/iPhone in the dock.



2 Turn the adjuster to fit the iPod/iPhone.



# Remove the iPod/iPhone 1 Pull the iPod/iPhone out of the dock

#### Listen to the iPod/iPhone

1 Ensure that the iPod/iPhone is loaded correctly.

2 Press **SOURCE** repeatedly to select iPod/iPhone source.

The connected iPod/iPhone plays automatically.
To pause/resume play, press ►■

To skip to a track, press I◀◀▶►I.

## Charge the iPod/iPhone

When the unit is connected to power, the docked iPod/iPhone begins to charge.

# Play from an external device

You can also listen to an external audio device through this unit.

- 1 Press **SOURCE** repeatedly to select MP3 link source.
- 2 Connect the supplied MP3 link cable to:
  - the MP3 LINK jack (3.5mm) on the back of the unit.
  - the headphone jack on an external device.
  - Start to play the device (see the device user manual).

· Only FM radio reception is available on this unit.

#### Tune to a radio station



Tip

- Position the antenna as far as possible from TV, VCR or other radiation source.
  - For optimal reception, fully extend and adjust the position of the
- 1 Press **SOURCE** repeatedly to select FM tuner.
- Press and hold TUNING +/- for more than 2 seconds
  - → [Srch] (search) is displayed.
  - → The radio tunes to a station with strong reception automatically.
- 3 Repeat step 2 to tune to more stations.
  - To tune to a weak station, press TUNING +/- repeatedly until you find optimal reception.

# Program radio stations automatically

You can program a maximum of 20 preset radio stations.

- In the tuner mode, press and hold TIME SET/AUTO SCAN for more than 2 seconds to activate automatic program mode.
- → [AUTO] (auto) is displayed and begins to blink. All available stations are programmed in the order of waveband reception strength.
  - → The first programmed radio station is broadcast automatically.

# Program radio stations manually

You can program a maximum of 20 preset radio stations.

Press TIME SET/AUTO SCAN to activate the program mode.

Tune to a radio station

- Press PRESET +/- to select a number.
- Press TIME SET/AUTO SCAN to confirm.
- → The preset number and the frequency of the preset station are displayed.
- 5 Repeat the above steps to program other stations.



To overwrite a programmed station, store another station in its place.

Press PRESET +/- to select a preset number.

# Other features

#### Set the alarm timer

You can set two alarms which go off at different time.

- Ensure that you have set the clock correctly.
- 2 Press and hold ALM 1 or ALM 2 for 2 seconds.
  - ♣ I or ♣ 2 and hour digits begin to blink.
  - Press TUNING +/- repeatedly to set the hour.
- 3 4 Press AI M 1 or AI M 2 to confirm
  - → ♣ I or ♣ 2 and minute digits begin to blink.
- 5 Repeat steps 3-4 to set the minute.
- 6 Repeat steps 3-4 to select whether to ring alarm on weekdays or at weekend
- 7 Repeat steps 3-4 to select an alarm sound source.
- 8 Repeat steps 3-4 to set the alarm volume.

#### Activate and deactivate the alarm timer

- Press ALM 1 or ALM 2 repeatedly to activate or deactivate the timer
  - If the timer is activated, 4 or 4 is displayed.
  - If the timer is deactivated, \$\black \| \text{ or } \$\black 2 \text{ disappears.}

#### Repeat alarm

- When the alarm rings, press REPEAT ALARM/BRIGHTNESS CONTROL
  - The alarm repeats ringing minutes later.

You can press TUNING+/- to adjust interval to repeat alarm.

#### Stop alarm ring

- 1 When the alarm rings, press the corresponding **ALM 1** or **ALM** 
  - → The alarm stops but the alarm settings remain.

#### View the alarm settings

1 Press ALM 1 or ALM 2.

## Set the sleep timer

This unit can switch to standby automatically after a set period of time.

- Press SLEEP repeatedly to select a set period of time (in minutes).
  - When the sleep timer is activated, the display shows z<sup>z</sup>.

#### To deactivate sleep timer

- 1 Press SLEEP repeatedly until [SLP OFF] (SLP off) is displayed.
  → When the sleep timer is deactivated, z<sup>2</sup> disappears on the
  - When the sleep timer is deactivated, <sup>2</sup> disappears on the display.



When the sleep timer is activated, the volume will gradually decrease.

# Adjust display brightness Press BRIGHTNESS CONTROL repeatedly to select different

levels of display brightness.

## No power

Ensure that the AC power plug of the unit is connected properly.

#### No sound

Adjust the volume.

#### Poor radio reception

Increase the distance between the unit and your TV or VCR.
