- Ensure that you have made the necessary AV connections (see 'Connect AV devices' on page 14).
- 1 Press AV 1, AV 2, AV FRONT or COAX to select an AV source.

Play from USB





Note

- Ensure that the USB device contains playable music (see 'USB playability information' on page 27).
- 1 Flip open the cover on the front panel.
- 2 Insert the USB plug of a USB device into the socket.
- Press USB to select the USB source.→ The total number of tracks is displayed.
- 4 Press PRESET/ALB/▲▼ to select a folder.
- 5 Pressl ✓ ► I to select a file.

5 Control USB play

Skip to a track

- 1 Press PRESET/ALB/▲▼ to select an album (folder).
- Press **I** I to select a track (file).

Pause/resume play

1 During play, press OK / ►II to pause/ resume play.

Search within a track

- 1 During play, press and hold ◀◀/▶▶.
- 2 Release to resume normal play.

Repeat play

- 1 During play, press **REPEAT** repeatedly to select:
 - → [REPEAT] (repeat): play the current track repeatedly.

Adjust subwoofer volume

1 In AV1, AV2, AV FRONT or COAXIAL mode, press MUSIC MODE/SUBW VOL to adjust the subwoofer volume.

- 1 During play, press **GAME SOUND** repeatedly to select:
 - [SHOOTING] (sporting)
 - [SPORT] (sport)

 - [NORMAL] (normal)

Select a movie sound effect

- 1 During play, press MOVIE SOUND repeatedly to select:
 - [DRAMA] (drama)
 - **[SCIENCE FICTION]** (science fiction)
 - [ACTION] (action)
 - [CONCERT] (concert)
 - [NORMAL] (normal)

Select a music mode (for USB only)

- 1 During USB play, press MUSIC MODE/ SUBW VOL repeatedly to select:
 - **[POP]** (pop)
 - [JAZZ] (jazz)
 - [ROCK] (rock)
 - [CLASSIC] (classic)
 - [NORMAL] (normal)

Mute sound

1 During play, press MUTE to mute/unmute sound.

7 Tune to FM radio stations

- 1 Ensure that you have connected and fully extended the supplied FM antenna.
- 2 Press TUNER.
- 3 Press and hold ◀◀/▶▶.
- 4 When [SEARCH] (search) is displayed, release the button.
 - → The FM tuner tunes to a station with strong reception automatically.
- **5** Repeat steps 3 and 4 to find more stations.

To tune to a weak station:

1 Press **◄◄/▶** repeatedly until you find optimal reception.

Program radio stations automatically



Note

- You can program a maximum of 20 preset radio stations.
- 1 Press PRESET/ALB/▲▼ to select a preset number to start programing.
- Press and hold **SET TIME/PROG** for 2 seconds to activate automatic programming.
 - → [AUTO] (auto) is displayed.
 - → All available stations are programmed in the order of waveband reception strength.
 - → The last programed radio station is played automatically.

Program radio stations manually



Program remote control

You can store a total of 12 most frequently used functions of other AV devices in the smart remote control. This feature allows you to use only one remote control to operate all of your AV devices.

By default, the remote control codes of a Philips TV are stored in the smart remote control. The available preset buttons are POWER, AV, ACH , AVOLV, MUTE and SLEEP.

1 Place the smart remote control (A) within 1mm-10mm distance from the other remote control (B).



- Press **LEARN** for 2 seconds to activate the learning mode.
 - → A blue indicator on the smart remote control (A) lights up.
- 3 Press the button on the other remote control (B) that is to be stored on the smart remote control (A).
 - → If the code is received successfully, the blue indicator flashes.
- 4 Press one of the white learning buttons on the smart remote control (A) to store the code of this button.

- → If the code is stored successfully, the indicator flashes green for 2 seconds, then turns blue again.
- 5 Repeat steps 3 and 4 to program more buttons on the smart remote control (A).
- 6 Press **LEARN** to exit the learning mode.

• During the learning process, the normal remote control functions are disabled.

Rename an AV source

- 1 Press AV 1, AV 2, AV FRONT or COAX to select an AV source you want to rename.
 - → The default name of the selected sound source is displayed.
- 2 Press **SETUP** to activate the renaming mode.
 - → The default name of the selected sound source flashes for 4 seconds.
- Within 2 seconds, press PRESET/ALB/▲

 ▼ to select a name that matches the AV
 device connected with the current socket
 from:
 - [TV]
 - [DVD]
 - [GAME] (game)
 - [SET TOP BOX] (set top box)
 - **[CABLE]** (cable)
 - **[SATELLITE]** (satellite)

Enable/disable automatic on/ standby

This feature only applies to AV devices or TV with audio connection to the soundbar. The soundbar can detect the state of AV devices that are connected through the audio connectors.

When automatic on/standby is enabled:

• If an AV device turns on, the soundbar turns on automatically.

To enable

When the soundbar is turned on, press and hold **SOURCE** on the front panel for more than 2 seconds.

To disable

When the soundbar is turned on, press and hold **SOURCE** on the front panel for more than 2 seconds again.

Set the alarm timer

- 1 Ensure that you have set the clock correctly.
- 2 In standby mode, press and hold **TIMER**.
 - → The hour digits are displayed and begin to blink.
- 3 Press + VOL to set the hour.
 - → The minute digits are displayed and begin to blink.
- 4 Press + VOL to set the minute.
- 5 Press **TIMER** to confirm.
- To activate the wake-up timer, press + VOL to select [ON] (on).

 - The soundbar turns on automatically at the set time and switches to the last selected source.
- To deactivate the alarm timer, select **[OFF]** (off) at step 6.

Set the sleep timer

- 1 When the soundbar is turned on, press SLEEP repeatedly to select a set period of time (in minutes).
 - → The soundbar turns off automaticaly after the set period of time.

No power

- Ensure that the AC adaptor of the main unit is connected properly.
- Ensure that there is power at the AC outlet.

No sound

- Adjust the volume.
- Check that the speakers are connected correctly.
- If there is no sound in the USB mode, ensure that you have connected a USB device that contains playable music.
- If there is no sound in the AV mode, ensure that you have connected AV devices to the soundbar correctly.

Remote control does not work

- Before you press any function button, first select the source with the remote control.
- Reduce the distance between the remote control and the soundbar.
- Insert the batteries with its polarities (+/- signs) aligned as indicated.
- Replace the battery.
- Aim the remote control directly at the sensor on the front of the soundbar.

Wireless connection fails.

 Set up wireless connection manually (see 'Set up wireless connection manually' on page 19).

Poor radio reception

- Increase the distance between the soundbar and yourTV orVCR.
- Fully extend the FM antenna.
- Connect an outdoor FM antenna instead.

Cannot display some files in USB device

- The number of folders or files in the USB device has exceeded a certain limit. This phenomenon is not a malfunction.
- The formats of these files are not supported.

USB device not supported

• The USB device is incompatible with the soundbar. Try another one.

Timer does not work

- Set the clock correctly.
- Switch on the timer.

Clock/timer setting erased

- Power has been interrupted or the power cord has been disconnected.
- Reset the clock/timer.


Mount to a wall






1 Align the bracket in the chosen location on a wall. Use a pencil to mark the drilling positions.




2 Drill holes as marked.




3 Secure 2 supplied screws in the holes, but leave 5mm between the screw head and the wall.
