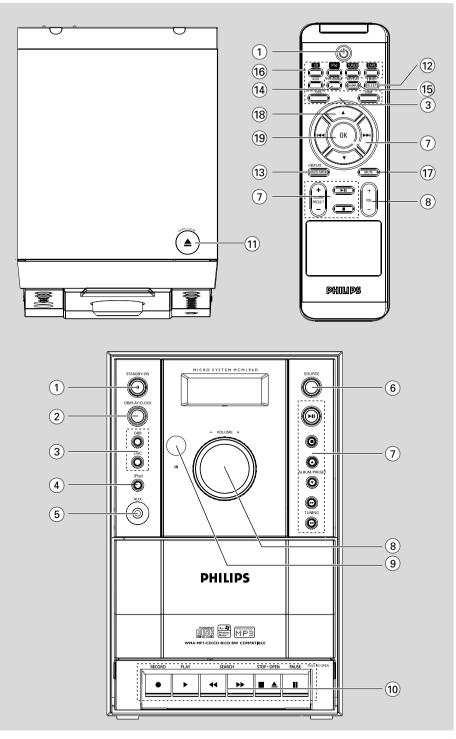

All unnecessary packaging has been omitted. We have tried to make the packaging easy to separate into three materials: cardboard (box), polystyrene foam (buffer) and polyethylene (bags, protective foam sheet).

Your system consists of materials which can be recycled and reused if disassembled by a specialized company. Please observe the local regulations regarding the disposal of packaging materials, exhausted batteries and old equipment.

Safety Information

- Before operating the system, check that the operating voltage indicated on the typeplate (or the voltage indication beside the voltage selector) of your system is identical with the voltage of your local power supply. If not, please consult your dealer.
- Place the system on a flat, hard and stable surface.
- The apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing.
- Install the unit near the AC outlet and where the AC power plug can be easily reached.

- Place the system in a location with adequate ventilation to prevent internal heat build-up in your system. Allow at least 10 cm (4 inches) clearance from the rear and the top of the unit and 5 cm (2 inches) from each side.

Hearing Safety

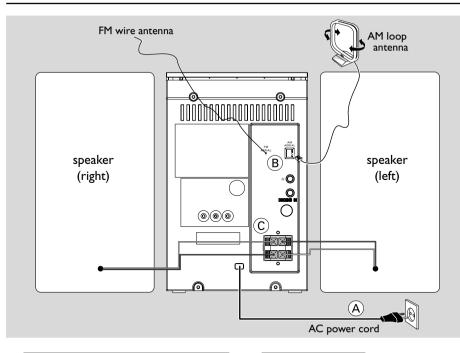

Preparations



Rear connections

The type plate is located at the rear of the system.

(A) Power

Before connecting the AC power cord to the wall outlet, ensure that all other connections have been made.

WARNING!

- For optimal performance, use only the original power cable.

- Never make or change any connections with the power switched on.

To avoid overheating of the system, a safety circuit has been built in. Therefore, your system may switch to Standby mode automatically under extreme conditions. If this happens, let the system cool down before reusing it (not available for all versions).

(B) Antenna Connection

AM Antenna

Connect the supplied AM loop antenna to the "AM aerial" terminal. Adjust the position of the antenna for optimal reception.

 Position the antenna as far as possible from a TV, VCR or other radiation source.



Preparations

FM Antenna

It is unnecessary to connect the FM pigtail antenna since it is fixed to the main unit.

Adjust the FM antenna for optimal FM stereo reception.

(C) Speakers Connection

Front Speakers

Connect the speaker wires to the SPEAKERS terminals, right speaker to "**RIGHT**" and left speaker to "**LEFT**", coloured (marked) wire to "**+**" and black (unmarked) wire to "**-**".



 Fully insert the stripped portion of the speaker wire into the terminal as shown.

Notes:

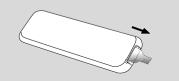
 For optimal sound performance, use the supplied speakers.

- Do not connect more than one speaker to any one pair of +/- speaker terminals.

 Do not connect speakers with an impedance lower than the speakers supplied. Please refer to the SPECIFICATIONS section of this manual.

Before using the remote control

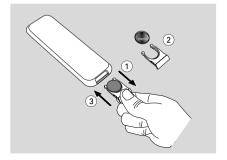
- Pull out the plastic protective sheet.
- Select the source you wish to control by pressing one of the source select keys on the remote control (for example CD, TUNER).
- Then select the desired function (for example
 ▶, I◀, ▶I).



Remove the insulation plastic tab

Replacing battery (lithium CR2025) into the remote control

- Push to open the battery tray.
- Replace a new battery according to the indicated polarity.
- Output the battery tray back to close it.

Basic Functions

IMPORTANT:

Before you operate the system, complete the preparation procedures.

Plug and Play (for tuner installation)

Plug and Play allows you to store all available radio stations automatically.

First time setup/power up

When you turn on the main supply, "AUTO INSTALL - PRESS PLAY" is displayed.

Press ►II on the system to start installation.
 → "PLUG ANJ PLAY" "INSTALL" is displayed, followed by "TUNER" and "AUTD".
 → PROG starts flashing.

→ The system will automatically store the radio stations with sufficient signal strength, starting from FM, then followed by AM band.

→ When all the available radio stations are stored or the memory for 40 presets are used, the last preset radio station will be played.

To reinstall Plug and Play

In standby mode, press and hold ►II on the system until "AUTO INSTALL - PRESS PLAY" is displayed.

Press > II again to start installation.
 All previously stored radio stations will be replaced.

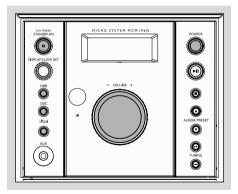
To exit without storing the Plug and Play

Press on the system.

→ If you do not complete the Plug and Play installation, the function will be restarted when you next turn on the main supply again.

Notes:

 If no stereo frequency is detected during Plug and Play, "EHEEK RNTENNA" will be displayed.
 During Plug and Play, if no button is pressed within 15 seconds, the system will exit Plug and Play mode.

Switching the system on

Press STANDBY ON or SOURCE (or ⊕ on the remote control).
 → The system will switch to the last selected source.

 Press CD, iPod, TUNER, TAPE or AUX on the remote control.

To switch the system to standby mode

- Press **STANDBY ON** on the system (or **(**) on the remote control).
- If in tape mode or recording mode, press

To switch the system to Eco-power standby mode

Power-saving automatic standby

The power-saving feature automatically switches to Eco power standby 15 minutes after a CD playback has ended and no control is operated.

Adjusting volume and sound

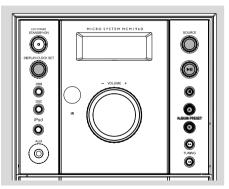

- Press DBB to switch bass enhancement on or off.

- Press MUTE on the remote control to interrupt sound reproduction instantly.

CD/MP3 Operation



IMPORTANT:

The lens of the CD player should never be touched.



Loading a disc

This CD player plays Audio Discs including CD-Recordables, CD-Rewritables and MP3/WMA CD.

- CD-ROM, CD-I, CDV, VCD, DVD or computer CDs, however, are not possible.
- DRM-protected WMA is not supported.
- Select CD source.
- Press OPEN/CLOSE▲ on



the top of the system to open the CD compartment. → □PEN is displayed when you

open the CD compartment.

Insert a disc with the printed side facing up and press down on OPEN/CLOSE▲ to close the CD door.

→ REAJING is displayed as the CD player scans the contents of a disc, and then the total number of tracks and playing time (or the total number of albums and tracks for MP3 disc) are shown.

Basic playback controls

To play a disc

Press ►II to start playback.
 The current track number and elapsed playing time of the track are displayed during disc playback.

To select a different track

Press TUNING I → ► I (on the remote control I → ►) once or repeatedly until the desired track number appears in the display.

To find a passage within a track

- Press and hold down on **TUNING** I< >> (on the remote control I< >> >>).
 The disc is played at high speed and low volume.
- When you recognise the passage you want, release **TUNING** I >> (on the remote control I >>).

Normal playback continues.

To interrupt playback

Press >II during playback.
 The display freezes and the elapsed playing time flashes when playback is interrupted.
 To resume, press >II again.

To stop playback

Press ■.

Notes: CD play will also stop when;

- the CD door is opened.
- the disc has reached the end.
- you select another source:TAPE, iPod,TUNER or AUX.
- you select standby.
- you press the tape deck PLAY ▶ key.

Playing an MP3/WMA disc

• Load an MP3/WMA disc.

→ The disc reading time may exceed 10 seconds due to the large number of songs compiled into one disc.

- → "99 XXX" is displayed. 99 is the total album number and XXX is the total track number:
- Press ALBUM/PRESET ▼ ▲ to select a desired album.

- Press TUNING I >> I (on the remote control I >> I) to select a desired track.
 The album number will change accordingly as you reach the first track of an album by pressing I >> or the last track of an album by pressing
- Press ►II to start playback.
- During playback, press DISPLAY/CLOCK to display the ID3 information if available.

Supported MP3 disc formats:

- ISO9660, Joliet, UDF 1.5
- Maximum title number: 256 (depending on filename length)
- Maximum album number: 32
- Supported sampling frequencies: 32 kHz, 44.1 kHz, 48 kHz
- Supported Bit-rates: 32~256 (kbps), variable bitrates

Different play modes: SHUFFLE and REPEAT

You can select and change the various play modes before or during playback. The play modes can also be combined with PROGRAMME.

SHUFtracks of the entire disc are played in random order

- REPALLrepeats the entire disc/ programme
- REP plays the current track continuously

REP ALB.....repeats all tracks in the current (for MP3 only) album

- To select your play mode, press the REPEAT/ SHUFFLE button before or during playback until the display shows the desired function.
- Press >II to start playback if in the STOP position.
 > If you have selected SHUFFLE, playback starts automatically.
- To return to normal playback, press the REPEAT/SHUFFLE button until the various SHUFFLE/ REPEAT modes are no longer displayed.
- You can also press to cancel your play mode.

Note:

- The SHUFFLE and REPEAT functions cannot be used simultaneously.

Programming track numbers

Programme in the STOP position to select and store your disc tracks in the desired sequence. If you like, store any track more than once. Up to 40 tracks can be stored in the memory.

In the stop position, use the TUNING I<</p>

 \blacktriangleright (on the remote control \dashv \triangleleft \rightarrow) to select your desired track number.

For MP3/WMA, you may press ALBUM/
 PRESET ▼ ▲ to select a desired album, then press I<< ►►I to select your desired track.

2 Press **PROGRAM** to store.

→ Display: **PROG** flashes, and PR □ I is displayed briefly, then the selected track number (and the selected album number for MP3/WMA).

Repeat steps 1-2 to select and store all desired tracks.

→ FULL is displayed if you attempt to programme more than 40 tracks.

In start playback of your disc programme, press
►II.

Reviewing the programme

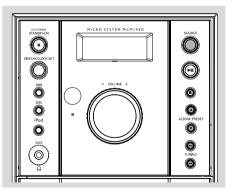
- Stop playback and press **PROGRAM** repeatedly.
- To exit review mode, press .

Erasing the programme

You can erase the programme by:

- pressing once in the STOP mode;
- pressing
 twice during playback;
- opening the CD compartment;
 PROG disappears from the display.

Radio Reception



Tuning to radio stations

- Select TUNER source.
- Press SOURCE on the set repeatedly or press TUNER on the remote repeatedly until the desired waveband (FM or MW) is displayed.
- Press down on **TUNING** I<< ►►I (or I<
 ►►I on the remote control) and release button.

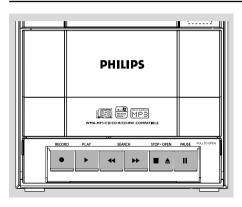

Cleaning the Cabinet

 When a disc becomes dirty. clean it with a cleaning cloth. Wipe the disc from the centre out.



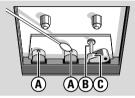

 After prolonged use, dirt or dust may accumulate at the disc lens. To ensure good playback quality, clean the disc lens with Philips CD Lens Cleaner or any commercially available cleaner. Follow the instructions supplied with cleaner

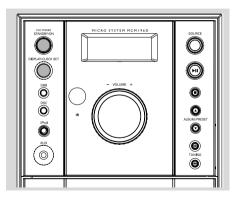
Cleaning the Heads and the Tape Paths

- To ensure good recording and playback quality, clean the heads (\overline{A}) , the capstan(s) (\overline{B}) , and pressure roller(s) $(\widehat{\mathbf{C}})$ after every 50 hours of tape operation.
- Use a cotton swab slightly moistened with cleaning fluid or alcohol.
- You can also clean the heads by playing a cleaning tape once.

Setting the clock

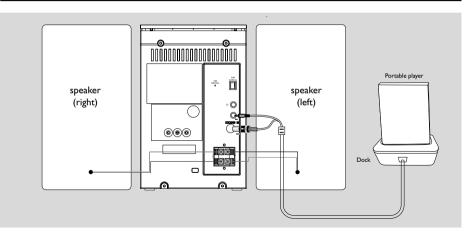

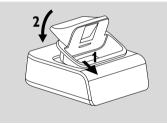

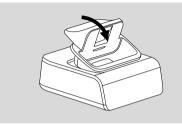
