





Hearing Safety

Listen at a moderate volume

- Sound can be deceiving. Over time your hearing "comfort level" adapts to higher volumes of sound. So after prolonged listening, what sounds "normal" can actually be loud and hearing adapts and leave it there harmful to your hearing. To establish a safe volume level

- Set your volume control at a low setting.
- Slowly increase the sound until you can hear it comfortably and clearly, without distortion

- Prolonged exposure to sound, even at normally "safe" levels, can also cause hearing loss.
- Be sure to use your equipment reasonably and take appropriate breaks.





Playing a DVD disc

After switching on, inserting the disc and closing the door, playback starts automatically. The screen shows the type of disc loaded. The disc may invite you to select an item from a menu. Use the ▲, ▼, ◄, ▶▶ keys to highlight your selection, and press ENTER.

Note: Since it is usual for DVD movies to be released at different times in different regions

of the world, all playes have region codes and discs can have an optional region code. If you load a disc of a different region code to your player, you will see the region code notice on the screen. The disc will not play, and should be unloaded.

Playing an audio or video CD disc

 After switching on, inserting the disc and closing the door, playback starts automatically. The screen shows the type of disc loaded as well as information about the disc's contents.

 While playing VCD with MTV/Karaoke, press number keys(0-9) to select the track and press >11 or ENTER to play the track. Press MENU to go back to menu of the selection.




