





## Connect power




1 Prepare the AC power adaptor.



2 Connect one end of the AC adaptor to the DC IN socket on the main unit.



Connect the other end of the AC adaptor to the wall outlet.



## Set time and date

- In standby mode, press and hold **SET** TIME/PROG for 2 seconds.
  - → [24 HR] begins to blink.
- Press ► to select 12/24 hour format.
- Press **SET TIME/PROG** to confirm. → The hour digits begin to blink.
- 4 Press I◀◀/▶▶I to set the hour.
- Press **SET TIME/PROG** to confirm. → The minute digits begin to blink.
- 6 Repeat steps 4-5 to set the minute, year, month, and day.



- In 12 hour format, [MONTH--DAY] is displayed.
- in 24 hour format, [DAY--MONTH] is displayed.

## Turn on

- Press **POWER**.
  - → The unit switches to the last selected source.

### Switch to standby

- Press POWER again to switch the unit to standby mode.
  - → The time and date (if set) appear on the display panel.

## Play from iPod/iPhone

You can enjoy audio from iPod/iPhone through this unit.


### Compatible iPod/iPhone

Apple iPod and iPhone models with a 30-pin dock connector:

- iPod classic, iPod touch, iPod nano, iPod 5th generation (video), iPod with color display, iPod mini.
- iPhone, iPhone 3G.

#### Listen to the iPod/iPhone

1 Place the iPod/iPhone into the dock.



- Press SOURCE repeatedly to select iPod/ iPhone source.
  - → The connected iPod/iPhone plays automatically.
  - To pause/resume play, press ►II.
  - To skip to a track, press ◄◄/▶►.
  - To search during play, press and hold I◀◀▶▶I, then release to resume normal play.

- To go back to previous iPod/iPhone menu, press MENU. To scroll through the menu, press PRESET +/-. To confirm a selection, press OK/>II.
  - If no key is pressed for more than 10 seconds, OK/►II acts back as the play/pause key.

## Charge the iPod/iPhone

When the unit is connected to power, the docked iPod/iPhone begins to charge.



Tip

 For certain iPod models, it may take up to a minute before the charging indication appears.

## Play from an external device

You can also listen to an external audio device through this unit.

- 1 Press **SOURCE** repeatedly to select MP3 link source.
- 2 Connect the supplied MP3 link cable to:
  - the MP3 LINK jack (3.5mm) on the back of the unit.
  - the headphone jack on an external device.
- 3 Start to play the device (see the device user manual).

## 5 Listen to radio



#### Note

Only FM radio reception is available on this unit.

### Tune to a radio station



#### Tip

 Position the antenna as far as possible from TV, VCR or other radiation source.



#### Note

- For optimal reception, fully extend and adjust the position of the antenna.
- 1 Press TUNER to select FM tuner.
- Press and hold I◀◀/▶►I on the remote control for more than 2 seconds.
  - → [Srch] (search) is displayed.
  - → The radio tunes to a station with strong reception automatically.
- **3** Repeat step 2 to tune to more stations.
  - To tune to a weak station, press I◀
     /▶►I repeatedly until you find optimal reception.

## Program radio stations automatically

You can program a maximum of 20 preset radio stations.

- 1 In the tuner mode, press and hold SET TIME/PROG for more than 2 seconds to activate automatic program mode.
  - → [AUTO] (auto) is displayed.
  - → All available stations are programmed in the order of waveband reception strength.
  - → The first programmed radio station is broadcast automatically.

## Program radio stations manually

You can program a maximum of 20 preset radio stations.

- 1 Tune to a radio station.
- 2 Press SET TIME/PROG to activate the program mode.
- 3 Press PRESET +/- to select a number.
- 4 Press SET TIME/PROG to confirm.
- 5 Repeat the above steps to program other stations.

## 6 Other features

## Set the alarm timer

You can set two alarms which go off at different time.

- 1 Ensure that you have set the clock correctly.
- Press and hold ALM 1 or ALM 2 for 2 seconds.
  - → [AL 1] or [AL 2] begin to blink.
- Press SOURCE to select an alarm sound source: iPod/iPhone, iPod/iPhone playlist, FM tuner, or buzzer.
- 4 Press ALM 1 or ALM 2.
  - → Hour digits begin to blink.
- 5 Press ► repeatedly to set the hour.
- 6 Press ALM 1 or ALM 2 to confirm.
  - → Minute digits begin to blink.
- **7** Repeat steps 5-6 to set the minute.
- 8 Repeat steps 5-6 to select whether to ring alarm the whole week, on weekdays, or at weekend.
- **9** Repeat steps 5-6 to set the alarm volume.

## \* Tip

- If you set iPhone/iPod playlist as the sound source, you must create a playlist in iTunes called "PHILIPS" and import it to your iPhone/iPod.
- If no playlist is created in the iPod/iPhone or there is no song in the playlist, the unit will wake to songs in the iPod/iPhone.

## Activate and deactivate the alarm timer

- 1 Press ALM 1 or ALM 2 repeatedly to activate or deactivate the timer.
  - If the timer is activated, [♣ AL 1] or
     [♣ AL2] is displayed.
  - If the timer is deactivated, [♣ AL1] or
     [♣ AL2] disappears.

## Repeat alarm

- 1 When the alarm rings, press BRIGHTNESS/REP ALM.
  - → The alarm repeats ringing minutes later.



 You can press I◄◄/►►I to adjust the interval to repeat alarm.

### Stop alarm ring

- 1 When the alarm rings, press the corresponding ALM 1 or ALM 2.
  - → The alarm stops but the alarm settings remain.

## View the alarm settings

1 Press ALM 1 or ALM 2.

## Set the sleep timer

This unit can switch to standby automatically after a set period of time.

- 1 Press **SLEEP** repeatedly to select a set period of time (in minutes).
  - When the sleep timer is activated, the display shows ₂z², and the volume will gradually decrease.

#### To deactivate sleep timer

- 1 Press **SLEEP** repeatedly until **[SLP OFF]** (SLP off) is displayed.
  - When the sleep timer is deactivated, <sub>z</sub>z<sup>z</sup> disappears on the display.

## Adjust display brightness

 Press BRIGHTNESS/REP ALM repeatedly to select different levels of display brightness.

## Adjust volume level

1 During play, press **VOL** +/- to increase/ decrease the volume level.

## Mute sound

1 During play, press MUTE to mute/unmute sound.

## Select a preset sound effect

### **Enhance bass**

- 1 During play, press **DBB** to turn on or off dynamic bass enhancement.
  - → If DBB is activated, [DBB] is displayed.
