How to connect a plug

The wires in the mains lead are coloured with the following code: blue = neutral (N), brown = live (L).

As these colours may not correspond with the colour markings identifying the terminals in your plug, proceed as follows:

- Connect the blue wire to the terminal marked N or coloured black.
- Connect the brown wire to the terminal marked L or coloured red.
- Do not connect either wire to the earth terminal in the plug, marked E (or e) or coloured green (or green and yellow).

Before replacing the plug cover, make certain that the cord grip is clamped over the sheath of the lead - not simply over the two wires.

Mains plug

This apparatus is fitted with an approved 13 Amp plug. To change a fuse in this type of plug proceed as follows:

- ① **Remove fuse cover and fuse.**
- ② **Fix new fuse which should be a BS13625 Amp, A.S.T.A. or BSI approved type.**

- ③ **Refit the fuse cover.**

If the fitted plug is not suitable for your socket outlets, it should be cut off and an appropriate plug fitted in its place.

If the mains plug contains a fuse, this should have a value of 5 Amp. If a plug without a fuse is used, the fuse at the distribution board should not be greater than 5 Amp.

The severed plug must be disposed off to avoid a possible shock hazard should it be inserted into a 13 Amp socket elsewhere.

Hearing safety

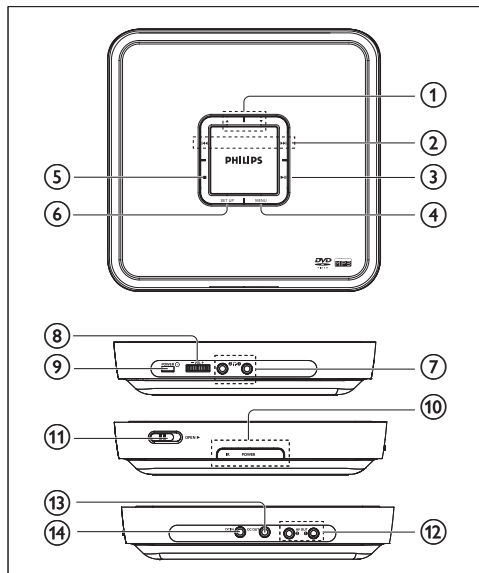

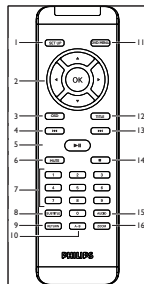

Preparation

To use the player in a car, attach the player and the two screens to the back of the front seat headrests.

- 1 Strap the car pouches over your car seat headrest.
- 2 Insert the DVD player and the two screens into the pouches.



- 3 Close the buckle and adjust the belt until it fits tightly around the headrest.

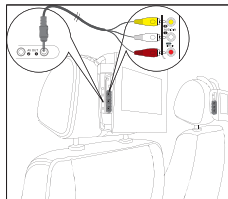
Connect audio/video cables



Note

- Match the color of the AV cable with the jacks: the yellow cable is for the yellow video jack, the red/white cable is for the red/white audio jacks.

- 1 Connect AV cable to the main unit and to the screen.



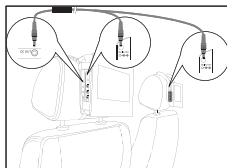
Connect power



Caution

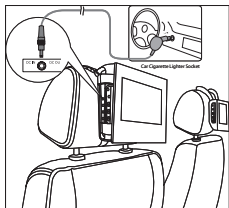
- Risk of product damage! Ensure that the power supply voltage corresponds to the voltage printed on the back or the underside of the player.
- Risk of electric shock! When you unplug the AC adaptor, always pull the plug from the socket. Never pull the cord.

- 1 Connect the single-connector end of the power cord to the **DC OUT** jack of the main unit.
- 2 Connect one end of the double-connector end of the power cord to the **DC IN** jack of one screen.
- 3 Repeat step 2 with the other screen.

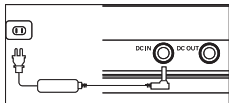


- 4 Connect the power:

- To connect power from inside a car:
Connect the car adaptor cable to the **DC IN** jack of the main unit and to the car cigarette lighter socket.



- To connect power from household power sources: Connect the AC adaptor cable to the **DC IN** jack of the main unit and to the power outlet.



Install remote control batteries



Caution

Connect headphones

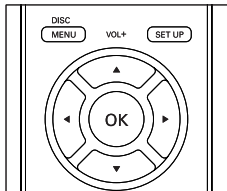

Select display language

English is the default language for screen display. You can change the display language.

- 1 Slide the **POWER** switch on the DVD player to the **ON** position.
- 2 Press the **POWER ON/OFF** button on one of the screens.
- 3 Press **SETUP**.



- 4 Select **[General]** > **[Language]**.
- 5 Select the language, then press **OK**.

4 Use your player

Turn on

- 1 Slide the **POWER** switch on the DVD player to the **ON** position.
- 2 Press the **POWER ON/OFF** button on the screens.

Play discs

- 1 Press **OPEN** on the main unit.
- 2 Insert the disc with label side facing up.
- 3 Push down to close the CD compartment.
↳ Play starts automatically.
 - If a menu appears, select an item, then press **OK** to start play.
 - To stop play, press **STOP ■**.
 - To pause, press **PLAY/PAUSE ► II**. Press again to resume play.

- To select the previous/next item, press **◀◀** or **▶▶**.
- To start search within video/audio, press and hold **◀◀** or **▶▶**. Briefly press **◀◀** or **▶▶** during search to adjust search speed.
- For Video CDs or SuperVideo CDs: Press **RETURN** to return to the previous menu.

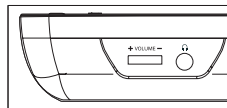
Adjust volume

For headphones connected to the player:

- 1 Adjust the volume control on the player.

For screen speakers:

- 1 Adjust the volume control on the screen.



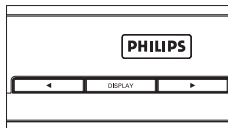


Tip

- When headphones are connected, no sound emits from the screen speakers.

Adjust display

- 1 Press **DISPLAY** on the screen repeatedly to select:
 - **[Brightness]**: adjust the brightness (☼) of the screen
 - **[Contrast]**: adjust the contrast (●) of the screen
 - **[Display ratio]**: select 16:9 display mode (≡) or 6:9 display mode (≡)
- 2 Press ◀ or ▶ to change value.



Play options

Select audio language

For DVDs that contain two or more audio languages.

- 1 During play, press **AUDIO** repeatedly until the language is selected.

Select subtitle language

For DVDs that contain two or more subtitle languages.

- 1 During play, press **SUBTITLE** repeatedly until the language is selected.

Select DivX video subtitle

- 1 Press **SETUP**.
- 2 Select **[Video] > [Mpeg-4 subtitles]**.
- 3 Select an option, then press **OK** to confirm.
- 4 Press **SETUP** to exit.

Select audio mode

When you play VCDs/CDs, you can select an audio mode.

- 1 Press **AUDIO** repeatedly until the audio mode is selected.

Zoom

For DVDs, VCDs and picture CDs, you can zoom in and out for video images or pictures.

- 1 Press **ZOOM** repeatedly to zoom in and out.
- 2 When the video image or picture is enlarged, press **▲▼◀▶** to pan through it.

Repeat a section

You can repeat a specific section of audio/video within a title/chapter/track (repeat A-B).

- 1 During play, press **A-B** to mark the start of the section to repeat.
- 2 Press and hold **◀◀** or **▶▶** to search for the end of the section.
- 3 Press **A-B** to mark the end of the section.

➡ The selected section plays repeatedly.

- 4 Press **A-B** to cancel.

Repeat one/all

- 1 During play, press **OSD**.
- 2 Select **[Repeat 1]** or **[Repeat all]**, then press **OK** to confirm.

Random play

For audio CDs and MP3 CDs only.

- 1 Press **OSD**.
- 2 Select **[Shuffle]**, then press **OK** to confirm.
- 3 Select **[On]** or **[Off]**, then press **OK** to confirm.

Rotate pictures

For picture CDs only.

- 1 When you view the picture, press **OSD**.
- 2 Press **◀** to rotate clockwise.
- 3 Press **▶** to rotate counter-clockwise.

- 4 Press **OSD** again to exit.

5 Adjust settings

Playback control options

Restrict access

- 1 Press **SETUP**.

- 4 Enter the password.
 - If this is the first time you restrict access, enter 9999 as the password.
- 5 Press **SETUP** to exit.

Set password

- 1 Press **SETUP**.
- 2 Select **[General] > [Set password]**.
- 3 Enter the current password.
 - If this is the first time you restrict access, enter 9999 as the password.
- 4 Enter the new 4-digit password, then press **OK** to confirm.
- 5 Enter the new password again, then press **OK** to confirm.
- 6 Press **SETUP** to exit.

Return to default settings

- **[4:3 LB]**: For normal TVs, for a wide-screen picture. Black bars may appear on the top and the bottom of the screen.
- **[4:3 PS]**: For normal TVs, for a full-height picture. The sides of the picture may be trimmed.

Select video output format

The default video output format has been chosen according to format that is broadcast in your country. If the picture looks unusual, change the video output.

Select audio output

- 1 Press **SETUP**.

Select digital audio output

If you connect the player to a sound system that supports digital sound, select a compatible digital audio output format.

- 2 Select **[Audio] > [Digital (SPDIF)]**.
- 3 Select an option, then press **OK** to confirm.

6 Troubleshooting



Warning

- Never remove the casing of this player.

To keep the warranty valid, never try to repair the system yourself.

If you encounter problems when using this player, check the following points before requesting service. If the problem remains unsolved, go to the Philips web site (www.Philips.com/support), or contact Philips (see Contact information). When you contact Philips, ensure that your player is nearby and the model number and serial number are available (see 'Get started' on page 26).

No power

- Ensure that both plugs of the mains cord are properly connected.
- Ensure that there is power at the AC outlet.
- Ensure that the battery is inserted correctly.
- Ensure that the car adaptor is connected correctly.

'No signal' is displayed

- Ensure that the player is turned on.
- Ensure that the AV cable is connected.

Distorted picture

- Clean the disc. With a clean, soft, lint-free cloth, wipe the disc outwards from the center.
- Make sure that the video output format of the disc is compatible with the TV.
- Change the video output format to match your TV or program (see 'Select video output format' on page 45).
- The LCD is manufactured using high precision technology. You may, however, see tiny black points and/or bright points (red, blue, green) that continuously appear on the LCD. This is a normal result of the manufacturing process and does not indicate a malfunction.

No sound

Ensure that the AV cable is connected correctly.

Cannot play disc

- Ensure the disc label is upwards.

- Clean the disc. With a clean, soft, lint-free cloth, wipe the disc outwards from the center.
- Check if the disc is defective by trying another disc.

No response to the remote control

- Ensure that the path between the remote control and the player is clear from obstacles.
- From a close distance, point the remote control directly at the player.
- Replace the remote control batteries.
- The function does not work for this disc. Refer to the disc instructions.

The player feels warm

- When the player is in use for a long period of time, its surface will be heated. This is normal.
