
Setup

Finding a suitable location

- Place the set on a flat, hard and stable surface. Do not place the set on a carpet.
- Do not put any equipment or heavy objects on top of the set.
- Do not position the set on top of other equipment that might heat it up (such as receiver or amplifier).
- Do not put anything under the set (such as CDs, magazines).
- Install this unit near the AC outlet and where the AC power plug can be reached easily.

Space for ventilation

 Place the apparatus in a location with adequate ventilation to prevent internal heat build up. Allow at least 10 cm (4.0") clearance from the rear and the top of the set and 5cm (2.0") from the left and right to prevent overheating.



Avoid high temperatures, moisture, water and dust

- Apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing.
- Do not place any sources of danger on the apparatus (such as liquid filled objects, lighted candles).

Cleaning discs

Some problems occur because the disc inside the player is dirty (frozen picture, sound disruptions, picture distortions). To avoid these problems, discs should be cleaned on a regular basis.

To clean a disc, use a micro fibre cleaning cloth and wipe the disc from the center to the edge in a straight line.









Connecting to television



Using Composite Video jacks (CVBS)

- Use the composite video cable (yellow) to connect the DVD player's TV OUT (CVBS) jack to the video input jack (or labeled as A/V In, Video In, Composite or Baseband) on the television (cable supplied).
- 2 To hear sound of this DVD player through your television, use the audio cables (white/red) to connect AUDIO OUT (L/R) jacks of the DVD player to the corresponding AUDIO IN jacks on the television (cable supplied).



Using Component Video jacks (YPbPr)

- Use the component video cables (red/blue/green) to connect the DVD player's YPbPr jacks to the component video input jacks (or labeled as YPbPr) on the television (cable not supplied).
- 2 To hear sound of this DVD player through your television, use the audio cables (white/red) to connect AUDIO OUT (L/R) jacks of the DVD player to the corresponding AUDIO IN jacks on the television (cable supplied).
- 3 Proceed to page 20 for detailed progressive scan setup.



Using an accessory RF modulator





- Use the audio cables (white/red) to connect AUDIO OUT (L/R) jacks of the DVD Player to the corresponding AUDIO IN jacks on the stereo system (cable supplied).

Connecting to a digital AV receiver



Receiver has a PCM, Dolby Digital or MPEG decoder



- 2 Connect the COAXIAL socket of the DVD player to the corresponding Digital Audio In jack on your receiver (cable not supplied).

 If the audio format of the Digital Output does not match the capabilities of your receiver, the receiver will produce a strong, distorted sound or no sound at all.

Using USB port


You can only view the content of following supported USB devices through this DVD player.

- Connect the supported USB device directly to the USB port on the front panel (as shown on the above illustration).
- Press USB button on the remote control in order to view the files stored in the supported USB device.
- Stop the playback before removing the supported USB device from the USB port.

Tips:

- The USB port supports playback of JPEG/ MP3/WMA files.
- Not all Portable audio/video players and Digital cameras are supported.
- While connected to a card reader, only one card can be read at the same time.
- If non-supported USB device is plugged in, 'Device Not Supported' will be displayed.
- If the USB device does not fit into the USB port, a USB extension cable is required.
- The format FAT16, FAT32 can be supported by USB and not NTFS.

Connecting to a HDMI or DVITV



IMPORTANT!

- HDMI connects untouched and uncompressed digital transmission for the highest and crispest sound or image quality.
- It has plug and play capability using only one HDMI cable for both audio / video output.
- Use a HDMI cable (supplied) to connect the DVD player's HDMI OUT to HDMI IN on the HDMI TV.

To hear sound via TV only,

Set the DVD player's { HDMI Audio Setup – On } for HDMI connection (see Digital Audio Setup – HDMI Audio Setup for detail).

Step I: Inserting Batteries




- Open the battery compartment.
- 2 Insert two batteries type R03 or AAA, following the indications (+ -) inside the compartment.
- Close the cover.

CAUTION!

- Remove batteries if they are exhausted or if the remote is not to be used for a long time.
- Do not use old and new or different types of batteries in combination.
- Batteries contain chemical substances, so they should be disposed of properly.

Using the remote control to operate the system



- Aim the remote control directly at the remote sensor (IR) on the front panel.
- ② Do not put any objects between the remote control and the DVD player while operating the DVD player.

Step 2 : Finding your viewing channel

- Press STANDBY-ON () on the DVD player to turn it on.
- 2 Turn on the TV and set it to the correct video-in channel. You should see the blue DVD background screen.
 - → Usually these channel are between the lowest and highest channels and may be called FRONT, A/V IN, VIDEO. See your TV's manual for more details.
 - Or, you may go to channel I on your TV, then press the Channel down button repeatedly until you see the Video In channel.
 - Or, the TV remote control may have a button or turn that chooses different video modes.
 - → Or, set the TV to channel 3 or 4 if you are using an RF modulator.
- (3) If you are using external equipment, (such as audio system or receiver), turn it on and select the appropriate input source for the DVD player output. Refer to the equipment user's manual for detail.


Step 3 : Setting up Progressive Scan feature

(for Progressive Scan TV only)

The progressive scan displays twice the number of frames per second than interlaced scanning (ordinary normal TV system). With nearly double the number of lines, progressive scan offers higher picture resolution and quality.

Before you start...

- Ensure that you have connected this DVD player to a progressive scan TV using the YPbPr connection (see page 10).
- Ensure that you have completed the basic installation and setup.
- 1 Turn on your TV and set to interlace mode (refer to your TV user manual).
- Press STANDBY-ON (*) on the remote control to turn on the DVD player.
- Select the correct video-in channel.→ The DVD background menu appears.
- 4 Press SETUP.
- **⑤** Press ▶ to select { Video Setup Page }.



6 Press ▲ ▼ repeatedly to select { Progressive }, then press ▶.

- Select { On }, then press OK to confirm.
 - → The menu will appear on the TV.



- 8 Press ◀ to highlight { OK } and press OK to confirm.
- Turn on your TV progressive scan mode (refer to your TV user manual).
 - → The menu will appear on the TV.



- Press
 to highlight { OK } and press
 OK to confirm..
 - The setup is now completed and you can start enjoy the high quality picture.

To deactivate Progressive Scan manually:

 Wait for 15 seconds for the auto recovery.

OR

- Press OPEN/CLOSE on the DVD player to open the disc tray.
- Press numeric keypad 'I' on the remote control.
 - → The DVD background screen appears.

Tip:

- There are some progressive scan TVs and High-Definition TVs that are not fully compatible with this unit, resulting in the unnatural picture when playing back a DVD VIDEO disc in the progressive scan mode. In such a case, turn off the progressive scan feature on both the DVD player and your TV.



Step 4: Selecting the matching color system

The color system of the DVD player, disc and TV should match in order for the disc to play. Before changing the TV system, determine the color system of your TV.



- Press SETUP.
- ② Press ► to select { Video Setup Page }.
- ③ Press ▲ ▼ repeatedly to select { TV Type }, then press ▶.
- Use ▲ ▼ to select one of the options below:

{ **PAL** }

Select this if the connected TV has the PAL color system. It will change the video signal of an NTSC disc and output it to PAL format.

{ NTSC }

Select this if the connected TV has the NTSC color system. It will change the video signal of a PAL disc and output it to NTSC format.

{ Multi }

Select this if the connected TV is compatible with both NTSC and PAL (multi-system). The output format will be in accordance with the video signal of the disc.

- **6** Select a setting and press **OK**.
 - → Follow the instructions show on the TV to confirm the selection.



6 Press ◀ to highlight { OK } and press OK to confirm.

To reset to default TV color system:

 Wait for 15 seconds for the auto recovery.

OR

- Before changing the current TV colour setting, ensure that your TV supports the 'selected TV Type' system.

Step 5: Setting the language

The language options are different depending on your country or region. It may not correspond to the illustrations shown on the user manual.

On-screen display (OSD) language

Select this to change the language of this DVD player screen display menu.
The menu language (on-screen display) for the system will remain as you set it.

- ② Press ▲ ▼ to select { OSD Language }, then press ▶.
- 3 Use ▲ ▼ to select a language and press OK to confirm.

Audio, Subtitle and Disc menu languages

You can choose your preferred language or sound track from audio, subtitles and disc menu languages. If the selected language is not available on the disc, the disc's default language will be used instead.



- Press STOP twice to stop playback, (if any), then press SETUP on the remote control.

{ Audio }

Select this to change disc sound track language.

{ Subtitle }

Playback Features

Starting disc playback

- 1 Turn on the TV to the correct program number for the DVD player (e.g. 'EXT', '0', 'AV').
- Press STANDBY-ON () to turn on the DVD player.
- You can also press OPEN/CLOSE
 button to turn on the DVD player and
 then will be followed by disc tray open.
- You can also hold down the STOP button on the remote control to open and close the disc tray.
- 4 Place a disc into the disc tray with the label facing up, then press OPEN/ CLOSE ▲.
 - → For double-sided discs, load the side which you want to play facing up.
- 6 Playback may start automatically. If not, press PLAY/PAUSE ►II.
- If a disc menu appears on the TV, see page 25 'Using the Disc Menu'.
- If the child lock was activated for the inserted disc, you have to enter your sixdigit password (see page 48).
- For more playback features, see pages 24~34.

Tips:

- Do not overturn the DVD player while disc loading, playing or ejecting.
- Do not close the disc tray manually even if the power switched off.

Basic playback controls

Unless otherwise stated, all operations described are based on Remote Control

Pausing playback

- During playback, press PLAY/PAUSE
 II to pause playback and display a still picture.
 - Sound will be muted.
- ② To resume normal playback, press PLAY/PAUSE ►II again.

Selecting title/chapter/track

- During playback, press PREV I to go to the beginning of the currect chapter/ track, press PREV I again to go to the previous title/chapter/track.
- Press NEXT ► to go to the next chapter/track.
- Press DISPLAY to display the disc information text line for title/chapter/ track (example - 00/08).
- Use alphanumeric keypad (0-9) to enter valid title/chapter/track number.
 - → The playback skips to the selected title/chapter/track.

Stopping playback

■ Press STOP

Tips:

- Screen saver will start automatically if the disc playback is stopped/paused for about 5 minutes.
- The player will automatically switch to Power Standby mode if you do not press any buttons for about 15 minutes after the disc has stopped playing.

Operations for video playback

Using the Disc Menu

Depending on the disc, a menu may appear on the TV screen once you load in the disc

To select a playback feature or item

Use ▲ ▼ ◀ ▶ keys or numeric keypad (0-9) on the remote, then press OK to start playback.

To access or remove the menu

Press DISC MENU on the remote.

Zooming in

This function allows you to enlarge the picture on the TV screen and to pan through the enlarged picture.

- During playback, press ZOOM repeatedly to display the picture with different scales.
 - → Use ▲ ▼ ◀ ▶ keys to pan through the enlarged picture.
 - Playback will continue.
- Press ZOOM repeatedly to return to the original size.

Resuming playback from the last stopped point

Resume playback of the last 5 discs is possible, even if the disc was ejected (open) or standby. Auto resume is active for DVD,VCD,SVCD,CD types of discs.

- Load one of the last 5 discs.
 - → 'Play from start, press [PREV]' appears during playback for first 10 seconds.

- During the message appears on the TV screen, press PREV to start playback from the beginning.
 - Playback restarts from the first title (DVD) or the beginning of the title/ track (VCD/CDDA/SVCD).

To cancel resume mode

■ In stop mode, press STOP ■ again.

Tip:

To remove the message from the TV screen, press DISPLAY.

Slow Motion

You can slow forward or slow reverse a disc during playback and select a different speed.

For DivX®,DVD,VCD,SVCD

- Press ▲ ▼ during playback to select the required speed: I/2, I/4, I/8 or I/16 (forward [DivX®,DVD,VCD,SVCD] or backward [DVD]).
 - → Sound will be muted.
- ② To return to normal speed, press PLAY/ PAUSE ►II.

Forward / Reverse Searching

You can fast forward or fast reverse a disc during playback and select a desired search speed.

For DivX®,DVD,VCD,SVCD,CD, MP3,WMA

- Press ◀ ► directly or press I◀ ► I for 2 seconds during playback to select the required speed: 2X, 4X, 8X, 16X or 32X (backward or forward).
 - → Sound will be muted (DVD/VCD/ SVCD/DivX®) or intermittent (MP3/ WMA/CD).
- ② To return to normal speed, press PLAY/ PAUSE ►II.

Viewing the disc playback information

Using the OSD menu

OSD menu shows the disc playback information (for example, title or chapter number, elapsed playing time, audio/ subtitle language), a number of operations can be done without interrupting disc playback.

- For DVD disc playback, pressing SUBTITLE/DISPLAY will toggle between Subtitle and OSD menu.
- For VCD disc playback, pressing SUBTITLE/DISPLAY will display OSD menu.

- Press ▲ ▼ to select {Time Disp.} (Time Display), then press ► to access.
 - Depending on the disc in the DVD player, the following display types appear on the TV screen.

For DVD

- TT Elapsed (elapsed playing time of current Title)
- TT Remain (remaining playing time of current Title)
- CH Elapsed (elapsed playing time of current Chapter)
- CH Remain (remaining playing time of current Chapter)

For VCD/SVCD

- Total Elapsed (elapsed playing time of current Disc)
- Total Remain (remaining playing time of current Disc)
- Single Elapsed (elapsed playing time of current Track)
- Single Remain (remaining playing time of current Track)

Repeat

- Press ▲ ▼ to select {Repeat}, then pressto access.
 - → Repeat menu appears on the TV screen.
- 2 Press ▲ ▼ to select one of the following repeat mode.

For DVD

- Chapter (currently playing chapter)
- Title (currently playing title)
- All (entire disc)
- Off (cancel)

For Video CD

- Track (currently playing track)
- All (entire disc)
- Off (cancel)

Repeat A-B


- Press ▲ ▼ to select {Repeat A-B}.
- 2 Press **OK** to mark the starting point 'A'.
- Press OK again to mark the ending point 'B'.
 - → The playback from point 'A' and 'B' is repeat.
- 4 Press **OK** the third time to exit.

Preview

The preview function allows you to reduce the picture of 6 tracks enough to display in a full screen.

- Press ▲ ▼ to select {Preview}, then press ► to access.
 - → The preview menu appears on the TV screen.



Special DVD Features

Playing a Title

USB mass storage device

When connecting a USB mass storage device to the DVD player, you can enjoy the device's stored music through the DVD player.







Frequently Asked Questions (USB)

Why does it take so long to display the contents on my USB device?

- This could be due to the large numbers of files (>500 files/folders) or size of the files (>IMB.)
- There could be other non-supported files in the device that the system is trying to read/display.

What if un-supported devices (e.g. USB mouse, keyboards) are plugged into the player?

 The device may cause the player to be unstable. Remove the unsupported device and unplug the mains cord. Wait for a few minutes before reconnecting the mains cord and power on the player again.

What happens when I plug in a USB HDD?

 HDD is not supported as the large storage capacity makes navigation very difficult. Transfer the music files (mp3) and photos (jpg) into a flash drive.

Why does the system fail to detect my USB portable music player?

 The portable music player may require propriety software that is bundled with our player in order to access the contents (eg. playlist.)

Why can't some devices be playback from USB Port on my player?

- USB Port only offer 500mA current, could not power up HDD players which require more current.
- Device which shows USB Mass Storage
 Device might actually be USB Hub when detect in USB analyser.
- Devices in NTFS format can't be supported.
- Devices require drivers to be installed will not supported by this player. They are not UMS or MTP devices, which does not require any driver installation or start up disc. When in UMS or MTP mode, the device is treated as an external HDD or portable device.

What types of file does the player support?

 We support only FAT16 and FAT32, not NTFS.

Why does the file name appear to be different from what was displayed on my computer (e.g. from "Good Bye. jpg" to "Good_B~I.jpg")?

- The length of the file name is restricted by the file system of the device (FAT16), which only supports eight (8) characters.
- The computer may be able to display the full file name as the operating system can convert the file system.

Is simultaneous **USB** and **Disc** playback possible?

 This is not possible due to memory limitation. In addition, a different user interface will be needed in order to function and in order to be simple enough to use.

Why can't I rotate the pictures in my device?

 In order to rotate the pictures in the USB device, the picture must contain EXIF information, stored by most digital cameras. This EXIF information may have been removed when you edit or copy the picture from other devices using editing programs.

Why can't the player play some of my music files, photos or movies?

 The music files may not be playable because of different formats and encoding bit-rates. Similarly, the photos may be of low resolution or too high resolution for the player to support. Analog: Sound that has not been turned into numbers. Analog sound varies, while digital sound has specific numerical values. These jacks send audio through two channels, the left and right.

Aspect ratio: The ratio of vertical and horizontal sizes of a displayed image. The horizontal vs. vertical ratio of conventional TVs. is 4:3, and that of wide-screens is 16:9.

AUDIO OUT Jacks: Jacks on the back of the DVD System that send audio to another system (TV, Stereo, etc.).

<u>Bit Rate</u>: The amount of data used to hold a given length of music; measured in kilobits per seconds, or kbps. Or, the speed at which you record. Generally, the higher the bit rate, or the higher the recording speed, the better the sound quality. However, higher bit rates use more space on a Disc.

<u>Chapter</u>: Sections of a picture or a music piece on a DVD that are smaller than titles. A title is composed of several chapters. Each chapter is assigned a chapter number enabling you to locate the chapter you want.

<u>Component Video Out Jacks</u>: Jacks on the back of the DVD System that send high-quality video to a TV that has Component Video In jacks (R/G/B, Y/Pb/Pr, etc.).

<u>Disc menu</u>: A screen display prepared for allowing selection of images, sounds, subtitles, multi-angles, etc recorded on a DVD.

<u>Digital</u>: Sound that has been converted into numerical values. Digital sound is available when you use the DIGITAL AUDIO OUT COAXIAL or OPTICAL jacks. These jacks send audio through multiple channels, instead of just two channels as analog does.

DivX[®] **3.11/4.x/5.x/6.0**: The DivX[®] codec is a patent-pending, MPEG-4 based video compression technology, developed by DivX[®] Networks, Inc., that can shrink digital video to sizes small enough to be transported over the internet, while maintaining high visual quality.

<u>Dolby Digital</u>: A surround sound system developed by Dolby Laboratories containing up to six channels of digital audio (front left and right, surround left and right, center and subwoofer).

JPEG: A very common digital still picture format. A still-picture data compression system proposed by the Joint Photographic Expert Group, which features small decrease in image quality in spite of its high compression ratio.

MP3: A file format with a sound data compression system. 'MP3' is the abbreviation of Motion Picture Experts Group I (or MPEG-I) Audio Layer 3. By using MP3 format, one CD-R or CD-RW can contain about 10 times as much data volume as a regular CD can.

Parental Control: A function of the DVD to limit playback of the disc by the age of the users according to the limitation level in each country. The limitation varies from disc to disc; when it is activated, playback will be prohibited if the software's level is higher than the user-set level.

PCM (Pulse Code Modulation): A system for converting analog sound signal to digital signal for later processing, with no data compression used in conversion.

Playback control (PBC): Refers to the signal recorded on video CDs or SVCDs for controlling reproduction. By using menu screens recorded on a Video CD or SVCD that supports PBC, you can enjoy interactive-type software as well as software having a search function.

<u>Progressive Scan</u>: It displays all the horizontal lines of a picture at one time, as a signal frame. This system can convert the interlaced video from DVD into progressive format for connection to a progressive display. It dramatically increases the vertical resolution.

Region code: A system for allowing discs to be played back only in the region designated beforehand. This unit will only play discs that have compatible region codes. You can find the region code of your unit by looking on the product label. Some discs are compatible with more than one region (or ALL regions).

<u>Title</u>: The longest section of a picture or music feature on DVD, music, etc., in video software, or the entire album in audio software. Each title is assigned a title number enabling you to locate the title you want.

TV OUT jack: Jack on the back of the DVD System that sends video to a TV.
