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1. Home Screen

1.1. Introduction

To enjoy the benefits of your Google TV, connect the TV to the Internet. Press **A** HOME on your remote control to get your Home screen. Like on your Android smartphone or tablet, the Home screen is the center of your TV. From the Home screen you can decide what to watch by browsing entertainment options from app and live TV.

The Home screen is organized in rows to let you discover great content from your favorite apps. You can also add additional rows or find new apps to get more content. Apps may populate their recommendation (if available) with their own choices as an individual row on the home screen.

Highlights on your home screen

With multiple tabs like Search, For you, Films, TV Shows, Apps, Library and Philips, you can discover movies and shows from your services and popular apps. Sign in to your Google Account to get personalized recommendations from your streaming services based on what you have watched and what interests you. You can also trigger Google search with voice or text input in the Search tab.

Apps

The **Apps** tab of the Home screen contains all installed Apps that come with the TV and the Apps you have installed from Google Play[™] Store. You can also install and add more apps as favorites from the **Apps** tab.

Navigation

Decide what to watch next with easy-to-use navigation. Browse your personalized recommendations, pick up where you left off, or quickly find a certain app using the new tab system.

Discover personalized recommendations

Browse shows and movies that you will love on all your favorite media services. Sign in to your Google Account to get started.

Get recommendations across Google

Your services are saved to your Google Account so you can get better recommendations across Google.

All about your Philips TV

The **Philips** tab includes information about your Philips TV. The **Smart TV Collection** row lists the apps that are designed for your TV and guides you on how to register your TV. The **How to...** row provides tips about common operations on your TV. The **Help** row helps you to access the user manual, or perform TV diagnose or Selfdiagnose to check your TV status.

1.2. Dashboard and Settings

Dashboard

The Dashboard is a side panel in Google TV that provides access to Settings, device controls, notifications and more.

The Dashboard can be accessed in three ways as follows:

1 - Navigating to the profile icon in the upper right of the home screen.

- 2 Press the 🌣 DASHBOARD key on the remote control.
- 3 Long press the A HOME key on the remote control.

The dashboard contains the following features.

• **Profile**: to display the current user profile icon or to add a new user profile

• Settings: to access all setting menus for adjusting the TV settings.

- Clock and screensaver: to indicate the system clock and to activate screen saver immediately.
- **Sources**: to launch the input source list for switching to any of the connected devices.
- Picture / Wi-Fi / Accessibility: quick link to adjust Picture / Wi-Fi / Accessibility settings.

• Notifications: to provide you messages about the Google TV system; press Clear all to dismiss all notifications.

Adjust settings

You can access the **Settings** menu via the dashboard in the top-right corner. Alternatively, you can access the **Frequent settings** menu and common menu items in the Philips TV Menu, which you can do directly from the remote control.

1.3. Google TV and Basic Mode

Feature differences

You can set your TV to Google TV mode or Basic Mode.

Basic Mode contains only Live TV and External devices (e.g. HDMI) features. Google TV requires you to log in with your Google account and Internet connection. With Google TV, you can enjoy all Basic Mode features and other Google personalized services. For example, movies and TV shows from your favorite streaming apps, personalized recommendations, and Google Assistant to search and control your TV with your voice.

Some features are not available in Basic Mode. For more information, please refer to the Google support page.

Home screen differences

The Home screen in Basic Mode has only two rows with no tabs. The first **Home** row contains **Watch TV**, **TV Guide**, **Sources** and **Dashboard** icons for TV feature operations. The second **App** row contains all preinstalled Apps. The **Dashboard** in Basic Mode does not include personal profiles and can only perform setting changes and display system notifications.

The Home screen of Google TV has multiple tabs like Home, Apps, Library and Search. Each tab contains rows of apps, movies and shows from your services and popular apps. You can get personalized recommendations from your streaming services based on what you have watched and what interests you. You can also trigger Google search with voice or text input in the Search tab.

1.4. Open the Home Screen

To open the Home screen and open an item:

- 1 Press **h HOME**.
- 2 Select an item and press OK to open or start it.
- 3 Press \leftarrow Back continuously or press \Uparrow HOME to go back to the Home screen.

When opening the Home screen, the background application/content playback will stop. You have to select the application or content from the Home screen to resume.

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2. Setting Up

2.1. Read the Safety Instructions

Please read the safety instructions before you use the TV.

To read the instructions, in Help > User manual, press the color key — Keywords and look up Safety Instructions.

2.2. TV Stand and Wall Mounting

TV Stand

You can find the instructions for mounting the TV stand in the Quick Start Guide that came with the TV. If you lose this guide, you can download it from www.philips.com/TVsupport.

Use the product type number of the TV to look for the **Quick Start Guide** to download.

Wall Mounting

Your TV is also prepared for the wall mount bracket (sold separately).

The wall mount size may vary depending on the different types of back cases; refer to the **Quick Start Guide** in your product package to see which size is for your TV.

Use the following wall mount dimensions when purchasing the wall mount.

Wall mounting the TV requires special skills and should only be performed by qualified personnel. The TV wall mounting should meet safety standards according to the TVs weight. Also read the safety precautions before positioning the TV. TP Vision Europe B.V. bears no responsibility for improper mounting or any mounting that results in accident or injury.

2.3. Tips on Placement

• Position the TV where light does not shine directly on the screen.

• The ideal distance to watch TV is 2 to 5 times its screen height. When seated, your eyes should be level with the center of the screen.

• Recommended distance to the wall:

A. When wall mounted, position the TV from 7 to 10 cm away from the wall.

B. If the TV has a stand, position it 10 to 20 cm away from the wall depending on the size of the stand.




Note:

Please keep the TV away from dust-producing sources such as stoves. It is suggested to clean the dust regularly to avoid getting dust into the TV.

2.4. Power Cable

- Insert the power cable into the **POWER** connector on the back of the TV.
- Make sure the power cable is securely inserted in the connector.
- Make sure that the power plug, in the wall socket, is accessible at all times.
- When you unplug the power cable, always pull the plug, never pull the cable.




Although this TV has a very low standby power consumption, unplug the power cable to save energy if you do not use the TV for a long period of time.

2.5. Antenna Cable

Insert the antenna plug firmly into the **Antenna** socket at the back of the TV.

You can connect your own antenna or an antenna signal from an antenna distribution system. Use an IEC Coax 75 Ohm RF antenna connector.



3. Remote Control

3.1. Key Overview

Hidden keys feature

Hidden keys offer more control functions when pressing the **123 key**. The **123 key** is in the middle of the remote control and is used to turn on/off hidden keys mode. When hidden keys mode is turned on, the **number keys** 0 to 9 and **media play control keys** appear with backlight and trigger the functions. When hidden keys mode is turned off by pressing the **123 key** again or is automatically turned off, the remote control works with the normal keys.

▲ Warning

Choking Hazard! This TV remote control contains small parts not suitable for children under 5 years old.



1 - 🕐 (Standby / On)

To switch the TV on or back to Standby. Long press for three seconds to reboot the TV.

2 - VOICE microphone

3 - AMBILIGHT

To select one of the Ambilight styles. * Ambilight setting is only for models which support Ambilight function.

4 - I (SOURCES) (Dot)

- To open the Sources menu.
- To enter digital sub-channels.

5 - 🏚 (DASHBOARD)

To launch Dashboard on the side of the screen to access Settings, device controls, notifications and more.

6 - 🌷 (Google Voice Search)

To start the Google Voice Search.

Middle



1 - TV Guide (🖽)

To open or close the TV Guide.

2 - OK key

To confirm a selection or setting. To open the channel list while watching TV.

3 - Arrow/navigation keys

To navigate up, down, left or right.

4 - OPTIONS (+)

To open or close the Options menu. Long press to open program info.

To switch back to the previous channel you selected. To return to the previous menu. To go back to the previous App/Internet page.

6 - Volume / ◀× (Mute)

Move down or up to adjust the volume level. Press the middle of the key to mute the sound or to restore it.

7 - 123 key

To turn the hidden function keys on or off and switch the keys between different sets of operations.

8 - Quick Menu / MENU (🕸)

To open the Quick Menu with typical TV functions.

9 - Number keys (hidden keys, available by pressing the 123 key)

To select a channel directly.

10 - CC

To enable/disable Closed Caption.

11 - TV (🗤) / EXIT

To switch back to watching TV or to stop an interactive

TV application. However, it might not work with some applications; behavior depends on third-party TV apps. This key changes to Number key **0** after pressing the **123 key**.

12 - 角 (HOME)

To open the Home menu. Long press to access the Dashboard.

Move down or up to switch to the next or previous channel in the channel list. To open the next or previous page in Text/Teletext. Press the middle of the key to open the channel list.

Direct selection of options. Press Blue key — to open the **Help**.

2 - NETFLIX

• If you have a Netflix subscription, you can enjoy Netflix on this TV. Your TV must be connected to the Internet.

• To launch Netflix, press **NETFLIX** to open Netflix immediately with the TV switched on or in standby. www.netflix.com

3 - prime video

To launch the Amazon prime video App.

4 - 💋 Eco / Green key

Press to get a message reminding you to enter the Eco settings menu; long press to open the Eco settings menu directly. Once the Eco settings menu is triggered by long pressing the key a few times, the message will no longer appear.

- 5 Playback (available when the 123 key is pressed)
- Play ▶, to play back.
- Pause II, to pause playback
- Rewind ◀◀, to rewind
- Fast forward ►►, to fast forward

6 - YouTube

To launch the YouTube App.

7 - ::: (Apps) / Public Value* / IVI**

To launch **Your apps** page to display the list of Apps that are pre-installed, or installed by user.

* When the country is set to **France**, the key will be the quick key to launch **Public Value** tab on Home screen. ** When the country is set to **Russia**, the key will be the quick key to launch the **IVI** app.

3.2. Pair Your Remote Control to the TV

This remote control uses both Bluetooth[®] and IR (infrared) to send its commands to the TV.

- You can use this remote control via IR (infrared) for most operations.
- To use advanced features like voice search, you need to pair (link) the TV with the remote control.

When you start the initial TV installation, the TV invites you to press the **Home** + **Back** key to pair with the remote control. It is best to complete the pairing when you first install the TV.

Note:

 Once the remote control has entered pairing mode successfully, the LED indicator around the microphone on the front side of the remote control starts blinking.
 The remote control must be kept close to the TV (within 3 feet) during pairing in order to ensure success.
 If the TV does not launch the voice control field when you press \$\mathcal{P}\$, pairing was unsuccessful.

4 - It is advisable to wait until the set has fully started up and launched all background processes before pairing mode is entered as the toast message containing further instructions may appear too late, thereby negatively impacting the pairing procedure.

Pairing or pairing again

If the pairing with the remote control was lost, you can pair the TV with the remote control again.

You can press the **Home + Back** keys (for approximately 3 seconds) to pair.

Alternatively, go to Settings > Remote & accessories > Remote control settings > Pair remote control, then follow the on-screen instructions.

A message appears when the pairing has been successful.

Remote Control Software

Settings > Remote & accessories > Remote control settings > Remote control info

Once the remote control is paired, you can check the current remote control software version.

Settings > Remote & accessories > Remote control

settings > Update remote control software

Check available remote control software for updates.

3.3. Voice Search

You can search for videos, music or anything else on the Internet by simply using your voice. You can speak into the microphone on the remote control.

You need to pair the remote control to the TV before use voice search.

To use Voice:

1 - Press and hold the \oint key on the remote control; the blue light on the remote control lights up, the search field opens, and the microphone is active.

2 - Speak out what you are looking for with clear

pronunciation. Once the voice input is done, release the \oint key to start the search. It might take some time for the results to appear.

3 - In the list of search results, you can select the item you want.

3.4. IR Sensor

The TV can receive commands from a remote control that uses IR (infrared) to send commands. If you use such a remote control, always make sure you point the remote control at the infrared sensor on the front of the TV.

▲ Warning

Do not put any objects in front of IR sensor of the TV as it may block the IR signal.

3.5. Batteries and Cleaning

Replace batteries

Refer to the **Quick Start Guide** in your product package for detailed information about the remote control batteries.

If the TV does not react to a button being pressed on the remote control, the batteries might be dead.

To replace the batteries, open the battery compartment on the back of the remote control.

1 - Slide the battery door in the direction shown by the arrow.

2 - Replace the old batteries with new batteries. Make

sure the + and the - ends of the batteries line up correctly.

3 - Reposition the battery door and slide it back until it clicks.

• Remove the batteries if you are not using the remote control for a long time.

• Safely dispose of your old batteries according to the end of use directions.

Cleaning

Your remote control is treated with a scratch-resistant coating.

To clean the remote control, use a soft damp cloth. Never use substances such as alcohol, chemicals or household cleaners on the remote control.

4. Switching On and Off

4.1. On or Standby

Make sure the TV is connected to the mains AC power. Connect the supplied power cord to the AC IN connector at the back of the TV. The indicator light at the bottom of the TV lights up.

Switch on


Press ⁽⁾ on the remote control to switch the TV on. You can also press the small joystick button on the bottom of the TV to turn the TV on in case you can't find the remote control or its batteries are dead.

Reboot

Long press **O** on the remote control for 3 seconds to reboot the TV.

Switch to standby

To switch the TV to standby, press \bigcirc on the remote control. You can also press the small joystick button on the bottom of the TV.



In standby mode, the TV is still connected to the mains power but consumes very little energy.

To turn off the TV completely, disconnect the power plug.

When disconnecting the power plug, always pull the power plug, never the cord. Ensure that you have full access to the power plug, power cord and outlet socket at all times.

5. Channel Installation

5.1. Antenna/Cable Installation

Manual channel update

You can always start a channel update yourself.

To start a channel update manually:

1 - Select Settings > Channels and Inputs > Channels > Antenna/Cable Installation and press OK.

- 2 Enter your PIN code if necessary.
- 3 Select Antenna/cable connection and press OK.
- 4 Select Antenna or Cable and press OK.
- 5 Press \leftarrow Back to close the menu.

5.2. Channel List Copy

Introduction

Channel List Copy is intended for dealers and expert users.

With Channel List Copy, you can copy the channels installed on one TV onto another Philips TV of the same range. With Channel List Copy, you avoid timeconsuming channel search by uploading a predefined channel list on a TV. Use a USB flash drive of minimum 1 GB.

Conditions

• Both TVs are from the same year range.

• Both TVs have the same hardware type. Check the hardware type on the TV type plate on the back of the TV.

• Both TVs have compatible software versions.

• For the Netherlands or any of these cable operators (Switzerland: Sunrise/Austria: Magenta/Poland: UPC/Romania: Vodafone/Hungary: Vodafone/Ireland: Virgin Media), the channel list copy is limited to satellite channel list copy. The terrestrial and cable channels list will not be copied or erased.

Current channel version

To check the current version of the channel list:

Select Settings > Channels and Inputs > Channels, select Channel List Copy, select Current Version and press OK.
 Press OK to close.

Current software version

You can go to **Settings** > System > About > SW version to view the version number of current TV software.

Copy a Channel List

To copy a channel list:

1 - Switch on the TV. This TV should have channels installed.

- 2 Plug in a USB flash drive.
- 3 Select 🏟 Settings > Channels and Inputs > Channels
- > Channel List Copy and press OK.

4 - Select Copy to USB and press OK. You might be asked to enter the Child Lock PIN code to copy the channel list.
5 - When copying is done, unplug the USB flash drive.
6 - Press < (left) repeatedly if necessary, to close the

menu.

Now you can upload the copied channel list onto another Philips TV.

Channel List Version

Check the current version of the channel list:

1 - Select Settings > Channels and Inputs >
Channels and press > (right) to enter the menu.
2 - Select Channel List Copy and select Current Version, then press OK.

3 - Press \bigstar (left) repeatedly if necessary, to close the menu.

Upload a Channel List to TV

To not Installed TVs

Depending on whether your TV is already installed or not, you must use a different method to upload a channel list.

To a TV that is not yet installed

1 - Plug in the power plug to start the installation and select language and country. You can skip the channel search. Finish the installation.

2 - Plug in the USB flash drive that holds the channel list of the other TV.

3 - To start the channel list upload,

select Settings > Channels and Inputs > Channels > Channel List Copy > Copy to TV and press OK. Enter your PIN code if necessary.

4 - The TV notifies you if the channel list is copied to the TV successfully. Unplug the USB flash drive.

To Installed TVs

Depending on whether your TV is already installed or not, you must use a different method to upload a channel list.

To an already installed TV

1 - Verify the country setting of the TV. (To verify this setting, see chapter Reinstall All Channels. Start this procedure until you reach the country setting. Press ← Back to cancel the installation.)

If the country is correct, continue with step 2.

If the country is not correct, you need to start a reinstallation. See chapter Reinstall All Channels and start the installation. Select the correct country and skip the channels search. Finish the installation. When done, continue with step 2.

2 - Plug in the USB flash drive that holds the channel list of the other TV.

3 - To start the channel list upload,

select Settings > Channels and Inputs > Channels > Channel List Copy > Copy to TV and press OK. Enter your PIN code if necessary.

4 - The TV notifies you if the channel list is copied to the TV successfully. Unplug the USB flash drive.

6. Channels

6.1. Watching channels

Tune to a Channel

To start watching TV channels, press **III**. The TV tunes to the channel you last watched.

Change Channels

To switch channels, press \equiv + or \equiv -.

If you know the channel number, type in the number with the number keys. Press **OK** after you entered the number to change immediately.

If the information is available from the Internet, the TV shows the current program name and details followed by the next program name and details.

Previous channel

To switch back to the previously tuned channel, press **\leftarrow Back**.

You can also tune to channels from a Channel List.

Lock a Channel

Lock and Unlock a Channel

To prevent children from watching a channel, you can lock a channel. To watch a locked channel, you must enter the 4-digit **Child Lock** PIN code first. You cannot lock programs from connected devices.

To lock a channel:

1 - Press 💵.

2 - Press **OK** to open the channel list. If necessary, change the channel list.

3 - Select the channel you want to lock.

4 - Press + OPTIONS and select Lock Channel and press OK.

5 - Enter your 4 digit PIN code if the TV asks for it. A locked channel is marked with a **1** (lock).

6 - Press < (left) to go back one step, or press ← Back to close the menu.

To unlock a channel:

1 - Press 💵.

2 - Press **OK** to open the channel list. If necessary, change the channel list.

3 - Select the channel you want to unlock.

4 - Press + OPTIONS and select Unlock Channel and press OK.

5 - Enter your 4 digit PIN code if the TV asks for it.

6 - Press < (left) to go back one step, or press < Back to

close the menu.

If you lock or unlock channels in a channel list, you only have to enter the PIN code just once until you close the channel list.

For more information, in **Help**, press the color key — Keywords and look up Child Lock for more information.

Age Rating

To prevent children from watching a program not suitable for their age, you can set an age rating.

Digital channels can have their programs age rated. When the age rating of a program is equal to or higher than the age you have set as age rating for your child, the program will be locked. To watch a locked program, you must enter the **Child Lock** code first.

To set an age rating:

1 - Select Settings > System > Child Lock > Age rating lock and press OK.

2 - Enter a 4-digit Child Lock code. If you did not set a code yet, select **Set code** in **Child lock**. Enter a 4-digit Child lock code and confirm. Now you can set an age rating.

3 - Back in Age rating lock, select the age and press OK. 4 - Press < (left) repeatedly if necessary, to close the menu.

To switch off the parental age rating, select **Free**. However, in some countries you must set an age rating.

For some broadcasters/operators, the TV only locks programs with a higher rating. The parental age rating is set for all channels.

Content rating

To set a content rating that will lock rated programs:

1 - Select **Content** Settings > System > Child lock > Content rating lock and press OK.

2 - Set the content and press **OK**. The selected content is blocked.

3 - Press **≺** (left) repeatedly if necessary, to close the menu.

Channel Options

Open options

While watching a channel, you can set some options.

Depending on the type of channel you are watching (analog or digital) or depending on your TV settings, some options are available.

To open the options menu:

- 1 While watching a channel, press + OPTIONS.
- 2 Press + OPTIONS again to close.

Mono / Stereo

You can switch the sound of an analog channel to Mono or Stereo.

To switch to Mono or Stereo:

1 - Tune to an analog channel.

2 - Press + OPTIONS, select Mono/Stereo and press > (right).

3 - Select Mono or Stereo and press OK.

4 - Press \triangleleft (left) to go back one step, or press \leftarrow Back to close the menu.

Audio Language

For digital broadcast, you can select an available audio language temporarily if none of your preferred languages are available.

Universal Access

Settings > Channels and Inputs > Channels > Universal access.

With Universal Access switched on, the TV is prepared for use for the deaf, hard of hearing, blind or partially sighted people.

Universal access for blind or partially sighted people

Settings > Channels and Inputs > Channels > Universal access > Audio description.

Digital TV channels can broadcast special audio commentary describing what is happening on screen.

Settings > Channels and

Inputs > Channels > Universal access > Audio description > Mixed volume / Audio effects / Speech.

• Select **Mixed volume**, you can mix the volume of the normal audio with the audio commentary.

• Switch Audio effects on for extra audio effects in the commentary audio, like stereo or fading sound.

• Select **Speech** to set speech preference, **Descriptive** or **Subtitles**.

Dialog enhancement

Settings > Channels and Inputs > Channels > Universal access > Dialog enhancement.

Increase the intelligibility of dialog and commentary, if available. Only available when sound setting **Clear dialog** is **On** and audio stream is AC-4.

Ginga

Switch off the Ginga feature

Settings > Channels and Inputs > Channels > Ginga.

Service navigation

Service navigation

Channels and Inputs > Channels > Service navigation.

Switch the availability to navigate through primary channels only or all channels, on or off.

Channel Logos

Switch off channel logos

Channels and Inputs > Channels > Channel logos.

The channel logo can be hidden or shown.

6.2. Favorite Channels

About favorite Channels

In a favorite channel list, you can collect the channels you like.

You can create 4 different lists* of favorite channels for easy channel zapping. You can name each Favorites List individually. You can only reorder channels in a Favorites List.

With a Favorites List selected, press the arrows \land (up) or \checkmark (down) to select a channel, then press OK to watch the selected channel. You only tune to the channels in that list when using \square + or \square – keys.

Create a favorites List

To create a favorite channels list:

- 1 Press 🖾, to switch to TV.
- 2 Press OK to open the current channel list.
- 3 Press + OPTIONS.

4 - Select Create Favorites List and press OK.

5 - In the list at the left, select a channel you want as a favorite and press OK. Channels come in the list at the right in the order you add them. To undo, select the channel in the list at the left and press OK again.
6 - If necessary, you can go on selecting and adding channels as favorites.

7 - To finish adding channels, press **← Back**.

The TV will ask you to rename the **Favorites List**. You can use the on-screen keyboard.

1 - Use the on-screen keyboard to delete the current name and enter a new name.

2 - When done, select Close and press OK.

The TV will switch to the newly created Favorites List.

You can add a range of channels in one go or start a **Favorites List** by duplicating the channel list with all channels and removing the channels you do not want.

The channels in the Favorites List are renumbered.

Add a Range of Channels

To add a consecutive range of channels to a Favorites List in one go, you can use Select Range.

To add a range of channels:

1 - Open the **Favorites List** where you want to add a range of channels.

2 - Press + OPTIONS, select Select Range and press OK.
3 - In the list at the left select the first channel of the range you want to add and press OK.

4 - Press ✓ (down) to select the last channel of the range you want to add. The channels are marked at the left.
5 - Press OK to add this range of channels and confirm.

You can also start creating a Favorites List from Select Range.

Edit Favorites

To add a consecutive range of channels to a **Favorites** List in one go, you can use Edit favorites.

To add a range of channels:

1 - Open the **Favorites List** where you want to add a range of channels.

- 2 Press + OPTIONS, select Edit favorites and press OK.
- 3 In the list at the left select the first channel of the
- range you want to add and press OK.
- 4 Press \checkmark (down) to select the last channel of the range

you want to add. The channels are marked at the right. 5 - Press **OK** to add this range of channels and confirm.

You can also start creating a Favorites List from Edit favorites.

Rename a Favorites List

To rename a Favorites List:

1 - Open the Favorites List you want to rename.

2 - Press + OPTIONS, select Rename Favorites List and press OK.

3 - Use the on-screen keyboard to delete the current name and enter a new name.

- 4 When done, select Close and press OK.
- 5 Press Pack to close the channel list.

Remove a Favorites List

To remove a Favorites List:

- 1 Open the Favorites List you want to remove.
- 2 Press + OPTIONS, select Remove Favorites List and press OK.
- 3 Confirm to remove the list.
- 4 Press **\leftarrow Back** to close the channel list.

7. TV Guide

7.1. TV Guide Data

With the TV Guide you can view a list of the current and scheduled TV programs of your channels. Depending on where the TV guide information (data) is coming from, analog and digital channels or only digital channels are shown. Not all channels offer TV Guide information. The TV can collect TV Guide information for the channels that are installed on the TV. The TV cannot collect the TV Guide information from channels viewed from a digital receiver or decoder.

7.2. Using the TV Guide

Open the TV Guide

To open the TV Guide, press **E TV GUIDE**. The TV Guide shows the channels of the selected tuner.

Press **III** TV GUIDE again to close.

The first time you open the TV Guide, the TV scans all TV channels for program information. This may take several minutes. TV Guide data is stored on the TV.

Tune to a program

From the TV Guide, you can tune to a current program.

To switch to the program (channel), select the program and press **OK**.

View program details

To call up the details of the selected program:

- 1 Press + OPTIONS, select Program Info and press OK.
- 2 Press \leftarrow Back to close.

Change Day

The TV Guide can show the scheduled programs for the upcoming days (maximum up to 8 days).

Press the color key — Day and select the day you need.

Search by Genre

If the information is available, you can look up scheduled programs by genre like movies, sports, etc.

To search for programs by genre:

- 1 Press := TV GUIDE.
- 2 Press + OPTIONS.
- 3 Select Search by genre and press OK.

4 - Select the genre you want and press **OK**. A list with the found programs appears.

5 - Press \leftarrow Back to close the menu.

* Note: The Search by genre function is only available for certain countries.

8. Connect Devices

8.1. About Connections

Connectivity Guide

Always connect a device to the TV with the highest quality connection available. Also, use good quality cables to ensure a good transfer of picture and sound.

When you connect a device, the TV recognizes its type and gives each device a correct type name. You can change the type name if you wish. If a correct type name for a device is set, the TV automatically switches to the ideal TV settings when you switch to this device in the Sources menu.

Antenna port

If you have a Set-top box (a digital receiver) or Recorder, connect the antenna cables to run the antenna signal through the Set-top box and/or Recorder first before it enters the TV. In this way, the antenna and the Set-top box can send possible additional channels to the Recorder to record.

HDMI ARC and eARC

Only **HDMI 3** on the TV supports **HDMI ARC** (Audio Return Channel) and **HDMI eARC**.

If the device, typically a Home Theater System (HTS), soundbar or AV receiver, also has the HDMI ARC connection, connect it to **HDMI 3** on this TV. With the HDMI ARC connection, you do not need to connect the extra audio cable that sends the sound of the TV picture to the HTS. The HDMI ARC connection combines both signals.

HDMI eARC (Enhanced Audio Return Channel) is an advancement over the previous ARC. It covers all ARC features but with higher bandwidth and speed. eARC supports high-quality audio transmission up to192kHz, 24-bit, uncompressed 5.1 and 7.1, and 32-channel uncompressed audio.

Note: HDMI eARC is only available on HDMI 3. Use Ultra High-speed HDMI cable for eARC. Only one eARC device is available at a time.



HDMI ports

HDMI Quality

An HDMI connection has the best picture and sound quality. One HDMI cable combines video and audio signals. Use an HDMI cable for High Definition (HD) TV signals.

For the best signal quality transfer, use an Ultra High Speed certified HDMI cable and do not use an HDMI cable longer than 5 m.

If a device connected with HDMI is not working correctly, check if a different HDMI Ultra HD setting can resolve this problem. In Help, press the color key — Keywords and look up HDMI Ultra HD.

Copy protection

HDMI ports support HDCP (High-bandwidth Digital Content Protection). HDCP is a copy protection signal that prevents copying content from a DVD disc or Blu-ray Disc. Also referred to as DRM (Digital Rights Management).

HDMI CEC - EasyLink

Connect HDMI CEC-compatible devices to your TV, you can operate them with the TV remote control. EasyLink HDMI CEC must be switched on in the TV and the connected device.

Switch on EasyLink

Settings > Channels and Inputs > Inputs > EasyLink > EasyLink > On.

Operate HDMI CEC-compatible devices with TV remote control

Settings > Channels and Inputs > Inputs > EasyLink > EasyLink remote control > On.

To turn on or off the EasyLink remote control function. Note that you can always control the volume of connected HDMI CEC-compatible devices irrespective of this setting.

Power off HDMI devices with the TV

Settings > Channels and

Inputs > Inputs > EasyLink > EasyLink auto device off.

Select **On** to allow the TV to turn the HDMI devices to standby. Select **Off** to disable this function.

Power on the TV with HDMI devices

Settings > Channels and Inputs > Inputs > EasyLink > EasyLink auto TV on.

Select **On** to allow HDMI devices to wake up the TV from standby status. Select **Off** to disable this function.

Power on the HDMI sound system with TV

Settings > Channels and Inputs > Inputs > EasyLink > EasyLink auto ARC on.

Select **On** to allow the TV to wake up the connected HDMI sound system from standby status. Select **Off** to disable this function.

EasyLink 2.0 sound control

Settings > Channels and

Inputs > Inputs > EasyLink > EasyLink 2.0 sound control.

Select **On** to control the sound settings of the HDMI sound system. You can adjust these settings via **Frequent** settings or **Settings** > **Display & Sound** > **Sound**. This is only applicable to EasyLink 2.0–compliant HDMI sound systems.

Note:

• EasyLink might not work with devices from other brands.

• The HDMI CEC functionality has different names on different brands. Some examples are: Anynet, Aquos Link, Bravia Theater Sync, Kuro Link, Simplink and Viera Link. Not all brands are fully compatible with EasyLink. Example HDMI CEC branding names are property of their respective owners.

HDMI Ultra HD

This TV can display Ultra HD signals. Some devices connected with HDMI - do not recognize a TV with Ultra HD and might not work correctly or show distorted picture or sound.

To avoid the malfunctioning of such a device, you can the adjust **HDMI Ultra HD** setting when the TV is in the HDMI source. The recommended setting for legacy devices is **Standard**.

Set the signal quality for each HDMI connector

Settings > Channels and Inputs > Inputs > HDMI (port) > HDMI Ultra HD > Standard, Optimal, or Optimal (Auto Game).

To change the settings, switch to the HDMI source first. Select **Optimal** to enable the highest quality HDMI signal for 4K program or movie watching (such as Ultra HD 4K set-top box, 4K Blu-ray player or streaming box).

• The setting **Optimal** allows maximum up to Ultra HD (50Hz or 60Hz) RGB 4:4:4 or YCbCr 4:4:4/4:2:2/4:2:0 signals.

• The setting **Standard** allows maximum up to Ultra HD (50Hz or 60Hz) YCbCr 4:2:0 signals.

Maximum supported video timing format for HDMI Ultra HD options:

- Resolution: 3840 x 2160
- Frame rate (Hz): 50Hz, 59.94Hz, 60Hz
- Video data sub-sampling (bit-depth)

- 8 bit: YCbCr 4:2:0, YCbCr 4:2:2*, YCbCr 4:4:4*, RGB 4:4:4*

- 10 bit: YCbCr 4:2:0*, YCbCr 4:2:2*, RGB 4:4:4*
- 12 bit: YCbCr 4:2:0*, YCbCr 4:2:2*

* Supported only when HDMI Ultra HD is set to Optimal or Optimal (Auto Game).

Select Standard if the picture or sound is distorted.

• Set **Optimal (Auto Game)** to enable the TV to support the HDMI Variable Refresh Rate* video (on some models only) and set the **Sound** style to **Game** whenever it is informed by the HDMI device connected to the TV.

* With HDMI Variable Refresh Rate, the TV changes its refresh rate in real time according to the frame rate signal on top of all features supported in **Optimal (Auto Game)** to synchronize with every picture. It is applied to reduce the lag, judder and frame tearing for better gaming experience.

Note:

To watch HDR10+ from an HDMI source, you may need to power off your player and power it on again when the player connected to the TV is playing such content for the first time. HDR10+ content is supported only when HDMI Ultra HD is set to Optimal or Optimal (Auto Game).

8.2. Home Theater System -HTS

Connect with HDMI ARC/eARC

Use an HDMI cable to connect a Home Theater System (HTS) to the TV. You can connect a Philips Soundbar or an HTS with a built-in disc player.

HDMI ARC

Only **HDMI 3** on the TV can offer the Audio Return Channel (ARC) signal. Once you have connected the Home Theater System, the TV can only send the ARC signal to this HDMI connection. With HDMI ARC, you do not need to connect the extra audio cable. The HDMI ARC connection combines both signals.

HDMI eARC

HDMI eARC (Enhanced Audio Return Channel) is an advancement over the previous ARC. It supports the latest high-bitrate audio formats up to192kHz, 24-bit, uncompressed 5.1 and 7.1, and 32-channel uncompressed audio. HDMI eARC is only available on HDMI 3.

Audio to video synchronization (sync)

If the sound does not match the video on screen, you can set a delay on most Home Theater Systems with a disc player to match the sound with the video.

Problems with HTS sound

Sound with loud noise

If you watch a video from a plugged in USB flash drive or connected computer, the sound from your Home Theater System might be distorted. This noise is heard when the audio or video file has DTS sound but the Home Theater System has no DTS sound processing. You can fix this by setting the **Digital Out Format** of the TV to **Stereo**.

Select **\$ Settings** > **Display & Sound** > **Audio out** > **Digital out format**.


No sound

If you cannot hear the sound from the TV on your Home Theater System, check if you connected the HDMI cable to an HDMI ARC/eARC connection on the Home Theater System. HDMI ARC/eARC is only available on **HDMI 3**.

8.3. Digital Audio Out -Optical

Audio Out - Optical is a high quality sound connection.

This optical connection can carry 5.1 audio channels. If your device, typically a Home Theater System (HTS), has no HDMI ARC connection, you can use this connection with the Audio In - Optical connection on the HTS. The Audio Out - Optical connection sends the sound from the TV to the HTS.



8.4. Smartphones and Tablets

To connect a smartphone or tablet to the TV, you can use a wireless connection. For a wireless connection, on your smartphone or tablet download the **Philips Smart TV** app from your favorite app store.

8.5. Blu-ray Disc Player

Use an **Ultra High speed HDMI** cable to connect the Bluray Disc player to the TV.

If the Blu-ray Disc player has EasyLink HDMI CEC, you can operate the player with the TV remote control.

In Help, press the color key — Keywords and look up EasyLink HDMI CEC for more information.


8.6. Game Console

HDMI

For best quality, connect the game console with an Ultra High speed HDMI cable to the **HDMI 1** or **HDMI 2** on the TV.

If an external audio system with HDMI ARC/eARC support is used together with TV and game console, the recommended connection is: connecting game console device's HDMI output to TV HDMI 1 port and connecting TV HDMI 3 to external audio system's HDMI input with another Ultra high speed HDMI cable. To have best


gaming audio effect matching video, you can set TV Audio output to Multichannel (bypass) here: Settings > Display and sound > Audio output > Digital out format.



8.7. USB Storage Device

You can view photos or play your music and videos from a connected USB flash drive or USB Hard Drive.

Insert a USB storage device into one of the **USB** connectors on the TV while the TV is switched on.



The TV detects the device and opens a list showing its content.

If the contents list does not appear automatically, press **SOURCES** and select **USB**.

To stop watching the USB storage device content, press I EXIT or select another activity.

To remove the USB storage device safely:

- 1 Press f HOME.
- 2 Select the USB drive under Dashboard >
- Notifications from top-right corner and press OK.
- 3 Select your device and press OK.
- 4 Select Eject and press OK.

5 - Wait until the eject procedure is finished and then pull out the USB storage device.

* Note: Connect a USB storage device with a size of less than 2TB.

Ultra HD on USB

You can view photos in Ultra HD resolution from a connected USB storage device. The TV will downscale the resolution to Ultra HD if the resolution of the photo is higher.

For more information on watching or playing content from a USB storage device, in **Help**, press the color key — Keywords and look up Photos, Videos and Music.

8.8. Photo Camera

To view photos stored on your digital photo camera, you can connect the camera directly to the TV.


Use one of the **USB** connections on the TV to connect. Switch on the camera after you have made the connection.

If the contents list does not appear automatically, press **SOURCES**, and select **USB**.

Your camera might need to be set to transfer its content with PTP (Picture Transfer Protocol). Read the user manual of the digital photo camera.

Ultra HD on USB

You can view photos in Ultra HD resolution from a connected USB device or flash drive. The TV will downscale the resolution to Ultra HD if the resolution of the photo is higher. You cannot play a video with native resolution higher than Ultra HD on any of the USB connections.



For more information on viewing photos, in **Help**, press the color key — Keywords and look up Photos, Videos and Music.

8.9. Computer

You can connect your computer to the TV using a highquality HDMI cable and use the TV as a PC monitor.

* Note for NVIDIA graphics card users:

If you connect your computer to the TV via HDMI, NVIDIA cards may automatically output Variable Refresh Rate (VRR) video to the TV when the TV's **HDMI Ultra HD** setting is **Optimal (Auto Game)**. Always make sure to turn off the VRR function in graphics card before you change the TV's **HDMI Ultra HD** to **Optimal** or **Standard**; the TV UI selection **Optimal** or **Standard** will turn off VRR support in the TV.

* Note for AMD Graphics card users:

If you connect your computer to the TV via HDMI, please ensure the following settings in the graphics card used to have proper performance.

- If graphics card output video is 4096 x 2160p or 3840 x 2160p and RGB pixel format is used, RGB 4:4:4 pixel format studio (limited RGB) shall be set in computer graphic card.

9. Connect Your TV

9.1. Network and Internet

Home Network

To enjoy the full capabilities of your Philips Google TV, your TV must be connected to the Internet.

Connect the TV to a home network with a high-speed Internet connection. You can connect your TV wirelessly or wired to your network router.

Connect to Network

Wireless Connection

What You Need

To connect the TV to the Internet wirelessly, you need a Wi-Fi router with a connection to the Internet.

Use a high-speed (broadband) Internet connection.



Turn Wi-Fi On or Off

Settings > Network and Internet > Wi-Fi > On/Off.

Make the Connection

Settings > Network and Internet > Wi-Fi > On/Off

1 - In the list of found networks, select on your wireless network. If your network is not in the list because the network name is hidden (you switched off the SSID broadcast of the router), select Add New Network to enter the network name yourself.

2 - Depending on the type of router, enter your encryption key - WPA2 or WPA3. If you entered the encryption key for this network before, you can select OK to make the connection immediately.

3 - A message will be shown when the connection is successful.

Problems

Wireless network not found or distorted

• Microwave ovens, DECT phones, or other Wi-Fi devices in your proximity might disturb the wireless network.

• Make sure that the firewalls in your network allow access to the TV's wireless connection.

• If the wireless network does not work properly in your home, try the wired network installation.

Internet does not work

• If the connection to the router is OK, check the router connection to the Internet.

The PC and Internet connection are slow

• Look in your wireless router's user manual for information on indoor range, transfer rate and other factors of signal quality.

• Use a high-speed (broadband) Internet connection for your router.

DHCP


• If the connection fails, you can check the DHCP (Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol) setting of the router. DHCP should be turned on.

In Help, press the color key — Keywords and look up Troubleshooting for more information.

Wired Connection

What You Need

To connect the TV to the Internet, you need a network router with a connection to the Internet. Use a high-speed (broadband) connection to the Internet.



Network and Internet Settings

View Network Settings

Settings > Network and Internet > View network settings.

You can view all current network settings here. The IP and MAC addresses, signal strength, speed, encryption method, Address/Netmask/Gateway/DNS of IPv4 or

Switch On with Wi-Fi (WoWLAN)

Settings > Network and Internet > Switch On with Wi-Fi (WoWLAN).

You can switch this TV on from your smartphone or tablet if the TV is in Standby. The setting Switch On with Wi-Fi (WoWLAN) must be switched on.

Switch on with Chromecast

Settings > Network and Internet > Switch on with Chromecast.

Set it **On** to allow this TV to be switched on from a Chromecast app on your mobile device. Power consumption of the TV in standby status will be higher when this is switched on. The Wi-Fi (WoWLAN) setting should be turned on first before you can change the setting **Switch on with Chromecast**.

Digital Media Renderer - DMR

Settings > Network and Internet > Digital Media Renderer - DMR.

If your media files do not play on your TV, make sure that the Digital Media Renderer is switched on. As a factory setting, DMR is switched on.

Quick Connect

Quick connect to your Wi-Fi

Settings > Network and Internet > Quick connect.

Quick connect helps you to quickly connect to your Wi-Fi by scanning QR code on your TV screen.

Join a Wi-Fi network by scanning the QR code with an Android phone and following the instructions. On the Android phone, go to Settings > Network and Internet > Wi-Fi > Select Wi-Fi > Advanced > Add device and then scan the QR code. Your TV will quickly join the Wi-Fi network with assistance from your Android phone.

TV Control with Matter

Connect your TV to a Matter smart home network

Settings > Network and Internet > TV Control with Matter.

Matter is the foundation for connected things and a protocol to connect compatible devices and systems. You can add your TV to a Matter smart home network by scanning the QR code or entering the setup code.

Connects with Control4®

Switch to enable connection with Control4®

Settings > Network and Internet > Connects with Control4.

Control4[®] is a provider of personalized automation and control solutions, helping to control multiple devices in your home. To connect your Philips Smart TV to Control4[®], make sure your Control4[®] environment and devices are properly set.

9.2. Google Account

Sign In

To enjoy the full capabilities of your Philips Google TV, you can sign in to Google with your Google Account.

By signing in, you will be able to play your favorite games across your phone, tablet and TV. You will also get customized video and music recommendations on your TV home screen, as well as access to YouTube, Google Play and other apps.

Sign In

Use your existing **Google Account** to sign in to Google on your TV. A Google Account consists of an email address and a password. If you don't have a Google Account yet, use your computer or tablet to create one (accounts.google.com). If you did not sign in during the first TV installation, you can always sign in later.

To sign in after completing the TV installation:

- 1 Select **\$ Settings** > Account & Sign-in and press OK.
- 2 Select Sign In and press OK.
- 3 Select Use your remote and press OK.
- 4 With the on-screen keyboard, enter your email address and press **OK**.

5 - Enter your password and press OK to sign in.

6 - Press \blacktriangleleft (left) repeatedly if necessary, to close the menu.

Kids Profile

Once you have signed in to a Google Account, you may like to create a **Kids profile** for your kids. A Kids profile allows parents to grant their kids access to both generalaudience TV apps and apps intended for kids. Parents select which apps to install, and can configure bedtime reminders and screen-time limits.

Under Kids profile, only allowed apps can be accessed and only HDMI connections are allowed as external sources.

Create a Kids profile

You may use your existing **Google Account** to sign in to your TV or add an account to create a Kids profile.

1 - Select the **Profile** icon via the **Dashboard** in the topright corner of Home screen.

2 - Select an existing account if you've already created accounts, or select + Add account and follow the instructions to add a new account.

3 - Select Add a kid to create a personalized space for your kid.

4 - During the onboarding process for **Kids profiles**, parents select which apps to install in the Kids profile from the apps on the Play Store that are rated for all ages.

9.3. Internet

Start Internet

You can browse the Internet on your TV. You can view any Internet website but most of them are not prepared for a TV screen.

• Some plug-ins (e.g. to view pages or videos) are not available on your TV.

• You cannot send or download files.

• Internet pages are shown one page at a time and full screen.

To start the Internet browser:

1 - Press **h HOME**.

2 - Select **Your apps** > **WEB BROWSER** (second row of icons in Basic mode) and press **OK**.

3 - Enter an Internet address and select to confirm.

4 - To close Internet, press **<** Back and then confirm to leave on message screen.

* Note: If **WEB BROWSER** is not in the **Your Apps** row, you can add the app manually.

10.1. Switch to a device

From the list of Sources, you can switch to any of the connected devices. You can switch to a tuner to watch TV or open the content of a connected USB storage device. You can switch to your connected devices to watch programs on that device, a digital receiver or a Bluray Disc player.

To switch to a connected device:

Press ➡ SOURCES to open the Sources menu.
 Select one of the items in the source list and press OK.
 The TV will show the program or content of the device.

* Note: A HDMI device listed in Source list as Unregistered cannot be controlled with the TV's remote control, as the communication protocol is limited.

10.2. AirPlay and HomeKit

Streaming contents via AirPlay

You can stream media files from Apple devices to your TV via AirPlay. Go to **Settings** > Channels and Inputs > Apple AirPlay and HomeKit to enter AirPlay and HomeKit Settings page and make sure AirPlay is turned On. Your Apple device must be connected to the same Wi-Fi home network as your TV to stream content.

Add your TV to Apple HomeKit

To add your TV to HomeKit and control your TV via Apple devices:

1 - Go to **Channels and Inputs** > Apple AirPlay and HomeKit to enter AirPlay and HomeKit Settings page.

2 - Select **Set Up** under the **HomeKit** section to generate a QR code on your TV.

3 - On your Apple device, open the **Home** app and tap **Add +** and then scan the QR code on the TV.

4 - Follow the instructions on your Apple device to add your TV to HomeKit.

11. Quick Menu and Frequent Settings

In the **Quick Menu** and **Frequent settings**, you will find a quick way to access TV functions and setting menus.

To open Quick Menu/Frequent settings and open an item:

 Press ➡[®] Quick Menu / MENU to open Quick Menu.
 Press the arrows < (Left) or > (right) to switch between Quick Menu and Frequent settings.
 Select an item and press OK to open or start it.
 Press ← Back to close Quick Menu or Frequent settings without starting anything.

* Note: **Quick Menu** and **Frequent settings** are not available on third-party TV apps.

12. Display and Sound

12.1. Picture

Picture Settings

About the Picture Settings Menu

The picture setting menu provides an easy flow to access multi-level picture settings from general to advanced. For some picture settings, values can be changed by breakaway menu to let you view all the setting values and preview the effects that will be applied.

On the first level of the Picture setting menu, you can always select an item and press the **OK** key to go to the next level of options. If a breakaway menu appears, you can slide or select a box to choose the setting values and preview the effect and then press **OK** to confirm the change. If there are other setting options on the same level, you can press the \land (up) or \checkmark (down) key to scroll to them without leaving the breakaway menu. Once you have finished changing the settings, you can keep pressing the **Grack** key to leave or close the setting menus.

Picture Style

Select a style

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Picture style. Alternately, press **\$** (DASHBOARD) on the remote control and select Picture > Picture style.

For easy picture adjustment, you can select a preset picture style.

• Personal - The picture preferences you set during the first start up.

- Crystal Clear Ideal for daylight viewing.
- Home Cinema Ideal for daily movie home entertainment experience.
- ECO Most energy conscious setting.
- Movie Ideal for watching movies with original studio effect.
- Game* Ideal for playing games.
- Monitor** Ideal for computer application display. Original video is displayed with minimum processing.

* Picture style - Game is only available in HDMI video and streaming video apps application.

** Picture style - Monitor is only available when HDMI source video is applicable for PC application.

When TV receives HDR signal (Hybrid Log Gamma, HDR10 and HDR10+), select a picture style below:

- HDR Personal
- HDR Crystal Clear
- HDR Home Cinema
- HDR ECO
- HDR Movie
- HDR Game
- HDR Monitor

Restore Picture style

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Restore picture style.

Select to restore the picture style.

Auto Film Picture style

Preferred Film Picture style

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Auto Film Picture style > Preferred Film Picture style.

You can select which **Picture style** will be automatically set when film content is detected. The preferred Film Picture style option is depending on the availability of Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Picture style.

*Note: To automatically detect film content and set your preference Picture style, you need to switch on the Auto Film Picture style from Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Auto Film Picture style > Auto Film Picture style.

Switch on/off Auto Film Picture style

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Auto Film Picture style > Auto Film Picture style.

Switch on or off to detect film content automatically and set your preference in the **C** Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Auto Film Picture style > Preferred Film Picture style.

More Picture Settings

Contrast

Brightness

Ambient Light Level Optimization

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Contrast > Brightness > Ambient light level optimization.

Switch on to adjust the picture settings automatically to the lighting conditions of the room.

Backlight Contrast

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Contrast > Brightness > Backlight contrast.

Adjust the contrast value of the picture. You can decrease contrast value to reduce power consumption.

Contrast Modes

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Contrast > Brightness > Contrast mode.

Select Normal, Optimized for picture, or Optimized for energy savings to set the TV to automatically reduce the contrast for best power consumption or for best picture experience, or select Off to switch off the adjustment.

Video Level

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Contrast > Brightness > Video level.

Adjust the video contrast level.

Dark Details

Gamma

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Contrast > Dark details > Gamma.

To set a nonlinear setting for picture luminance and contrast.

Note: Not available for some models when Ambient dark detail optimization or Dark detail optimization is set to On.

Black Level

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Contrast > Dark details > Black level.

To set the black level of the picture.

Note: Setting the black level far from reference value (50) may result in lower contrast (dark detail disappears or black picture becomes gray).

Contrast Enhancement

Dynamic Enhancement Level

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Contrast > Contrast enhancement > Dynamic enhancement level.

Select **Off**, **Maximum**, **Medium**, or **Minimum** to set the level at which the TV automatically enhances the details in the dark, middle and light areas of the picture.

Note: Not available when an HDR signal is detected. Not available in **Monitor** mode.

HDR Control

HDR Tone Mapping

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Contrast > HDR control > HDR tone mapping.

Set the method used in HDR tone mapping processing. Off is to disable TV internal tone mapping or follow HGiG (HDR Gaming Interest Group) gaming HDR standard to a matching gaming device. You can adjust the method to Static (if HDR10 signal detected) or Dynamic (if HDR10+ signal detected).

Note: Available when an HDR10 or HDR10+ signal is detected.

HDR Effect Settings

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Contrast > HDR control > HDR10 effect / HDR10+ effect / HLG effect.

When an HDR10/HDR10+/HLG signal is detected and HDR tone mapping is not set to Off, you can adjust the HDR effect level to More details, Balanced, or More brightness for each type of HDR content.

Color

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Color.

Saturation

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Color > Saturation.

To adjust the value of saturation for the colors.

Note: not available when picture style is Monitor or HDR Monitor.

Adjust the tint setting

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Color > Tint.

To adjust the tint setting value.

Adjust the color enhancement

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Color > Color enhancement.

Select Maximum, Medium, Minimum or Off to set the

level of the color intensity and the details in bright colors.

Adjust color temperature

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Color > Color temperature > Whitepoint.

Select Warm, Normal, Cool or Custom to set the color temperature for your preference.

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Color > Color temperature > 2 whitepoint alignment or 20 whitepoint alignment.

Customize the whitepoint alignment based on the selected color temperature of the picture.

Color control

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Color > Color control.

The **Color control** setting is only available when **Color enhancement** is set to **Off**. To adjust or reset to default values for **Hue**, **Saturation** and **Intensity** for the color **Red**, **Yellow**, **Green**, **Cyan**, **Blue** and **Magenta**. If you want to reset all values to default, select **Reset all to default**.

Sharpness

Enhancement

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Sharpness > Enhancement.

To adjust the sharpness value of the picture.

Texture enhancement

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Sharpness > Texture enhancement.

Switch on to have superior sharpness in line edges and details. Not available when **Picture format** is set to **Fill Screen**.

Picture Clean

Noise reduction

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Picture clean > Noise reduction.

Select **Off**, **Maximum**, **Medium**, or **Minimum** to set the level for removing the noise from video content. Noise is mostly visible as small moving dots in the on-screen picture.

MPEG Artifact Reduction

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Picture clean > Artifact Reduction.

Select **Off**, **Maximum**, **Medium**, or **Minimum** to have different degrees of smoothing of artifacts in digital video content.

Artifacts are mostly visible as small blocks or jagged edges in on-screen images.

Picture clean is not available when Picture style is Game, HDR Game, Monitor or HDR Monitor.

Motion

Motion styles

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Motion > Motion styles.

Motion styles provides optimized motion setting modes for different video content.

Select one of the motion styles to have a different viewing experience for motion video. (Off, Pure Cinema, Movie, Standard, Smooth, Personal)

Not available for below cases:

- Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Picture style
 > Monitor
- Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Picture style
 > Game

Smoothness

Settings > Display & Sound > Picture > Motion > Smoothness.

To make picture movement smooth by minimizing judder.

Select from **0** to **10** to have different degrees of reducing motion judder visible in movies on the TV. Select **0** when noise appears in the moving picture on-screen.

Note: Only available when **Motion styles** is set to **Personal**.

Quick Picture Setting

During the first installation, you made some picture settings in a few easy steps. You can redo these steps with **Quick Picture Setting**.

To set the picture in a few easy steps:

- 1 Select **\$ Settings** > **Display & Sound** > **Picture**.
- 2 Select Quick Picture Setting* and press OK.
- 3 Use the navigation keys to select your

preferred source, sharpness, contrast, color and motion settings.

4 - Select Finish or press < (left) repeatedly if necessary,

* Quick Picture Setting is not available when Picture style is set to Monitor/HDR Monitor/Game.

12.2. Screen

Picture Format

If the picture is not filling the whole screen, if black bars are showing on the top or bottom or at both sides, you can adjust the picture to fill the screen completely.

To select one of the basic settings to fill the screen:

1 - Press Settings > Display & Sound > Screen > Picture format > Fill Screen, Fit to Screen, Wide Screen and Original, and press OK.

2 - Press **<** (left) repeatedly if necessary, to close the menu.

• Fill Screen – automatically enlarges the picture to fill the screen. Picture distortion is minimal, subtitles remain visible. Not suitable for PC input. Some extreme picture content can still show black bars. Picture content aspect ratio may change.

• Fit to Screen – automatically zooms in on the picture to fill the screen without distortion. Black bars may be visible. Not suitable for PC input.

• Wide Screen – automatically zooms in on the picture to 16:9 full screen. Picture content aspect ratio may change.

• Original – automatically zooms in on the picture to fit the screen at the original aspect ratio. No content lost visible.

To format the picture manually:

1 - Press Settings > Display & Sound > Screen > Picture format > Advanced and press OK.

2 - Use Shift, Zoom, and Stretch to adjust the picture.
3 - Or select Undo to return to the setting the picture had when you opened Picture Format.

• Shift – Select on the arrows to shift the picture. You can only shift the picture when it is zoomed in.

• Zoom – Select on the arrows to zoom in.

• Stretch – Select on the arrows to stretch the picture vertically or horizontally.

• Undo – Select to return to the picture format you started with.

Some Picture format setting selections may not be available in some conditions. For example, in video streaming, Android app application, gaming mode, etc.

- Personal Access to more in-depth sound settings.

Customize personal settings

- 1 Set the sound style to Personal.
- 2 Go to **\$ Settings** > **Display &**

Sound > Sound > Personal settings to change personal sound settings.

Restore personal settings

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > Personal settings > Restore personal mode.

Select to restore personal sound settings.

Personal Settings

Speaker virtualizer

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > Personal settings > Speaker virtualizer.

Select **On** or **Auto (Dolby Atmos)** to enable Dolby Atmos, which can add height dimension in sound. With height dimension, sound can be precisely placed and moved in three-dimensional space. Select **Off** to turn the function off.

Clear dialog

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > Personal settings > Clear dialog.

Select **On** to get an improved sound quality for speech program.

AI Equalizer

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > Personal

settings > AI Equalizer.

Select **On** to enable intelligent equalizer adjustment based on audio content and custom settings.

Custom AI Equalizer

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > Personal settings > Custom AI Equalizer.

Press the Arrow/navigation keys to adjust the level of AI Equalizer.

Restore personal settings

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > Personal settings > Restore personal mode.

Select to restore personal sound settings.

TV Placement

TV placement

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > TV placement.

Select **On a TV stand** or **On the wall** to have the best sound reproduction according to the setting.

Personalized Sound

Personalized sound settings

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > Personalized sound.

Personalize your TV speakers sound

Personalized sound settings allow you to create a personal profile based on your hearing abilities by taking a hearing test. You can choose your preferred sound settings so that you can hear more clearly and experience better sound, thereby enhancing your TV viewing experience.

How do I test my hearing and set up my hearing profile?

Start the hearing test from Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > Personalized sound > Configure. Create your own hearing profile with a short hearing test.

Before the test, you need to switch your current audio out to **TV speakers** as the setup affects the TV speakers only. The hearing test works best when carried out in silence; make sure your environment is quiet when testing.

Select Let's start and enter a profile name to start the

test.

During the test:

- You will hear a beep sound increasing in volume.
- Press OK button when you hear the beep sound.
- Then, you will hear a beep sound decreasing in volume.
- Press OK button when you don't hear the beep sound.
- The test will repeat 5 times with different tones.

Once the test is complete, your hearing test results will be presented, and you can then select **Save and exit** to store the profile. You can apply the current profile or create other profiles, with a maximum of 3 profiles. You can also **Rename profiles** or **Remove profiles** when needed.

EasyLink 2.0

Control the sound settings of the HDMI sound system via EasyLink 2.0

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > EasyLink 2.0.

You can adjust the individual sound settings of the HDMI sound system via Frequent settings or Display & Sound > Sound. This is only applicable to EasyLink 2.0–compliant HDMI sound systems. To switch on the control, make sure the EasyLink 2.0 sound control menu item is set to On under Channels and inputs > Inputs.

Select sound style

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > EasyLink 2.0 > Sound style.

Switch between the preset sound styles. There are ideal styles for watching movies, listening to music and other sound content.

- Movie Ideal sound style for watching movies.
- Music Optimized for listening to music.
- Voice Enhances the dialog in the vocals.
- Stadium Gives the feel of a large open-air stadium.

• Custom - Personalized sound mode. This setting is only available when the connected device is compatible with the TV.

Adjust bass level

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > EasyLink 2.0 > Bass.

Press the Arrow/navigation keys to adjust the bass level.

Adjust treble level

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > EasyLink
2.0 > Treble.

Press the Arrow/navigation keys to adjust the treble

level.

Custom Equalizer

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > EasyLink 2.0 > Custom Equalizer.

Adjust the frequency bands when the **Sound style** is set to **Custom**. Press the **Arrow/navigation keys** to adjust the AI Equalizer levels. This setting is only available when the connected device is compatible with the TV.

Surround Sound

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > EasyLink 2.0 > Surround Sound.

Select a surround effect from the preset types.

- Upmix Upmix to take full advantage of all speakers.
- Standard Speaker output through the original channels.

• Surround AI - Optimum surround effect using AI analysis.

DRC

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > EasyLink 2.0 > DRC.

Select the preferred Dynamic Range Control (DRC).

- Auto Dynamic range is automatically adjusted.
- On Optimize the dynamic range.
- Off Turn off dynamic range adjustment.

Height speakers

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > EasyLink 2.0 > Height speakers.

Select the preferred height speakers movement. This setting is only available when the connected device is compatible with the TV.

- Auto Dynamic movement depending on content.
- On Always elevated.
- Off Flat position.

Select sound stage

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > EasyLink 2.0 > Sound stage.

Select a listening experience. This setting is only available when the connected device is compatible with the TV.

• Auto - Dynamic setting changes depending on content.

• On - Immersive Sound Stage, good for watching movies.

• Off - Crystal Sound Stage, good for listening to music and dialog.

Reset all to default

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > EasyLink 2.0 > Reset all to default.

Reset all the EasyLink 2.0 sound settings back to the original factory settings.

There are more settings options that may be available if your HDMI sound system supports them:

Subwoofer level adjustment Dolby Atmos adjustment Height level adjustment DTS Virtual X enable/disable TRUE Volume enable/disable Night mode enable/disable Auto volume setting Display enable/disable

Room Calibration

Room calibration

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > Room calibration.

This calibration will allow the TV to determine the acoustics in your room and provide optimized sound quality through the TV speakers that best matches the acoustics.

You need to pair your remote control with the TV before starting the setup and make sure the TV Audio out setting is TV speakers. For a more accurate result, please keep the room quiet.

To start the room calibration:

 Hold your remote control at the listening position and point it toward the TV during the tuning process.
 Select Calibrate now or Calibrate again to start the calibration.

3 - A test sound will be played and measured through your remote control. Hold your remote control and point it toward the TV; this can take several seconds.
4 - Once your TV speakers are successfully calibrated, select **Test** to listen to the sound before and after the TV speakers are calibrated. Select **Apply** to accept the setting or select **Try again** to redo the calibration.
5 - When room calibration setup is successful and applied, the TV returns to the Settings menu. Now go to **\$** Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > Room calibration and select **Apply calibration** to tune the audio output from TV speakers.

Advanced Sound Settings

Volume Control

Auto volume

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > Advanced > Auto volume.

Select **On or Off** to switch the auto volume adjustment on or off.

Select **Night Mode** for a more comfortable, quiet listening experience.

Delta volume

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > Advanced > Delta volume.

The Delta volume setting can be used to balance the sound level difference between the TV channel and the HDMI source input. Press the **Arrow/navigation keys** to adjust the delta value for TV speaker volume.

* Note: Delta volume is available when the input source is set to HDMI or Analog sources and the Audio out is set to **TV speakers** or **HDMI sound system**.

Dolby Atmos Notification

Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > Dolby Atmos notification.

Switch On or Off the Dolby Atmos notification when Dolby Atmos content begins to play on your TV. The notification is only available when Settings > Display & Sound > Audio out is set to TV speakers and Settings > Display & Sound > Sound > Personal settings > Speaker virtualizer is set to On or Auto (Dolby Atmos).

12.4. Audio Output

Speakers and eARC

Audio out

Settings > Display & Sound > Audio out.

Set the TV to play the sound on TV or on the connected audio system.

You can select where you want to hear the TV sound and how you want to control it.

• If you select **TV speakers**, the TV speakers are always on.

• If you select Optical, the TV speakers will be switched

off and Digital output/Optical will be turned on.

With an audio device connected with HDMI CEC, select **HDMI sound system**. The TV will switch off the TV speakers when the device is playing the sound.

eARC

Settings > Display & Sound > Audio output > eARC.

Set eARC mode to Automatic or Off.

Digital Output Settings

Digital output settings are available for optical and HDMI ARC sound signals.

Digital out format

Settings > Display & Sound > Audio output > Digital out format.

Set the audio out signal of the TV to fit the sound capabilities of the connected Home Theater System.

Stereo (uncompressed): If your audio playback devices have no multichannel sound processing, select to only output stereo content to your audio playback devices.
Multichannel: Select to output multichannel audio content (compressed multichannel sound signal) or stereo audio content to your audio playback devices.

• Multichannel (bypass): Select to output Dolby Digital Plus or DTS content to your audio playback devices or Home theater system.

- Make sure your audio playback devices support Dolby Atmos feature.

- SPDIF output (DIGITAL AUDIO OUT) will be enabled when streaming Dolby Digital Plus content.

Digital out leveling

Settings > Display & Sound > Audio output > Digital out leveling.

Adjust the loudness level of the HDMI sound system.

- Select More to have louder volume.
- Select Less to have softer volume.

Digital out delay

Settings > Display & Sound > Audio output > Digital out delay.

For some Home Theater Systems, you might need to adjust the audio sync delay to synchronize the audio to the video. Select Off if a sound delay is set on your Home Theater System.

Digital out offset (Only available when Digital out delay set to On)

Settings > Display & Sound > Audio output > Digital out offset.

If you cannot set a delay on the Home Theater System, you can set the TV to sync the sound. You can set an offset that compensates for the time necessary for the Home Theater System to process the sound of the TV picture. You can set the value in steps of 5ms. Maximum setting is 60ms.

13. Apps

13.1. About Apps

You can find your favorite Apps on the **Your apps** row on the Home menu.

Like apps on your smartphone or tablet, the apps on your TV offer specific functions for an enriched TV experience. You can use the **WEB BROWSER** app to surf the Internet.

Apps can come from the Google Play[™] Store. To get you started, some practical apps are pre-installed on your TV.

To install apps from the Google Play[™] Store, the TV must be connected to the Internet. You must sign in with a Google Account to use the Google Play apps and Google Play[™] Store. Select the app you want to install and select the **Install** button to start the installation. Once the app installation is done, you can select the **Open** button to open the app or **Uninstall** button to uninstall the app.

13.2. Google play

Movies and TV

With the **Google TV** app, you can rent or buy movies and TV shows to watch on TV.

What You Need

- your TV must be connected to the Internet
- you must sign in with your Google Account on the TV
- add a credit card to your Google Account to purchase movies and TV shows

To rent or buy a movie or TV show:

- 1 Press **f** HOME and select Apps tab.
- 2 Select the **Google TV** app and open it.
- 3 Select a movie or TV show and press OK.
- 4 Select the purchase you want and press **OK**. You will be taken through the purchase procedure.

To watch a rented or purchased movie or TV show:

- 1 Press **f** HOME and select Apps tab.
- 2 Select the Google TV app and open it.
- 3 Select the movie or TV show from your library in the app, select the title and press **OK**.
- 4 You can use the **Stop**, **Pause**, **Rewind** or **Fast forward** buttons on the remote control.

5 - To stop the Movies & TV app, press **Back** repeatedly or press **TV EXIT**.

* Note: If Google TV is not on the Your Apps row, you

can search for it using the search field to **Open** or **Install** it.

Games

With Google Play Games, you can play games on TV. Online or offline.

Start the Google Play Games app to select and install new game apps on your TV. Some games are free of charge. A message appears if a particular game needs a gamepad to play the game.

3 - Select a game to play or select a new game to install and press **OK**.

13.4. Manage Apps

Settings > Apps.

If you stop an app and return to the Home menu, the app is not really stopped. The app is still running in the background to be readily available when you start it again. To run fluently, most apps need to save some data in the cache memory of the TV. It might be good to stop an app completely or clear the cache data of a particular app to optimize the overall performance of apps and to keep memory usage low on your TV. Also, it is best to uninstall apps that you are not using anymore. You can select **Apps > See all apps** or **Unused apps** to list your installed or used apps.

For each installed app, you can also set the permissions for Manage updates, App permissions, Special app access and Security.

Text to Speech

Settings > System > Accessibility > Text to speech.

Set to convert the text into speech for blind or partially sighted people.

Accessibility shortcut

Settings > System > Accessibility > Accessibility shortcut.

Quick access to Accessibility settings.

14.2. About

System Software Update

Update from Internet

If the TV is connected to the Internet, you may receive a message to update the TV software. You need a high-speed (broadband) Internet connection. If you receive this message, we recommend you to carry out the update.

With the message on-screen, select **Update** and follow the instructions on-screen.

You can also look for a software update yourself.

During the software update, there is no picture and the TV will switch off and on again. This might happen several times. The update can take a few minutes. Wait until the TV picture comes back on. Do not press the power switch **O** on the TV or on the remote control during the software update.

To look for a software update yourself:

- 1 Select **C** Settings > System > About > System update > Internet (recommended) and press OK.
- 2 The TV will look for an update on the Internet.

3 - If an update is available, you can update the software right away.

4 - A software update can take several minutes. Do not press the ⁽¹⁾/₍₂₎ key on the TV or remote control.

5 - When the update is done, the TV will return to the channel you were watching.

Update from USB

It might be necessary to update the TV software.

You need a computer with a high-speed Internet connection and a USB flash drive to upload the software on the TV. Use a USB flash drive with at least 2Gb of free space. Make sure that write protection is switched off.

To update the TV software:

1 - Select **C** Settings > System > About > System update.

2 - Select USB and press OK.

Identify the TV







18. Smartphones and Tablets

18.1. Philips Smart TV app

The **Philips Smart TV** app on your smartphone or tablet is your new TV buddy. The app lets you switch channels and adjust the volume — just like a remote control.

The Philips Smart TV app is available for iOS and Android and is free of charge.

Alternatively, you can go to **Settings** > Network and Internet > Remote app QR code and press OK; a QR code will be presented on the TV screen. Scan the QR code with your mobile device and follow the instructions to download and install the Philips Smart TV app. When using the app, your mobile device and Philips TV need to connect to the same Wi-Fi network.

19.1. What You Need

On this TV, you can play games:

- from the Google Play Store in the Home menu
- from a connected Game Console

Games from the Google Play Store must be downloaded and installed on the TV before you can play them. Some games need a gamepad to play.

To install game apps from Google Play Store, the TV must be connected to the Internet and you need to agree to the Terms of Use to use the apps. You must sign in with a Google Account to use Google Play apps and Google Play Store.

19.2. Gamepads

To play games from the Internet on this TV, you can connect a selected range of wireless Gamepads. The TV can support 2 connected Gamepads at a time. When you connect the Gamepad, you can use it immediately.

19.3. Play a Game from a Game Console or Computer

To start a game from a Game Console or Computer the first time:

1 - Connect the Game Console or Computer to the TV with an Ultra High Speed HDMI cable before powering on the console or computer.

2 - Press **SOURCES** and select a game console or the name of the connection.

3 - Set **HDMI Ultra HD** to **Optimal** for standard gaming or to **Optimal (Auto Game)** for HDMI Variable Refresh Rate (on some models only).

- 4 Power on the Game Console or Computer.
- 5 Start the game.

For more information on connecting a Game Console, in **Help**, press the color key — **Keywords** and look up **Game Console, connect**.

19.4. Gaming Bar

The Game bar is an integrated center for information display and setting control while playing a game. It provides a quick way to change picture, audio and Ambilight* settings. You can also create up to 10 separate game profiles for different types of games for own preference. It is applicable for HDMI source as long as the **Picture style** is set to **Game/HDR Game**. Toggle to enable or disable from **HDMI** (ports) > **Options** > **Game bar**, or long press the **MENU** to enable/disable the Gaming bar when game signal detected and game mode is enabled.

* Ambilight setting is only for models that support Ambilight function.

Activation and deactivation

When TV auto switch to Game mode (via game detection) is activated, the TV will show a message to inform you that Game mode is enabled and the Game bar is available, press **OK** to activate the Game bar. To deactivate the Game bar, you can press **← Back** or it will close automatically after 20 seconds without interaction.

Gaming information

Game bar will show the key information for the gaming.

Frame rate: current FPS (frame per second), displayed on top of screen.

Profile name: current applied profile of settings, displayed on top of Game bar.

HDMI information: current HDMI port, speed/mode and HDCP version, displayed under the profile name. Video source information: displayed on bottom of Game bar.

- VRR type: current type of VRR
- Resolution: video source resolution
- Bit depth and pixel format: data information of current source
- SDR/HDR format: the supported HDR type or SDR of source
- Content type: video content is General, Game or Movie
- ALLM: to show the HDMI ALLM is supported
- Motion setting: current setting of Motion

Game tools

The Game tools* contains frequently used tools that can improve your gaming experience. Move the cursor to Profile name bar and press **OK** to enable or disable the game tools. Move the cursor to Game tool icon and press **OK** to turn on the green light on icon and enable the tool. Press **OK** again to disable the tool. Move down to select ••• under the icon to enter the setting options for the Game tool.

Crosshair: enable/disable to show the dial point. You can adjust **Type**, **Size**, **Thickness** and **Color** of the crosshair from setting options.

Shadow enhancer: disable to use current Black level in Picture settings; enable to overwrite the setting to higher black level. You can adjust the type in setting

options to apply different levels of enhancer. **Color filter**: enable to adjust the color on screen. You can select one of color options and set to strengthen the color by **Single color** or exclude the color by **Exclude color**. While **Color filter** is enabled, the **Color enhancement** and **Color control** under **Picture** > **Color** settings are not accessible since only one of the three UI can take control each time.

* Depending on your TV model, some tools may not be available on your TV.

Game bar settings

Select the setting icon 🌣 on the left side of Game bar, and press OK to change the following settings:

Profile: the profile stores the settings of the Game bar. You can select a Standard profile or create your own profiles. The Game bar settings can be adjusted for different types of Games. When you are satisfied with current settings for specific game or game type, you can go to Game bar setting > Profile and select Add profile to store current settings and name the profile. Along with the Standard profile, you can create up to eight customized profiles. Once the customized profile is created, you can press left or right key to switch between the profiles from the Profile name bar.

FPS indicator: set to enable/disable and display position for the FPS information.

Switch On and Remote Control

The TV does not switch on

• Disconnect the power cable from the power outlet. Wait for one minute then reconnect it.

• Make sure that the power cable is securely connected.

Creaking sound at startup or switch off

When you are turn the TV on, off or to standby, you hear a creaking sound from the TV chassis. The creaking sound is due to the normal expansion and contraction of the TV as it cools and warms up. This does not affect performance.

TV does not respond to the remote control

The TV requires some time to start up. During this time, the TV does not respond to the remote control or TV controls. This is normal behavior.

If the TV continues to be unresponsive to the remote control, you can check if the remote control is working by means of a mobile phone camera. Put the phone in camera mode and point the remote control to the camera lens. If you press any button on the remote control and you notice the infra-red LED flicker through the camera, the remote control is working. The TV needs to be checked.

If you do not notice the flickering, the remote control might be broken or its batteries are low.

This method of checking the remote control is not possible with remote controls which are wirelessly paired with the TV.

The standby light keeps on blinking

Disconnect the power cable from the power outlet. Wait 5 minutes before you reconnect the power cable. If the blinking reoccurs, contact Philips TV Consumer Care.
