1. Home Screen

1.1 Introduction

To fully enjoy your Google TV, connect your TV to the Internet. Press ♠ (Home) on your remote control to access the Home screen. Like on your Android smartphone or tablet, the Home screen is the central hub of your TV. From the Home screen you can decide what to watch by browsing entertainment options from apps and live TV.

The Home screen is organized in rows to let you discover great content from your favourite apps. Apps may also display their recommended content as individual rows on the Home screen.

Highlights on your home screen

You can find movies and shows from services and popular apps using multiple index tabs, such as Search, Recommended for You, Videos, Shows, Apps, and Collections. Sign in to your Google account to receive personalized recommendations based on your past viewing habits and interests. You can also use voice or text input in the Search tab to quickly find content using Google's search system.

Favourite Apps

The home screen's application index includes all installed applications that come with the TV, as well as applications you have installed from the Google Play™ store. You can also install and add more apps as Favorites from the Apps index tab.

Tour guide

Decide what you want to watch next with easy-to-use navigation. Browse your personalized recommendations, pick up where you left off, or use the new index tab system to quickly find specific apps.

Explore personalized recommendations

Browse your favorite shows and movies on all your favorite media services. Sign in to your Google Account to get started.

Get recommendations through Google

Your services will be saved to your Google account, allowing you to get better recommendations across Google's services.

1.2 Dashboard and Settings

The Dashboard is a side panel in your TV that provides access to settings, device controls, notifications, and more.

You can access the dashboard in three ways:

- 1- Navigating to 👀 = Dashboard icon on the home page.
- 2- Press the 🌣 DASHBOARD button on the remote control.
- 3- Long press the final HOME button on the remote control.

 The dashboard contains the following features.
- All Settings: Access all settings menus to adjust TV settings.
- Screensaver: Display the system clock. Press this function to start the screen saver immediately.
- Inputs: Launch the input source list to switch to any connected device.
- Display: Quick access to adjust picture settings.
- · Sound: Quick access to adjust sound settings.
- Wi-Fi: Quick access to adjust Wi-Fi settings.
- Accessibility: Quick links to adjust accessibility settings.
- Bluetooth: Quick links to adjust Bluetooth settings.
- Notifications: Display system-related notifications.
 Clear all: Select Clear all to dismiss all notifications.

To open the home screen and access its items:

1.3 Open the home screen


- 1 Press A HOME.
- 2 Select an item and press OK to open or start it.
- 3 Keep pressing ← return or press ♠ HOME to return to the home screen.

When you open the home screen, any background applications or content playback will stop. You must select an application or content from the home screen to continue.

2. Quick Guide

2.1 Remote Control

- Use the remote control by pointing it towards the remote sensor. Obstructions between the remote control and the sensor may interfere with its normal operation.
- Avoid shaking the remote control violently. Do not expose the remote control to liquid, and keep it away from places with high humidity.
- Do not place remote control under direct sunlight which will cause deformation of the unit due to heat.
- When the remote sensor is under direct sunlight or strong lighting, the remote control may not function properly. In such cases, try adjusting the lighting, relocating the TV, or using the remote control closer to the sensor.



1. Power ((l))

Turn on or turn off the TV.

2. Mic (🗓)

Start using the near field voice function.

- Short press MIC button to wake up the voice assistant.
- Long press MIC button to start receiving your voice command. Release the MIC button after speaking to process your voice command.

3. Account (🚢)

Sign in with your Google account to access your favorite entertainment.

4. Dashboard (🌣)

Access the dashboard of your Google TV.

5. OK

Confirm, enter or execute the selected item, or show the list of Ouick Button.

6. Navigation Buttons (UP/DOWN/LEFT/RIGHT)

- Navigate the menu to select the content you need.
- On the Live TV Screen, press Right→Keyboard →

Virtual Keyboard (Includes Red/Green/Yellow/Blue virtual buttons).

7. Home (🏚)

Access the home screen.

8. Guide ())

Access the Electronic Program Guide in DTV mode.

9. Back (←)

Return to upper-level content, or exit the current operation.

10. Mute (🛱)

Mute or restore the TV sound.

11, Volume Up/Down (+/-)

Adjust the sound volume.

12. Source (**∃**)

Bottom



13. Application Buttons

Quickly access specific applications.

14. Daily Key (🗪)

- Short press to start the shortcut function, or set it up for the first time.
- Long press to configure the shortcut function.

2.2 Install Remote Control Batteries

Place two AAA size batteries in the remote control's battery compartment, making sure to match the polarity markings inside the compartment.

Precautions For Using Battery


Improper using of the battery will cause leakage. Please follow the guidelines below to ensure safe use:

- Always ensure correct battery polarity (+/-) during installation to avoid short circuits.
- Replace batteries when their voltage is low, which is indicated by a reduced operational range.
- Remove the batteries if the remote control will not be used for an extended period.
- Do not mix different types of batteries (e.g., manganese and alkaline) or combine old and new batteries.
- Never dispose of batteries in fire, attempt to recharge non-rechargeable batteries, or disassemble them.
- Please dispose of batteries in compliance with relevant environmental protection regulations.
- WARNING: The batteries (battery pack or batteries installed) shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.
- WARNING: Batteries should not be exposed to extremely low air pressure, which may cause explosion or leakage of flammable liquids or gases.

3. Setting Up

3.1 Positioning the TV

- Place the TV on a solid, horizontal surface like a table or desk. For proper ventilation, leave at least 10 cm (about 4 inches) of space around the TV. To prevent any fault and unsafe situations, please do not place any objects on top of the TV. This apparatus can be used in tropical and/or moderate climates.
- Fix the rear of enclosure to wall(only for some countries)

Warning: Stability Hazard

A TV may fall, causing serious personal injury or death. Many injuries, particularly to children, can be avoided by taking simple precautions such as:


- Always use cabinets, stands, or mounting methods recommended by the TV manufacturer.
- Always use furniture that can safely support the TV's weight.
- ALWAYS ensure the TV is not overhanging the edge of the supporting furniture.
- ALWAYS educate children about the dangers of climbing on furniture to reach the TV or its controls.
- ALWAYS route cords and cables connected to your TV so they cannot be tripped over, pulled or grabbed.

- NEVER place the TV on tall furniture (for example, cupboards or bookcases) without anchoring both the furniture and the TV to a suitable support.

If relocating an existing TV, apply these same precautions.

3.2 Mounting on a Wall

An optional wall mount can be used with your TV.
Consult with your local dealer to purchase the
recommended wall mount bracket. Carefully attach
the wall mount bracket at the rear of the TV. Install the
wall mount bracket on a solid wall perpendicular to

- the floor. If you are attaching the TV to other building materials, please contact qualified personnel to install the wall mount. Detailed instructions will be included with the wall mount. Use a wall mount bracket that securely holds the TV and leaves enough space for connecting external devices.
- To avoid damage or injury, keep the TV screen upright or tilted within 0° to 5° when mounted on the wall.
- If you need to tilt the TV downward beyond 5°, purchase the necessary accessories from your local dealer for safe installation. Improper tilting may void your warranty, and you may be responsible for any resulting damage or injury.






- Disconnect the power before moving or installing the TV. Otherwise electric shock may occur.
- Remove the TV stand before mounting the TV on the wall by reversing the stand installation steps.
- Do not install the TV on ceilings or slanted walls, as it may fall and cause serious injury. Use an authorized wall mount and contact qualified personnel for installation. Otherwise, warranty coverage will be voided.
- Do not overtighten screws, as this can damage the TV and void the warranty.

- To prevent injury, this apparatus must be securely attached to the floor/wall in accordance with the installation instructions.
- Use the screws and wall mounts that meet the following specifications. Any damages or injuries by misuse or using an improper accessory are not covered by the warranty.

4. Connections

4.1 AV IN

Receive audio and video signals from external AV devices.



4.2 Antenna / Satellite

Connect a coaxial cable to receive signal from the antenna, cable or satellite.



4.3 USB

Connect a USB storage device.



4.4 HDMI

Receive HD input signal from external HDMI devices.



4.5 Digital Audio Out

Use an optical cable to output your TV's audio signal to a compatible digital audio receiver.



4.6 Network

Wired network port.



4.7 Headphone

Output the TV sound to the connected headphone. Speakers will be muted when headphone is plugged in.



5. Voice Function

5 1 Far Field Voice



1. TV Control Button (Located under this icon)

* In standby mode:

Press the TV control button to turn on the TV.

* In working status:

Short press TV control button to call out the following menu of soft keyboard. Inside it, short press TV control button to move the cursor and select the desired item, then long press TV control button to enter or execute the selected item.



2. Far Field Microphones

Microphones of far field voice function. It is best to keep yourself within 3 meters away from the far field microphones while using the far field voice function.

3. Light Effect

Show the light effect featured by the TV.

4. Switch of Far Field Microphones (Located under these icons)

Turn on or turn off the microphones of far field voice function.

5. Remote Sensor

Receive the signal transmitted by the remote control.

6. Far Field Indicator

Indicate the status of far field microphones and far field voice function.

5.2 Near Field Voice



1. Near Field Microphone

Microphone of near field voice function. It is best to keep your mouth within 5 centimeters away from the near field microphone while using the near field voice function.

2. MIC Button of Near Field Voice Function

Press to start using the near field voice function.

< Pair Bluetooth remote control with your TV >

For the remote control supplied with your TV, please finish pairing with your TV before using it for near field voice function. The pairing could be done at the first step of "Initial Setup", or in "Settings".

7. Trouble Shooting

7.1 General Problem / Solution

Remote control does not work

Change the batteries.

Check if batteries are installed correctly.

Check if main power is connected.

Check if there are obstructions between remote sensor and remote control

Poor Signal

This is usually caused by interference from electronic equipments or radio interference sources.

7.2 Picture & Sound / Solution

• No picture, no sound

Check the signal source.

Plug another electrical device into the outlet to check if it is working or turned on.

Check if power plug is in good contact with the outlet.

No sound, picture OK

If no sound, unmute the sound or increase the volume.

Open the sound menu and adjust 'Balance'.

Abnormal picture

If there is no color or poor picture quality, you can:

- 1. Adjust the color settings in the menu.
- 2. Keep the TV at a sufficient distance from other electronic products.
- 3. Try another channel.

Bad TV signal (Display mosaic or snowflakes)

- 1. Check the signal cable and adjust the antenna.
- 2. Fine tune the channel.
- 3. Try another channel.

7.3 Multimedia Player / Solution

 'This file is invalid' /'Unsupported audio' appears, or audio is normal but video is abnormal, or video is normal but audio is abnormal

The media file may be damaged. Try playing it on a PC to verify.

Check if video and audio codec is supported.

7.4 Network / Solution

Network failure

Check if the router is working properly. Ensure the TV is successfully connected to the router.

7.5 Browser / Solution

- Web page can not be displayed completely Some third-party extensions of the current web page may not be supported, and please close
- the current web page.

Browser is forced to shut down

The current web page may have too many contents, causing insufficient memory. This can lead to the browser shutting down.
